ROLL CALL

Frank G. McCartney, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting, called the Roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present- there being five members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Good Morning.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman...

As I mentioned last month, the general trend of rising monthly traffic and toll collection figures that we have seen since the middle of 2009 continues, but the general trend has been positive over the past 18 months, commercial traffic – our most important revenue generator – continues to lag. Once again in October, revenue collections from commercial vehicles (trucks) failed to

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recover to pre-recession levels. We nonetheless continue to press ahead in delivering on the promise we made to our customers to improve the agency's network of infrastructure and services. One important facet of this modernization effort has been a series of projects the agency has carried out this year in the area of electronic toll collection. We are on the cusp of bringing Express E-ZPass service online at the toll plaza for the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge. Over the past three months, work crews removed three toll booths and constructed a single Express E-ZPass lane at the toll facility. This past weekend, a series of westbound lane closures were executed to allow for testing and commissioning of the new system. Workers also installed two large overhead signs to help direct eligible E-ZPass equipped motorists to the facility. We are now at a juncture where we might receive word at any moment that the temporarily configured Express E-ZPass lane has indeed been put into service. When we started this project in August, our goal was to have this facility operational in time for the Thanksgiving Day holiday weekend, it now looks like we will accomplish that goal. There are many people I want to commend: Chief Engineer George Alexandridis and Program Manager for Technology Chip Stracciolini oversaw the program along with support from District 3 operations and maintenance staff, in the field, Chris Rood of AECOM provided construction oversight, Greenman-Pedersen provided construction management and construction inspection services and construction was performed under a contract with AP Construction. ACS is the toll system integrator at the front end and ETC is running the customer service and violation processing centers. Most of all, however, I want to thank our customers for their patience and understanding, for three months, they endured traffic delays and long lines at the toll plaza during evening peak periods on Thursday and Friday. While the opening of the Express E-ZPass lane is a major milestone, I must point out that other facets of this project will still need to be carried out over the coming months. Construction barriers, for example will limit the width of the Express E-ZPass facility and the remaining five lanes of the former eight-lane barrier toll plaza will need to be reconfigured and upgraded. Work on paving, roadway striping and more signage also needs to be carried out. Our new goal is to complete the entire project by late spring. As you may recall, the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge is our second facility to offer Express E-ZPass service. In May, the Commission opened two Express E-ZPass lanes at the I-78 Toll Bridge. On November 13, the facility achieved its sixmonth anniversary. An additional toll collection improvement project that the Commission initiated in 2010 also is on the brink of reaching completion. In December, we expect to complete the installation and activation of a Violation Enforcement System of high-resolution cameras and near-infrared lights at all of our toll plazas. The Milford-Montague and Portland-Columbia Toll Bridges will be the last two facilities to switch to camera-based toll enforcement, When that occurs, we will deliver on another promise to our customers - the removal of the dreaded gates at each and every one of our toll plaza lanes. All of these upgrades have occurred during the year that the Commission's E-ZPass program broke the 70,000 account threshold. We continue to see a trend of more E-ZPass usage and more E-ZPass account holders with each passing month.

Over the next several weeks, we expect to see one bridge rehabilitation project begin winding down and two new projects begin staging and early construction activities. The Riegelsville Toll-Supported Bridge project is expected to reach substantial completion as scheduled on December 1. The contractor is finishing replacement of the bridge's floor system. Work on the new bridge lighting system is now fully underway and the reinstallation of bridge security cameras is

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scheduled to begin in early December, masonry repairs also are underway. The entire project remains on track to be completed no later than December 24. Staging and work-site preparation for the Upper Black Eddy-Milford Toll-Supported Bridge rehabilitation project is expected to begin once all full traffic shutdowns come to an end at the nearby Riegelsville Bridge on December 1. We originally proposed to carry out the Upper Black Eddy-Milford project early this year, but we delayed the project at the urging of area residents and business. We subsequently agreed to carry out the project during the cold weather months of 2010 and 2011. The bulk of work will take place during a four-month shutdown of the bridge from January 11 to May 17, this will be the first time the 77-year-old bridge will undergo a rehabilitation, also in December, staging and site preparation work will get underway for a rehabilitation of the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge. This work will require some lane closures and traffic stoppages during off-peak hours. The bulk of construction work, however, will not begin until after the end of the winter season. This project is being carried out in a manner that meshes with two other projects now taking place at the bridge, the Express E-ZPass project and the Substructure Repair and Scour Remediation Project. All work is being coordinated in a manner that maximizes the use of lanes closures and any other project-related traffic restrictions.

In closing I would to wish everyone a safe and Happy Thanksgiving. I am grateful to have the privilege to reflect on so many noteworthy accomplishments at the Commission over the past year.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of November 22, 2010 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (OCTOBER, 2010)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for October 2010 in comparison to the October 2009 traffic and revenue statistics. Toll Revenue increased 0.90% for the month of October and is up 2.72% on a full year comparison. The month of October 2010 had ten weekend days, one more than 2009, which adversely affected commercial toll traffic in the month-to-month comparison.

Analysis of October 2010/October 2009 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 0.90 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.59 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 5.07 percent increase.

Analysis of October 2010/October 2009 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 122,005 vehicles, or 3.79 percent.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 253 vehicles, or 0.06 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 122,258 vehicles, or 4.37 percent
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for October 2010 decreased by 13,698 vehicles, or 0.51 percent as compared to October 2009.

Traffic analysis for 2010 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges through the first ten months of 2010 was 106,542 total vehicles as compared to 102,301 total vehicles for January through October 2009, an increase of 4.15 percent.
- Recorded westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for YTD 2010 is reflecting a 2.09 percent decrease as compared to the same ten month period in 2009.

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for October 2010 reflected a 10.58 percent increase as a result of an increase of 61,332 cars and an increase of 2,062 trucks when compared to October 2009. It should be noted that roadway construction work preparation for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in October 2006, with full lane closures commencing in October 2007. This project was substantially completed in October 2009. Closure of the Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge for rehabilitation, resulted in diversion of normally non-toll bridge traffic onto the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge during the period of May 24, 2010 through October 24th, when the bridge reopened to traffic. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 3,476 cars combined with an increase of 239 trucks to generate an overall increase in total toll traffic of 2.16 percent for October 2010 as compared to October 2009.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an overall increase of 6.88 percent in total toll traffic for the month of October 2010 compared to October 2009 as the result of an increase of 56,933 cars and an increase of 3,323 trucks. It should be noted that the two new ORT lanes at I78 opened on May 13, 2010. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 15,989 passenger vehicles and 3,752 trucks combined to generate a 3.76 percent decrease in total toll traffic for October 2010.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 33.51 percent increase in total toll traffic during October 2010 as a result of increases of 36,525 automobiles and 1,394 trucks compared to October 2009. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, combined decreases of 22,339 passenger vehicles and 3,771 trucks generated a 3.18 percent decrease in total toll traffic for October 2010 as compared to October 2009. It should be noted that construction of the *E-ZPass* ORT lane at DWG has resulted in the diversion of traffic to Portland-Columbia. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 2,320 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 252 trucks to produce an overall 2.34 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of October 2010.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of October, 2010 and October, 2009, and the year-to-date periods ending October 31, 2010 and October 31, 2009.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of October 2010 and the ten month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2010 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,918,567 for the month of October. For the 2010 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$36,561,589 or 95.3% of the year-to-date operating budget. Most of the expense line items are well within their year-to-date operating budget.

