ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being five members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good morning. We are continuing to make progress in advancing preparations for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project while moving ahead with a series of other projects and initiatives, some of which are ready for Commission consideration today;

"On the Scudder Falls front, the removal of trees and brush from a river island in the path of the first span of the replacement bridge was recently completed. Due to recent high water conditions, some creativity was employed to carry out this timesensitive work, including use of a crane on the existing bridge to hoist equipment down to the island below. The crane subsequently was used to hoist wood chips

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and felled tree trunks off the island for disposal. Back on land, advance construction of noise- abatement walls has stepped up pace along the Pennsylvania I-95 bridge approach. That work is now about 90 percent complete and is on track to reach final completion in early June. Likewise, utility relocation work is progressing on the Pennsylvania side of the current bridge along Taylorsville, River, and Woodside roads in Lower Makefield Township. These efforts should be completed in time for the bridge replacement project contractor to start land- based construction activities in May. Although the project's longterm construction schedule still needs to be finalized, the expectation is that inwater construction activities for the new bridge will begin on or shortly after July 1 when environmental restrictions permit the work;

"While the Scudder Falls Bridge has garnered the bulk of attention in recent months, we have not lost sight of the 19 other river crossings in our system. Case in point is the Electronic Toll Collection System Replacement Project that was initiated with testing last summer and fall. The transitioning of our toll facilities to this new system began in mid-December. Now we are on the cusp of completing the installation and implementation of the replacement of our electronic and manual toll collecting infrastructure. Next week, we expect to complete the transitions at our Easton-Phillipsburg and I-78 toll plazas. This work will involve the final mixed-mode lane at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Plaza and the Express E- ZPass facility at the I-78 Toll Plaza. To carry out the I-78 Express E-ZPass transition, we will be closing the facility 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. each night this week. Motorists will be directed to use the adjoining toll booths during these periods. Following the successful completion of these remaining transitions, the contractor is to be engaged in fine-tuning and troubleshooting the new system. And in June, we will implement the toll clarification for recreational vehicles with trailers and cars in tow that the Commission authorized last September as part of this toll system replacement effort. The swap out of our legacy toll system and the transition to new, improved equipment comes at an optimum time because we are about to start a new project at our I-78 location:

"Today's executive agenda includes two contract resolutions for this endeavor, which will largely involve rehabilitation and improvements to 11 approach and overpass structures within our I-78 jurisdiction in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. The work will include approach slab replacements at eight bridges, cleaning and painting at six bridges or overpasses, and an assortment of other tasks, including restriping of our entire I-78 roadway. One contract for consideration today is for the award of construction and the other is for construction management/inspection services. With approval, construction work could begin in early to mid-summer and continue through the year until winter, when activity would be curtailed for the cold weather. The project would then fully ramp up in the spring and continue until completion in November 2018;

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"A final executive agenda item worthy of mention today is a proposed authorization of a renewal of a direct purchase agreement involving Commissionissued series 2007B bonds. These are the outstanding variable-rate bonds the Commission sold via a direct purchase agreement with Wells Fargo three years ago. With the mandatory tender on these bonds coming due May 1, an RFP was issued for banks to consider buying the bonds. As you may recall, the Commission received eight proposals and Wells Fargo's was deemed to be in the best interest of the Commission. Accordingly, a renewal arrangement was negotiated under which the Commission will be able to reduce its interest rate by 13 basis points. In dollars and cents, this works out to a savings of more than \$400,000 for the Commission over the next three years. Our Chief Financial Officer, Jim Petrino, deserves mention here for closing out this new arrangement. Today's resolution would allow for the execution and delivery of agreements in support of this transaction is up for your consideration today;

"Mr. Chairman, this positive financial outcome marks the end of my report."

AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF EACH FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE FORWARD PURCHASE CONTINUING COVENANT AGREEMENT

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Stanley moved and Commissioner Van Vliet seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (the "Commission") has issued its Bridge System Revenue Bonds, Series 2007B in the aggregate principal amount of \$150,000,000, of which \$114,050,000 are currently outstanding (the "2007B Bonds"), consisting of sub-Series 2007B-1 and sub-Series 2007B-2, each in the aggregate principal amount of \$75,000,000, of which \$57,025,000 are currently outstanding (the "2007B-1 Bonds" and the "2007B-2 Bonds," respectively), pursuant to a Trust Indenture dated as of January 1, 2003 (the "General Indenture" and as amended and supplemented to date, the "Indenture"); and

"WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of Resolution FIN-01-03-17 (the "Original Resolution"), adopted by the Commission on March 27, 2017, the Commission selected Wells Fargo Bank, National Association ("Wells Fargo Bank") as purchaser of the 2007B-1 Bonds and Wells Fargo Municipal Capital Strategies, LLC ("Wells Capital Strategies") as purchaser of the 2007B-2 Bonds, subject to the final terms and conditions of such purchases being negotiated to the satisfaction of the Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer of the Commission; and

"WHEREAS, the terms and conditions so negotiated and set forth in (i) the First Amendment to Forward Purchase Continuing Covenant Agreement, dated May 1, 2017 ("2007B-1 Amendment"), which 2007B-1 Amendment amended the existing Forward Purchase Continuing Covenant Agreement, dated as of January 1, 2014 between the Commission and Wells Fargo Bank, and (ii) the First Amendment to Forward Purchase Continuing Covenant Agreement dated May 1, 2017 ("2007B-2 Amendment"), which 2007B-2 Amendment amended the existing Forward Purchase Continuing Covenant Agreement, dated as of January 1, 2017 ("2007B-2 Amendment"), which 2007B-2 Amendment amended the existing Forward Purchase Continuing Covenant Agreement, dated as of January 1, 2014, between the Commission and Wells Capital Strategies (items (i) and (ii) are collectively referred to herein as the "Transaction") are determined satisfactory to the Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer; and

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"WHEREAS, the Commission is now desirous of adopting this supplemental resolution in order to, among other things, supplement the terms and provisions of the Original Resolution for the purpose of authorizing and approving the execution and delivery of the 2007B-1Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment, delegating to certain officers and officials of the Commission the power to execute and deliver such 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment and for the purpose of authorizing the execution and delivery of certain certificates, documents, agreements and other related materials in connection with the foregoing (collectively, the "Related Documents").

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission at its Regular Meeting assembled this 24th day of April, 2017, as follows:

ARTICLE I

TITLE AND INTERPRETATIONS

<u>Short Title</u>. This supplemental resolution may hereafter be cited by the Commission and is hereafter referred to as the "Supplemental Resolution." The Original Resolution as supplemented by this Supplemental Resolution, is collectively referred to as the "Resolution."

Defined Terms. Capitalized terms, not otherwise defined herein, shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Indenture, unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

<u>Certain Terms</u>. As used in this Supplemental Resolution, the terms "herein", "hereunder", "hereby", "hereto", "hereof" and any similar terms refer to this Supplemental Resolution, the term "heretofore" means before the time of adoption of this Supplemental Resolution; and the term "hereafter" means after the time of adoption of this Supplemental Resolution.

<u>Successors and Assigns</u>. Whenever the Commission is named or referred to in this Supplemental Resolution, such reference shall be deemed to include its successor or assigns, whether so expressed or not.

Applicable Law. This Supplemental Resolution is adopted pursuant to the Compact.

AUTHORIZATION OF 2007B-1 AMENDMENT AND 2007B-2 AMENDMENT

Authorization and Approval of 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment.

The form of the 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment presented at this meeting (a copy of which shall be filed with the records of the Commission) is hereby approved. The Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director or the Chief Financial Officer, or any other commissioner, officer or employee of the Commission authorized to perform specific acts or duties by a resolution duly adopted by the Commission, a certified copy of which shall be on file with the Trustee (each a "Commission Officer") is hereby authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver, and any other Commission Officer is hereby authorized and directed to affix and attest the seal of the

Commission to, if necessary, the 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment in substantially such form, with such insertions and changes therein and any supplements thereto as Co-Bond Counsel and the Commission's Pennsylvania and New Jersey General Counsel may advise and the Commission Officer executing the same may approve, such approval to be evidenced conclusively by such Commission Officer's execution thereof.

