

ROLL CALL

Frank G. McCartney, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting, called the Roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being five members present from Pennsylvania and five members present from New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public or Press on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

<u>Traffic Engineering Report</u> – In a few minutes, we will have a brief presentation on the 2007 traffic engineering report, which you will be asked to accept later in the meeting.

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The purpose of the report is to determine if year 2008 projected revenues will meet the debt service requirements for our capital bonds, and I am happy to report that they do.

Our consultants project that toll revenues in 2008 will total more than \$89 million, which represents an increase of \$4.7 million over 2007 revenues. This is in large part due to the toll adjustment for trucks that was put in place last spring.

The actual number of vehicles projected to cross our toll bridges in 2008 is expected to increase by 270,000 vehicles.

<u>Milford Montague</u> – Construction on the Milford Montague Toll Bridge is set to begin today, after a very successful partnering meeting earlier this month.

We should be able to avoid lane closures for at least a few weeks while contractors mobilize and until work really picks up. The bridge will remain open during construction, but will be limited to one-lane of traffic throughout the project. A temporary traffic light will be installed to help vehicles move through smoothly.

We have also agreed to a summer moratorium on construction that will run from the Thursday before Memorial Day until after Labor Day.

Community open houses on the project are scheduled for February 6 and February 14.

<u>I-78</u> – The rehabilitation of I-78 on the New Jersey side will move into a new stage next month. Effective February 18, the shoulders will be eliminated and the lanes will be narrowed.

Within the next week, we will be posting speed reduction signs lowering the speed from 65 miles per hour to 50 miles per hour as we prepare for the next phase of work.

<u>CAI</u> – Also today, you will be asked to vote on a number of grant awards under our Compact Authorized Investments program.

The first is an entirely new grant to Lambertville for the reconstruction of Kline's Court from Bridge Street to Ferry Street. This \$70,000 grant brings the total amount of grant funding to Lambertville to \$2,280,000 for six projects, two of which are already completed.

To date, the Commission has awarded more than \$36 million in grants to 31 communities since the start of the CAI program in September 2005.

<u>T-Mobile</u> – You will see on your agenda today an agreement with T-Mobile under which the Commission will stop using its fixed point-to-point microwave radio system on affected paths so as not to interfere with T-Mobile's deployment of an advanced wireless service network. T-Mobile has agreed to compensate the Commission \$1.2 million for its agreement to stop using these microwaves.

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This is a real win for the Commission. These microwaves have generally been used to communicate by radio from district to district. With the installation of our new electronic surveillance system, which includes new radios, we will no longer need the microwaves.

STATISTICS OF TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2007 COMPARED WITH MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2006

The following provides a comparison of toll direction traffic volumes for the month and year-to-date periods ending December 31, 2007, as compared with the month and year-to-date periods ending December 31, 2006.

Traffic Volume Comparisons – 2007 Year-to-Date versus 2006 Year-to-Date

In 2007, total vehicular toll traffic for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges decreased by 212,500 vehicles or 0.6% and total revenue increased by \$5,110,900 or 6.4%, as compared to 2006. Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges increased by 350,000 vehicles or 1.1% as compared to the previous year.

In District I, toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for 2007 decreased by 471,200 vehicles as compared to 2006, resulting in a 6.4% decrease in total toll traffic. It is noted that roadway construction work for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in January 2007. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 158,800 vehicles generated an overall increase in total toll traffic of 8.5% for 2007 as compared to 2006. It is noted that the nearby Centre Bridge – Stockton Toll Supported Bridge experienced weekday closures in 2007 for the rehabilitation project (TS-429A).

In District II, a 53,800 increase in vehicles resulted in a 0.5% increase in total toll traffic at I-78 for 2007 as compared to 2006. The Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 600 vehicles, generating an overall decrease of less than 0.1% in total toll traffic for 2007 as compared to 2006.

In District III, total toll traffic at Portland-Columbia (PC) reflected an increase of 9.8% for 2007 as a result of an increase of 129,100 vehicles. It is noted that the nearby Riverton – Belvidere Toll Supported Bridge experienced closures for bridge rehabilitation project (TS-371A). At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 81,100 vehicles generated a decrease in total toll traffic for the year of approximately 0.8% as compared to 2006. Milford-Montague (MM) experienced a decrease of approximately 1,300 vehicles, resulting overall in a 0.1% decrease in toll traffic for the year.

