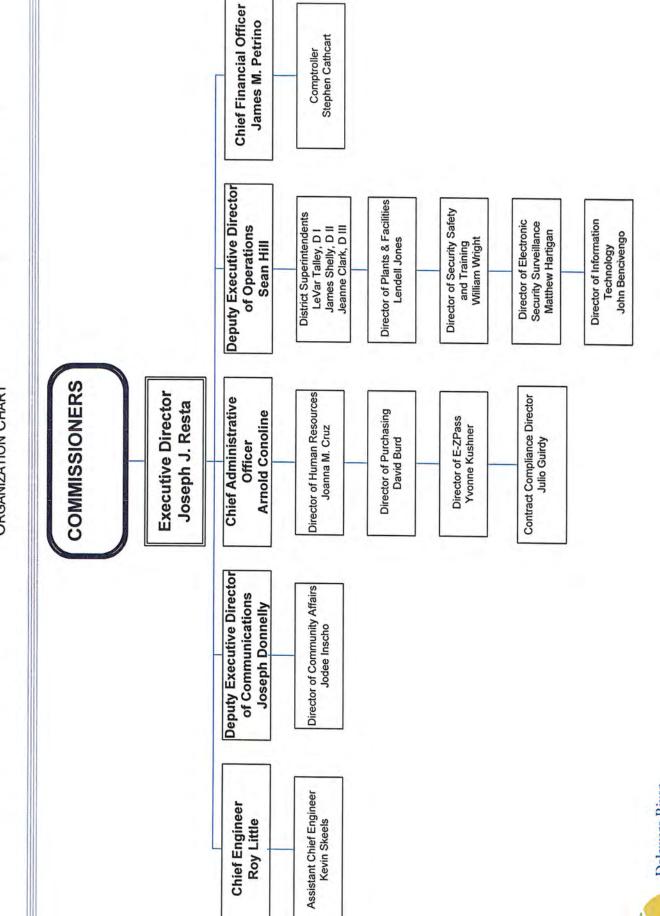

CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Monthly Meeting of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission was called to Order at the New Hope Executive Offices, 2492 River Road, New Hope, PA. 18938-9519, on Monday, February 27, 2017 at 10:30 p.m. pursuant to notice properly forwarded to each member in compliance with the by-laws. Michael Lavery, Chairman, presided at this meeting. The Commissioners met in Executive Session to discuss legal and personnel matters prior to this meeting.

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being three members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

PROCLAMATION OF THE COMMISSIONERS TO ALAN CLARKSON

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and stated that he would like to present a Proclamation of the Commissioners to retire Alan Clarkson. He then stated that this proclamation will become an official component to the minutes of this meeting.

- "WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission is a bistate transportation agency with a network of 20 bridges linking the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and
- "WHEREAS, the Commission employs roughly 350 full-time employees to operate, maintain, and protect its system of transportation facilities; and
- "WHEREAS, retiring employee Alan R. Clarkson became a Commission toll collector on May 16, 1995 and was promoted to his current District III toll sergeant position on June 27, 2011; and
- "WHEREAS, Sgt. Clarkson has earned praise and admiration as the driving force behind the design and messaging of an annual workplace safety calendar that has become a fixture at countless office desks, bridge shelters, bulletin boards and lunch rooms; and

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- "WHEREAS, this unofficial "keeper of the days" has conceptualized, organized and produced 11 calendars since the inaugural 2007 edition; and
- "WHEREAS, he regularly performed much of this work on a volunteer, extracurricular basis at his home and at the Commission; and
- "WHEREAS, this product has helped to foster greater employee awareness of workplace safety, the history of the Commission's bridges and toll plazas, and the service mission of Commission employees in general; and
- "WHEREAS, like other employees, he has been exemplary in the performance of his duties; and
- "WHEREAS, Sgt. Clarkson deserves recognition for involvement in many other endeavors, including the River Currents employee newsletter, the Communications Projects Team, the 75th Anniversary Committee; the Green Team, and more than three full terms on the Safety Committee; and
- "WHEREAS, he also created and redesigned many forms used throughout District III and the Commission, including Patrol Vehicle Inventory, Safety Inspection Checklist, Request for Benefit Day (ADM-60), and Collector's Report of Unusual Occurrences (ADM-71); and
- "WHEREAS, Sgt. Clarkson's tenure at the Commission clearly extends the bounds of the Commission's highest standards of service; now, therefore,
- **"BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission assembled for a Meeting at New Hope, PA this 27th day of February 2017, that this Commission hereby recognizes Alan R. Clarkson, Commends his promotion of workplace safety, his advancement of life-saving and first-aid, and his infectious commitment to enhancing the delivery of Commission services to the public; and
- "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Proclamation be included in the Minutes of this Meeting, a copy be placed in Sgt. Clarkson's personnel file, and a duly authenticated ceremonial copy be transmitted to Toll Sergeant Alan R. Clarkson.

