### ROLL CALL

Frank G. McCartney, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting, called the Roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present- there being five members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State New Jersey.

### WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

### INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

### EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Good Morning.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman...

The Commission experienced one of the busiest construction seasons on record this past summer. Work on two projects with extensive bridge closures is now winding down. Construction is ramping up on two other projects now in the field, and a series of new projects are moving ahead in the planning pipeline.

I am happy to report that both the Calhoun Street and Washington Crossing Toll-Supported Bridges reopened to vehicular and pedestrian traffic on Friday – just like we promised. The Calhoun Street Bridge reopened at 7:15 p.m. Friday after being shutdown on May 24 for a comprehensive four-month rehabilitation. The project's results are impressive, which include a new floor deck, straightened truss members, a new walkway and improved railing, new period lighting and a thorough repainting. The rehabilitated bridge strengthens our agency's preservation, credentials exponentially. It is a magnificent transformation. We are planning to hold a rededication ceremony at the bridge on October 12. The Washington Crossing Bridge, meanwhile, reopened 6 a.m. Friday – just in time to handle the morning's commuter traffic. This bridge was shutdown on August 9 for 46 days as part of a multi-faceted project. The most important work involved extensive repairs to address bulging at the Pennsylvania abutment and wing walls. We made optimum use of the closure period by performing a series of other improvements and repairs while the bridge was shutdown. While the full closure has ended, work will continue at the bridge for another month, all project elements should be completed by November 1.

Work on the Delaware Water Gap Express E-ZPass/Open Road Tolling Project kicked into high gear after the Labor Day weekend. Two of the collection lanes at the bridge's toll plaza have been permanently taken out of service. The contractor also has closed an additional two toll plaza lanes during off-peak times, however, an around-the-clock closure of half of the toll plaza's eight lanes has been postponed indefinitely. This challenging traffic phase was planned to allow drilling of foundations for "monotubes" that will hold all of the electronic toll-collection equipment to be suspended above a single Express E-ZPass lane at the location. Engineers have postponed this work phase so they can reassess whether the subsurface rock is strong enough to support shallower monotube foundations, meanwhile, other project elements continue to move forward and we remain optimistic about achieving our goal for having the Express E-ZPass lane on line at the Delaware Water Gap by Thanksgiving.

Construction activities also are in full gear at the rehabilitation project that began during the summer at the Riegelsville Bridge. As we promised area businesses and residents, the bridge shutdowns for this project were postponed until after the end of the summer tourism season on Labor Day. Last week, in fact, was the first time that full bridge closures were utilized for the project. Under the contract, bridge shutdowns are limited strictly to weeknights and six weekends, full closures are to end by December 1. We set this deadline so the project's closure periods would not overlap with work that will begin later this fall for a rehabilitation of the Upper Black Eddy-Milford Toll-Supported Bridge. We expect all work on the Riegelsville project to be completed by Christmas Eve.

Work has begun on repairs and rehabilitations of the substructures at 12 of our 20 bridges. This project stems from the findings of underwater inspections reports and an assessment of substructure conditions following the 2006 flood. The work involves two construction contracts

- one for District 1 bridges in the south and a second for District 2 and 3 bridges in the central and northern regions of our jurisdiction. This project should be completed within a year.

In addition to the upcoming Upper Black Eddy-Milford Rehabilitation Project that I mentioned earlier, two additional projects are in the pipeline. Over the past two weeks, engineers and inspectors conducted a thorough examination of the Easton-Phillipsburg (Route 22) Toll Bridge, approach roadways, and related facilities, the work required engineers to use ropes and cables to gain access to all areas of the bridge. The inspections are a key element for a concept study that will determine the scope of repairs and improvements for an eventual rehabilitation project. Another prospective capital initiative moving forward right now is the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Project. Today, Commissioners have before them resolutions for the award of a construction contract and authorization to negotiate a CM/CI contract for this project. Major items of work for this project include: bearing and deck joint replacements, substructure repairs, bridge deck seal coating and blast cleaning and painting of the bridge superstructure. Construction work could begin this November. Traffic-related impacts in the westbound direction will be staged in a manner so as not to compound congestion arising from the current Express E-ZPass project.

I want to remind everyone that our Chief Engineer George Alexandridis will receive the Dr. John L. Buzzi Engineering Excellence Award at the New Jersey Alliance for Action's annual Eagle Awards dinner on the evening of Wednesday, October 13. If any Commissioners want to attend this event, please let us know as soon as possible. Mr. Chairman, this concludes my monthly report.

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and said:

Thank you, Frank. We have one additional item to report on. Earlier this month, Frank McCartney was elected to serve as the 2011 president of the International Bridge Tunnel and Turnpike Association – also known as the IBTTA. The IBTTA is a worldwide alliance of toll operators and associated industries that provides a means for sharing best practices and ideas about toll-financed transportation systems and services. This is a prestigious honor for Frank personally and for our agency in general. This is a testament to Frank's lifetime of work in the transportation agency. It further underscores how fortunate we are to have Frank working for us at the Bridge Commission.

Vice Chairman Alfano also addressed the meeting and said:

I would like to associate myself with everything that Chairman DeGerolamo just said. I would also like to point out that the Commission was among the first agencies to be a member of the IBTTA. The organization now has roughly 250 members spread among 23 countries on six continents. I believe this is the first time that an officer of the Bridge Commission has had the honor to serve as president of this international agency. This election clearly shows the high regard that Frank – and by extension, our agency – is held among our peers in the tolling/transportation industry. Clearly, this gives our agency an added edge in terms of prestige and functionality.

### DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of September 27, 2010 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (JULY, 2010)

Summary: The Commission experienced a decrease in total toll revenue for July 2010 in comparison to the July 2009 traffic and revenue statistics. This is only the second month since May 2009 that toll revenue has not exceeded the revenue generated in the corresponding month of the previous year. February 2010 was the only other month since May 2009 that reflected a decrease in total toll revenue compared to the corresponding month of the previous year.

### Analysis of July 2010/July 2009 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 0.39 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 2.72 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 5.25 percent increase.

### Analysis of July 2010/July 2009 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 177,532 vehicles, or 5.03 percent.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 8,820 vehicles, or 2.14 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 186,352 vehicles, or 5.98 percent
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for July 2010 decreased by 50,554 vehicles, or 1.88 percent as compared to July 2009.

### Traffic analysis for 2010 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for the first seven months of 2010 was 103,696 total vehicles as compared to 99,974 total vehicles for January through July 2009, an increase of 3.72 percent.
- Recorded westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for YTD 2010 is reflecting a 0.88 percent decrease as compared to the same 6-month period in 2009.

### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for July 2010 reflected a 24.14 percent increase as a result of an increase of 142,185 cars and an increase of 4,977 trucks when compared to July 2009. It should be noted that roadway construction work preparation for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in July 2006, with full lane closures commencing in July 2007. This project was substantially completed in September 2009. Closure of the Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge for rehabilitation, has resulted in diversion of normally non-toll bridge traffic onto the Trenton Morrisville Toll Bridge during the period of May 24, 2010 through the current date. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 1,367 cars combined with a decrease of 829 trucks to generate an overall decrease in total toll traffic of 1.28 percent for July 2010 as compared to July 2009.

### District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an overall increase of 6.49 percent in total toll traffic for the month of July 2010 compared to July 2009 as the result of an increase of 68,550 cars and a decrease of 5,134 in trucks. It should be noted that the two new ORT lanes at I78 opened on May 13, 2010. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 36,678 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 7,475 trucks combined to generate a 7.93 percent decrease in total toll traffic for July 2010.

### District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 1.08 percent increase in total toll traffic during July 2010 as a result of an increase of 1,652 automobiles and a decrease of 248 trucks compared to July 2009. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, increases of 10,040 passenger vehicles and 37 trucks combined to generate a 1.06 percent increase in total toll traffic for July 2010 as compared to July 2009. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 1,970 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 148 trucks produced an overall 1.34 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of July 2010.

### E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of July, 2010 and July, 2009, and the year-to-date periods ending July 31, 2010 and July 31, 2009.

### Meeting of September 27, 2010

### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of July 2010 and the seven month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2010 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,292,886 for the month of July. For the 2010 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$25,230,157 or 92.67% of the year-to-date operating budget. Most of the expense line items are well within their year-to-date operating budget.

There are several line items that are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Salary expense is currently running about .75% or \$77,000 over budget. The current operating budget anticipates a 3.5% vacancy rate for all salary classes but currently less than 2% of budgeted positions are vacant. Overtime is 10.7% or \$17,000 over budget due to the significant snow events in early 2010. All other expense line items are within their budgets. All of these over budget line items improved from the previous month.

The month of July was a three payroll month, and as a result, salary expense for July was higher than previous months. The Commission has 2 three payroll months per year and budgets accordingly.

### DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of September 27, 2010 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (AUGUST, 2010)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for August 2010 in comparison to the August 2009 traffic and revenue statistics. This increase in total toll revenue continues a fifteen-month trend wherein total toll revenue has exceeded the revenue generated in the corresponding month of the previous year. As the result of three major snow events, February 2010 was the only month since June 2009 that reflected a decrease in total toll revenue compared to the corresponding month of the previous year.

### Analysis of August 2010/August 2009 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 3.64 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 2.68 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 5.88 percent increase.

### Analysis of August 2010/August 2009 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 202,259 vehicles, or 5.71 percent.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 13,130 vehicles, or 3.27 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 189,129 vehicles, or 6.02 percent
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for August 2010 decreased by 142,726 vehicles, or 5.22 percent as compared to August 2009.

### Traffic analysis for 2010 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for the first eight months of 2010 was 105,884 total vehicles as compared to 101,805 total vehicles for January through August 2009, an increase of 4.01 percent.
- Recorded westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for YTD 2010 is reflecting a 1.45 percent decrease as compared to the same 8-month period in 2009.

### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for August 2010 reflected a 23.86 percent increase as a result of an increase of 142,052 cars and an increase of 6,034 trucks when compared to August 2009. It should be noted that roadway construction work preparation for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in August 2006, with full lane closures commencing in August 2007. This project was substantially completed in September 2009. Closure of the Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge for rehabilitation, has resulted in diversion of normally non-toll bridge traffic onto the Trenton Morrisville Toll Bridge during the period of May 24, 2010 through the current date. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 5,349 cars combined with a decrease of 159 trucks to generate an overall increase in total toll traffic of 3.03 percent for August 2010 as compared to August 2009.

