ROLL CALL

Frank G. McCartney, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting, called the Roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present--there being four Members present from Pennsylvania and five Members present from New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public or Press on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY APPOINTED COMMISSION MEMBER FROM THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA – MELISSA HELLER

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and introduced Melissa Heller, newly appointed Commission Member from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Chairman DeGerolamo then requested Marcel Groen, Pennsylvania Legal Counsel to issue the Oath of Office to Ms. Heller.

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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

<u>I-78</u>

Rehabilitation of the I-78 roadway on the New Jersey side began earlier this month. Signs have been posted advising motorists about the project and that construction crews are mobilizing.

The roadway will remain open during the construction. Plans call for three lanes in the peak travel direction to be maintained. The closure of one or two lanes for construction is anticipated to occur during off-peak travel periods. We are not anticipating any traffic impacts until at least December.

This project will fix the deteriorating conditions of the roadway. Heavy truck traffic has caused the roadway to settle and the concrete to crack.

I should also add that the project team held a very productive partnering session to kick-off the project and everyone is looking forward to a smooth project.

NEW HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE

Last month Commissioners voted on a contract for repairs to the concrete apron of the New Hope-Lambertville Toll-Supported Bridge. I am happy to report today that the contractor has already mobilized and that inspections are expected to begin this week with construction following soon after.

The project includes repairing a 6-foot-by-3.5 foot section of deterioration of the concrete apron at the base of Pier 2, which is the second pier from the Pennsylvania side.

A recent inspection of the pier apron has determined that the current condition of the apron poses no threat to the stability of the bridge or the safety of the traveling public. The Commission is making improvements now to avoid possible deterioration of the apron during future flood events.

SCUDDER FALLS

Some of you may have seen construction crews out on the Scudder Falls Bridge these past few weekends. Our maintenance teams have been working to repair potholes on the bridge. The right southbound lane has been closed on Saturdays during the repairs and our crews have reported only minor delays for the traveling public. Our crews expect to be out there for at least one or two more weekends.

We have advised motorists in advance of each day of work that they may encounter delays during this operation and should allow extra time for travel in the area. The State Police have been assisting in traffic control.

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MILFORD MONTAGUE

Today you will be asked to vote to award the construction contract for the rehabilitation of the Milford Montague Toll Bridge.

The rehabilitation will include repainting the bridge and replacing the existing bridge deck, approach roadway pavements and toll plaza.

Construction is expected to begin by the end of this year.

CAI

Also on today's agenda is the award of a \$645,390 Compact Authorized Investment grant to Hopewell Township, N.J. to help improve handicap accessibility at Washington Crossing State Park.

The grant will fund the construction of handicap ramps, a sidewalk, additional handicap parking spaces and a brick walkway connection between the parking area at Washington Crossing State Park and the Delaware and Raritan Canal towpath.

Since September 2005, the Commission has awarded more than \$35 million in CAI grants to nearly 30 municipalities to help fund a total of 55 separate projects.

The CAI program has proven successful in helping our community partners fund important improvements that they may not otherwise be able to afford. By improving access to the canal towpath, we are improving access to our river communities and our bridges.

DBIA

I apologize if I already mentioned this, but it is such great news that I need to tell you again:

The Commission has been awarded the New York Tri State Region Project of the Year Award by the Design Build Institute of America for the successful installation of our EZ-Pass System.

This is a great honor for the Commission, and congratulations are in order all around.

As some of you may remember, one of the primary features of the early capital program was the deployment of an electronic toll collection system, E-ZPass, to reduce congestion and increase throughput on the Commission's toll bridges.

A very short time frame for deployment was required because the Commission had made a public commitment to not increase tolls, funding necessary to finance the overall capital program, until E-ZPass had been successfully deployed at each of the Commission's seven toll bridges.

Beginning in January 2002 with the issuance of an RFP for a Program Manager, the Commission put together a team of consultants, contractors, construction managers, system integrators and

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customer service vendors, including STV, Transcore, ACS, The Washington Group, and Roadcon.

All team members were focused on implementing an electronic toll collection system in an expedited manner.

In 11 months, the Commission, as General Contractor, had two lanes of electronic toll collection operational at each of its seven toll facilities. Seven months later, the Commission had all 36 toll lanes at each of its seven toll facilities fully operational with EZ Pass only and mixed use.

This award recognizes the success of this project, and is something we should be extremely proud of.