There are several line items that are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Salary expense is currently running about .29% or \$42,000 over budget. The current operating budget anticipates a 3.5% vacancy rate for all salary classes but currently less than 2% of budgeted positions are vacant. Health Care Benefit cost is 4.65% or \$235,000 due to higher than budgeted rates for the premium based healthcare plan. All other expense line items are within their budgets

There were no unusual expenditures during the month of October.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

October 2010

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of October 2010, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 61 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 80 price inquiries were sent out for 36 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.23 per order (80÷36). Significant procurements for the period are highlighted below:

- Two Purchase Orders were let, in the amount of \$24,266.00, for the installation of roll up doors on salt storage buildings.
- Two Purchase Orders were let, in the amount of \$10,679.28, for IT maintenance service renewals.
- Two Purchase Orders were let, in the amount of \$10,447.15, for snowplow parts.
- A Purchase Order, in the amount of \$8,150.00, was let for the replacement of a light pole and light following an accident. Thirdparty insurance reimbursement will not be sought as the damage was a result of a hit and run accident and no information is available.
- A Purchase Order, in the amount of \$6,914.00, for guiderail repairs was let. Third-party insurance reimbursement has been received.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

COMMUNICATIONS REPORT October 2010

COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Retrieval of Construction Barge in Vicinity of the New Hope-Lambertville Toll-Supported Bridge: Heavy rains on September 30 and October 1 caused a construction barge from the Commission's Substructure Repair and Scour Remediation Project to run adrift in the rising waters of the Delaware River around daybreak on October 1. The pilotless barge was spotted by the fire chief of the New Hope Eagle Fire Company. The chief and his colleagues navigated the swift currents to bring a pilot onto the barge, bring it under control, and then navigate it safely beneath the NH-L Bridge. The barge was later towed to the New Hope shore and secured. The timeless and courageous actions of the firemen saved the bridge from harm. The Commission issued a press release that generated widespread regional media coverage. Later in the month, crafted four framed proclamations that the Commission provided to the firemen at the October 25 meeting.

Rededication of Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridges: October 12 ceremony at Pennsylvania end of the bridge attracted newspaper, Internet and television coverage, including large New Jersey section spread in the Star-Ledger of Newark. Event raised awareness of Commission's efforts to preserve historic bridges and generated flood of comments at following days Alliance for Action awards dinner in New Brunswick, N.J. Attendees included the mayors and various council representatives from Trenton and Morrisville. Highlights included comments by officer of the Trenton Historical Society, singing of national anthem by a Morrisville vocalist, and presentation of colors by a Trenton-based African-American military reenactors group.

Most Challenging Traffic Phase of Delaware Water Gap Express E-ZPass Project Ends: Issued a series of press releases, posted an NJ511 traffic alert and updated the agency's website to raise public awareness of a 10-day period in which the toll plaza at the Delaware Water Gap (I-80) Toll Bridge operated with only four collection lanes. The four-lane configuration resulted in traffic backups during peak driving periods, but public complaints were limited.

Complete Annual Report: Finalized all sections of the annual report on calendar year 2009. The report contains the first comprehensive essay on the Commission's history since 1953. There also is timeline of major traffic and operational milestones of the Commission's first 75 years of operation. Other articles in the report address customer services, the Compact Authorized Investment grants program, and a thorough updating of project completed or initiated under Commission's capital program in 2009.

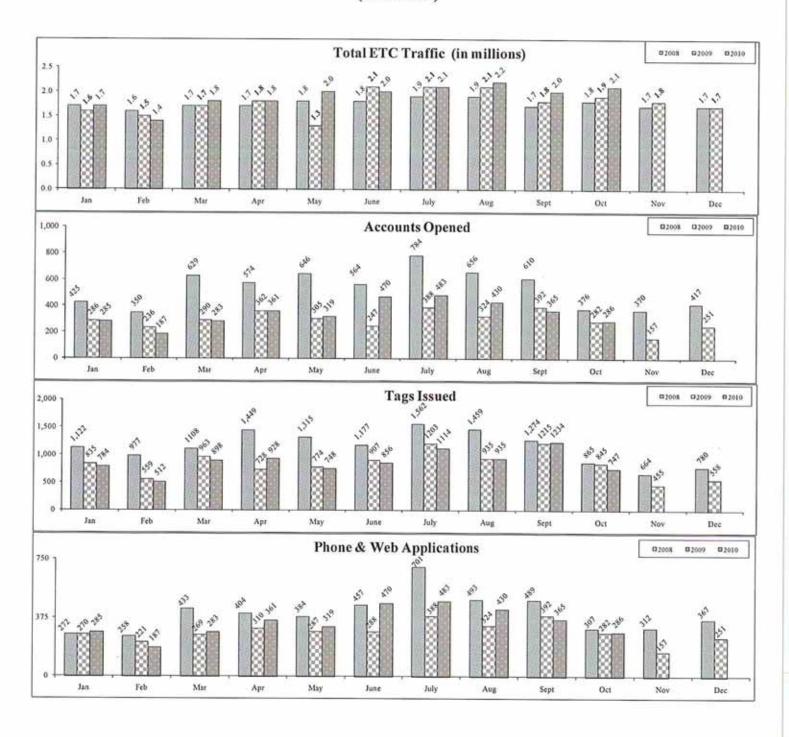

Access Control System

- On October 1, 2010, ESS personnel assisted emergency responders and other Commission personnel with monitoring a construction barge that was moored just south of the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge and broke free as a result of the rising river. The free floating barge threatened the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge until it was maneuvered around the piers and under the bridge by the barge's owner and the New Hope Fire Company. Additionally this date, ESS personnel participated in the Systems Operational Demonstration Test (SODT) for the I-78 611 ESS system.
- On October 5, 2010, ESS personnel participated in the Scudder Falls SODT test.
- On October 6, 2010, ESS personnel met with MEC and the resident Engineer for the DWG ORT project and determined the best location for the re-installation of camera DG01. The camera will be installed in such a manner to enhance its viewing capabilities of both the east and west sides of the toll plaza.
- On October 13, 2010, ESS personnel met with MEC to discuss the ESS maintenance.
- On October 21, 2010, ESS personnel and Engineering met with representatives from MEC to discuss the pending acceptance of the ESS system.

PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The Environmental Assessment (EA)/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation for the project was circulated for public comment on 12/9/09 and was made available for public review on the Commission's project website and at a number of publicized locations. Public comments were accepted until 2/4/2010, the end of the requisite public comment period.

In conjunction with the EA review process, a Public Hearing was conducted in compliance with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Act of 1970, and Section 128 Title 23 of the United States Code, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as well as New Jersey Department of Transportation policies and procedures. The design consultant AECOM, with HNTB as their Environmental Team Sub-consultant, have prepared responses to the comments received during the public comment period, which have been reviewed by the Commission. To initiate the process of requesting a FONSI from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), these responses have been submitted to PennDOT, PennDOT HDAQ (Legal), NJDOT, and FHWA Metro Philadelphia and PA Division offices for review.

At a meeting held with FHWA and PennDOT representatives on June 11, 2010 the Commission was informed that tolling will have to be made part of the proposed action for the project and the impacts from tolling the bridge will have to be addressed as part of the current EA process. The FHWA will not issue a FONSI for the project until the impacts from tolling have been assessed. A subsequent meeting/conference call on August 25, 2010 with FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT representatives confirmed that an addendum to the current EA document will have to be prepared to address the tolling impacts to the project, and make tolling of the SFB part of the proposed action for the project. The re-evaluation of the EA, and the addendum thereto, are being prepared by AECOM under the C-502A I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project Design Management Consultant Services contract.