### District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an overall increase of 5.74 percent in total toll traffic for the month of August 2010 compared to August 2009 as the result of an increase of 54,847 cars and an increase of 2,945 in trucks. It should be noted that the two new ORT lanes at I78 opened on May 13, 2010. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 9,567 passenger vehicles and 1,565 trucks combined to generate a 2.11 percent decrease in total toll traffic for August 2010.

### District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 1.35 percent decrease in total toll traffic during August 2010 as a result of a decrease of 2,121 automobiles and an increase of 415 trucks compared to August 2009. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, combined increases of 3,466 passenger vehicles and 5,469 trucks generated a 0.93 percent increase in total toll traffic for August 2010 as compared to August 2009. At Milford-Montague (MM), a decrease of 4,897 passenger vehicles combined with a decrease of 9 trucks to produce an overall 3.74 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of August 2010.

### **E-ZPass** Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of August, 2010 and August, 2009, and the year-to-date periods ending August 31, 2010 and August 31, 2009.

### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of August 2010 and the eight month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2010 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,032,154 for the month of August. For the 2010 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$29,262,311 or 94.7% of the year-to-date operating budget. Most of the expense line items are well within their year-to-date operating budget.

There are several line items that are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Salary expense is currently running about .73% or \$85,000 over budget. The current operating budget anticipates a 3.5% vacancy rate for all salary classes but currently less than 2% of budgeted positions are vacant. Overtime is 6.5% or \$13,000 over budget due to the significant snow events in early 2010. Health Care Benefit cost is 1.68% or \$67,000 due to higher than budgeted rates for the premium based healthcare plan. All other expense line items are within their budgets

There were no unusual expenditures during the month of August.

### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

### July 2010

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of July 2010, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 58 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 36 price inquiries were sent out for 18 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.0 per order (36+18=2). Significant procurements for the period are highlighted below:

- Five Purchase Orders, totaling \$186,611.85, were issued for 2010 Capital vehicles and equipment.
- Four Purchase Orders, totaling \$17,985.58, were issued at the request of the IT Department for hardware and software needs.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

### August 2010

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of August 2010, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 55 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 62 price inquiries were sent out for 30 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.07 per order (62÷30). Significant procurements for the period are highlighted below:

- Four Purchase Orders, totaling \$31,742.82, were issued at the request of the IT Department for equipment and software needs.
- Three Purchase Orders, totaling \$25,436.50, were issued for the procurement of 2010 Capital vehicles and equipment.
- A Purchase Order in the amount of \$5,000.00 was issued for the repair of a Commission vehicle for which third-party insurance reimbursement is being pursued.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

Event generated Sunday feature article in Easton Express-Times.

Washington Crossing Near-Term Improvements Project: Draft and issued press release, updated project webpage and posted NJ511 travel alert to raise public awareness of the approaching 46-day shutdown of the Washington Crossing Toll-Supported Bridge, effective Aug. 9. Public awareness campaign generated articles in Trenton Times, Courier-Times, Hopewell Valley News, Bucks County Herald, Pennington Post and other weekly publications. Also prompted coverage by KYW radio, WZBN TV, and NJ 101.5 FM.



The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving Electronic Security and Surveillance:

## Radio System

- On July 5, 2010, (Holiday), ESS personnel worked on restoring a radio outage at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facility that resulted from storms and power failures.
- ESS personnel continued to work with the New Jersey State Police (NJSP) to program radio consoles for the ESS Primary Control Center (PCC).
- On July 30, 2010, the DRJTBC/NJSP State Police Dispatch Center was scheduled
  to move from Troop "C" Hamilton Headquarters, to the Regional Operations
  Intelligence Center (ROIC), located at Division Headquarters, West Trenton, N.J.
  To prepare for the move, ESS and NJSP personnel conducted a trial test for the
  cut over of the Dispatch Center's "800" telephone line. The telephone line is used
  by each bridge facility to contact dispatch. During the trial test, the telephone line
  was successfully re-directed from Hamilton Dispatch to the Regional Operations
  Intelligence Center (ROIC).

Subsequently, on July 30, 2010, the "800" telephone line and the DRJTBC/State Police Dispatch Center was permanently transferred from Hamilton to the ROIC. The "800" telephone line now rings directly in the ESS Primary Control Center which is occupied by the ESS Monitors and NJSP Dispatchers.

• During the month of July, the Commission was contacted by the Pennsylvania Office of Public Safety Radio (POPSR). The agency expressed interest in utilizing property at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facility to erect a repeater site to enhance the coverage of Pennsylvania's 800 MHz radio system. Subsequently, on July 28, 2010, ESS personnel met with Dave Forster, POPSR, and surveyed the Commission's property for a plot of land to erect the repeater. Mr. Forster discussed the possibility of installing a 140' pole in the northwest section of the property. Further discussion and correspondence is expected from the agency.

- On July 29, 2010, ESS personnel attended a planning session at NJDOT with NJSP, PSP, and NJDOT personnel to facilitate radio interoperability between the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania. The meeting was productive and as a result, another meeting was scheduled for August 26, 2010, at the ROIC to further develop the concept.
- ESS personnel investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during, and after normal working hours.

## Access Control System

- On July 20, 2010, ESS personnel facilitated the repair of various exterior doors at the New Hope-Lambertville and Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facilities.
- During the month, ESS personnel continued to create and update the floor maps contained in the ESS computers that identify new door numbers and locks.
- ESS personnel created ID badges for new employees, summer employees, and consultants. The ACS database was audited to purge the system of invalid employee and contractor cards. Additionally, various employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors and upon the approval of the Deputy Executive Director of Operations.
- During the month, the new ESS Monitors hired on July 6, 2010, were trained by ESS personnel on the Access Control System.
- Additionally, various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during, and after normal working hours.