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the Meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

Mr. Groen, Pennsylvania Legal Counsel addressed the meeting and said:

"For the Commissioners information, there is a maintenance agreement that was drafted as part of this Agreement, stating that the Commission is not responsible for traffic signals at the sites, but the Commission will maintain the rest of the property."

At the conclusion of the review Commissioner Hart moved and Commissioner Alfano seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

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- "RESOLVED by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (the "Commission"), at its Regular Meeting assembled this 29th day of October, 2007, that the Commission approves the following Resolution; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission was created in accordance with Article I, Section 10, Clause 3 of the Constitution of the United States of America, the Congress of the United States of America has consented to the Compact by Acts approved August 30, 1935, August 4, 1947, March 31, 1952 and April 2, 1987, as a bi-state agency by an agreement between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey executed on December 19, 1934 by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and executed on December 18, 1934 by the Governor of the State of New Jersey, as thereafter supplemented, modified and amended by supplemental agreements between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey from time to time (collectively, the "Compact"); and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission is composed of ten (10) members, five (5) from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, who are citizens appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and serve at the pleasure of the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and five (5) from the State of New Jersey, who are citizens appointed by the Governor of the State of New Jersey with the consent of the State Senate for three (3) year terms (collectively, the "Commissioners"); and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission constitutes a public corporation instrumentality of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey; and
- "WHEREAS, the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey do not apply to the Commission unless complimentary legislation is enacted in both jurisdictions and approved by Congress; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has enacted a law, 36 P.S. § 3401, and the State of New Jersey has enacted a law, N.J.S.A. 32:9A-1, which allow the Commission to dispose of unneeded property; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission is the current owner of Parcel No. 602, including the Route 202 Spur, located in New Hope Borough, Bucks County, Pennsylvania (the "Property"); and
- "WHEREAS, the Property is also located adjacent to Bucks County Tax Map Parcel No. 27-4-2(A) and Tax Map Parcel No. 27-4-2(B), located in New Hope Borough, Bucks County, Pennsylvania (the "Scannapieco Property"), which is owned by Scannapieco Development Corporation ("Scannapieco"); and
- "WHEREAS, Scannapieco proposes to construct a residential development on the Scannapieco Property; and
- "WHEREAS, Scannapieco originally proposed that access be provided to the residential development along Route 202, approximately 500 feet south of the Route 202 Spur; and

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- 'WHEREAS, the Borough of New Hope expressed a concern with Scannapieco's proposed access and requested that Scannapieco investigate the possibility of relocating the proposed access across from the Route 202 Spur and install a traffic signal to facilitate pedestrian crossings; and
- "WHEREAS, the Borough of New Hope agreed to maintain the proposed traffic signal and related roadway signage and pavement markings; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission received a letter from CMX (formerly Schoor DePalma), traffic engineering consultant for the Scannapieco Development Corporation, dated October 15, 2007, indicating that they have determined that the transfer of Right-of-Way will not impact the Commission's ability to collect tolls at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge; and
- "WHEREAS, in order to meet the Borough of New Hope's request for location of the access to the proposed residential development on the Scannapieco Property, the Commission agreed to dedicate the Property to PennDOT and to continue to maintain the Property, excluding the proposed traffic signal and related roadway signage and pavement markings; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission seeks to dedicate the Property for a nominal fee to PennDOT, as more particularly set forth on the plan titled "Right-of-Way Acquisition Plan, US Route 202 Toll Road, Rabbit Run Preserve", prepared by Schoor DePalma Engineers and Consultants, dated September 6, 2007 (the "ROW Plan"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission seeks to confirm its agreement with PennDOT and the Borough of New Hope, whereby the Commission will agree to continue to maintain the Property, excluding the proposed traffic signal and related roadway signage and pavement markings, after dedication of the Property to PennDOT, which maintenance shall include maintaining the grass and plantings and snow removal; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission's maintenance responsibilities with regard to the Property shall be set forth in a Maintenance Agreement between the Commission and PennDOT, in accordance with the plan titled "Lower York Road (S.R. 0202) Jurisdictional Map", prepared by Schoor DePalma Engineers and Consultants, dated September 7, 2007 (the "Jurisdictional Map"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B"; and
- "RESOLVED, that dedication of the Property from the Commission to PennDOT is hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed; and
- "FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director of the Commission is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents which will facilitate the transfer of the Property from the Commission to PennDOT in accordance with the ROW Plan; and
- "FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director of the Commission is hereby authorized to execute a Maintenance Agreement between the Commission and PennDOT confirming the maintenance responsibilities set forth on the Jurisdictional Map."