Meeting of November 22, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The EA/Draft 4(f) Document was also distributed to each of the involved transportation agencies and the Cooperating Agencies (US Army Corps of Engineers, US EPA, PA DEP and the National Marine Fisheries Service) for their review. The Section 4(f) Evaluation, which is part of the EA, was forwarded by FHWA to their Washington D.C. Office for the Conditional Legal Sufficiency Review. This review has been completed by FHWA, and the request for the final executed Programmatic Agreement has been made by FHWA to issue Legal Sufficiency. The EA/Draft 4(f) Document will now need to address all comments received from the review agencies and to reflect tolling of the SFB as part of the proposed action. The final EA/4(f) Document will then be submitted to the FHWA's Washington D.C. Office along with a fully executed copy of the Programmatic Agreement for a final Legal Sufficiency review.

Both NJ and PA State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) have issued determinations of effects for project effects on historic and archaeological resources. A **Programmatic Agreement** to stipulate future actions required under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act has been prepared for this project. This document identifies the mitigation measures to be taken as a result of the finding of Adverse Effect to the Delaware & Raritan Canal cultural resource in NJ; and potential for adverse effect to archaeological resources in PA and NJ.

The October 1, 2010 version of the Programmatic Agreement (PA) supersedes the February 25, 2010 version. It contains a revision to a specific mitigation section within the PA Stipulations section. This revised language has been agreed to by all signatory parties to the PA. The Commissioners at the September 27, 2010 Commission Meeting approved the change to the PA stipulation II.A.2, and authorized the Executive Director to execute the PA. The revised PA was distributed for signature to two of the three executing parties—New Jersey State Preservation Officer; Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Officer (PHMC); and concurring parties—Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), and Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) on October 13, 2010. Upon receipt of these signatures the PA will be forwarded to PennDOT Counsel for approval as to Legality and Form. PennDOT will forward to FHWA, the third executing party, for signature. Final distribution of the executed PA will then take place.

The FHWA recommended additional consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) on the EA. Accordingly, a **Biological Assessment Report** (BA) was prepared for threatened and endangered (T&E) species impacts and was submitted to the NMFS in September 2008. On June 11, 2010 the Commission received the final Biological Opinion from NMFS, which includes a determination of 'No Jeopardy' from NMFS. This completes Section 7 consultation.

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FINANCIAL/LEGAL ADVISORY SERVICES FOR A P3 FOR SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

STUDY Contract No. C-393G-1

At the Commission's special meeting on August 17, 2010 the Commission announced the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Financial/Legal Advisory Services for a P3 for Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge project. This RFP was posted on the Commissions web site on August 20, 2010.

On August 27, 2010 a Non-mandatory Pre-proposal conference call with interested financial/legal firms was held at the Commission's New Hope Facility. Twenty-two (22) firms participated in the conference call. An additional 38 firms listened to a digital replay of the conference call which was available through September 3, 2010.

On September 17, 2010 ten (10) proposals were received in response to this RFP. Oral interviews were held October 18 and 21, 2010.

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

PROGRAM MANAGER Contract No. C-396A

The Program Manager, Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey, continues to support the Acquisition and Installation phase of the project involving the completion of "punch-list" items as well as the preparation and submission of project close-out documentation.

DESIGN-BUILD-MAINTAIN PROJECT Contract No. DB-396A

System Acceptance work continues on the Acquisition and Installation phase of the project including addressing "punch-list" items together with the preparation and submission of all remaining documentation.

The DBM Team is currently supporting the Maintenance phase of the project under the direction of the Commission's Electronic Security and Surveillance Department which operates the system from the Primary Control Center located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, NJ.

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ESS TECHNICAL CONSULTANT Task Order Assignment No. C-539A-1

URS Corporation provided services relating to acceptance testing of the reinstallation of the electronic surveillance / detection system performed as part of the Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge Rehabilitation (Contract No. TS-447B) project.

I-78 ROADWAY REHABILITATION CONTRACT

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-424A

Greenman-Pedersen, Incorporated (GPI) completed their work associated with this contract and submitted their final invoice. This project is closed out.

1-78 OPEN ROAD TOLLING (ORT) LANES DESIGN

DESIGN-BUILD Contract No. DB-427

I-78 ORT Construction Contract DB-427B

AP Construction, Inc. completed the punch list work. The remaining required design submittals are being finalized for submission. The close out change order and final invoice are being processed with the project continuing to be closed out.

I-78 ORT Construction Management/Construction Inspection CM-427B

Hill International continues to provide CM/CI services for this contract. The monitoring and coordinating the field activities of the contractor associated with Contract DB-427B (punch list work) was completed. The preparation of contractor's final invoice and close out/final change order is underway. The finalizing the project documentation along with the continuation of the project's close out is proceeding.

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In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project DB-427C

ACS State and Local Solutions (ACS), Commission staff and STV continue to participate in bi-weekly progress meetings. As needed, ACS participates in coordination conference calls with Commission staff, STV and ETC (Customer Service Center / Violation Processing Center DBOM) to coordinate the VES implementation at the Portland – Columbia and Milford – Montague Toll Bridges and the ORT implementation at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge. ACS submitted the revised Section 6 of the System Detailed Design Document for review and acceptance. The changes are related to the Class 13 software change implemented on 9/27/10. ACS submitted the revised I-78 ORT Operational Test Plan and the first draft of the VES Operational Test Plan for review. ACS is currently drafting the Operations VES & ORT Plan and the Maintenance & Service Manual.

ACS continues to participate in bi-weekly progress meetings with all involved parties for the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge ORT project. ACS removed the electronic toll collection equipment from Lane 3 at the plaza. ACS mobilized their equipment and electrician to the site and began equipment installation in the tunnel of the plaza. Additionally, ACS technicians and engineers are working off site constructing the equipment panels that will be installed in the tunnel.

ACS completed the VES Commissioning Test at the Milford - Montague Toll Bridge. VES equipment wiring termination is underway at the Portland - Columbia Toll Bridge.

ACS and TransCore met with Commission Staff to discuss their proposal to revise the software used in the conventional toll lanes system to reduce the occurrence of Cash Lane Violations. This proposal is being evaluated by Commission Staff.

ACS continues to complete predictive and preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Additionally, Commission Staff requested that ACS prepare a letter report providing guidance regarding system components that should be replaced in order to maintain the in-lane system until 2012 – 2014, the end of the systems useful life.

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Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Design-Build-Operate-Maintain Project DB-427D

Customer Service Center (CSC) operation weekly conference calls with Commission staff and ETC continue so all parties may discuss on-going and upcoming efforts, as well as issues and their resolution. Commission Staff, STV and ETC participated in a Quarterly Meeting at the CSC in Richardson, Texas. ETC has participated in conference calls with Commission staff and ACS (In-Lane Toll System DBM) to coordinate the VES implementation at the Portland – Columbia and Milford – Montague Toll Bridges and the transmission of test violation and image data to the CSC/VPC.

ETC is working to resolve an issue regarding customer overcharges. ETC staff reported incidents of patrons inquiring about unusual credit card charges. ETC's investigation traced the issue to account replenishments that began on October 2, 2010 in which 37,063 transponder accounts were incorrectly charged by the account replenishment program. In addition 723 ACH transactions were assessed but not processed. ETC was able to contact Wachovia and stop processing before any ACH charges were assessed. A data cleanup was performed and the replenishment amounts and low balance threshold values were rolled back to the original values. A credit card refund program was developed for a bulk refund processing. ETC reimbursed any NSF or credit card fees to the customer and to the Commission that were charged due to this error.

EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG TOLL BRIDGE REHABILITATION SCOPING/CONCEPT STUDY

DESIGN CONTRACT C-437A

This project was awarded to Pennoni Associates at the July 26, 2010 Commission meeting. A kick-off meeting was held with Pennoni on August 5, 2010 and full notice-to-proceed was subsequently issued. Field activities including inspection and condition assessment commenced the week of September 13, 2010 and completed by the end of September. A progress meeting was held on October 19, 2010. The Pennoni team is gathering their findings and in the initial stages of preparing condition assessment reports.

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DELAWARE WATER GAP TOLL BRIDGE (I-80) OPEN ROADTOLLING (ORT) CONSTRUCTION

DESIGN Contract No. C-440B

Stantec continues to provide post design post award services that include reviewing and responding to RFIs submitted by the contractor and reviewing and responding to technical submittals from the contractor. Additionally, Stantec participated in bi-weekly progress meetings.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-440B

AP Construction, Inc. continues to progress the work for the I-80 Open Road Tolling (ORT). Work on the ORT in the toll plaza area continues with work associated with the gantry, the roadway, median barrier and the drainage in this area ongoing. The gantry caisson drilling was found more difficult than anticipated and hence alternate foundations for the gantry (spread footings) were designed by Stantec and installed by AP Construction. The plaza work requires Toll Plaza Lanes 1, 2 and 3 being out 24/7 and also at times Lane 4. Also work on the advance sign structures (4 total) is underway. The electrical work associated with the ORT continues along with the electrical work on the new stand by generator. AP's CPM Schedule Updates No. 2 and 3 were approved. Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings continue to take place.

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ETC SYSTEM OWNERS REPRESENTATIVE Task Order Assignment No. C-455B-2

Under this Task Order Assignment STV, Incorporated has participated in meetings, conference calls and document reviews that are discussed under DB-427C In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project and DB-427D Customer Service Center / Violation Processing Center Design, Build, Operate and Maintain. This Task Order Assignment is complete and will be closed out.

PORTLAND-COLUMBIA TOLL BRIDGE FACILITY AND LOCUST STREET BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS (CONTRACT NO. T-441A)

PORTLAND BOROUGH SEWER FORCE MAIN CONNECTION AND FACILITY PARKING LOT PAVING

DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C-450B-4

This assignment is for study and design work associated with the required connection of the Portland-Columbia Toll Facility to a nearby new sanitary sewer system installed by the municipality. Additionally, the 2007 Annual Inspection Report identified the need for minor improvements and repaving of the Administration Building main parking lot, the salt storage yard lot and the access driveway and turn-around for the salt storage yard. This work has been incorporated into this assignment.

T&M made their Final Submission which was forwarded to LBG for inclusion as part of Construction Contract T-441A. Construction started on this project in June 2010 and is substantially complete. The Consultant continues to perform post design services.

PORTLAND-COLUMBIA TOLL BRIDGE SALT STORAGE FACILITY

DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C-450B-6

This assignment is for study and design work associated with a new District III salt storage facility to be constructed at Portland-Columbia Toll Bridge Maintenance Facility as described in the 2007 and 2008 Annual Inspection Reports.

T&M's final design was incorporated into the Contract T-441A bid package. Construction is now substantially complete. T&M continues to perform post design efforts associated with this assignment.

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PORTLAND-COLUMBIA TOLL BRIDGE FACILITY, LOCUST STREET REPAIRS

DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C-449A-8

The Louis Berger Group's (LBG) final design included improvements to the Locust Street Bridge and installation of toll plaza attenuating devices was incorporated into the Contract T-441A bid package along with other facility improvements as designed by T&M through assignments C-450B-6 (Salt Storage Facility) and C-450B-4 (Portland Borough Sewer Force Main Connection and Facility Parking Lot Paving).

LBG continues to perform post design efforts associated with this assignment.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Task Order Assignment No. C-454A-4

This assignment is for providing Construction Management and Inspection Staff for Contract T-441A. Carroll Engineering Corporation (Carroll) was issued a Notice-to-Proceed in early June 2010. Carroll has been coordinating field activities with the contractor, inspecting work performed to date, reviewing contractor schedules, conducting bi-weekly Progress Meetings, preparing daily reports and tracking project submittals and request for information.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-441A

This project was awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, H&G Contractors, Incorporated on April 26, 2010. H&G was provided with a Notice of Award and Limited Notice-to-Proceed on the same date. A Kick-Off Meeting was held with H&G on May 18, 2010 and Notice-to-Proceed was provided on May 24, 2010. Construction commenced in early June 2010 and at this time all field work is substantially complete. A final inspection was held on October 18, 2010. The project is being closed out.

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WASHINGTON CROSSING TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE PHASE 1 REHABILITATION & CONCEPT STUDY

DESIGN Contract No. C-442A

The project consists of repairs to the deteriorated masonry abutments, wingwalls and piers repair of scour protection measures at all piers, introduction of an aesthetic surface treatment on pier no. 2 to match the remaining piers, improvements to the sidewalk railing and replacement of the decking as well as various improvements to the approach roadways and lighting.

Design is complete, bids have been received and an award for the construction contract was made at the June 28, 2010 Commission Meeting. The project is substantially complete. Dewberry is currently performing post design services.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-442A

This project was awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, James J. Anderson Construction Company, Incorporated on June 28, 2010. Anderson was provided with a Notice of Award and Limited Notice-to-Proceed on June 29, 2010. Full Notice-to-Proceed was issued and a kick-off meeting and partnering session were held. The bridge was closed on August 9' 2010 for a scheduled 46-day duration. Pennsylvania abutment repairs, pier repairs, and miscellaneous steel repairs were all completed. The bridge was re-opened as scheduled on September 24, 2010. At this time all work is substantially complete. A final inspection was held on October 22, 2010. The project is being closed out.

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UPPER BLACK EDDY-MILFORD TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE REHABILITATION DESIGN

DESIGN Contract No. C-444A

Erdman Anthony's (EA) design services have been completed for this contract. All permits are in hand with the exception of the NJDEP Individual Flood Hazard Permit. All comments from NJDEP have been addressed and the application for this permit has been resubmitted. The Consultant has been responding promptly to RFIs and Shop Drawing submittals. EA attended the Pre-construction Meeting that was conducted on October 6, 2010 and the first Schedule Update and Progress Meetings that were conducted on October 27, 2010

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-444A

The CM/CI Consultant conducted the Pre-construction Meeting and the first Schedule Update/Progress Meeting in October 2010. The consultant has been logging RFIs and Shop Drawings, and coordinating flow of information among the construction contractor, design engineer and the Commission. The consultant will relocate to the field office in late November 2010.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-444A

Notice to Proceed was issued effective October 22, 2010. The contractor, Road-Con, has been submitting RFIs and Shop Drawings to the CM/CI Consultant for review by the Design Consultant. Road-Con will mobilize in late November 2010 and will start construction in December 2010. The bridge will be closed to traffic on January 11, 2011 for construction, per contract.

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RIEGELSVILLE TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE REHABILITATION DESIGN

DESIGN Contract No. C-445A

The Design Consultant, Amman & Whitney, (A&W) continues to respond to Requests for Information from the contractor. Shop drawing reviews and comments between the designer and contractor are ongoing. A&W also is participating in bi-weekly Progress and Schedule Update Meetings.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-445A

STV conducts Construction Status Meetings at the bridge site bi-weekly. The consultant team is actively coordinating RFIs and Shop Drawing Submittals among the contractor, the design consultant and the Commission. STV maintains the inspectors' schedules among their staff and their subconsultants' staffs, covering day and night inspection and plant fabrication activities. STV also keeps the Commission aware of contractor schedule updates as they occur.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-445A

Neshaminy Constructors has completed the open grid deck and floor system replacement in Span 3. Progress has extended into Span 2. They replace 15 feet of the deck and floor system per nightly 11 hour shutdown, utilizing a barge for removal and replacement whenever possible. Weekend shutdowns have been utilized near the abutment and pier, and at times of swift currents. During daylight hours, substructure work progresses with single lane flagging. Work began at the New Jersey abutment and is proceeding across the bridge to the Pennsylvania abutment.