Commissioner Siptroth addressed the meeting and said:

"Mr. Chairman. I have known Alan before he came to work at the Bridge Commission when he worked in the local car dealership as a high official there. And certainly I want to thank you for your services in district three and the Bridge Commission in its entirety. I know you were very involved, as the proclamation mentioned, in a lot of activities, but also in the training of the new employees because I remember you being in the new training office which has now been turned in to something else down in Portland, but I remember that as well. And certainly in our church. We attend the same church, and he lives in the community,

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and also your activities in the church. I want to wish you and Liz both well in your retirement, and I know you won't let any moss grow in any particular place and you will be very active in the community."

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good morning. My comments today will primarily focus on recent and impending activities and preparations regarding our Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. But before beginning that discussion, I first want to recognize our new Pennsylvania Commissioner, Miriam Huertas.

"Commissioner Huertas brings a strong business and community advocacy perspective to the Commission

"She is the Senior Vice President of the Allentown unit of the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce, where she engages in fundraising and organizing seminars and workshops in support of Allentown's businesses. She also directs the Hamilton District Main Street Program in that city. Miriam also sits on policy-making or advisory boards for the Sacred Heart Health Care System, the Allentown Economic Development Corporation, the Lehigh Valley Health Network and Muhlenberg College. Commissioner Huertas, welcome to the Commission.

"There has been a flurry of activities behind the scenes since the award of the construction contract to the Trumbull Corporation at the January Commission meeting. We have issued a notice of award/limited notice to proceed to Trumbull and had an initial scheduling conference with their project representatives. Trumbull and its subcontractors have since submitted a series of contractually required documents. These include insurance certificates, PLA documentation, and performance and payment bonds. We aim to have final contract documents signed in the next couple of weeks. Trumbull is working on developing a construction schedule. In the near term, the company is looking to start field survey work and begin submitting shop drawings sometime in March. Utility relocation work also could begin within the coming weeks. If everything keeps progressing, land-based construction activities could begin in April with in-water work related to the construction of the new bridge's foundations starting in July.

"Another preparatory step for the project has involved completing the receipt of necessary regulatory permits. The most significant of these — the Section 404 Permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers — was received late last week, culminating a multi-month process involving signoffs from multiple state and regional regulatory agencies on both sides of the river. Today, we are hopeful of finalizing a Memorandum of Agreement with the New Jersey Green Acres

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Program regarding the Delaware and Raritan Canal's towpath connection with the new bridge's pedestrian walkway access ramp.

"Project financing also has successfully moved forward in recent weeks. After the Commission authorized the issuance of up to \$475 million in bonds for the Scudder Falls project, marketing of the bond transaction was initiated on Feb. 7 with the posting of the Preliminary Official Statement and Investor Presentation. The Investor Presentation received significant interest, having been viewed by 65 people from 57 different investment firms, bond funds or banks. The bond offering went to pricing on Feb. 14 with the order period taking place between 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. This timing was beneficial to the Commission because it preceded Federal Reserve Chairwoman Yellen's testimony to the Senate Banking Committee - comments which triggered a correction in the bond market later in the day. Basically, we were the right name at the right time in the market. Investors were very interested in our bonds as they looked to diversify their portfolios. Within 45 minutes of the scheduled opening, our transaction was fully subscribed. By the time the transaction closed - 10:30 a.m. - we had received over \$2.5 billion in orders. To put it another way, is that was 6.4 times the amount of bonds we had offered to sell. The final par amount of the bond issue was \$430,250,000 - about \$45 million less than had been originally authorized. The overall bond yield was 3.69 percent. The closing on the sale is scheduled to take place this Wednesday.

"Today, the Commission has a series of resolutions to consider to keep the project's momentum going. Three separate resolutions are on the agenda for contract awards with engineering firms to perform construction inspection services for specific facets of the project. One contract pertains to the inspection of the construction of the main river bridge. A second concerns the various improvements to be made to the bridge's Pennsylvania approach roadways. And the third applies to improvements for the bridge's New Jersey approach facilities. While not part of the bridge replacement project, there is another Scudder Fallsrelated resolution on today's agenda. This is a contract award to an architectural firm to design a new headquarters building for the Commission in close proximity to the Scudder Falls Bridge in Lower Makefield, PA. This new facility would provide office space to replace our 65-year-old administration building along Route 1 in Morrisville. Our goal is to the have the new building constructed and opened sometime in 2019. This would then allow us to convert our current Morrisville building into a largely maintenance-only operation. People will soon begin to see a slow but steady rise in work activities taking place at Scudder Falls in the coming months. This will kick off with the resumption of noise wall installation work along the Pennsylvania I-95 approach beginning next week. The progression of activities should continue for the next 4-1/2 years. I want to remind everyone, that through all of the various stages of construction, we intend to keep traffic moving through the project area at all times. We will continue to provide periodic progress updates in the months and years to come."

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Commissioner Laurenti addressed the meeting and said:

"I would like to commend the Commission and especially Mr. Petrino for the excellent work in reference to the bonds and kudos to all around to the staff for moving this forward. Thank you."

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of February 27, 2017 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (January, 2017)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for January 2017 in comparison to the January 2016 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the first month of the year. Increases in commercial traffic throughout the Commission and passenger traffic in District I are directly related to the closure of the Delaware River Turnpike Bridge on Jan. 21, 2017.