STATISTICS OF TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2007 COMPARED WITH MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2006

The following provides a comparison of toll direction traffic volumes for the month and year-to-date periods ending September 30, 2007, as compared with the month and year-to-date periods ending September 30, 2006.

<u>Traffic Volume Comparisons – September 2007 versus September 2006</u>

In the month of September, total vehicular toll traffic for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges decreased by 3,670 vehicles or 0.1%, as compared to September 2006. Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges increased by 45,900 vehicles or 1.8% as compared to the previous year.

In District I, toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for September 2007 decreased by 42,700 cars and decreased by 3,100 trucks as compared to September 2006, resulting in a 7.5% decrease in total toll traffic. It is noted that roadway construction work for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in January 2007. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 10,400 cars combined with an increase of 700 trucks generated an overall increase in total toll traffic of 7.1% for September 2007 as compared to September 2006.

In District II, a 18,300 increase in cars combined with a decrease of 7,800 trucks resulted in a 1.3% increase in total toll traffic at I-78 for the month of September 2007 as compared to September 2006. The Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge experienced an increase in traffic volume. An increase of 9,600 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 2,900 trucks generated an overall increase of 1.3% in total toll traffic for September 2007.

In District III, total toll traffic at Portland-Columbia (PC) reflected an increase of 12.2% for the month of September 2007 as a result of an increase of 12,500 automobiles and an increase of 600 trucks. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 6,100 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 300 trucks generated a decrease in total toll traffic for the month of approximately 0.7% as compared to September 2006. Milford-Montague (MM) experienced an increase of approximately 6,500 passenger vehicles and an increase of 100 trucks, resulting overall in a 5.3% increase in toll traffic for the month.

E-Z Pass Penetration Rates

The following table provides a summary of E-Z Pass penetration rates experienced at the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges during September 2007, September 2006, 2007 year-to-date (YTD), and 2006 year-to-date. E-Z Pass penetration rates for all of the Commission's toll bridges was 55.8% for the month of September 2007 and is 55.5% 2007 year-to-date. Overall E-Z Pass penetration rates increased by 1.8% in September 2007 as compared to September 2006; including an increase of 1.5% in autos and an increase of 3.1% in trucks.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of September 2007 and the nine month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2007 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,332,113 for the month of September. For the fiscal year-to-date 2007, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$32,465,148 or 97.05% of the year-to-date operating budget. The positive variance between the operating budget and actual expenses is due to normal operating activity.

Several line items are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Unemployment Compensation is currently over its annual budget but situation is insignificant to the total operating budget due to the size of the budgeted line item. Temporary salaries are running ahead of budget and are expected to end the year over budget as a result of higher than anticipated charges at the District II toll bridges and Administration. The OT expense for Administration is more than offset by salary savings from vacant positions. EZPass Operating expense is running ahead of budget due to higher than budgeted charges for transaction processing.

There were no unusual expenses or charges for the month of September.

September 2007

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of September 2007, showing the divisions chargeable for the expensed and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission.
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate.
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent.

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 65 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 53 price inquiries were sent out on 20 groups of inquiries during the month, or an average of 2.7 inquiries for each item or group of items.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The following activities under the general heading of community relations/governmental affairs have recently taken place.

- ❖ The Director and Assistant Director of Community Affairs participated in a meeting with Pam Bush, President of the Delaware River Greenway Partnership and Gregg Rackin, River Administrator for the Wild & Scenic Lower Delaware to discuss a public education program on the Delaware River planned for 2008. Additional details will be forthcoming.
- The Director and Assistant Director of Community Affairs attended a Progress and Scheduling Meeting for Contract T-424A I-78 Roadway Rehab project. Working together with the public involvement consultant for the project, various outreach activities are underway, including an 800 hotline number, website information, informational handouts, and meetings with local and regional police, emergency services and public works officials. Community Affairs Director and Assistant Director also participated in a daylong partnering session for the I-78 Roadway Rehab project held on October 15, 2007.
- The Department of Community Affairs met with the Engineering Department to prepare for a stakeholder interview with the NJ Department of Transportation in connection with the Route 29 Boulevard Project, from Cass Street to north of the Calhoun Street Bridge. The Commission has been asked to participate in these interviews and share its current or future plans in the Route 29 project area, its jurisdictional limits, function as it relates to the Route 29 project, available plans or drawings for current/future work, and its thoughts and vision for the Trenton Route 29 downtown area. The NJ DOT project team will also be inviting officials from the borough of Morrisville as a suggestion offered by Commission staff. Stakeholder interviews will be conducted at the NJ DOT offices on Thursday, October 25, 2007.
- ❖ Community Affairs department staff met with engineering staff on Tuesday October 16 to review the scope of public involvement activities envisioned for the C-427B I-78 Open Road Tolling (Express EZ Pass) project currently in design stages. The goal is to develop a public information/public outreach program consistent with the needs of the project and cost efficient in its application.