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CALHOUN STREET TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE REHABILITATION PRELIMINARY DESIGN, FINAL DESIGN AND POST DESIGN SERVICES

DESIGN Contract No. C-447B

TranSystems has completed their post design support phase of this project coinciding with the construction final completion date of October 29, 2010. Submission of TranSystem's final invoice is anticipated in November 2010.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-447B

Hill International, Incorporated (Hill) is overseeing the completion of the extra traffic signal work items, remaining punch list items and providing final as-built drawings. Hill is in the process of boxing up the field office files for delivery to the Commission in preparation of closing the field office by the end of October. They are in the process of developing the final construction invoice and change order to be submitted in early November. They are also working on their "lessons learned" report and other final deliverables to close-out their contract by mid November 2010.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-447B

Neshaminy Constructors, Incorporated (NCI) of Feasterville, Pennsylvania substantially completed the bridge rehabilitation work and opened the bridge to vehicular and pedestrian traffic on the contract stipulated milestone date of September 24, 2010. A rededication ceremony was held near the PA approach to the bridge on October 12' 2010 with a ribbon cutting and unveiling of the rededication plaques. Pedestrian push buttons and additional striping were added to the PA crosswalk at the bridge due to PennDOT required changes to the traffic signal and requests by pedestrians. This additional work required an extension to the final completion date from October 8' 2010 to October 29, 2010. Neshaminy is working on the last remaining punch list items and their final invoice will be submitted in early November 2010. NCI is submitting their final construction documentation which will close-out this project.

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TOLL FACILITIES EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATOR STUDY

STUDY

Task Order Assignment No. C-450A-10

Internal distribution was completed of the Final Study Report for the Trenton-Morrisville Facility. The study's recommendations will be incorporated into the Trenton-Morrisville Upgrade project (T-466A).

NEW HOPE LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE PAVEMENT REHABILITATION AND BRIDGE REPAIRS

STUDY

Task Order Assignment No. C-453A-3

A Project Kick-Off Meeting with Gannett Fleming was conducted on May 26, 2010. A field survey review meeting was conducted with the Consultant on June 29, 2010 to brief Commission staff members with their field survey findings prior to submitting the Draft concept study report.

Draft Concept Study Report was received on July 09, 2010. A Draft report review meeting was conducted on July 23, 2010 and comments given to the Consultant. The Final Report was received on October 08, 2010 incorporating all of the Commission comments on the Draft Report. This Task Order Assignment is being closed.

The results of this study will be incorporated into the New Hope-Lambertville project, PA and NJ Approach Roadways Repairing & Route 29 Overpass Bearing Seat Replacement (T-543).

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MANUAL FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL IN WORK ZONES

DEVELOPMENT OF STANDARD MPT PLANS FOR HIGHWAY SPEED BRIDGES/ROADWAYS Task Order Assignment No. C-453B-3

T&M Associates is conducting meetings with Commission Engineering and Operations staff to review the preliminary draft submission of standard MPT plans for the use of Commission maintenance personnel, consultant engineers, and contractors performing work on or near Trenton-Morrisville, New Hope-Lambertville, I-78 & Easton Phillipsburg Toll Bridges and Scudder Falls Toll Supported Bridges.

DELAWARE WATER GAP TOLL BRIDGE MAINTENANCE GARAGE SPACE STUDY

STUDY Task Order Assignment No. C-454A-1

A Space Program Report (analysis of existing and proposed space needs) was received on August 2, 2010. This report was reviewed by Commission staff and with the Consultant at a report review that was held on August 27, 2010.

Garage addition floor plan options encompassing the proposed spaces identified in the Space Program Report are being prepared by the Consultant. As part of the Concept Study Phase, the Consultant is currently investigating the availability of utilities necessary to serve the garage addition. The Consultant will submit a draft Concept Study in early December 2010.

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FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEM AT ALL CRITICAL EQUIPMENT SPACES CONCEPT STUDY

STUDY Task Order Assignment No. C-454A-2

A Draft Concept Study Report was submitted by Carroll Engineering, reviewed by Commission staff, and a review meeting with the Consultant was held.

As part of the review process, the Engineering staff has surveyed other E-ZPass Interagency Group members in order to gather information on other agencies' practices regarding fire protection of toll plaza tunnels housing electronic toll collection equipment. Findings were shared with the Consultant on August 13, 2010 and incorporated into the Final Report. Final Concept Study Report was received on October 19, 2010 and it is currently being reviewed to verify that all of the Commission comments on the Draft Report have been incorporated.

TRENTON MORRISVILLE TOLL BRIDGE FACILITY BUILDINGS STRUCTURAL REPAIRS

STUDY Task Order Assignment No. C-454A-5

A Project Kick-Off Meeting was conducted on June 2, 2010. Field Surveys were concluded on June 10, 2010 and a field survey review meeting was conducted on June 23, 2010.

A Draft Concept Study Report was received on July 27, 2010, reviewed by Commission staff, and comments were shared with the Consultant during a Draft Report review meeting on August 27, 2010. Final Concept Study Report was received on October 15, 2010 incorporating all of the Commission comments on the Draft Report. This Task Order Assignment is being closed.

The report recommends various repairs to the stone façade's mortar joints, roof coping seams, and concrete areas damaged by water intrusion over the years. The report's recommendations will be incorporated into the Trenton-Morrisville Building Renovation (T-519A)

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DELAWARE WATER GAP TOLL BRIDGE BEARING REMEDIATION AND DECK STUDY

DESIGN Contract No. C-472A

The Consultant, Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA), has begun their construction phase services part of their contract with the award of the construction contract to Allied Painting, Inc. They have provided conformed sets of construction plans and specifications and have begun answering requests for information. CWA will participate in the upcoming Preconstruction and Partnering meetings.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-472A

Construction Management/Construction Inspection services for the Delaware Water Gap Bridge Rehabilitation project were advertised on July 10, 2010. Five (5) Consultants submitted LOIs and four (4) were short listed for interviews. Of the three firms recommended by the technical evaluation team for consideration, STV Incorporated of Trenton, New Jersey was selected by the Commission and awarded the CM/CI contract at the October 2010 Commission meeting. STV took over the CM/CI responsibilities from the CPMC after receiving their Limited Notice to Proceed on October 27, 2010.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-472A

Allied Painting, Inc. (API), of Cherry Hill, New Jersey was awarded the Delaware Water Gap Bridge Rehabilitation Project at the September 2010 Commission meeting. API submitted a preliminary schedule, Insurance and subcontractor qualifications with their Insurance being approved on October 18, 2010. They began investigating areas to set up field offices for themselves and the CM/CI and were issued their full Notice to Proceed on October 27, 2010.