#### ESS

- On July 1, 2010, the ESS Primary Control Center was activated at the NJSP ROIC, NJSP Headquarters, West Trenton, N.J. ESS Personnel also met with Mr. Tolotta to discuss the training program for the new ESS Monitors.
- On July 6, 2010, the new ESS Monitors reported for their first day of training, which lasted through July 17, 2010. The Monitors were fingerprinted, investigated, and given a tour of the twenty DRJTBC bridges. Thereafter, they

received training on the ESS System, Access Control System, DRJTBC radio system, NJSP radio system and telephone network, Toll Officer's and Bridge Officer's responsibilities, NJSP Dispatcher responsibilities, after hour notifications and property checks, major incidents that occur on DRJTBC property, daily Primary Control Center operations, and various other Commission policies and procedures. ESS personnel conducted all the training and/or facilitated all background investigations and training with the NJSP. On July 18, 2010, the Primary Control Center began operating twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. The Director and Coordinator of ESS worked various hours from July 6 through July 24<sup>th</sup> to ensure the operation of the Primary Control Center by training and supervising the ESS Monitors. During this period, ESS personnel were also tasked with performing their normal duties, and serviced requests from both the Commission, and allied agencies.

- ESS personnel worked with IT to create e-mail and computer access to the Commission's IT network from the ESS Primary Control Center. Access has been temporarily facilitated via the NJSP IT network. Efforts continue to create and install the DRJTBC IT network at the ROIC/PCC.
- On July 19, 2010, ESS personnel prepared a status report for Engineering detailing the outstanding performance issues involving the ESS System.
- On July 22, 2010, ESS personnel and Engineering participated in a conference call with JEK regarding the project management of the ESS System. Thereafter, ESS personnel and Engineering met with MEC to discuss ESS maintenance issues.
- On July 27, 2010, the Commission received the fully executed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) from the NJSP and New Jersey Attorney General. The MOU finalized the agreement to house the ESS Primary Control Center at the ROIC.
- On July 28, 2010, ESS personnel processed ESS maintenance invoices for MEC and overtime invoices for the Pennsylvania State Police for traffic control during ESS maintenance activity.

#### Radio System

- On August 19, 2010, ESS personnel updated the Commission's spare parts and radio inventory. A storage area for spare parts and radio was created at the New-Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility.
- On August 26, 2010, ESS personnel attended a follow up meeting to the July 29, 2010 radio interoperability planning session at NJDOT. The meeting was held at the New Jersey State Police (NJSP) Regional Operations Intelligence Center (ROIC) and personnel from the NJSP, PA State Police (PSP), and NJDOT attended.

During the meeting the established goad was to create two avenues of radio interoperability between the states of PA and NJ. One would facilitate secure police communications and the other would enable radio communications with police agencies and various other allied agencies such as the Commission, NJDOT, PennDot, ect. Subsequently, it was decided that the state of New Jersey's "StateCOM" channels will be patched with Pennsylvania's "Global" channels to create interoperability between the police and non police agencies such as NJDOT, PennDot, DRJTBC, ect. Currently, it appears as though the channels created to enable the Commission to communicate directly with responding state police patrols will be designed as the interoperability channels for police agencies. The Commission will have access to both avenues.

NJDOT has requested radio training material from the Commission to assist with introducing and training their personnel on New Jersey's 800 MHz radio system

 During the month of August 2010, ESS personnel worked with the New Jersey State Police (NJSP) Radio Technicians to determine what was causing poor radio reception in the area of the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility. After researching and troubleshooting the issue, it was determined that an antenna on the Stockton IR site was inoperable. The antenna was subsequently replaced and radio communications have been restored to normal.

This meeting was followed by a conference call on August 30, 2010, to discuss and schedule Cartegraph travelling to New Hope to commence development of the inventory control.

# PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

## STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The Environmental Assessment (EA)/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation for the project was circulated for public comment on 12/9/09 and was made available for public review on the Commission's project website and at a number of publicized locations. Public comments were accepted until 2/4/2010, the end of the requisite public comment period.

In conjunction with the EA review process, a Public Hearing was conducted in compliance with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Act of 1970, and Section 128 Title 23 of the United States Code, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as well as New Jersey Department of Transportation policies and procedures. The design consultant AECOM, with HNTB as their Environmental Team Sub-consultant, have prepared responses to the comments received during the public comment period, which have been reviewed by the Commission. To initiate the process of requesting a FONSI from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), these responses have been submitted to PennDOT, PennDOT HDAQ (Legal), NJDOT, and FHWA Metro Philadelphia and PA Division offices for review.

At a meeting held with FHWA and PennDOT representatives on June 11, 2010 the Commission was informed that tolling will have to be made part of the proposed action for the project and the impacts from tolling the bridge will have to be addressed as part of the current EA process. The FHWA will not issue a FONSI for the project until the impacts from tolling have been assessed. A subsequent meeting/conference call on August 25, 2010 with FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT representatives confirmed that an addendum to the current EA document will have to be prepared to address the tolling impacts to the project, and make tolling of the SFB part of the proposed action for the project.