Traffic Volume Comparisons – December 2007 versus December 2006

In the month of December, total vehicular toll traffic for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges decreased by 226,600 vehicles or 7.1%, as compared to December 2006. Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges decreased by 102,800 vehicles or 4.0% as compared to the previous year.

In District I, toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for December 2007 decreased by 65,700 cars and decreased by 1,100 trucks as compared to December 2006, resulting in a 11.0% decrease in total toll traffic. It is noted that roadway construction work for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in January 2007. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 3,900 cars combined with a decrease of 500 trucks generated an overall decrease in total toll traffic of 2.8% for December 2007 as compared to December 2006. Beginning on November 16, 2007, the outer (right) lanes in each direction of the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge were closed pending the completion of repair work.

In District II, a 41,500 decrease in cars combined with a decrease of 11,300 trucks resulted in a 6.2% decrease in total toll traffic at I-78 for the month of December 2007 as compared to December 2006. The Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge experienced a decrease in traffic volume. A decrease of 16,700 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 3,700 trucks generated an overall decrease of 3.9% in total toll traffic for December 2007.

In District III, total toll traffic at Portland-Columbia (PC) reflected a decrease of 8.2% for the month of December 2007 as a result of a decrease of 8,300 automobiles and a decrease of 600 trucks. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 60,700 passenger vehicles combined with a decrease of 2,300 trucks generated a decrease in total toll traffic for the month of approximately 7.6% as compared to December 2006. Milford-Montague (MM) experienced a decrease of approximately 10,100 passenger vehicles and a decrease of less than 100 trucks, resulting overall in a 9.5% decrease in toll traffic for the month.

E-Z Pass Penetration Rates

The following table provides a summary of E-Z Pass penetration rates experienced at the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges during December 2007, December 2006, 2007 year-to-date (YTD), and 2006 year-to-date. E-Z Pass penetration rates for all of the Commission's toll bridges was 56.5% for the month of December 2007 and is 55.9% 2007 year-to-date. Overall E-Z Pass penetration rates increased by 2.4% in December 2007 as compared to December 2006; including an increase of 2.3% in autos and an increase of 2.6% in trucks.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

There follows reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of December 2007 and the entire fiscal year 2007 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total operating expense totaled \$3,317,190 for the month of December. For the fiscal year 2007, total operating expense amounted to \$42,520,125 or 95.7% of the operating budget. This surplus between the operating budget and actual operating expenses was slightly greater than the Commission has experienced in recent years.

Most budget line items finished the year as surplus. Several line items exceeded the operating budget for 2007. They included Temporary Salaries which were \$68,000 higher than budget due to heavier use of part-time toll collectors instead of paying overtime to full-time staff, but this shortage was offset by a \$73,000 surplus in the Overtime expenses. Unemployment Compensation expense exceeded budget \$46,000 as a result of the Commission's 2006 restructuring. EZPass Operating expense exceeded budget by \$268,000 due to higher than anticipated utilization. License & Inspection expense, Uniform expense and Commission expense exceeded budget, but to a fairly insignificant amount.

There were not unusual expense items or charges for the Month of December or the entirety of 2007.

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of December 2007, showing the divisions chargeable for the expensed and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (3) By authority of the Superintendent.

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 36 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 24 price inquiries were sent out on 9 groups of inquiries during the month, or an average of 2.7 inquiries for each item or group of items.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

During the month of December, 2007 the Director of Policy and Planning participated in a number of communications and meetings that explored the following:

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's (DVRPC) Board and Executive Committee's Meetings included two presentations. The first presentation Rating the Region: The State of the Delaware Valley compared thirteen metropolitan areas in terms of their human environment; the economy; the built and natural environment; transportation; and the civic environment. The second presentation Road Safety Audit Program is a result of the DVRPC relationship with PennDOT District 6 and New Jersey, to identify roadways which demonstrate a history of, or have a potential for a high incidence of motor vehicle crashes. An audit of interest was the City of Trenton- Calhoun Street Road Safety Audit.

The Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce Government Affairs Committee had a presentation and discussion for the potential creation of a Monroe County Health Department. Pennsylvania State Representatives Mike Carroll (D-118), Mario Scavello (R-176), and John Siptroth (D-189), along with staff members from Pennsylvania State Senators Pat Brown (R-16), Lisa Boscola (D-18), Elisabeth Baker(R-20), and Robert Mellow (D-22) gave a Harrisburg report which included an I-80 Tolling update.

The Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce Economic Development / Transportation Committee was given an update by PennDOT District 5's Monroe County Maintenance Manager on the status of pending road and bridge projects, in particular, Monroe County's section of I-80 which is difficult to manage.

TRENTON-MORRISVILLE (ROUTE 1) TOLL BRIDGE REHABILITATION AND ADDITION OF ONE NB AUXILIARY LANE

DESIGN Contract No. C-380A

The Design Consultant, The Louis Berger Group, continues to provide services through the post-design/construction phase of the project.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-380B

The Construction Management/Construction Inspection Consultant, Hill International, has been coordinating field activities with the contractor, reviewing contractor schedules, conducting bi-weekly progress and scheduling meetings, preparing daily reports, tracking project submittals and developing public involvement and outreach efforts.

Hill's Public Involvement Consultant, Bergmaier Associates, continues to update the project website, answer customer generated questions via the toll free number and updating the quarterly newsletter.

As a result of the initial OSIIA Compliance Inspection that took place in July 2007 one of the recommendations moving forward was for the Commission to perform follow-up safety inspections of the Contract T-380B, Rehabilitation of the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge and One Auxiliary Lane, jobsite.

Hill has hired an experienced Safety Professional (Applegate Associates, Inc.) to perform periodic OSHA Compliance Inspections on the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation construction site. At the conclusion of each site visit, Applegate will be providing the Commission with a report of their findings. The inspections have taken place in October, November and December 2007. For the remainder of the project inspections will be scheduled bi-monthly.

Construction work is progressing on schedule. Stage 1 is underway and expected to last until the spring of 2008. Stage 1 work includes the rebuilding of the toll plaza, construction of the head house that connects the main building to the new toll tunnel, as well as demolition and rebuilding the downstream portions of the main river bridge. Deck demolition has been completed on the downriver portion of the main river bridge. Pier cap extensions have been constructed and new structural steel has been set. The contractor has placed new deck and is curing the remaining spans in all the main river spans in the widened locations. The toll plaza demolition continues with the removal of portions of the existing canopy and toll booths. New toll islands, booths and canopy sections are currently being installed. New structural steel girders have been placed on the widened portion of the PennDOT viaduct over Conrail & Delaware Canal adjacent to Pennsylvania Avenue. Sound barrier wall has been constructed along Ramp G from Pennsylvania Ave to Route I NB. Numerous Commission owned overpass structures are also being reconstructed on both sides of the river.

A progress "Partnering Meeting" was held on October 23, 2007 at the Construction Manager's field office. Representatives from the Commission, Berger, Hill and Conti were in attendance. The session was run by a facilitator, FMI Corporation. The next session is scheduled for January 28, 2008.

PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The preliminary Preferred Alternative is the inside widening of I-95 in Pennsylvania, Option 2 at Taylorsville Road and Option 1c – Modified (Roundabout) at Route 29. The Preferred Alternative also includes a total replacement of the Scudder Falls Bridge with the new bridge containing 5 northbound and 4 southbound lanes on an upstream alignment.

The Environmental Assessment (EA) document is being prepared and a preliminary draft was submitted to the Commission for review in December 2007. The EA will be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for review in February. The EA will be distributed to the public for review in April and a public hearing is scheduled for May. The final decision document is expected by August 2008.

NORTHERLY CROSSINGS CORRIDOR CONGESTION MITIGATION STUDY

STUDY Contract No. C-395A

The Commission has conducted a series of workshops with NJDOT and PennDOT intended to facilitate establishing a Task Force which will focus on building a consensus with respect to mitigating future traffic congestion along the 1-80 corridor in both the eastbound and westbound direction.

A Memorandum of Understanding is currently being developed to include a Problem Statement, Mission Statement as well as Goals and Objectives for the Task Force.

Work includes the continuation of implementation oversight generally focused on coordinating preliminary matters and providing administrative support relating to the issuance of Notice-to-Proceed and the initiation of site surveys.