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DISTRICT 1, 2 & 3 SUBSTRUCTURE REPAIR AND SCOUR REMEDIATION

DESIGN Contract No. C-476A

The Design Consultant, STV, Incorporated (STV) is continuing to provide postdesign services. STV is responding to Requests for Information (RFI) from the contractor. Shop drawing reviews and comments between the designer and CM/CI are ongoing. STV participated in progress meetings for both construction contracts. STV continued to provide support in the field.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-476A

The Delaware River Join Toll Bridge Commission issued a Notice of Award and Limited Notice-to-Proceed to the Trumbull Corporation (Trumbull) effective July 27, 2010. Trumbull is working out of the field office for T/TS-476A-1, located in Washington Crossing, PA, and the field office for T/TS-476A-2, located in Easton, PA. Trumbull continues to provide CM/CI services for this contract which includes: staffing to inspect the various work activities, preparation of contractor invoices, conducting and documenting progress and schedule meetings and the tracking of submittals, RFIs and correspondence. Trumbull performed an independent safety evaluation of both construction contracts in October.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T/TS-476A-1

Kyle Conti Construction (KCC) was issued a Notice-to-Proceed effective September 1, 2010 for work to be performed at District 1 Bridges. KCC mobilized at the two (2) New Hope-Lambertville bridges and the Centre Bridge-Stockton Toll Supported Bridge and is proceeding with above-water repairs at these locations. KCC constructed cofferdams and commenced below water repairs at the Centre Bridge-Stockton Toll Supported Bridge. KCC worked double shifts in October to meet the October 15, 2010 milestone for installation of the cofferdams at the three PA piers at this bridge. KCC will mobilize at the Lower Trenton Toll Supported Bridge and the Calhoun Street Toll Supported Bridge in November. Work is proceeding on schedule.

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CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T/TS-476A-2

A.P. Construction (AP) was issued Notice-to-Proceed effective September 1, 2010 for work to be performed in Districts 2 and 3.

AP mobilized at all seven bridges in their contract and they are working on above water and below water repairs at the bridges. AP will complete cofferdam and concrete work at the Portland – Columbia Pedestrian Bridge and the Northampton Street Toll Supported Bridge in November. Work is proceeding on schedule.

MUSSEL SURVEY Task Order Assignment No. C-453B-4

Under the New Jersey Structural/Civil Task Order Agreement, T&M Associates was issued a Notice-to-Proceed effective September 7, 2010 for underwater freshwater mussel surveys and relocation work to be performed in Districts 1, 2 and 3 in support of the T/TS-476A-1 & 2 Substructure Repair and Scour Remediation Projects. T&M obtained the requisite Scientific Collection Permits to perform the surveys and relocations of endangered freshwater mussel species, as required by the construction permits. The surveys were completed in October 2010. T&M Associates will submit their formal report in November 2010.

UNDERWATER INSPECTIONS AT SCOUR CRITICAL BRIDGES Task Order Assignment No. C-453B-5

T&M Associates was issued Notice to Proceed, effective October 5, 2010 for Underwater Inspections at the remaining Bridges rated as Scour Critical but not included in the current scour repair contracts (T/TS-476A-1 and T/TS-476A-2) due to permitting requirements. The Kick-off Meeting was held on September 17, 2010. T&M Associates hired W.J. Castle to perform the underwater inspections, while T&M provided oversight, engineering, and reporting. The field work for the base contract was completed on October 20, 2010. T&M Associates will prepare the final report in November and provide data for the Commission's General Engineering Consultant's input into the bridge management system (BMS).

Meeting of November 22, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DESIGN MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT (DMC) SERVICES FOR THE I-95/SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

DMC TOLLING STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT SERVICES

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2C

The Commission at its April 26, 2010 Meeting authorized the Executive Director to move expeditiously to accomplish the Goals and Short Term Activities enumerated in the Statement of Intent for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project. This Statement of Intent, amongst other things, included the development of a strategy to implement All Electronic Cashless tolling (AECT) on the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge.

AECOM received a Limited Notice-to-Proceed letter was issued on May 14, 2010 effective April 26, 2010. The Limited NTP allowed work on the following tasks;

- · Establishing a timeline for tolling implementation;
- · Preparation of tolling applications and/or agreements with FHWA;
- · Commencing the Toll/Traffic Diversion Study;
- · Preparation of the RFLOI for the Traffic and Revenue Study.

On July 26, 2010 the Commission's New Jersey Counsel, Florio Perrucci Steinhardt & Fader, L.L.C. and Pennsylvania Counsel, Fox Rothschild LLP each provided a favorable opinion as to the Commission's authority to toll the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge, with respect to the Commission's Compact. These letters of opinion from each counsel were subsequently forwarded to the FHWA. The FHWA is currently reviewing these legal opinions.

The TOA was fully executed by the Commission on July 1, 2010. The first draft of the Toll/Traffic Diversion Study Report was submitted on July 20, 2010 to the Commission for review and comment. Subsequent drafts of the report were prepared and submitted for review on July 28' 2010, August 11, 2010 and August 13, 2010. The final draft of the Toll/Traffic Diversion Study Report was submitted on August 25, 2010. AECOM briefed the Commissioners at the September 2010 Commission Committee Meeting as to the findings of the study.

AECOM has coordinated with Commission staff on the preparation of an RFLOI for a prepared an RFLOI for a Level 3 (Investment Grade) Traffic and Revenue Study. This RFLOI will be issued under contract number C-549A.

Meeting of November 22, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DMC PROJECT DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2D

The Commission at its April 26, 2010 authorized the Executive Director to move expeditiously to accomplish the Goals and Short Term Activities enumerated in the Statement of Intent for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project. This Statement of Intent, amongst other things, included the advancement of schedule-critical engineering/permitting activities to meet the objectives outlined in the Statement of Intent.

This TOA was fully executed by the Commission on July 1, 2010 and includes the necessary professional services to complete certain priority items of work that are critical to the overall schedule of the project. These priority tasks include environmental permitting; right-of-way (ROW) acquisition; archeological work necessary to obtain cultural resource clearance for the project; Stormwater Management design and permit plan preparation; and transition of key public involvement tasks from the Environmental Assessment Phase (Commission Contract C-393A) to the Design Management Consultant (DMC; C-502A).

In addition, this TOA includes DMC Services to support the Commission's twostep Professional Services procurement process. This process includes the preparation of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) document and a Request for Proposal (RFP) document for Final Design and Construction Services for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project.

Permit Pre-application Meetings have been held with the Pennsylvania DEP, USACE, NJDEP, the D&R Canal Commission, NJDEP Green Acres and the Bucks County Soil Conservation District. A review meeting was also held with Lower Makefield Township to discuss their stormwater design requirements. Approval of the Phase I/II Archeological Reports, including the Phase III work plans have been received from PHMC and NJSHPO. The Phase III data recovery for the NJ site began in early October. In conjunction with the Phase III work effort, the Commissioners at the September 27, 2010 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute a License Agreement with AECOM that allows for the use of the Commission owned house along River Road in PA as a field office for the required archaeological activities. AECOM staff occupied the house in late October. Work continues on the property surveys associated with impacted properties; and on natural drainage features to support the permit plan preparation. Work also continues on the stormwater design and the various other tasks associated with this Task Order Assignment.

Meeting of November 22, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT DEPARTMENT October 2010

General

In October, the Compact Authorized Investment department won another award for the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission. This is the third award bestowed to the Commission for the work done through the CAI projects. The application was written and submitted by the CAI director to compete for the Community Reinvestment Award granted by the WCEDC of the Warren County Regional Chamber of Commerce for the Phillipsburg's South Main St. Improvement project, the Belvidere's Water Street Improvement project, the Alpha Improvements of Edge St. project, and the Pohatcong's Riegelsville Transportation Improvement project. Mr. Frank Tolotta and Mr. Glenn Reibman collaborated with this award submission and Mr. Joseph Donnelly attended the award ceremony. This is another milestone completed by widely acclaimed CAI program.