During the month of September, 2007 the Director of Policy and Planning participated in a number of communications and meetings that explored the following:

The Lehigh Valley Economic Development Corporation's Transportation Committee was briefed by Gary Davies of Urbitran Associates concerning the Central New Jersey / Raritan Valley Transit Study which should begin in October and span about eighteen plus months.

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's Planning Coordinating Committee and Regional Transportation Committee had two interesting informational presentations. The first presentation dealt with the Keystone Industrial Port Complex (KIPC) which is located in Fairless Hills, Bucks County. Once the site of the United States Steel Corporation's Fairless Works, KIPC will be a full redevelopment of a four thousand acre brownfield site. The second presentation dealt with PennDOT's Engineering District 6 Regional Operations Plan (ROP).

The Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce Economic Development / Transportation Committee were informed that PennDOT's Route 80 Study is expected to be completed in late spring 2008.

The Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce Transportation Committee featured Pennsylvania State Representative Doug Reichley (R-134). Representative Reichley discussed with the committee the Legislature's view of the transportation issues facing the Commonwealth.

The Pike County Road Task Force was updated by PennDOT District Four concerning projects and winter maintenance in Pike County.

The Lehigh Valley Transportation Study Technical Committee voted to recommend PennDOT's District 5 Regional Operations Plan (ROP) to the Lehigh Valley Transportation Study Coordinating Committee. PennDOT's goal is to fund and implement all projects listed in the District 5 ROP.

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board Meeting, Executive Committee Meeting, and Retreat were held at the Enterprise Center at Burlington County College. The day's theme was fostering a greener future: climate change and sustainability. The Board would also like to see a less restrictive policy with the use of Pennsylvania Act 44 funds with reference to bridges.

TRENTON-MORRISVILLE (ROUTE 1) TOLL BRIDGE REHABILITATION AND ADDITION OF ONE NB AUXILIARY LANE

DESIGN Contract No. C-380A

Design Consultant Louis Berger continues to provide services through the post-design/construction phase of the project.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-380B CTH/DGF

CM/CI consultant Hill International has been coordinating field activities with the contractor, reviewing contractor schedules, conducting bi-weekly progress and scheduling meetings, preparing daily reports, tracking project submittals and developing public involvement and outreach efforts.

Hill's Public Involvement consultant, Bergmaier Associates, continues to update the project website, answer customer generated questions via the toll free number and updating the quarterly newsletter.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-380B

Construction work is progressing on schedule. Stage 1 is underway and expected to last until the spring of 2008. Stage 1 work includes the rebuilding of the toll plaza, construction of the head house that connects the main building to the new toll tunnel, as well as demolition and rebuilding the downstream portions of the main river bridge. Pier cap extensions are primarily completed on the downriver portion of the main river bridge, structural steel has started being set on spans closest to New Jersey and deck demolition has also commenced. The toll plaza demolition has continued with the removal of portions of the existing canopy and toll booths. New islands and canopy sections are currently being installed. New structural steel girders are being placed on the widened portion of the PennDOT viaduct over Conrail & Delaware Canal adjacent to Pennsylvania Avenue. Numerous Commission owned overpass structures are also being reconstructed on both sides of the river.

The next progress "Partnering Meeting" is scheduled to be held on October 23, 2007 at the Construction Manager's field office. Representatives from the Commission, Berger, Hill and Conti will be in attendance. The session will be run by a facilitator, FMI Corporation.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The preliminary Preferred Alternative is the inside widening of I-95 in Pennsylvania, Option 2 at Taylorsville Road and Option 1c – Modified (Roundabout) at Route 29. The Preferred Alternative also includes a total replacement of the Scudder Falls Bridge with the new bridge containing 5 northbound and 4 southbound lanes on an upstream alignment.

The project consulting Team met with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (PHMC) and the New Jersey State Historic Parks and Preservation Organization (SHPPO) to discuss the findings of the archaeology studies and to discuss determination of eligibility. The Environmental Assessment (EA) document is being prepared.

