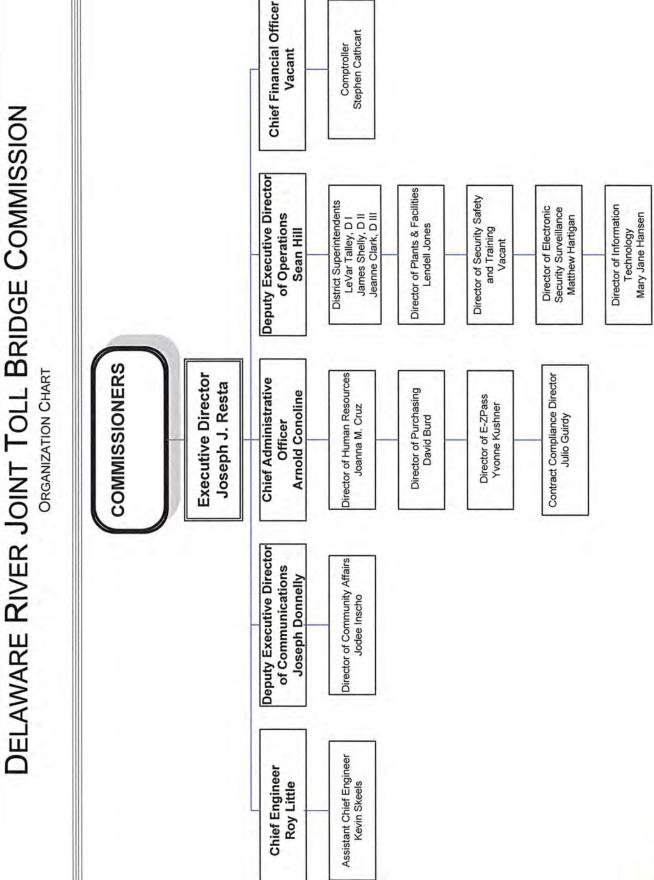

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good morning. With the turn of weather to spring conditions, the Commission has shifted its focus from winter storms to projects, inspections and annual maintenance;

"A key focus for us right now are our annual bridge inspections. Federal Highway Administration regulations require all bridges in the country to be inspected at least once every two years. To comply with this directive, the Commission examines its seven toll bridges in odd-numbered years and its 13 non-toll bridges in even-numbered years. So, this year's inspections are taking place at our non-tolled crossings and their respective associated facilities, such as bridge monitor shelters, walkways and approach roadways. Personnel from our general engineering consulting firm are working closely with our engineering staff and maintenance employees to do this work. The Lower Trenton Bridge was inspected two weeks ago. The focus of attention last week was the New Hope-Lambertville Bridge. Today they are inspecting the Washington Crossing Bridge's top deck.

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Tomorrow, they will move on to the Upper Black Eddy-Milford Bridge followed by the Riverton-Belvidere Bridge next week. The inspections will wrap up with the issuance of a detailed report that will be provided to Commissioners and then made public later this year;

"We continue to advance the public outreach and design activities for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. We gave a general project presentation at a Mid-Jersey Chamber of Commerce breakfast meeting two weeks ago. The audience primarily consisted of executives and business owners in close proximity to I-95 in Mercer County, N.J. We showed the project's informational video and a PowerPoint presentation that reinforced three key points: The project's purpose and need, How construction will be staged so traffic can keep moving unimpeded across the bridge during peak travel periods, And further explanation of allelectronic tolling and our commitment to hold hearings once a toll rate is established for the bridge in the coming weeks. We expect to do more presentations like this when the opportunities arise with key stakeholder organizations like chambers of commerce and large regional employers;

"This coming Wednesday night, a different sort of outreach meeting is scheduled. It is a formal presentation specifically arranged for purposes of announcing the results of supplemental noise analysis recently conducted along several sections of the bridge's I-95 approach in Lower Makefield Township, PA. The target audience will be residents in neighborhoods along I-95 where noise abatement walls were previously determined to be unwarranted.