The EA/Draft 4(f) Document was also distributed to each of the involved transportation agencies and the Cooperating Agencies (US Army Corps of Engineers, ES EPA, PA DEP and the National Marine Fisheries Service) for their review. The Section 4(f) Evaluation, which is part of the EA, was forwarded by FHWA to their Washington D.C. Office for the Conditional Legal Sufficiency Review. This review has been completed by FHWA, and the request for the final executed Programmatic Agreement has been made by FHWA to issue Legal Sufficiency. , The EA/Draft 4(f) Document will now need to address all comments received from the review agencies and to reflect tolling of the SFB as part of the proposed action. The final EA/4(f) Document will then be submitted to the FHWA's Washington D.C. Office along with a fully executed copy of the Programmatic Agreement for a final Legal Sufficiency review.

#### Meeting of September 27, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Both NJ and PA State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) have issued determinations of effects for project effects on historic and archaeological resources. A Draft **Programmatic Agreement** to stipulate future actions required under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, was reviewed by FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT. This document identifies the mitigation measures to be taken as a result of the finding of Adverse Effect to the Delaware & Raritan Canal cultural resource and potential for adverse effect to archaeological resources in PA and NJ.

The Commissioners, at the February 22, 2010 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the Programmatic Agreement on behalf of the Commission. Subsequent to this authorization the Programmatic Agreement was distributed to all signatory agencies on February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

Signatures have been received from one (1) of the three executing signatories – Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Officer (PHMC); and all (three in total) of the concurring signatories – Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), and Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT). It is noted that all the executing and concurring signatories executed the Programmatic Agreement within two weeks after its distribution on February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

The final executing signatory, the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office (NJSHPO) has indicated that they have an issue with certain language within the Programmatic Agreement and therefore cannot sign the agreement as written. Commission staff have been actively engaged with NJSHPO and NJDEP to resolve this latest issue. A meeting was held on August 4, 2010 with representatives from the New Jersey Governors Office, NJDEP and NJSHPO to resolve the issue with the language in the Programmatic Agreement. It was agreed that NJSHPO would draft revised language to the one paragraph in the agreement that was in question and forward the revisions to the Commission for review. Commission Staff and Legal Counsel have reviewed the proposed revisions and have forwarded their comments to NJSHPO. NJSHPO has indicated their concurrence with the Commission's comments and will sign the document. The Commission is coordinating with the PHMC to notify them of the revised language. Upon completion of this coordination, the revised Programmatic Agreement will be distributed to all signatory parties for new signatures.

The FHWA recommended additional consultation with the NMFS on the EA. Accordingly, a Biological Assessment Report (BA) was prepared for threatened and endangered (T&E) species impacts and was submitted to the NMFS in September 2008. A major concern to the Cooperating Agencies was the causeway construction method and the associated impacts to the T & E species habitat in the vicinity of the Scudder Falls Bridge. At a meeting held on July 17, 2009 all of the agencies agreed that the trestle causeway is the preferred method of construction in the river. As a result of this meeting, a letter was prepared and submitted to NMFS (dated 9/10/09) that revised the causeway recommendation made in the BA document. On June 11, 2010 the Commission received the final Biological Opinion from NMFS, which includes a determination of 'No Jeopardy' from NMFS. This completes Section 7 consultation.

## STUDY Contract No. C-393G-1

At the Commission's special meeting on August 17, 2010 the Commission announced the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Financial/Legal Advisory Services for a P3 for Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge project. This RFP was posted on the Commissions web site on August 20, 2010.

On August 27, 2010 a Non-mandatory Pre-proposal conference call with interested financial/legal firms was held at the Commission's New Hope Facility. Twenty-two (22) firms participated in the conference call. An additional 38 firms listened to a digital replay of the conference call which was available through September 3, 2010.

#### ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

## PROGRAM MANAGER Contract No. C-396A

The Program Manager, Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey, continues to support the Acquisition and Installation phase of the project involving the completion of "punch-list" items as well as the preparation and submission of project close-out documentation.

## DESIGN-BUILD-MAINTAIN PROJECT Contract No. DB-396A

System Acceptance work continues on the Acquisition and Installation phase of the project including addressing "punch-list" items together with the preparation and submission of all remaining documentation.

Installation of the Primary Control Center at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, NJ was completed in early July. A DS3 line is currently being installed and tested. The DS3 line will replace eight T1 lines that are currently serving the PCC. The DS3 will provide additional WAN capacity equivalent to 27 T-1 lines.

The DBM Team is currently supporting the Maintenance phase of the project under the direction of the Commission's Electronic Security and Surveillance Department which operates the system from the Primary Control Center.

The contract with Tilcon New York, Incorporated remains open with \$300,000 remaining in retainage until resolution of the westbound roadway depression is obtained. ### COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT DEPARTMENT Months of July and August 2010

### General

In July 26<sup>th</sup> meeting the Commissioners approved four new grant applications in New Jersey. The projects approved were the follows: 1). Improvements to Federal Twist Road project for \$246,191 in Delaware Township, NJ; 2). Honeysuckle Lane Road Reconstruction project for \$195,000 in Milford, NJ; 3). Resurfacing of Mt. Joy Road project for \$232,990 in Holland Township, NJ; 4). Wilburtha Road Improvements project for \$240,682 in Ewing, NJ.