Staff attended the Partnering Meeting held on December 18, 2007.

Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey continues to assist the Commission, together with Counsel, in discussions with Advanced Wireless Services (AWS) license holders who have bought rights to regional wireless frequencies through an FCC auction and determined that their proposed AWS networks will potentially interfere with the Commission's microwave communications system. Negotiations are in progress for an agreement to compensate the Commission for vacating its licenses to operate in the affected frequencies.

DESIGN-BUILD-MAINTAIN PROJECT DB-396A

A Partnering Meeting was held on December 18, 2007 for the purpose of encouraging the formation of a cohesive partnership between the Commission, its' Program Manager and the Mass. Electric Construction Company together with its principal subcontractors and suppliers.

Mass. Electric Construction Company (MECC) has been actively addressing preliminary matters associated with the start-up of work associated with the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System Design-Build-Maintain Project.

Additionally, MECC has initiated site surveys to document existing electrical infrastructure and existing utilities at each bridge as well as identify potential electrical and electronic surveillance equipment locations and proposed electrical and fiber optic conduit routing.

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was publicly advertised on July 17, 2007. Seven (7) Contractors submitted their Statement of Qualifications (SOQs) on August 08, 2007. All seven (7) of the Contractors were deemed pre-qualified to bid.

Final construction bid documents were received from VITETTA on September 10, 2007. Construction bid solicitations were issued to all seven (7) firms on September 10, 2007 as construction Contract T-397B. A mandatory Pre-Bid Meeting was held at the New Hope - Lambertville Toll Bridge Administration Building on September 18, 2007. Conformed Contract Documents were received from VITETTA. Notice to Proceed effective date was December 21, 2007; and a Pre-Construction Meeting was held on January 07, 2008.

PB Americas, Incorporated (PB) continues to provide post design support for the project. PB is continuing to respond to Contractor requests-for-information (RFIs), reviewing and responding to shop drawings and other submissions from the contractor and attending the bi-weekly Progress Meetings as needed. PB also continues to have on site representation for the 4 Drilling and Slurry Grouting Trial Areas with Trial Area # 1 completed and the remaining 3 trial areas underway.

The Commission and Commission Counsel have been working with the Borough to prepare the requested easement documentation.

The Milford Water Authority's Contractor has completed the installation of the water line.

WASHINGTON CROSSING TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE PHASE 1 REHABILITATION & CONCEPT STUDY

Contract C-442A

A Request for Letters of Interest (RFLOI) for this project was posted on the Commission's website on November 13, 2007. A pre-LOI meeting was held on November 20, 2007 with eighteen firms in attendance. LOI's are due on December 10, 2007. The TEC has reviewed the LOI's and are scheduled to meet with the SSC in mid-January to present their findings.

UPPER BLACK EDDY-MILFORD TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE REHABILITATION CONTRACT

DESIGN Contract No. C-444A

A Request for Letters of Interest was published in late December. The Pre-LOI Meeting was held on December 11, 2007 and was attended by 41 representatives from 34 different consultants and subconsultants. Letters of Interest were received from 11 different design teams on January 4, 2008. Short-listing and selection of the design team is ongoing.

This project is for the in-depth inspection, structural analysis and comprehensive concept study for the Calhoun Street Bridge. It is anticipated that the concept study will be used to develop the scope of a future design and subsequent construction contract. The Consulting Engineering Agreement was executed October 24, 2007.

Lichtenstein Consulting Engineers have reviewed the results from the load testing, coupon sampling and paint sampling of the bridge. Lichtenstein Consulting Engineers have developed a structural analysis computer model of the bridge and have preformed the preliminary load rating, fatigue analysis and seismic evaluation.

PORTLAND COLUMBIA SIGN STRUCTURE REPAIR

DESIGN Assignment #2

Under this Task Order Assignment the Commission asked The Louis Berger Group, Incorporated to develop design documents to repair a damaged cantilevered sign structure at the Portland Columbia Toll Bridge Facility. The Louis Berger Group, Incorporated submitted final design plans on August 17, 2007.

Procurement of the sign structure repair materials is underway. Shop drawings have been reviewed and approved by the Consultant and the Commission's engineering staff in early December. The Commission's District III maintenance forces are expected to perform the construction work required to repair the sign structure.