"Prior sound readings at those locations showed these areas did not meet the required thresholds for installations of noise abatement walls. Supplemental noise readings were recently collected at these locations and modeling analysis updated as part of complying with provisions of the project's Environmental Assessment documentation. As you may recall, a group of Lower Makefield residents attended our December meeting to express their concerns about the absence of noise walls near their neighborhoods. We subsequently committed to collect additional noise readings and announce the findings at a public meeting

"There is a notable procurement item on today's executive agenda — new traffic counters. For about the past 20 years or so, the Commission has used an Inductive Loop Detection System (ILDS) of embedded or saw-cut loops to electronically count traffic at its 18 vehicular bridges. The exception are the westbound lanes at the seven toll bridges where the E-ZPass Electronic Collection System is utilized to provide traffic counts. Our ILDS system has become increasing unreliable at some locations. Compounding matters, the software and methods of communications to interpret, share and store traffic count information have become obsolete. For example, the current system involves data being transferred over dial-up telephone lines. A recent engineering study was undertaken and it confirmed that our current

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system is beyond its useful life and needs to upgraded or replaced. Accordingly, a resolution prepared for Commissioners' consideration today would authorize the purchase of a replacement system consisting of Remote Traffic Microwave Sensors, auxiliary equipment, servers and software. This modernized Traffic Count System would afford us the lowest installation, operation and maintenance costs and a high level of accuracy. It will feature non-intrusive microwave radar devices to count vehicles at our various bridges. These counting units will be installed above and to the side of the approaches to our facilities. This will allow for improved maintenance with no roadway closures. Installation of the new system will be done by our maintenance forces, another savings point. Once installed, the radar-based counters will transmit data to a new server via cell-tower technology. This type of technology is not experimental; it is being used by other transportation agencies around the region;

"In closing today, I want to remind everyone that our next meeting will take place in only three weeks — on May 18 — due to the Memorial Day holiday.

"Please enjoy the weather in the meantime."

Commissioner Laurenti addressed the meeting and said

"I have two questions. In reference to Scudder Falls. The first is, what were the types of questions that we received at the Mid-Jersey Chamber?"

Executive Director Resta then replied:

"The types of questions, we had actually were from some folks from Titusville, New Jersey, they were concerned about traffic during construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge. Titusville is north of the Washington Crossing Bridge, so they were referencing a diversion study that was done some years ago that did not include any traffic diversions through Titusville, and they were wondering if Titusville was going to be impacted. We have a very low likelihood, that would be the case, and we relayed the answer as such. Other questions were really about how much the toll is going to be and what's going to happen with the traffic. So we are working our way towards the proposed toll structure that will be put forth to Commissioners soon, once we are done our analysis of our design. As far as traffic, we are already sequencing in keeping two lanes of traffic, existing traffic pattern in each direction during peak period traffic."

Commissioner Laurenti then said:

"And then the second question. Would you send after the meeting, the supplemental noise analysis? Could you send that to the Commissioners?"

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Executive Director Resta replied:

"Yes. It will be posted on the website, but we will make sure we send it to Commissioners as well."

Chairman Lavery then invited any further questions.

Commissioner Siptroth addressed the meeting and said:

"Thank you, Chairman. Regarding the contract of the traffic counter program. I should have asked this question earlier. Since we're using a cell phone technology to disseminate the information that's projected, is there a provision in the system that the data is stored."

Executive Director Resta replied

"Yes. It is stored locally before it is transmitted. It's transmitted on a schedule, so any time that there is any kind of blip in the network, it gets stored and then gets sent."

Commissioner Siptroth then said

"Thank you. And that's being retained-that stored information?

Executive Director Resta replied

"The stored information is just part of what you get in the system. It is in the equipment itself,"

Chairman Lavery invited any further questions. No further questions were presented.

Executive Director Resta addressed the meeting and said:

"Mr. Chairman, just as a reminder, this is actually the purchase order being placed with Signal Services, Incorporated, West Chester, Pennsylvania. The amount is \$268,724. And this is part of a cooperative purchasing agreement through the Department of General Services Pennsylvania's COSTARS program."

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Van Vliet moved and Commissioner Siptroth seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

Thank you Commissioner. Employees go through a process. The annual Promotion's require certain criteria. Maintenance Worker III to Maintenance Worker II requires the acquisition of a commercial driver's license which enables the Commission to essentially enjoy the fruits of the respective employee's labor in that during snow collection season, over the winter season, we get to actually have folks work our road equipment to clean the roads. To go from Maintenance Worker II to a Maintenance Worker I requires the acquisition of a trade, and the employees in maintenance become more highly skilled and, obviously, the Commission enjoys the fruits of that labor as well.