<u>Authorization of Execution and Delivery of Related Documents</u>. The Commission hereby approves and authorizes any Commission Officer to execute and deliver the Related Documents and all documents, agreements and certificates necessary or required under the 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment or to enable the Commission to complete the Transaction.

MISCELLANEOUS

<u>Appointment of Market Agent</u>. In accordance with Section 1.2 of the Fourth Supplemental Indenture, as amended by Section 2(b) of the Eighth Supplemental Indenture, the Commission hereby appoints Phoenix Capital Partners to act as Market Agent for purposes of effecting the Transaction.

Ratification and Prior Actions. All actions heretofore taken and all documents and instruments heretofore prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Commission in connection with the Transaction, including the execution and delivery of the 2007B-1 Amendment and 2007B-2 Amendment and any Related Documents and any matters related thereto are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

<u>Authorized Act of Officers</u>. The Chairman, Vice Chairman, the Executive Director, the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Assistant Secretary and the Chief Financial Officer of the Commission are, and each of them hereby is, authorized and directed to do and perform all things, to execute and deliver all certificates, documents, contracts, forms and instruments in the name of the Commission, to take all actions necessary and proper, including any actions not otherwise determined herein or in the Original Resolution, and to make all payments necessary or, in their opinion, convenient so that the Commission may carry out or effect the Transaction and all other matters authorized in the Original Resolution or this Supplemental Resolution.

<u>Filing</u>. A copy of this Supplemental Resolution shall be filed for public inspection in the office of the Commission.

<u>Repeals</u>. All resolutions and parts of resolutions, to the extent the same are inconsistent herewith, are hereby rescinded and repealed.

Effective Date. This Supplemental Resolution shall be effective immediately.

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of April 24, 2017 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (March, 2017)

Summary: The Commission experienced a decrease in both total toll traffic and revenue for March 2017 in comparison to the March 2016 traffic and revenue statistics. Increases in commercial traffic through-out the Commission, and passenger traffic in District I, have been directly related to the closure of the Delaware River Turnpike Connector Bridge on January 21, 2017. It should also be noted that 2016 was a leap year. Year-to-Date totals for 2017 reflect one less day. Additionally, a significant snow storm in March over the entire Commission resulted in several days of lost or reduced traffic during the month.

Analysis of March 2017 / March 2016 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 0.93 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.23 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 2.97 percent decrease.

Analysis of March 2017 / March 2016 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic decreased by 92,519 vehicles, or 2.78 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 12,616 vehicles, or 2.65 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic decreased by 105,135 vehicles, or 3.68 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for March 2017 was 104,498 total vehicles as compared to 107,483 total vehicles in March 2016.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the eleven vehicular toll supported bridges for March 2017 decreased by 2,953 vehicles, or 0.11 percent when compared to March 2016. Average daily westbound traffic at these bridges for March 2017 was 84,572 vehicles as compared to 84,668 for March 2016.

Traffic analysis for 2017 YTD:

• Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 3.60 percent increase for the first three months of 2017 as compared to the same period in 2016.
- Westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 1.91 percent increase for the first quarter of 2017 as compared to last year.
- Much of these increases are the result of the PA/NJ Turnpike Connector Bridge closing, offset somewhat by the lost calendar day due to the 2016 leap year.