NEW HOPE LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE INTERIM INSPECTION AND REPAIR DESIGN

Assignment #4

Subsequent to the GEC inspection of the New Hope - Lambertville Toll Bridge (NHLTB) in August, a letter report was submitted to the Commission outlining the inspection findings. The report noted that ten (10) cantilever floor beam brackets exhibited small cracks in the tie-plate/top flange connections. The report recommended an interim inspection within (3) months.

The purpose of this Task Order Agreement Assignment is to implement the recommendations made by the GEC to inspect and design repairs for the superstructure. This assignment will include an In-Depth Interim Inspection focusing on the cantilever floor beam brackets recommendations for a means of arresting the existing cracks, design and post design services for the crack repairs and recommendations for all necessary floor beam bracket retrofit repairs. The assignment will also include a second Interim Inspection following the repairs.

During the week of November 5, 2007 TranSystems | Lichtenstein performed an interim inspection of the bridge. A meeting was held with the Consultant on November 15, 2007 to discuss the inspection findings. Five (5) additional small cracks were discovered in the cantilever floor beam brackets during the interim inspection. As a precautionary measure, the right lanes in each direction of the bridge, which are partially supported by the cantilever brackets, were closed to traffic on November 16, 2007. Those lanes will remain closed until repairs have been implemented. No adverse traffic impacts are expected from the lane closures due to the light traffic volumes on the bridge. The Consultant is expected to submit a final Interim Inspection report by the end of January. The Interim Inspection report will include recommendations on how the Commission should proceed with a retrofit plan and the associated construction work.

COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT

General

During the month of December the CAI department presented three CAI applications to the Commissioners for their consideration, of which, two were approved for funding of their projects. The CAI Director and the Due Diligence engineers gave a Power Point presentation of the funded CAI projects and their current status. This presentation generated various questions about the projects that appear to be having significant probability of not being completed by the due date of December 31, 2008. There were status meetings with The City of Trenton, NJ; Belvidere, NJ; Milford, NJ; Lambertville, NJ; and Milford, PA. A summary of these meetings will be provided at the individual municipalities updates below. A new application was also received from Lambertville for a street repaving and sidewalk reconstruction of Klein Court in the City.

Update of some of the most significant efforts with the grantees during this month

Pennsylvania

- 1. Milford Borough, PA = This project construction was completed in December, 2007, and just needs some minor punch-list items and a project close-out. The Borough was awarded \$453,000 grant to assist in funding a streetscape improvement along E. Harford Street (Route 209) between 2nd and 3rd Streets. The project included improvements to the storm drainage system, along with new paving, sidewalk, granite curving, street lighting, and several new benches and street trees.
- 2. Smithfield, PA In December, the CAI Director met with Brian Barrett, Township Supervisor and Jacqueline Ocker, Township Clerk to obtain necessary signatures that were due on the agreement to be fully executed. The Township also completed and sent to the CAI department the first reimbursement request for their project. This request is being processed for payment. The Township is still waiting for a resolution of any engineering comments and issues with Penn DOT and the Township. The current schedule still remains for the project to be bid in January and to start construction in April, 2008. Bimonthly meetings were set up to review the status updates of the project.
- 3. Delaware Water Gap, PA The Borough Engineer still has not finalized the project plans and specifications for project advertisement and award. The anticipated date for construction is to begin in the Spring of 2008. The CAI department has rescheduled a project progress status meeting for January 15, 2008 that was previously set for December, 2007.