There still are a number of grant applications unfunded in both states that will stay in the CAI department files as there were a lot more grants requests than CAI grant funding available. The Department will continue to concentrate on reimbursing the existing funded projects reimbursement requests and gathering information to execute the grant agreements of the recently funded grants projects as well as managing the coordination of the ongoing approved projects.

During the month of August, there were several projects that started construction and others that continued their existing construction work.

### Update of some of the most significant activities with the grantees during the month of June

### Pennsylvania

- Milford Borough, PA I July the CAI director met with two Milford's council representatives
  and visited the project sites to discuss the recently awarded grant process and the gather
  information on the completion of the Grant Agreement. The grant is for a Storm Water Drain
  System and Street Restoration project approved in the amount of \$163,475.00.
- Smithfield, PA The Township is working on the plans for its newly granted pedestrian/bicycle
  trails system in both the Township of Smithfield and the Borough of Delaware Water Gap. At
  the April 2010 Commissioners meeting, this application was approved. The Township has been
  notified of their grant award and the CAI department has executed the grant agreement with the
  Township.

The construction of the original Pedestrian Improvement project is substantially complete and is waiting for a Penn DOT final inspection. The contractor, Grace Industries, has installed the ADA improvements as part of the grant approved by the Commission for the project. As previously discussed, the ADA features that were installed include detectable warning surfaces at various locations, along with a colored surface overlay for the sidewalk underneath the River Road underpass. Only a few minor punch list items remain to be completed for the project, including a potential alternate material for the ADA sidewalk treatment near the overpass.

 Delaware Water Gap, PA – The Borough's Mayor has requested to change the scope of work from the previously awarded project of a Route 611 Traffic Signalization Project approved by the Commissioners at their meeting on January 25, 2010 to three other projects. 1) Replacement of Well House #4 at an estimated cost of \$90,000.00.

### Pennsylvania (continued)

Well house #4 which shelters the well and operational equipment for one of the public water supply wells depended upon heavily by the Borough is in very poor condition. 2) Traffic Calming along Broad Street and Main Street in the Borough of Delaware Water Gap at an estimated cost of \$10,000.00. 3) Continuation of sidewalk and streetscape improvements along the frontage of the Castle Inn on Waring Avenue at an estimated cost of \$30,000.00.

The Route 611 Traffic Signalization project includes the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of Foxtown Hill Road (SR 0611) & the Martz Trailways Terminal. The CAI department has executed the grant agreement and financial documents with the Borough. To date, the traffic study component of the project has been completed.

The construction of the *Broad Street Sidewalk Project* is substantially complete, with several punch list items remaining to be addressed. In addition, a final inspection must be completed by Penn DOT. In December 2009, several of the project items were inspected, including the signage that was to be installed. Currently, the work to complete the remaining concrete repairs are scheduled for Summer 2010, at which time a final inspection will be held with the Borough Engineer and Penn DOT.

- 4. Portland Borough, PA The Borough resubmitted a new application for streetscape improvements on State Street with some modifications in the hope to get it reconsidered by the Commissioners for funding. The application was discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date. The three other CAI funded projects have been completed. Only the crosswalk section of the Park and Walk project is waiting for final Penn Dot inspections.
- Lower Mount Bethel, PA The Township has worked on the DRJTBC/ Lower Mount Bethel
  Twp Agreement execution of the Park and Ride and Transportation Center Trail project that was
  approved on June 28th for \$80,191.
- Easton, PA On their April 26, 2010 meeting the Commissioners awarded a grant request to the City of Easton for its *Pedestrian and Traffic Improvements in the North 3<sup>rd</sup> St. Corridor project*. The Designs for this project have been completed.

The construction for Phases 1 and 2 of the Waterfront Improvements project were awarded during the month of September 2009. The construction of phase 1 of the project, which included a "road diet" for Larry Holmes Drive, high visibility pedestrian crosswalks, intersection improvements at Northampton Street and Larry Holmes Drive to improve pedestrian accommodation, along with a sewer line connection from the Commission's guard house to existing lines at the intersection of Northampton Street and Larry Holmes Drive was substantially completed in August. The construction for Phase 2, which is to include improvements to the pedestrian pathways along Larry Holmes Drive and in Scott Park and Pennsylvania (continued)

Riverside Park, along with decorative lighting, landscaping and a visitor and pedestrian plaza at Scott Park, has been under construction since July. This construction is to be completed by October 2010.

### Pennsylvania (continued)

 Williams Township, PA – The I-78 & Morgan Hill Road Interchange Traffic Signalization project was completed in 01/2010.

The Township recently submitted six grant requests that applications that were discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but have not been awarded to date. I must be noted that the CAI department determined that two of these applications do not satisfy the required characteristics of the CAI program for this grant round as they cannot be completed by the December 31, 2010 deadline.

- Riegelsville Borough, PA During their June 2010 meeting, the Commissioners approved the Borough's application to complete the safety lighting portion of the Pedestrian Bridge project in the amount of \$45,000.00. The CAI department has worked on completing the full execution of the Contract Agreement with municipality.
- 9. Solebury Township, PA The Commissioners approved the Walton Drive Bridge Replacement Project for \$660,000 at their January 2010 meeting. This project is to replace a deteriorated, undersized bridge located in a residential neighborhood in Solebury Township. During the month of June, the Township received bids for the project and the construction contract was awarded to the low bidder, Hale Built Construction. It is anticipated that project will be completed in the fall 2010. This project has come in under budget and the Township has requested that the excess fund be utilized for additional road improvements on Walton Drive.