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for March 2016 in comparison to the March 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of March.

Analysis of March 2016 / March 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 9.59 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected an 8.79 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated an 11.97 percent increase.

Analysis of March 2016 / March 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 331,822 vehicles, or 11.06 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 34,299 vehicles, or 7.77 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 297,523 vehicles, or 11.63 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for March 2016 was 107,483 total vehicles as compared to 96,779 total vehicles in March 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for March 2016 increased by 105,139 vehicles, or 4.17 percent as compared to March 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for March 2016 was 84,668 vehicles as compared to 81,276 in March 2015.

Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 9.51 percent increase through the first three months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 3.09
 percent increase for the first three months of 2016 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for March 2016 reflected a 12.60 percent increase as the result of the increase of 80,847 cars and 3,844 trucks when compared to March 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), increases of 13,261 cars and 1,726 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 10.25 percent for March 2016 as compared to March 2015.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 11.00 percent in total toll traffic for the month of March 2016 compared to March 2015 as the result of increases of 80,313 cars and 16,210 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 32,147 passenger vehicles and 2,797 trucks combined to generate an 8.32 percent increase in total toll traffic for March 2016.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced an 11.66 percent increase in total toll traffic during March 2016 as a result of increases of 8,295 automobiles and 2,501 trucks compared to March 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the increase of 71,012 passenger vehicles combined with the increase of 7,012 trucks to generate an overall increase of 11.11 percent in total toll traffic for March 2016 as compared to March 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), increases of 11,648 passenger vehicles and 209 trucks combined to produce a 13.22 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of March 2016.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of March 2016 and the three month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2016 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,377,341 for the month of March. For the 2016 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$13,492,787 or 85.1% of the YTD operating budget.

All of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budget except for Overtime. Overtime Wages exceed the YTD budget by \$2,455 or 1.8% due to the of adverse weather activity during January 2016. This expense item is anticipated to come into line with the budget during the next several months.

There were no unusual expenses or charges during the month of March.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

MARCH 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of March, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 69 purchase orders in the total amount of \$4,456,307.06. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 30 price inquiries were sent out for 10 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.0 per order (30/10= 3.0).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of March 2016 are shown below:

- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, at the request of the Electronic Security & Surveillance Department, for the Motorola radio system upgrade in the total amount of \$3,439,395.93, for the Commission.
- ➤ Nine (9) Purchase Orders were let, for vehicles & equipment in the total amount of \$626,196.74, consisting of four (4) 2016 Ford Explorers, two (2) wheel Loaders, one (1) bucket truck, a truck mounted attenuator and a chipper, under the 2016 approved Capital Budget for various Commission Facilities.
- > Two (2) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$106,900.00 for guiderail repairs and replacements at the I-78 Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$17,904.00 for the landscaping project at the Commission's I-78 Welcome Center.
- > Two (2) Purchase Orders were let, at the request of the IT Department, in the total amount of \$16,184.00 for the Commission's software renewal needs.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

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ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF MARCH 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. X Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. We received approval to issue a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Commission Staff will prepare a Purchase Order.
- 3. TransCore submitted the draft Engineering Plans and the System Detailed Design Document for review and comment. TransCore facilitated bi-weekly project status meetings, demonstration of the toll collector lane terminal, and attended a test of the proposed currency counter with Commission Staff. A spare LED sign was shipped to TransCore for interface testing. Test E-ZPass transponders were ordered and provided to TransCore for their use in the Factory Acceptance Test and the Onsite First Installation Test. Standard Commission proximity cards were provided to TransCore for testing as well.

Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is underway. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in February 2017.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee and Policy Committee meetings.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-ZPass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.