NORTHERLY CROSSINGS CORRIDOR CONGESTION MITIGATION STUDY

STUDY Contract No. C-395A WMC/RWL

The Commission has conducted a series of workshops with NJDOT and PennDOT intended to facilitate establishing a Task Force which will focus on building a consensus with respect to mitigating future traffic congestion along the I-80 corridor in both the eastbound and westbound direction.

Workshops were held on August 1, 2007 and September 20, 2007 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge facility and included discussions regarding the development of a Memorandum of Understanding for the Task Force. Each workshop was attended by representatives of NJDOT, PennDOT, PA Turnpike and the Commission.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

PROGRAM MANAGER Contract No. C-396A WMC/RWL

Work involved the initiation of implementation oversight generally focused on coordinating preliminary matters and providing administrative support relating to the issuance of Notice-to-Proceed.

Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey continues to assist the Commission, together with Counsel, in discussions with Advanced Wireless Services (AWS) license holders who have bought rights to regional wireless frequencies through an FCC auction and determined that their proposed AWS networks will potentially interfere with the Commission's microwave communications system. Negotiations are in progress for an agreement to compensate the Commission for vacating its licenses to operate in the affected frequencies.

DESIGN-BUILD-MAINTAIN PROJECT DB-396A WMC/RWL

In accordance with Resolution ENG-02-09-07, the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System Design-Build-Maintain Project, Contract No. DB-396A, was awarded to Mass. Electric Construction Company of Whitestone, New York.

The project includes design-build-maintain services in connection with the Commission's plan to install an Electronic Surveillance / Detection System to properly secure the bridge structures, bridge roadways, overpasses, toll plazas and support facilities within its jurisdiction.

A project Kick-off Meeting is scheduled to be held in late October.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

NEW HOPE – LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING RENOVATIONS AND ADDITION

DESIGN Contract No. C-397B RJZ/RWL

A Request for Pre-Qualifications (RFQ) was publicly advertised on July 17, 2007. Seven (7) Contractors submitted their Statement of Qualifications (SOQ's) on August 08, 2007. All seven (7) of the Contractors were deemed pre-qualified to bid.

Final construction bid documents were received from VITETTA on September 10, 2007. Construction bid solicitations were issued to all seven (7) firms on September 10, 2007 as construction Contract T-397B. A mandatory Pre-Bid Meeting was held at the New Hope - Lambertville Toll Bridge Administration Building on September 18, 2007. Six (6) out of the seven (7) Pre-Qualified Contractors attended the meeting. Bids are scheduled to be received on October 18, 2007.

1-78 ROADWAY REHABILITATION CONTRACT

DESIGN Contract No. C-424A EHM/DGF/CLR

PB Americas continues to provide post design support for the project. PB is continuing to responding to Contractor requests-for-information; and reviewing shop drawings and submissions from the contractor.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-424A EHM/CLR

Greenman – Pedersen, Inc continues to provide CM/CI services for this contract which includes coordinating field activities with the contractor, reviewing contractor schedules, contractor invoicing, conducting bi-weekly Progress and Scheduling Meetings, preparing daily reports, tracking project submittals along with public information efforts.

Greenman - Pedersen's Public Involvement consultant, ACT Engineers, has reached out to local officials to provide details on the project. At this time, all local officials have asked that the Commission keep the local Police department informed of any local street impacts. ACT has begun development of the first project newsletter and begun to answer customer generated questions via the toll free number.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-424A EHM/DGF/CLR

Tilcon New York, Inc. has completed establishing the CM/CI field office and has begun construction on October 15, 2007. A Partnering Session was held on October 15, 2007. Work has begun on the drainage channel stabilization along County Route 519 under I-78 and repaying of the right shoulders in advance of shifting traffic onto the shoulder for Stage 1 work. A preliminary baseline construction schedule has been submitted and it is anticipated that it will be finalized and approved by late October 2007.

Contract No. C-425A

STORM SEWER OUTFALL PIPE MAP

DESIGN Assignment #7 JMD/RWL

Under this Task Order Assignment T&M Associates was tasked with finding, inspecting, and mapping all Commission sewer outfalls in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

The consultant has completed the mapping and inspection of all outfalls in Districts 1, 2 and 3. An internal meeting was held to discuss and finalize the Outfall Inspection Report to be submitted to T&M Associates.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

PORTLAND BOROUGH SEWER FORCE MAIN CONNECTION LOCATION

DESIGN Assignment #9 JMD/RWL

The Borough of Portland has been ordered by the PA DEP to provide a sewage treatment plant to service residential and other facilities within the Borough. The Borough has requested an easement to construct a sewer force main to the treatment plant within Commission property. The Commission and Commission Counsel have been working with the Borough to prepare the requested easement documentation.