In October, the CAI director gave a PowerPoint presentation on the status of the CAI program and projects during the Commissioners' Committee meeting. The presentation included recently completed projects, CAI projects in the progress of being completed, and projects that will need an extension in 2011. In October the department held a meeting with Mr. Frank Tolotta and the PA and NJ due diligence engineers to discuss projects that are still pending determination and meet the CAI requirements. It was recommended, by Mr. Tolotta, for the department to prepare an updated financial picture of the CAI remaining funds and the pending projects submitted by municipalities for funding requests.

Pennsylvania

- Milford Borough, PA During the month of October, the Borough continued to make progress
 with preparing the plans and specifications to obtain the necessary permits to complete the Storm
 Water Restoration Project by the due date of December 31, 2010. The project was advertised for
 construction bids on October 30th and November 1st. Bids will be received on November 15th.
 The Borough's grant award for the project is \$163,475.00.
- 2. Smithfield Township, PA The Township continues to make progress on completing the plans and specifications for the *Intermunicipal Trail Project* in order to obtain the necessary permits from the County Conservation District, the Pennsylvania Historical Museum Commission (PHMC) and the PA Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) to complete the project. However, the Township has recently submitted a request to the Commission for an extension to complete the project in 2011 due to additional permitting that has been required, which the Township did not originally anticipate.

The construction of the original Pedestrian Improvements project is substantially complete and is waiting for a PennDOT final inspection. The contractor, Grace Industries, has installed the ADA improvements as part of the grant approved by the Commission for the project. As indicated in the past, the ADA features that were installed include detectable warning surfaces at various

locations, along with a colored surface overlay for the sidewalk underneath the River Road underpass. Only a few minor punch list items remain to be completed for the project, including a potential alternate material for the ADA sidewalk treatment near the overpass. It is anticipated that this project will be completed by December 31, 2010.

3. Delaware Water Gap Borough, PA – The CAI department continues to work with Delaware Water Gap Borough to revise the scope of their \$130,000 grant award originally intended for the Route 611 Traffic Signalization Project. Recently, the Borough proposed three (3) new projects including 1) Traffic Calming along Broad Street and Main Street, estimated cost of \$10,000, 2) Continuation of sidewalk and streetscape improvements along the frontage of the Castle Inn on Waring Drive, estimated cost of \$30,000.00, and since the Borough's request for the well house #4 does not meet the CAI criteria and the Borough has been notified that this project was not approved; therefore, in October the Borough submitted a revised request number 3) to complete paving on several Borough roadways in lieu of the well house replacement project. The Borough has also submitted a request to the Commission for an extension to complete the grant project in 2011. The Borough's revised scope of work request as well as the extension request are currently under review by the CAI department.

The *Broad Street Sidewalk Improvements Project* is substantially complete with a few punchlist items remaining, as well as a final inspection by PennDOT. It is anticipated that this project will be completed by December 31, 2010. As previously mentioned, the *Waring Drive/Delaware Ave. Drainage Improvements Project* was completed in August 2009.

- 4. Portland Borough, PA The Borough submitted a revised application, in the amount of \$153,782.66 for Streetscape Improvements on State Street and Delaware Avenue, in the hope that the project will be reconsidered by the Commissioners for funding. The revised application is a scaled-down version of their original application, which was submitted in the amount of \$515,701.40. The revised application is currently under review by the CAI department. The original application was discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date. The two other CAI funded projects have been completed. Closeout of the Park & Walk grant is currently in process by the CAI department.
- Lower Mount Bethel, PA During the month of October the Township received bids for the Park & Ride Trail Project. The construction contract was awarded to the low bidder, Kobalt Construction, in the amount of \$45,770.00. It is anticipated that construction of the trail will begin in November 2010 and be completed by December 31, 2010.
- 6. Easton, PA The City of Easton continue its work on Riverside Park and Scott Pak. It is also completing all clearances and has started the new project for the traffic improvements in the North 3rd St. Corridor, which was approved by the Commissioners with some modifications at its general meeting on April 26th. Alternate bids for additional improvement work was submitted by the City of Eaton for work on Commission's property on Snyder Street and in the adjacent area of this project that the Commission has decided not to pursue now due to the anticipated reconstruction project on the EP Route 22 Toll Bridge.

Pennsylvania (continued)

In January a change order was approved by the CAI department to include new lighting and signage along Larry Holmes Drive south of the Northampton Street Bridge. This work has been completed.

The construction contracts for Phases 1 and 2 of the *Waterfront Improvements* project has been ongoing through the summer months. This includes a "road diet" for Larry Holmes Drive, high visibility pedestrian crosswalks, intersection improvements at Northampton Street and Larry Holmes Drive to improve pedestrian accommodation, along with a sewer line connection from the Commission's Construction of the ADA Curb Ramps and Decorative Crosswalks, which is part of the *Pedestrian Pathways/Intersection Enhancements and Northampton St. Bridge Bike Path* grant, was completed in September 2009. The City has also purchased and installed the materials for the Bike Path Extension. The curbs and sidewalks abutting the Northampton Street Bridge have been reconstructed. The change order submitted to the CAI department to add new lighting poles in the Scott Park area of the project was approved and completed.

7. Williams Township, PA – The 1-78 & Morgan Hill Road Interchange Traffic Signalization Project was completed in January 2010. To date, \$374,014.13 of \$430,590.00 (87% of total grant amount) has been reimbursed to the Township. The Township is currently in the process of preparing their final reimbursement request submission to the CAI department for the project.

In the Spring, the Township submitted six (6) applications that were discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but have not been awarded to date. We would also note that it was determined that the Belmont Street Reconstruction and the Hilton Street Improvements projects do not satisfy the required characteristics of the CAI program as they cannot be completed by the December 31, 2010 deadline; however, is an extension is granted, these projects can be reevaluated.

- 8. Riegelsville Borough, PA The Borough continues to make progress on completing the plans and specifications in obtaining the necessary permits to complete the *Delaware Canal Footbridge Lighting Project*. The Borough has indicated that they intend to advertise the project the week of November 8th and bids will be received on November 17th.
- 9. Solebury Township, PA The contractor for the Walton Drive Bridge Replacement Project continues to make progress on the construction of the project. As previously discussed, at the September Commissioners meeting a resolution was approved for alternate #2 of the original project, which permitted a change of scope to repave the entire length of Walton Drive. It is anticipated that this project will be completed by December 31, 2010.Construction of the Route 202 Trail and Park project began on August 4, 2008 by K.C. Construction, and was completed in September 2009. To date, \$1,204,444.60 of \$1,755,150.00 has been reimbursed by the CAI Department (69%). A reimbursement request, in the amount of \$326,958.65, is currently under review, awaiting further documentation from the Township.

10. New Hope Borough, PA – The Borough has purchased the lighting fixtures and poles through the COSTARS program for the Main St. Bridge Lighting Project, which was approved this Summer in the amount of \$84,815.00. Additionally, during the month of October the Borough awarded the construction contract for the installation of the lighting fixtures to Armour & Sons Electric, in the amount of \$29,860.00.

The construction of the *Bridge St. Traffic Signals project* to Armour & Sons Electric is substantially complete and is anticipated to be completed by December 31, 2010 due to the need to include ADA compliant pedestrian facilities as per the direction of PennDOT. To date the Borough has been reimbursed \$412,798.75 of \$446,404.00 (92% of total grant amount).

11. Falls Township, PA – The original traffic signal installation and modernization project is complete and a final reimbursement request in the amount of \$77,876.00 was approved in December 2008. The Township utilized \$332,571.00 of the \$335,000.00 grant award.

In the Spring 2010, the Township submitted another application for the *Tyburn Road & New Falls Road Traffic Signal Upgrade Project*, in the amount of \$108,140.00. This application was considered at the June Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date.