STATUS UPDATES:

During the month of March, the Contract Compliance Department (CCD) completed the updates of the Professional Services Guidelines and the Construction Services Guidelines. These updates were necessary to include updated information about B2GNOW and the new LCP Tracker program for construction contracts. Along with the guidelines, 'Form A' - Consultant/Contractor Certification and Summary was updated, and 'Form H' – the Project Clouse-Out form was eliminated as it became obsolete since a project closing can now be completed electronically through B2GNOW. The guidelines and forms were uploaded in the Commission's website under the contract Compliance /IBE session of the 'Doing Business' link. The CCD also developed addendum letters to further explicitly inform prospective vendors of their responsibility of the IBE program at the time FRPs or bids are advertised. These updates and changes were with the support of the Deputy Executive Director, Joseph Donnelly and Chief Engineer, Roy Little. The CCD also

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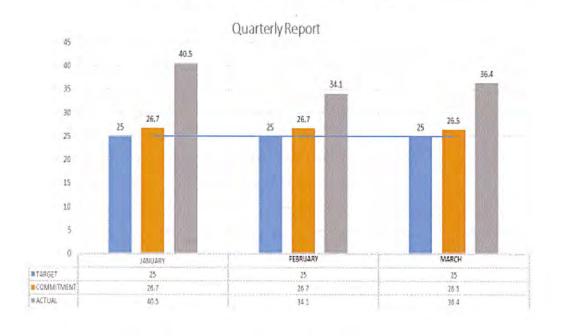

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COMMUNICATIONS REPORT March 2016

COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Commission Informational Video for Website Redesign – Completed review work and final edits of introductory website video for the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission. The promotional/educational video discusses the agency's service mission, features a variety of photographs of Commission facilities, and provides a quick recap on its strong financial condition. The video will be featured on the Commission's public website once its redesign is completed. Conceivably, public access will be provided via YouTube and/or Vimeo.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project - Worked with the engineering department, the project team, design engineers Michael Baker Inc., Stokes Creative Group and public involvement consultants McCormick Taylor to completed preparations for the New Jersey-focused project open house and no-net-loss public reforestation hearing held on March 15 in Ewing, NJ. The preparations began in February and included a series of activities and workproduct reviews. Products included an event reminder press release, introductory hearing scripts for the executive director and the hearing moderator, a welcome handout, and a tolling fact sheet. One important item was an updated/New Jersey-oriented version of the project video first prepared for the Pennsylvania open house in December. Also reviewed and made corrections to the updated fact sheet to be distributed at the March 15 outreach session. 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Community Affairs Report March 2016

The following Community Affairs activities took place during March:

Scudder Falls

In preparation for the March 15 NJ Open House and Reforestation public hearing, visited area municipal building to speak with local officials and personally invited them to meeting.

The March 15 NJ Project Open House and Reforestation public hearing was very well attended (96 people signed in), and we received valuable feedback from residents and local officials. As follow-up measure, Printing Technician/Clerk Teller Kevin Barta produced a supply of project information flyers that I will be distributing in the community.

Continued to coordinate with public-involvement consultants McCormick-Taylor's staff and sub-consultants on messages received through project website, DRJTBC website, and toll free info line to ensure all inquiries are answered.

Researched public awareness campaigns of other agencies around the country concerning All Electronic/Cashless Tolling.

Attended PA Sound wall contract management meeting.

Assisted in preparations for meeting with the Mid-Jersey Chamber of Commerce scheduled for April 12, to include a presentation on the project by Joe Resta

Knowlton/Columbia Salt Issue

In an effort to reduce any duplication of services (and unnecessary salting of roads) NJDOT has arranged for a meeting on April 1 with representatives of the Commission, Township DPW and NJ DOT to review each agency's role in maintenance of the roads in Columbia. The written agreement currently in place is from 1970 and needs to be updated.

Emergency Vehicles

We continue to receive occasional phone calls from local first aid squads who have received toll violations, even when following the proper protocol of calling ahead and using the lane as directed by bridge personnel. E-ZPass staff is always helpful in determining whether a dismissal of the violation is appropriate and processing same. It appears the main reason for the violations is that the vehicles travel through the lane too fast for the attendant to over-ride the toll.

The squads have not made further requests for "non-revenue" transponders. They seem satisfied with their ability to contact the Commission directly and have the violations taken care of, rather than dealing with the Regional E-ZPass Customer Service center.

Host Communities

Attended Easton "State of the City" address by Mayor Sal Panto, hosted by the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce at Lafayette College. Spoke briefly with Mayor Panto and will be meeting with him at greater length in the near future.