The Commission requested T & M Associates prepare a proposal to review the proposed sewer force main plans prepared by the Borough engineering consultant, Brinjac Engineering, and determine the best location for stub connection to which the Commission will ultimately connect our P-C Toll facility. As part of the connection, the Commission is required to install a grinder pump provided by the Borough, and construct a lateral connection from our building to the sewer tap location.

The final report has been submitted by T&M for review. It is expected that this Task Order Assignment will be closed by the end of the year.

Meeting of October 29, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

I-78 OPEN ROAD TOLLING (ORT) LANES DESIGN

DESIGN Contract No. C-427B CAS/RWL

HNTB Corp. is finalizing the draft Customer Service Center / Violation Processing Center Design, Build, Operate and Maintain Request for Proposals (RFP). Once the document is finalized, it will be routed internally for final review prior to being issued.

Several meetings were held with Commission staff, Commission counsel, HNTB and STV to discuss how the maintenance of the existing Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) system should be incorporated into the In-Lane Toll System RFP.

HNTB is continuing with the design effort for the project. The horizontal and vertical geometry is approximately 90% complete. Contract plans for grading, cross sections, pavement repair, roadway signage and pavement markings, staging, and traffic control are all on-going. HNTB has analyzed the existing storm water drainage system and is currently designing the proposed system. Geotechnical borings for the proposed retaining walls is complete and analysis of this information is on-going. HNTB completed a site visit to gain an understanding of the electrical system for the roadway lighting and is moving forward with the lighting design. The design of the retaining walls along the eastbound side of I-78 as well as the proposed sign structures is moving forward. The design of the gantry structure for the ORT equipment is on-going.

HNTB is analyzing the existing tunnel and looking at the feasibility of creating an access point in the vicinity of lane 7. Since the stair house located adjacent to the I-78 eastbound lanes will be demolished, the tunnel located beneath the eastbound lanes will be permanently closed off.

HNTB is reviewing the existing signage located on the toll plaza canopy and is determining the feasibility of placing signage over all lanes. They are also investigating the feasibility of using LED display signs rather than the current flip signs.

A pre-proposal meeting was held on July 11, 2007 and four proposals were received on August 1, 2007. Interviews were held with all four firms on August 17, 2007. COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT

General

In September the CAI department scheduled and held a series of meetings with municipalities that needed interventional attention with their projects or that were not adhering to the schedule they had agreed to in the contract agreement mutually executed by them and the Commission. Subsequent to the meetings, most grantees readjusted their schedules and have been steadfastly following the work plan required by the new schedule. However, there is a few that still need further close monitoring in order for them to barely meet the project completion deadline of December 31, 2008. The CAI department has determined that the next 15 months will be very crucially busy as many of the grantees are now completing their final engineering plans and scheduling advertisement of bids and construction schedules. Another common denominator encountered in a few projects is the inability to adhere to project budget by surpassing the original grant amount. In two instances the projects were completed under budget. As indicated in previous reports, some grantees that exceeded their dedicated cost estimates compensated this deficiency by modifying their projects scope. There are others that may had altered their scope of work and are contemplating requesting more fund from the Commissioners in order to complete their projects.

Four new applications from Hopewell Township, NJ; Belvidere (an amended application); West Amwell, NJ; and Delaware Township, NJ will be presented to the Commissioners for their consideration for grants.

Update of some of the most significant efforts with the grantees during this month

Pennsylvania

- 1. Milford Borough, PA Delta engineering completed the plans for this project and construction work was awarded to LR Costanzo Construction Services, who started the work in Early September. The project is in process and for the next two months with a completion date of December 15, 2007. This project lends itself to a great opportunity for a ribbon cutting ceremony upon its completion.
- 2. Smithfield, PA A status meeting was held on September 19th in Smithfield with the team leaders of this project, which included Boucher & James engineering and Simone-Collins architects. The engineer and the architects have done considerable amount of work to bring them up to date with the previously adopted schedule. There is a meeting scheduled with several members of Penn DOT to discuss the issue of the blinking lights, and to paint the bridge with anti-graffiti paint as well a storm water improvement permits. The plan should be 90% complete by the end of the month in order to go out to bids in January 2008. There is a need for an HOP permit for some of the work being done. The Township is also working on its first reimbursement request for work already done. The pending schedule is for the project to be bid in January and to start construction in April 2008.