The funded project for the construction of the Route 202 Trail and Park project was completed in September 2009; however, the municipality is still sorting out some of its invoices for reimbursement.

The municipality also requested additional grants for a roundabout project at the intersection of Route 202/179 and Kitchens Lane in the amount of \$800,000.00 and two new grant applications for the Gateway Trail Phase 2 and Phase 3. These applications were reviewed by the due diligence engineer and determined that they satisfy a majority of the required characteristics of the CAI grant program. The applications were discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but have not been awarded to date.

10. New Hope Borough, PA – In the June meeting the Commissioners a grant application for the Main St. Bridge Lighting project in the amount of \$84,815.00. The Borough also presented one application was submitted in conjunction with the Landmark Towns organization, to install Wayfinding Signage to/from and through New Hope Borough, Bristol Borough, Morrisville Pennsylvania (continued)

Borough and Yardley Borough, in the amount of \$872,969.00, another for a *Main Street Pedestrian Crosswalks project*, amount of \$101,400 to improve ADA compliant accessibility, including modified curb ramps and the installation of pavement markings at a mid-block crossing. These applications satisfy a majority of the required characteristics of the CAI grant program, but they have not been awarded to date.

### Meeting of September 27, 2010

### Pennsylvania (continued)

The Bridge St. Traffic Signals project is anticipated to be completed in the summer of 2010.

 Falls Township, PA – The original Traffic Signal Installation and Modernization project was completed in December 2008.

The Township submitted a new grant application for the modernization and upgrade of the traffic signal at New Falls Road and Tyburn Road, in the amount of \$108,140.00. This application was discussed at the June 2010 Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date.

 Upper Makefield Township, PA – The Township recently submitted a new grant application for the completion of the Gateway Park-Village Streetscape Phase 2 project, in the amount of \$54,000.00. The application was discussed at the June 2010 Commissioners meeting and was awarded.

Phase 1 of the Washington Crossing Gateway project was completed in the spring 2010.

 Lower Makefield, PA – The Township has recently submitted a new grant application for the completion of the Black Rock Pedestrian Trail project, in the amount of \$170,877.00. The application was discussed at the June 2010 Commissioners meeting and was awarded.

The Traffic Signal project at the intersection of Yardley-Newtown Rd & Creamery Rd is complete and the original grant is closed out.

14. Bristol Borough, PA – Recently, the Borough submitted three new requests for CAI funding. One was to install decorative crosswalks (initially part of the original grant project to upgrade the traffic signals in the Borough) at each signalized intersection, at an estimated cost of \$423,126.12. This application was not awarded. The other two requests were for a new Public Works Garage, at an estimated cost of \$750,000, and a grant application for a Regional Police Station and Training Center project. These applications did not meet the primary characteristics of the CAI program.

The construction of the *Traffic Signals Revitalization* project was completed by Armour & Sons Electric in July 2009.

- 15. Yardley, PA Construction of the Yardley Borough Roads Improvements project was completed in August 2008 and closed out. The Borough of Yardley in conjunction with the Landmark Towns organization submitted an application to install Way finding Signage to/from and through New Hope Borough, Bristol Borough, and Morrisville Borough in the amount of \$872,969.00. This application was discussed at the commissioners June 2010 meeting, but was not awarded.
- 16. Morrisville, PA The Borough recently submitted eight new roads, lighting, and traffic signal improvements applications. The Borough also agreed to submit an additional application grant application for the Moreau Street Rehabilitation project, in the amount of \$360,000 and was approved at the June 2010Commission meeting.

### Pennsylvania (continued)

The Commission also approved *Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk Replacement project* in the amount of \$56,300. Contract Agreements are being fully executed.

In January the Borough submitted a grant surplus reallocation request in the amount of \$31,896.02 to replace as many light heads as possible on East Bridge Street to enhance the downtown area. This request was approved in the January Commissioners Committee meeting.

All four other granted projects in Morrisville are completed.

### New Jersey

- 1. Montague, NJ -The Municipal Park and Ride project in Montague started this past May. A storm water drainage basin had been excavated and the helipad was under construction; however, Montague has submitted 10 change orders requests for approval for a total of \$101,000. The CAI department has requested additional backup information to justify those requests and has expressed concerns that they would increase the construction cost by 43%. CAI has been in discussions with Montague's new municipal engineer regarding the cost extras and the additional information needed. The municipality is moving forward with the project.
- 2. Knowlton, NJ The Paulinskill Trail project as divided into two phases, the first was clearing brush and installing the trails. The second phase is the concrete underpass which was dependent on DEP approvals. Finelli Consulting Engineers submitted a flood hazard area permit and a freshwater wetlands general permit to the NJ DEP and were both approved in August to continue the work of the trail extension to construct a second section of the Paulinskill Trail, in order to connect with Pennsylvania via the Portland/Columbia pedestrian bridge. The final plans have been completed and forwarded to the CAI department.

The other four CAI funded projects for the municipality have been completed.

- Belvidere, NJ In May, 2010 the final reimbursement request has been processed and the Water Street Improvements project was closed out.
- 4. Phillipsburg, NJ The Second Phase of the South Main Street Union Square Improvements project started construction in May. The sidewalks reconstruction, wiring and lighting on South Main Street were completed in August. The municipal parking lot wiring and lighting are being installed in August and should be completed by the second week of September. This project is expected to be completed by October, 2010.