- 4. Portland Borough, PA In early December, the Borough received bids for the Park and Walk project. The respective CAI due diligence is reviewing the bids and it is anticipated that the project will be awarded in January.
 - In regard to the Park and Ride project, in early December, Portland representatives met with Frank Russo, owner of the parcel where the Park and Ride project is supposed to be built. They wanted Mr. Russo to agree to subdivide a part of his site and to sell it to the Borough of Portland right now and let Phantom move along at their own pace. Due to the fact that there are interconnected drainage and access issues between the Phantom site and the proposed Borough's Park & Ride site, there was no progress gained for a proposed acquisition directly from Mr. Russo.
 - The Borough is contemplating asking the DRJTBC for an extension on the project. Frank Russo believes that by the end of January Phantom Fireworks will be in a position to decide on whether they will reactivate the Park & Ride Project. Mayor Bucci and the President of Borough Council agreed to ask the DRJTBC for an extension of time to permit the original project to be implemented with the DRJTBC granting an extension beyond the contract deadline of December, 2008. To date the CAI department has not received a formal request for a time extension for this project.
- 5. Lower Mount Bethel, PA This project continues to move forward and it is expected to have all the necessary permits ready for construction of the trail as scheduled. During the month of December this project was advertised for bids. The municipality is also expecting to open bids by end of January 2008. The property deed for the visitor center has been signed and both projects are still in motion. The Township received all its pending permits, including the DEP permit and the completion of the property transfer documents. The Township anticipates awarding the trail project for construction in February, 2008.
- 6. Williams Township, PA The Township is getting ready to award this project for construction. It received all its necessary permits and the bids came in at approximately \$55,822 under the budgeted construction phase.
- 7. Easton, PA Since the November 28th meeting with all the key stake holders of the Riverwalk project, there has been a lot of public speculation as to the future of this project. Partially due to the change in the administration of the City of Easton and the termination of Barbara Kowitz, who was the leading contact overseeing this project in the City. There was very little progress made on this project during the month of December. In January, the new administration will take over the City and the CAI department will follow up with them to determine how they want to proceed. Also, during the November 28th meeting, representatives from the Easton Parking Authority and the City alluded to a request for an extension of the DRJTBC agreement to complete the project, but up to date, the CAI department has not received such request. The CAI department will schedule a meeting with the new administration to review the project status as well as the other two pending projects.

- 8. Riegelsville Borough, PA The Borough continues to work out some details with DCNR on the bridge design. DCNR is requiring the bridge to have a specific façade and the Borough is working with the prefab bridge manufacturer to determine if the façade can be provided and what the cost will be. Once that is ironed out, the Borough will be submitting the plans and right-of way application to DCNR for their review. All of the other details have been finalized for the project. In the meantime, the Borough has submitted their Joint Permit application to PA DEP for their review. They met with Verizon and Met Ed on site to review relocating an existing utility pole and wires. The engineer has also has prepared preliminary easement drawings and have submitted them to the Borough for their review.
- 9. Solebury Township, PA The Township is still working on the project and bridge design. The project completion date is still very close to the contract agreement due date of December 31, 2008 and the CAI department continues to monitor this project. The Township is also working on a resolution for the right of way transfer/easement of the DRJTBC property where the pedestrian bridge will be placed over the canal. The CAI due diligence engineer and atty. Kim Freimuth from Fox Rothschild are assisting in the coordination of this process.
- 10. New Hope Borough, PA The Borough is requesting an additional \$176,404 from the Commission for the overage of their construction estimate. Amy Kaminski of Carroll Engineering is the Borough's for this project Ms. Kaminski has indicated that all the necessary permits are in place and that they are ready to advertise as soon as the Borough approves it. The next Council meeting is on January 9th.
- 11.. Falls Township, PA No significant changes this month. The CAI department is still waiting for reimbursement request from them to close out the project.
- 12. Upper Makefield Township, PA The phase II of the project is still in the approval process from Penn DOT, PHMC, and the Bucks County Conservation District. However, the commencement for construction is still Mach, 2008 with duration thru October, 2008.
- 13. Lower Makefield, PA –The Traffic signal project is completed and the Township is still getting all the necessary paper work together for a close out. The Township has alluded that it wants to send another project application to the CAI department. The CAI department is waiting for the last reimbursement request. No significant changes have been made since the last report.
- 14. Bristol Borough, PA The Borough awarded the construction of the project to the low bidder, Armour & Sons Electric, for \$1,446,049.77. This is over the available grant amount of \$999,500. The Borough has requested that the Commission consider adding funding to the grant amount, which has not yet been determined.
- 15. Yardley, PA The Borough provided a summary of the bids received for the project. The low bidder was Harris Blacktopping at \$504,423.76. The Commission grant will cover \$234,217 of this cost. The project is on schedule and should be completed on time. The CAI department is awaiting the correct insurance certificate from the Borough.

16. Morrisville, PA – West Bridge St. plans are fine and Penn DOT HOP was approved for West Bridge Street Curb & Sidewalk Replacement Pennsylvania Avenue to Cox St. The municipality is in process of advertising this project. The municipality continues to move ahead with this project and the other 3 projects it that was granted.