Pennsylvania (Continued)

- 3. Delaware Water Gap, PA During the latter part of September the grantee became more accessible to communicate with the CAI department and it appears that the plans are moving ahead slowly. After a review of the preliminary plans the due diligence engineer noticed that there appears to be a change from the original scope of work on the Broad Street/Delaware Avenue project and the Warring Street project. It was also noted that a HOP permit may be necessary for some of the work on the State Right-of-Way. A meeting was scheduled for October 2nd to discuss the above concerns and to secure pending deliverables from the municipality. The project engineer is Douglas Olmstead with Boucher and James, Inc; which is the same engineering company working on the adjacent Smithfield Township project.
- 4. Portland Borough, PA –The back up information needed for the Reimbursement Requests of Portland was received. However, a meeting with Penn Dot regarding the crosswalk needs to occur, and although the CAI department has offered to assist Mayor Kay Bucci with this contact, she continues to indicate that she will take care of it and has not. The HOP permit for the Park and Walk project has not been attained and neither has the property been acquired for the Park and Ride project. Time is running out and there has not been any significant progress made in the past few months to demonstrate a comfort level that either of these two projects will be completed on time. The CAI department will schedule a follow up meeting for October with the stake holders of the projects in an effort to get a pulse on the statuses.
- 5. Lower Mount Bethel, PA The due diligence engineer is still working on obtaining the proper deliverables information for the RR from the municipality. The Property deed from PPL was received as well as the latest the quarterly report has date inaccuracy that is being ascertained. The municipality is in the process of acquiring a revised budget and contract from its engineer. According to the latest cost estimates, the Township will seek to reduce construction costs by getting donated work from the public work department. A status meeting is pending in the month of October.
- 6. Williams Township, PA The DRJTBC Engineer is reviewing the latest plans received from the Township as well as detailed cost estimates. There is an additional traffic signal added to the scope of work that was not in the initial application. The will review the 3rd light application. Penn DOT is requesting additional comments in order to issue a HOP. The CAI department is waiting for a construction schedule.
- 7. Easton, PA The due diligence engineer is waiting for final plans, cost estimates, and a concept plan to approve before the city can move ahead with the traffic calming project. The project manager and project supervisor must provide the CAI department with the necessary information before further the reimbursement request can be approved. The City must send a complete request letter to combine the bike path project and the trail projects. The Trolley project is complete for this year and a reimbursement request was submitted by the City.
- 8. Riegelsville Borough, PA A meeting with DCNR Commission is to take place in order to verify that this project has not adverse effect on the Canal and its habitats. Permit is pending in order for the project to move ahead for bids.

Pennsylvania (Continued)

- 9. Solebury Township, PA Both projects are in good shape. Bucks County conservation district needs to be approved. They think that they can bid by December. The project needs official PICO approval for the park. Bridge and parking lot are in our grant as well as the trail. The organization, Friends of the Canal Park is against the project. The due diligence engineer met with the project team and got a lot more information from them. The DCNR has not given them approval for the prefab bridge. They don't need the DEP chapter 105 approval. Penn Dot permit and the right-of-way transfer are the biggest issues. Julianne Dargan completed the plan review. Solebury received Penn DOT comments. There were three received by the CAI department and are under review. Plans are for this project to be ready for advertising by October.
- 10. New Hope Borough, PA A status report from the Borough engineer is expected soon. The signal project is expected to be completed by December 31 2007, however, they still don't have Penn Dot permit. There is no advertising for construction yet. The municipality is preparing the specs that need Penn DOT approval. The occupancy permit and HARB approval of permits for ornamental light poles for the traffic signal are expected to be approved soon.
- 11. Falls Township, PA –No significant changes this month. The CAI department is still waiting for reimbursement request from them to close out the project.
- 12. Upper Makefield Township, PA The project, is expected to be advertised and warded by Penn DOT in late October or early November. The Township has all the final approvals.
- 13. Lower Makefield, PA –The Traffic signal project is completed and the Township is getting all the necessary paper work together for a close out. The Township has alluded that it wants to send another project application to the CAI department. The CAI department is waiting for the last reimbursement request.
- 14. Bristol Borough, PA the Borough received its approval on the plans from Penn DOT. There is a prebid meeting schedule for October.
- 15. Yardley, PA A meeting is scheduled for October to discuss The Borough's Agreement and work schedule as well as the Appendix B.