 Upper Makefield Township, PA – The Township continues to make progress on preparing the bid package required to complete Gateway Park-Village Streetscape Phase 2 Project. It is anticipated that the project will be advertised for bids in November 2010 and completed by December 31, 2010.

The Washington Crossing Gateway Project was completed in the Spring 2010. To date the Township has been reimbursed \$1,447,000.00 of \$1,447,000.00 (100% of total grant amount).

13. Lower Makefield, PA – The Township awarded the construction contract for the Black Rock Pedestrian Trail Project during the month of October to S&H Landscaping, in the amount of \$106,307.00. The project is currently in construction and the Township is working diligently to complete this project by the due date of December 31, 2010.

The Traffic Signal project at the intersection of Yardley-Newtown Rd & Creamery Rd is complete. A final reimbursement request has been processed by the Commission and the original grant is closed out.

 Bristol Borough, PA – The construction of the Traffic Signals Revitalization Project was completed by Armour & Sons Electric in July 2009 and the project has been closed out. The Borough utilized \$1,333,843.28 of \$1,334,450.00 grant (99.9% of total grant amount).

In the Spring 2010, the Borough submitted another application for the *Decorative Crosswalks Project*, in the amount of \$423,126.12. This application was considered at the June Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date.

Pennsylvania (continued)

 Yardley, PA – The CAI department has reimbursed the entire grant amount of \$234,217.00 to the Borough for its Yardley Borough Road Improvements Project and the project has been closed out.

The Borough of Yardley in conjunction with the Landmark Towns organization submitted an application to install Wayfinding Signage to/from and through New Hope Borough, Bristol Borough, and Morrisville Borough in the amount of \$872,969.00. This application was discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but was not awarded.

16. Morrisville, PA – The Borough recently submitted eight new roads, lighting, and traffic signal improvements applications. The Borough agreed to submit a new grant application for the Moreau Street Rehabilitation project, in the amount of \$360,000, and one for Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk replacement project. Both of these applications were approved. Work is going well on the Moreau Street Rehabilitation project and the contract agreement is being completed for full execution of the Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk Replacement project. Engineering plans for this work are still in progress.

The four originally funded projects in Morrisville are completed.

New Jersey

- Montague, NJ The relocation of the emergency heliport from the Park & Ride location has been completed. The construction of the Park & Ride was to begin the week of October 25 and is scheduled to be completed by the end of November 2010.
- Knowlton, NJ After acquiring all the necessary permits, including the DEP permit, the
 municipality bid the job construction, but only one qualified bid came in and the committee will
 re-advertise the job with an opening date of October 15th. The contract has been awarded with
 construction to begin on November 1 with a completion date of November 30.
- Belvidere, NJ The Water Street Improvements project was completed and closed out in May of 2010. In May the final reimbursement request has been processed and the project is in the process of being closed out.
- 4. Phillipsburg, NJ The second phase of the project started construction in May. The sidewalk reconstruction part of the project was completed, only pending part of this job are the trees planting and few punch list items. The agreement for the Extension of South Main Street project –Phase 3 is next, but the municipality is contemplating asking for a project completion extension until the Spring of 2010. This project was awarded a grant for \$997,962 at the Commissioners' February meeting. Reimbursements requests of this project are continually being processed.

The original, Phase I project, was completed and a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on December 3, 2008.

New Jersey (continued)

- Pohatcong NJ A new application was received by the CAI Department for Resurfacing of River Road. This application was presented to the Commissioners at their February 2010 meeting. This request was not awarded. The two granted projects to Pohatcong Township have been completed.
- Holland, NJ Holland was awarded a CAI grant for the resurfacing of Mt. Joy Road and has
 requested an extension for the work to be completed by the spring of 2011.

Holland completed and was fully paid for its previous CAI project. This project is in the process of being closed out.

- 7. Milford, NJ –The Borough was awarded a grant for the repair and resurfacing of Honeysuckle Lane off Bridge Street. The Borough's staff is working on completing the final designs for this project. They have requested an extension until next year to complete this project. The Bridge Street Improvements project is complete.
- 8. Frenchtown, NJ Since no major development has been noted for over 2 years regarding the acquisition of the property for the Village Green Park, the CAI department met with Mayor Ron Sworen to discuss the disposition of this project. Since this meeting the Mayor has submitted a new application for resurfacing and pedestrian improvements of Bridge St., Race St. and South Harrison Street. This new application is being reviewed by the due diligence engineer and appears to meet the requirements of the CAI program.

The Park and Ride project is complete.

9. Lambertville, NJ – During the June's Commission meeting the Commissioner's approved a new grant for Lambertville's Perry St. Road Reconstruction project. The CAI department has been advised that the City would like an extension for this project until the Spring of 2011. The other outstanding projects are geared to be completed by December 31, 2010. These projects are: Delevan Street Rd. Reconstruction project, McGreary's Alley Reconstruction project, and South

Franklin Street Traffic calming project. Construction work is in progress during the Fall until completion by the December 31, 2010 deadline.

The City of Lambertville has completed eight projects since the beginning of the CAI program.

- Stockton, NJ The funded CAI projects for the Bridge Street Improvements project is completed. The municipality received a transportation construction project award for its CAI project.
- West Amwell, NJ An application for Rocktown Hill Road Improvement Project to the approach to the intersection of Route 31 was approved for \$100,000 by the Commissioners at their January 25, 2010 meeting. The Township is working on completing the project by the deadline of December 31, 2010.

Meeting of November 22, 2010

New Jersey (Continued)

The Section 11 of Rocktown-Lambertville Road Reconstruction project is now completed. The Section 12 and Section 13 Road Reconstruction project are also completed. Reimbursement requests continue to be processed for sections 12, and 13 of the completed projects.

12. Delaware Twp, NJ - The Township received a new grant for the Improvements and Resurfacing of Federal Twist Rd. and to install drainage improvements and erosion control within the existing road right of way. The Agreement is being process.

The Previous CAI projects were completed. The CAI department and the municipality are in the process of closing out the projects. The municipality has made a request to utilize the remainder of their grant to chip seal the grant project and the Due Diligent engineer is still working with the municipality to ascertain the CAI qualification of this additional project cost.

13. Hopewell, NJ – The Township was approved for a grant application for the design and construction of sidewalk replacement in the Village of Titusville. This application was awarded a grant by the Commissioners at their April 2010 meeting. The Township will need an extension until the spring of 2011 to complete this project.

The ADA Ramps and Walkway project was complete. The CAI department is in the process of closing out of the project.

- Ewing, NJ The Township was awarded a grant Wilburtha Rd. Improvement project. The project will be awarded in October 2010 and it is expected to be completed by December 31, 2010.
- 15. Trenton, NJ CAI Director and the due diligence engineer met with representatives of the City, the County, the NJDOT, representatives from the new Mercer County Courthouse development in Trenton, and the City engineers from AECOM to discuss the status of the project and coordinate staging of both projects. A subsequent meeting is to be held with Commission engineers to discuss proposed configurations of the three traffic signals owned by the Commission on Warren Street in Trenton and the traffic analysis on the construction area completed by EACOM engineers. There has been over \$200,000 worth of work done in this project and the reimbursement request is in the process.
- Alpha NJ The Alpha's and Pohatcong's Reconstruction of Edge Rd. project has been completed and is in the process of been closed out.
- 17. Kingwood, NJ The Township's Reconstruction of Tumble Falls Road was awarded a grant for \$373,000.00 and the contract agreement has been executed. The project has been awarded and is under construction and should be completed by the deadline of December 31, 2010. Most of the construction work especially the roadway repaving, is being done by municipal forces.