DISTRICT REVIEW

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for March 2017 reflected a 7.27 percent increase as the result of increases of 52,927 cars and 2,059 trucks when compared to March 2016. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), decreases of 8,506 cars and 1,192 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 6.02 percent for the month of March 2017 as compared to March 2016.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 4.47 percent in total toll traffic for the month of March 2017 compared to March 2016 as the result of the decrease of 49,451 cars and the increase of 5,926 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 21,582 passenger vehicles and 1,237 trucks combined to generate a 5.02 percent decrease in total toll traffic for March 2017.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 6.33 percent decrease in total toll traffic during March 2017 as a result of decreases of 5,735 automobiles and 807 trucks compared to March 2016. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 63,467 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 8,296 trucks to generate an overall decrease of 7.07 percent in total toll traffic for March 2017 as compared to March 2016. At Milford-Montague (MM), combined decreases of 9,321 passenger vehicles and 429 trucks produced a 9.60 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of March 2017.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of March 2017 and the three month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2017 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$6,492,676 for the month of March. For the 2017 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$15,321,099 or 88.8% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Overtime wages are currently exceeding budget by \$71,153 or 46.3%, mainly due to a number of full-time position vacancies and the recent snow storm. This line item is expected to come back into budget during the operating year.

There were three payrolls expensed during the month. This resulted in higher than usual monthly expense. The additional payroll was accounted for in the Commission's monthly operating budget.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

March 2017

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of March, 2017, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 82 purchase orders in the total amount of \$407,702.14. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 50 price inquiries were sent out for 16 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.13 per order (50/16 = 3.13).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of March 2017 are shown below:

- Twenty-six (26) Purchase Orders were issued, in the total amount of \$166,178.81, for roadway salt needs of various Commission facilities.
- Four (4) Purchase Orders were issued, in the total amount of \$64,242.50, for guiderail repairs and replacements at various Commission facilities.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$37,458.02, for router support for our entire fleet of such devices.
- ➢ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$15,364.26, for a Commission software system renewal.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$14,756.00, for cash fund security safes at our seven Toll Facilities.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

CSC/VPC Pre-Migration Collection Accounts:

As a result of pre-migration collection efforts from January 2015 through March 2017, Professional Account Management (PAM) a Duncan Solutions Company reports \$159,378.45 collected in outstanding tolls and fees.

Professional Account Management (PAM) a Duncan Solutions Company provide the Commission with monthly payment status updates. Collection activity will continue to be monitored by the E-ZPass Department.

<u>New Jersey Customer Service Center (CSC) Update:</u>

User Acceptance Testing (UAT) sessions began in January and continued through March. The purpose of these sessions was to observe end-to-end testing of various CSC functions. ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF MARCH 2017

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Revisions to the Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments is on-going. TransCore facilitated weekly meeting to discuss the transition of the toll lanes. All lanes at the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge are complete. Transitioning of the I-78 Toll Bridge conventional toll lanes is on-going and planning for the open road tolling lanes is underway. Transitioning of the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge lanes is also underway. Weekly project status meetings will continue during the installation phase of the project.
- 2. A vehicle classification issue was discovered at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge open road tolling lane. This prompted the installation of a filter to hold these transactions at the toll host for a week until the issue was resolved. The filter was then lifted and the transactions were then able to be transmitted to the customer service center for processing.
- 3. The preliminary work for the toll plaza canopy dynamic message signs (DMS) for the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges is underway. During the preliminary work, it was determined that the existing conduit from the monotube to the administration building/tunnel at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge is damaged and cannot be used for the signs electrical and communication cables. We received a proposal from TransCore to repair the conduit and it is being evaluated.

Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in June 2017.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee meeting and Policy Committee meetings.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for

the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-ZPass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project Website – Overhauled contents and organization of the home page for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project's website. The changes were done in anticipation of increased public interest at the project approaches construction in the months to come. The new home page gives visitors a quick bullet-by-bullet summary of the project work elements as well as a quick high-level schedule. The changes also give prominent access to videos about the project and the new bridge's planned allelectronic toll collection system. The Latest updates item on the homepage also is more prominent and the project schedule entry on the website has been thoroughly updated to include the start of land-based construction this spring and the start of in-water construction on or after July 1.The website's project milestones section was updated to include items during the second half of 2015. Additional from 2016 are being identified for listing/coding by consultants Stokes Creative Group.