New Jersey

- 1 Montague, NJ Insurance issue has not yet been resolved. The Township attorney is speaking with the DRJTBC attorney in an effort to try to compromise on the insurance certificate needed by the Commission for the Agreement.
- 2 Knowlton, NJ No quarterly report yet. The due diligence will call regarding the status of their paperwork and the new project they wish to fund. The foot trail study will be done in December and the municipality may ask for funds to complete the trail. The CAI department encouraged the municipality file an application. The CAI department received a letter with copy of deed and property insurance for the property that was purchased to construct a park adjacent to the Portland Columbia pedestrian bridge.

New Jersey (Continued)

- 3 Belvidere, NJ A revised grant application request for additional work from the original award was received in September. This application request was reviewed by the CAI department and will be presented to the Commissioners for consideration.
- Phillipsburg, NJ The town is still working on the ROW transfer and the approval of Stream encroachment and soil erosion control. The traffic signal study essentially completed, but will not be done as initially submitted. SHPO gave a verbal approval to the project. The bricks cross walk and utility are still issues that need to be resolved. A meeting is scheduled for October 15th to go over the status of the project.
- 5 Pohatcong, NJ Reimbursement Request #4 has been received and is appears to be fine and will be processed for payment. A meeting is scheduled for October to review the project status.
- 6 Milford, NJ The engineer is meeting with some property owners to resolve some right-of-way issues for the project. A meeting is being scheduled for October 18th.
- Frenchtown, NJ Van Cleef has begun work on the project. A meeting was held with the Mayor Ron Swaron and Van Cleef engineer and there is a contract drawn up for the engineer. Cleef completed the base mapping for both projects. An agreement, insurance Certificate and a resolution is expected from the Township by early October.
- Stockton, NJ Stockton has applied for all permits and has received approval from the D&R Canal and NJDOT. Attorneys for Stockton and Commission have been conversing on right-of-way transfer issues. The Borough also received the stream encroachment permit and possible detour in PA. The DRJTBC engineer is looking at the PA side of traffic pattern during construction. The Borough now wants to buy the parcel by the Rail Road station Deli to make it a parking lot. There will be an increase construction cost due to permit requirement from SHPO and the NJ DOT. The engineer will send the CAI department an explanation on the additional cost and reason for increase.
- 9 Lambertville, NJ Mt. Hope St. project is complete; Ferry St. project has made great progress and is on scheduled. It should be completed at the middle to the end of October. The mapping for Quary Street and Swan Street is complete and the George St. plan is moving along.
- 10 Ewing, NJ Agreement will be reviewed to rescinding original grant. The CAI department is waiting for a new application to rehabilitate several county bridges. Nothing has been received to date.
- 11 Trenton, NJ –. The final plans are completed and NJDOT indicated that the project is actually under budget as an \$800,000 retaining wall that was to be completed was deleted from the final plans. The agreement between the City of Trenton and the NJ DOT has not been completed due to disagreements on several terms of the contract. NJDOT is looking to order bids by December 2007, but the project completion is now pushed back to about June 2009.
- Morrisville, PA The first reimbursement request has been completed and paid. The traffic impact with work on west bridge Street is being reviewed by the DRJTBC engineering department.

New Jersey (Continued)

- Delaware Twp., NJ These projects we completed during September. The CAI department is waiting for a report from the Township engineer as there has not been any RR submitted yet. The Township needs to justify the payments and the payment tickets and coring will be used as the construction work was completed by the Township public work department. Delaware has submitted a new application for road repair on Lower Creek Road. This application was reviewed by the CAI department and will be presented to the Commissioners for award consideration.
- 14 Hopewell, NJ A new grant application was submitted and it will be presented to the Commissioners for consideration at their October meeting. A meeting was held with the CAI department, representative of the DRJTBC engineering department the Plant and Facility Department and the assistant superintendent of District Ito review the project and any possible parking configuration of the bridge officer parking space on Washington Crossing Bridge. An ADA research is pending to be completed prior to the Commissioners meeting. If this research is satisfactory, the application will be submitted for the Commissioners consideration of award at their October meeting.
- West Amwell, NJ The base plans are complete and the engineer is working on preliminary plans. The CAI department will schedule a meeting with the grantee in October to follow-up on project status. A new application for a road reconstruction of section 12 of Rocktown-Lambertville Road was submitted by the Township and it will be presented for consideration by the Commissioners at their October meeting.