DESIGN Contract No. C-628A-5

Dewberry was issued Notice to Proceed effective February 22, 2016. A project kick-off meeting was held with Dewberry and their subconsultant, The Lighting Practice, on March 3, 2016. The designer is proceeding with required tasks. The concept report will investigate newer technologies to effectively light the sign and is expected in early May 2016.

Construction Management Contract No. CM-664A

This Contract is for Construction Management Professional Services associated with the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Toll-Supported Bridge. Included in the scope is a constructability review and preparation of an independent Engineers Estimate using the 60% Design Documents for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project prepared by Michael Baker, International under Commission Contract No. C-660A (SFB). TRC Engineers, Inc. (TRC) has completed all of the Contract Phase 1 boring work, which included borings for the noise walls, the main river bridge, the sign structures, the retaining walls, the approach bridges and the pedestrian/bike bridge, and also the taking of pavement cores and bulk sampling. TRC reached Contract Substantial Completion on Phase 1 on November 23rd, two weeks ahead of schedule. A kickoff meeting was held with MT on November 25, 2015. The Commission provided comments to MT's draft PI plan and is awaiting a revised draft. MT is attending C-660A progress meetings, has successfully transferred responsibility of the project hotline and website to the MT team. MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township. MT is currently working with the Commission to schedule and plan additional outreach events planned over the next several months.

AP completed the installation of the HD Silt Fence in Stage 1 and all trees in Stage 1 have been felled. Clearing of the tree debris continued through March along the north and southbound sides of I-95 in Pennsylvania between exits 49 and 51. This work included clearing the Right-of-Way fence of vegetation, installing inlet filter bags, chipping the felled trees and spreading the mulch for soil stabilization. Punch list work has also been ongoing throughout March. AP was granted a Substantial Completion time extension to March 31, 2016 for extra tree clearing work and added rock construction entrance protection.

DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies. Environmental permitting agency coordination continues as well as preparation of the USACE and PADEP permit application packages, including all back-up documentation. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the project within the Commission's jurisdiction was submitted to the PADEP on February 29, 2016. The USACE Permit application Package was submitted to the USACE on March 4, 2016. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the Project within PennDOT's jurisdiction was submitted to PennDOT in early March and then subsequently submitted to the PADEP on March 25, 2016. Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP - Green Acres regarding the final application package for the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJDEP - Green Acres required another 30-day public comment period as part of the application process that runs from March 6th through April 7th. We are still awaiting preliminary approval of the Revised Jurisdictional Determination (JD) Plans that were submitted to the USACE on

December 11, 2015. The PA Wetlands Mitigation Site Design was completed and was submitted to the PADEP and the USACE as part of the Joint Permit Applications.

The ROW acquisition process continued during the month of January, including coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. The Commission closed on Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road during the month of January and now owns that parcel. A closing date of April 15, 2016 is anticipated for Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road in Pennsylvania. On February 24th an Agreement of Sale was executed for the Morris property (Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001) with a closing date scheduled for no later than May 31, 2016. The partial acquisition of the Willard property for (Parcel 20-027-007) was completed during the month of February. During the On-call phase, SCI performed construction services at the I-78 Toll Plaza, replacing the bumper block in front of a toll booth that was damaged by a truck impact in February. As a result of the accident, the Commission decided to replace all bumper blocks at that plaza. SCI completed the replacements in March under an emergency construction contract under the terms and conditions of the base contract TS-677A.

Meeting of April 25, 2016

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF MARCH 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of March 2016, the Purchase Order for the new radio system was issued to Motorola. ESS personnel are in the process of developing radio channel programs and vehicle/personnel assignments for the new radios.
- ESS personnel arranged for various radio installations and repairs during the month of March 2016.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the month of March 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's lock smith) to address various lock issues. The doors within the I-78 garage expansion will have a new card reader lock that is built into the door handle.
- During the month of March 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric to install new locks on the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge Shelters that utilize a card reader and/or biometrics for access.
- In March 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges for new employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees.
- During the month of March 2016, the ACS database was audited and the system
 was purged of invalid employee and contractor cards. Various other employee
 ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