Annual Report – All work on the 2015 annual report was completed and the completed report with the final changes and corrections has been posted to the website. We are awaiting billing from the subconsultants who helped to design/layout the report along with media consultants Bellevue Communications.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project Public Involvement – Recognizing the approaching start of project construction, a planning/coordination meeting was held during March to outline upcoming public outreach activities. This included immediate short-term improvement to the project website, development of a new project logo, continuation of focus group activities and preparation/editing of a Facilitation Guide for customer interview sessions.

Communications is working with IT and website consultant Stokes Creative Group to remedy this situation so that accurate month-to-month and year-to-year comparisons can be provided with the May operations report.

March 2017

The following Community Affairs activity took place during the month of March:

Scudder Falls Public Involvement

Attended kick-off meetings for construction and construction management contracts.

Attended Public Involvement status meeting, discussing redesign of website and upcoming focus groups.

Assisted in review and response to messages received via the Commission and Scudder Falls project websites, as appropriate. Questions and concerns included the sound wall design, construction schedule, and property acquisition.

Reviewed correspondence from Lower Makefield Township, concerned about the future plans for the historic Henry Paff House. Referred to Kevin Skeels.

Columbia/Knowlton Salt issue:

Reviewed Knowlton Township's proposal for funding of reverse osmosis systems and discussed with Commission officials and New Jersey Counsel Reginald Jenkins. Provided Mr. Jenkins with background info. Arranged meeting with Knowlton officials to address some questions about the proposal. Meeting with the Mayor will be April 4, after which Counsel will have a recommendation to the Commissioners for the April 19 Committee meeting.

Lumberville-Raven Rock Pedestrian Bridge:

Commission officials saw an article in the newspaper about an EPA Support rally held at Bulls Island State Park and the Lumberville-Raven Rock Pedestrian Bridge. A Use of Facilities permit was not requested. Contacted Bulls Island Superintendent Patricia Kallesser. The group also did not request permit to hold the event in the park. She was at the park that day and spoke to the organizer, who claimed he was not aware of permit requirements. She felt it would not have been prudent to stop the

rally at that time. Superintendent Kallesser is aware of the Commission's use of facilities permit policy and will continue to share that information with individuals who request use of the park.

Town of Phillipsburg

Attended Chamber of Commerce breakfast with District 2 Maintenance Foreman Mark Dilts, featuring the "State of the City" presentation by Phillipsburg Mayor Stephen Ellis. Spoke to the chamber staff member who assists with town events, including the Old Towne Festival and the proposed Pork Roll Festival, both of which are planned to be held in the riverside area. Offered the Commission officials' assistance in the event planning, to ensure the activities do not encroach on commission property.

Easton shoreline debris

Reviewed correspondence received by District 2 Superintendent James Shelly from the Easton City Department of Public Works regarding debris left by individuals camping along the river in the area of the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge. Visited the site with District 2 Maintenance Foreman Mark Dilts. River level is too high to address the issue right now. When the water recedes, maintenance staff will remove the debris. Safety, Security and Training will continue to monitor the area, to keep individuals from camping in the area and refer them to available city services.

Trenton STEM program

The City of Trenton Recreation Department is hosting an upcoming STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) program. They would like to have the students re-create a replica of the Lower Trenton Toll Supported Bridge and requested photos or plans to use. Referred request to the Engineering Department.

Portland PA request

Reviewed request from Portland PA officials for the Commission to perform street-sweeping in the Borough. As per policy, the Commission is not able to grant the request. Prepared response for review.

MT has attended numerous C-660A progress meetings, and has successfully taken responsibility of maintaining the project hotline and website. MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township and April 27, 2016 Pennsylvania Noise Walls Update Meeting. MT organized and participated in the July 19th & 21st District I Open House/Toll Hearings held in Ewing Township (NJ) and Lower Makefield Township (PA) respectively. MT also organized and participated in August 2nd & 4th District II Toll Hearings in Easton (PA) and Phillipsburg (NJ) respectively also and the August 9th & 11th District III Toll Hearings held in Montague (NJ) & East Stroudsburg (PA) respectively. In late March Sparwick began clearing trees from a portion of Park Island immediately upstream of the existing Scudder Falls Bridge. This effort was performed by Sparwick, within the contract ceiling, outside of the Indiana Bat restriction period for tree cutting which begins on April 1st. The project team began working on the project research and mapping, focusing on wetlands constraints and utility paths. The buildings programming sheets and adjacency matrix are being prepared that will be used to facilitate the design charrette.