In January a new grant application request to extend the South Main Street Improvements—Phase 3 project from Shappell Park to Stockton Street was received by the Town of Phillipsburg in the amount of \$997,962 and it was approved by the Commissioners at their February, 2010 meeting.

The original South Main Street Improvements – Phase 1 project was completed and a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on December 3, 2008. The Engineering Department and the Town of Phillipsburg reached an agreement regarding the reconstruction of Union Square.

### New Jersey (continued)

This section of the project was completed by Top Line Construction and coincided with the rest of the CAI project on Main St. and Broad and 3<sup>rd</sup> Streets.

 Pohatcong, NJ – A new application was received by the CAI Department for Resurfacing of River Road. This application was presented to the Commissioners at their February 2010 meeting. This request was not awarded.

Pohatcong also submitted a joint application with the Borough of Alpha for *Improvements to Edge Road project*. This application was approved by the Commissioners March 2009. The Borough of Alpha served as the lead municipality in the project and it was competed in June 2010.

The two previously CAI funded projects for Pohatcog have been completed and closed.

 Holland, NJ – Holland Township submitted an application for the Resurfacing of Mt. Joy Road Project that approved for \$232,990 at the Commissioners June, 2010 meeting. The Contract Agreement for this grant is being fully executed.

The previous CAI funded project in Holland, Resurfacing of Four Roads, was completed and it's in the process of being closed out.

 Milford, NJ – The Borough submitted an application for the Repair and Resurfacing of Honeysuckle Lane project that was approved at the July Commissioners meeting.

The Bridge Street Improvements project was completed, but has not been closed due to pending invoices from the Borough.

- 8. Frenchtown, NJ The Park and Ride project is complete. The Reimbursement requests are being paid by the CAI department. However, no major development has been noted during this period regarding the acquisition of the property for the Village Green Park. The Mayor has requested an extension until 2010 for the latter project.
- Lambertville, NJ During the June Commission meeting the Commissioner's approved a grant for the Perry Street Road Reconstruction Project for \$349,200. The Agreement for this project is being fully executed.

The CAI department is assisting the City to compile its pending invoices for completed work up to date.

The design for the South Franklin Street traffic calming project has been completed and the project has been bid. The plans for Delevan Court and McCready's alley were combined into one bid and should be bid shortly. The City has completed a total of eight CAI funded projects.

New Jersey (continued)

 Stockton, NJ – The CAI department continues to assist the Borough with compiling its final invoices for reimbursement.

The Bridge Street Improvements project is completed. The CAI department and the municipality are in the process of closing out this project. The municipality was nominated for a transportation construction project award for its CAI project.

 West Amwell, NJ –The Township is completing the designs for the Rocktown Hill Road Improvement Project to the approach to the intersection of Route 31.

Sections11, 12 and 13 of Rocktown-Lambertville Road Reconstruction project are now completed. Reimbursement requests continue to be processed for section 13.

**Delaware Twp, NJ** – The Township application for the *Improvements and Resurfacing of Federal Twist Rd.* was approved by the Commissioners at their July meeting. The Agreement for this granted project is being executed.

The Previous CAI projects were completed and are in the process of being closed out the projects.

- 12. Hopewell, NJ The grant application for the Design and Construction of Sidewalk Replacement in the Village of Titusville. This application was awarded a grant by the Commissioners at their April 2010 meeting. The ADA Ramps and Walkway project was completed and it is in the process of being closed out.
- Ewing, NJ The application requesting funding for the Wilburtha Rd. Improvement project in the amount of \$240,682 at the Commissioners meeting in July, 200.

The Ewing Township 2008 Roadway Resurfacing Project was completed. The final payment has been processed.

14. Trenton, NJ –Revised the project design, schedule and its overall progress for the Market and South warren Streets Boulevard Project have been submitted to the Commission. The reduction in traffic in Trenton has allowed the project to be downscaled in terms of number of lanes. There will be minor adjustments to traffic lights and intersections under Commission control. Trenton will provide a traffic report to the Commission for review.

In their application, Trenton indicated that the project would be ready to be bid in June 2009, with construction to begin in the summer and completion in the fall of 2010 or spring of 2011. Trenton supplied additional information regarding this application to the CAI department. Work on this project is still in progress. The project has not been bid as of to date.

 Alpha NJ – The Reconstruction of Edge Rd. has been completed as agreed and the Borough is compiling its final invoices for reimbursement and close out.

With my brother and his wife and children; and my wife, children and grandchildren present at the dedication ceremony at the Slate Belt Museum on August 8<sup>th</sup>, it further extends that high regard of your work to five generations.

When Barbara and I started going through the materials with my brother Ron and sisterin-law Kay retrieved from the old bridge house after my aunts passed away, we were awed by the historic documents dated back to 1823. The record of New Jersey/Pennsylvania agency meetings, stock certificates, and handwritten lists of stockholders plus pictures taken over a number of years were important to us. When your newspaper article appeared requesting items of interest to be brought to the commission to be shared with the public, we were happy that you provided the opportunity for us to share our discovery with the public.

Thank you for making that possible. Your effort, time, and commitment to a lot of work going through boxes of materials and your pleasant relationship with us and our family members is deeply appreciated. You are both wonderful representatives of an accountable, respected public agency. We appreciate your service.