New Jersey

- Montague, NJ The CAI department sent the Contract Agreement to the municipality for signature and is awaiting its return with updated appendix B. This agreement should be fully executed in January, 2008, and the project can still be completed within the allotted time of the contract agreement.
- 2. Knowlton, NJ In December, the CAI director spoke with Lisa Patton, the Township Clerk regarding the project. The Township was advised by its legal department to hire a new company to reevaluate the property demolition project for the asbestos that was found in the property and the need to be disposed of properly. The Township is working on completing the final report and thinks that it should have the house ready for demolition by end of February or March this year.
- 3. Belvidere, NJ The CAI director and due diligence engineer meet with the Town on December 14th to discuss the submission of the revised application. The Town indicated that it was willing to assume jurisdiction over the portion of Water Street from the Commission and the there is no need to remove the concrete for the ROW transfer to the Town. A new cost estimate was presented with application. The application was presented to the Commissioners during its December meeting, but was not no action was taken at that time.
- 4. Phillipsburg, NJ All permits for this project have been obtained by Phillipsburg and the Town has awarded the project to Top Line Construction Corp. for \$2,809,665.90. However, the CAI department was not made aware that the project was going to be awarded, nor did the CAI department was given the opportunity to review the bids prior to the award as required by the contract Agreement. The CAI department is in the process of obtaining the necessary documentation and deliverables from the Town of Phillipsburg to satisfy the agreement requirements.
- 5. Pohatcong, NJ The Township is still attempting to obtain all the necessary permits for the construction of the project, including approval of the Warren County engineer as CR 627 and 627 spur are county roads. The Township is also waiting for the soil erosion permit. The Township is still planning to award the project for construction during the spring of 2008.
- 6. Milford, NJ On December 27th, the CAI director and due diligence engineer met with Milford engineer and president of City Council to review the project status. The engineering plans are 98% complete. The construction project will be advertised for bids in February and bids to be opened by mid February. The Utility relocation should start in mid February.

New Jersey Continued

- 7. Frenchtown, NJ –Bimonthly meetings will be held with the Borough to monitor the projects progress status. There were not significant changes in December. A meeting is being scheduled for January.
- 8. Lambertville, NJ The City of Lambertville is on target with all its projects. It has also submitted a new application to repave about 75 feet of Klein Court and to reconstruct a sidewalk. The Mt. Hope Project and the Ferry St. projects are completed.
- 9. Stockton, NJ The Borough received approval and re-authorization of plans from SHPO, anticipating advertisement for bids in January 2008. ROW issue has arisen regarding the ownership of the Bridge St. ROW. DRJTBC Attorney is reviewing this issue. A project status review meeting will be set up in January.
- 10. Ewing, NJ The Commission awarded Ewing Township a \$1.8 million grant for its 2008 Roadway Resurfacing project, which includes improvements to an estimated 55 roadways throughout the township. Improvements include new asphalt, surface course, traffic striping and the installation of handicap ramps. This grant replaces an earlier grant in the same amount to the township. The Commission rescinded that grant award at the request of the township.
- 11. Trenton, NJ -. An executive meeting with representatives of the City of Trenton, of NJDOT, and DRJTBC was held on December 19th at NHL. The projects status and constraints was discussed and several possible solutions were suggested by the three entities. A follow up meeting will be scheduled for January. Letters requesting an extension of the project as well as one requesting that the Commission included the project construction to the current Conti Route 1 reconstruction contract are expected from the City of Trenton.
- 12. Delaware Twp., NJ The current funded project is still pending close outs as there are still some punchlist items that need to be completed.
- 13. Hopewell, NJ Agreement has been sent to Hopewell for completion and the Township is working on having it fully executed. A meeting will be scheduled in the near future to review the project status.
- 14. West Amwell, N.J. The Commission awarded West Amwell Township a second grant for \$365,000 for the reconstruction of a section of Rocktown Lambertville Road. Storm drainage will be installed as part of the reconstruction and the storm drainage ditch will be improved. The first project is still under status review for its completion.
- 15. Holland, NJ The CAI department is still n the process of acquiring all the necessary information from the Township to have its agreement fully executed.