I-78 BRIDGES AND APPROACH SLAB REHABILITATION

DESIGN

Contract No. C-644A

Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) was awarded this design contract at the Commission's February 2016 Meeting and their Notice of Award/Limited Notice to Proceed was issued effective March 1, 2016. This design project is for the repair of various bridge, pavement and other miscellaneous deficiencies associated with the 13 bridges and approach roadways located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction on I-78.

During this reporting period, GF participated in a pre-bid meeting on March 7 and assisted in the developing of an Addendum to be posted on the Commission's website on March 31, 2017.

RESTRIPING OF THE MERGE LANES EXITING THE I-78 TOLL PLAZA

DESIGN

Task Order Agreement Contract No. C-628A-8

Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (DE), through a standing Consultant Engineer Agreement, was requested to provide Engineering Services to design modifications to the existing striping of the merge area west of the I-78 westbound toll plaza. DE was requested to utilize Malick & Scherer, PC. (M&S) for this design effort due to their current involvement as a sub-consultant to Gannett Fleming on the C-644A I-78 Bridges and Approach Slab Rehabilitation Project, whose tasks include the restriping of the entire I-78 mainline located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction. The purpose of this restriping design is to provide dedicated through lanes for the two left ORT E-Z Pass lanes continuing after the toll plaza, and have the four right toll lanes merge with the right high speed lane in the vicinity of the Morgan Hill Road Interchange.

This design has been incorporated by Gannett Fleming, under Professional Services contract C-644A, into the I-78 Bridges & Approach Slab Rehabilitation Construction Contract T-644A, which was advertised on March 2, 2017. M&S will provide post design services during the construction contract T-644A.

DESIGN-BUILD Contract No. DB-427

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

DB-584

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in June 2017.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

All sites (toll and toll supported bridges) were installed by Commission Staff with assistance from Signal Service. Signal Service continues to visit each site to conduct manual traffic counts and compare them to the traffic counter. All sites are calibrated and sending data to the server. The server currently resides with Signal Service for on-going configuration and we are accessing the data remotely. Once configuration is complete it will be installed in the Commission's Administration Building.

DISTRICT 2 & 3 PHASE 1 TOLL COLLECTION COUNTING FACILITIES

PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th, 2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's comments with the Consultant. Final Design Submission was received December 30, 2016 and a design submission review meeting was conducted on January 9, 2017 and revised documents were received January 19, 2017.

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

Upon payment of the final invoice for this Task Order Assignment, it will be closed out.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

Revisions to the Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments is on-going. TransCore facilitated weekly meeting to discuss the transition of the toll lanes. All lanes at the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge are complete. Transitioning of the I-78 Toll Bridge conventional toll lanes is on-going and planning for the open road tolling lanes is underway. Transitioning of the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge lanes is also underway. Weekly project status meetings will continue during the installation phase of the project.

April 24, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

A vehicle classification issue was discovered at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge open road tolling lane. This prompted the installation of a filter to hold these transactions at the toll host for a week until the issue was resolved. The filter was then lifted and the transactions were then able to be transmitted to the customer service center for processing.

The preliminary work for the toll plaza canopy dynamic message signs (DMS) for the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges is underway. During the preliminary work, it was determined that the existing conduit from the monotube to the administration building/tunnel at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge is damaged and cannot be used for the signs electrical and communication cables. We received a proposal from TransCore to repair the conduit and it is being evaluated.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT IMPLEMENTATION CM Task Order Assignment No. C-701A-1

RK&K is providing on-site construction inspection/management services for the replacement of the electronic toll collection system. Services provided included inspection of the concrete roadway slab replacements at the Easton-Phillipsburg and I-78 Toll Bridges. Review of concrete specifications, placement, and cylinder breaks is on-going. Additionally, a review a proposal to repair broken conduit at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge is underway.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

Upon payment of the final invoice for this Task Order Assignment, it will be closed out.

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015; kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visits to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed.

Based on review comments, locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel, Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission. Meeting is being scheduled to revise scope and discuss utilization of new communication infrastructure. As a result of the recent critical fracture of a truss member resulting in the closing of a PA Turnpike bridge, the scope of this contract was expanded. It has been decided to install sensors on all five bridges in the task order and to add the Milford Montague Bridge to the assignment. A revised scoping meeting was held on February 28th and a revised cost will be submitted. Cost for revised scope was submitted March 22 and was deemed excessive. Revised cost estimate was submitted on March 28 and is under review.

A kick-off meeting was held on March 217, 2017 for the 2017 Toll Bridge Inspections at the –Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, District 3, Operations, Engineering, and CWA.

The 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspection Report was accepted by the Commissioners at the March 27, 2017 Meeting and distributed to staff on March 31.

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF MARCH 2017

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued working to complete the radio upgrade. The new base station radios continue to be programed and installed at the various bridges. Planning and acquisition continues for the microwave portion of the upgrade. Efforts continue to find a new tower replacement for the Corn Hill Site.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel and the New Jersey State Police initiated a search to replace the Gravel Hill Tower. To date, the only possible replacement site is utilized by the PA State Police. Efforts are being made to survey this site to see if it would work for the Commission.
- Due to the recent changes in the Banking Room and toll counting areas, the antenna and cabling for the Portland-Columbia OIC office base station radio had to be moved to the opposite end of the building.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- Due to the recent changes in the Banking Room and toll counting areas at Trenton-Morrisville, I-78, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap, and Milford-Montague, ESS and Schneider Electric worked to update the building maps and door alarm schedules for these locations.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues.
- In March 2017, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants.

- During the month of March 2017, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employees and contractor cards. Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of March 2017, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to plan for the cut over from the Commission's current video and access control system to the Genetec system.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. Currently ESS is waiting to receive the results of the Firetide Wireless survey.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued working with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility. ESS personnel surveyed the Park and Ride property for cameras to enhance the security of that property and deter individuals from abandoning vehicles, boats and campers.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. The upgrade projects at the Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges have been completed.
- During the month of March 2017, Telegra delivered two servers that are programmed for the Commission to test their analytics. Testing will commence once Schneider Electric installs the servers.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Purchasing to implement the new Comcast communications

- system. To date, all ESS locations with the exception of Milford-Montague have been cut over to the Comcast WAN.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.
- The ESS Primary Control Center (PCC) continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed fifteen video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video Report" for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On March 9, 2017, ESS personnel attended the DRJTBC Staff and Operations Meeting held at the New Hope Executive Headquarters.
- On March 29, 2017, ESS and Security, Safety and Training (SS&T) met with both State Police Liaisons to talk about responses to Commission incidents.
- On March 30, 2017, ESS attended an Operations Meeting regarding banking guidelines and Garda armored car services. Additionally, on this date a meeting was held with Operations to discuss the responsibilities of SS&T vs. Toll.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS staff developed an "Executive Radio Training" PowerPoint to be posted on the DRJTBC Intranet. This is a new initiative to try and offer training in a timely manner for new hires and recently promoted personnel.
- During the month of March 2017, several candidates for two new ESS Monitor positions were interviewed. The Commissioners subsequently hired two new ESS

Monitors from Pennsylvania. After review of their background checks, both new hires were cleared to work at the NJSP Regional Operations Intelligence Center and the Primary Control Center.

- During the month March 2017, the proposed new toll officer's response vehicle was approved by the Commission. ESS is now working with Purchasing to acquire the vehicles.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS composed a draft SOG pertaining to Toll Officers responding to roadway incidents.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Operations and Engineering to develop new toll and banking facilities that will afford the Commission and its employees more security and protection from theft.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS personnel continued to review the various emergency operations plans for the toll bridges.
- During the month of March 2017, ESS worked with Security, Safety and Training on various endeavors.