Analysis of January 2017 / January 2016 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 9.46 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 10.21 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 7.34 percent increase.

Analysis of January 2017 / January 2016 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 215,387 vehicles, or 7.40 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 45,220 vehicles, or 11.25 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 170,167 vehicles, or 6.78 percent.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for January 2017 increased by 81,771 vehicles, or 3.49 percent as compared to January 2016.

Traffic analysis for 2017 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for January 2017 was 100,861 total vehicles as compared to 93,913 total vehicles in January 2016.
- Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for January 2017 was 78,292 vehicles as compared to 75,654 for January 2016.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for January 2017 reflected a 17.01 percent increase as the result of increases of 96,475 cars and 14,451 trucks when compared to January 2016. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), increases of 6,894 cars and 674 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 5.45 percent for January 2017 as compared to January 2016.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 7.66 percent in total toll traffic for the month of January 2017 compared to January 2016 as the result of increases of 41,467 cars and 22,737 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 6,402 passenger vehicles and 1,335 trucks combined to generate a 1.90 percent increase in total toll traffic for January 2017.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.72 percent increase in total toll traffic during January 2017 as a result of increases of 549 automobiles and 98 trucks compared to January 2016. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the increase of 20,770 passenger vehicles combined with the increase of 5,865 trucks to generate an overall increase of 3.84 percent in total toll traffic for January 2017 as compared to January 2016. At Milford-Montague (MM), a decrease of 2,390 passenger vehicles and an increase of 60 trucks combined to produce a 2.55 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of January 2017.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

There follows reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of January 2017, the first month of operations of fiscal year 2017 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,014,087 for the month. This expense represents 66.1% of the 2017 year-to-date operating budget. This large positive variance is mainly due to the lack of encumbrances approved during the month of January. As the annual encumbrances are added for fuels, utilities, supplies and materials over the next several months, this large surplus is anticipated to be reduced.

There were no unusual expenses during the month of January 2017.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF JANUARY 2017

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month. Xerox transitioned two (2) lane technicians to TransCore to provide maintenance service and support of the new toll lanes.
- 2. Xerox and Commission staff transferred the spare parts inventory from the Xerox warehouse to the Commission's Morrisville Administration Building garage as the lease for the current warehouse has expired and was not renewed since Xerox will no longer be maintaining the Commission's lanes. Additionally, staff from the NJTA searched items from the spare parts that we no longer have use for and these items were transmitted to them.
- 3. TransCore is revising the engineering design package, Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments. TransCore facilitated daily status calls as we continue to transition lanes at the New Hope-Lambertville, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. Commission Staff are now operating toll lanes on the new system at the New Hope-Lambertville, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. Weekly project status meetings will continue during the installation phase of the project.
- 4. The toll plaza canopy dynamic message signs (DMS) for the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges were delivered to the plazas.
- 5. The Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing punch list items were closed.
- 6. Training for the Toll Collectors, Officers-in-Charge, Bankers, Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent from District 2 is underway.

IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

The Contract Compliance Program and IBE Target of 25% of the total Commission's contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of twenty-eight (28) contracts, including four (4) Task Order Agreements with the new IBE program requirements.

STATUS UPDATES

During the month of January the Contract Compliance Department (CCD) focused on setting up the newly acquired of Elation Systems, Inc. that replaced the previous LCP Tracker and B2GNOW manual systems. Elation Systems is a more comprehensive and advantageous to CCD as the users can electronically upload the data into the system. It allows for more accuracy and less time consuming when contractors are able to upload the prevailing wage rates as well as the certified payrolls electronically. The Elation Systems will reject payrolls that do not meet the States wage requirements immediately and note the required correction, without a resubmittal of paperwork.

- In January, the CCD staff was trained in the usage of Elation Systems via a webinar and invited all prime Construction companies and Consulting firms participating in the Commission's IBE program and that have an open contracts with the Commission to register into Elation Systems. Subsequent to the registrations completion with Elation Systems, the CCD also coordinated two separate webinars to train construction services prime companies and their subcontractors in separate dates the professional services prime and their subconsultants had the opportunity to participate in a webinar training session with their subconsultants.
- ➤ In January the CCD compiled and provided documentation for a Right-to-Know request that was submitted by a citizen requesting to see the certified payrolls for the I-78 Garage Expansion Project.
- > The CCD in partnership with PennDOT coordinated a Meet and Greet event in its District 5 facility in Allentown, PA in which dozens of IBE firms had the opportunity to meet and make a presentation to prime companies in attendance. The event was very well attended and had a standing room only with companies that demonstrated a great amount of enthusiasm and interest in the opportunity of partnering with each other to do work with the Commission.
- > The CCD worked with the Director of Communication and representatives of Stokes Consulting to provide Contract Compliance Department and IBE information to be included in the Commission website.

TRANSITIONAL REPORT

> Due to the fact that the CCD acquired a new payroll verification system from Elation Systems, Inc. and all of the Commission contracts data already established in the previous B2GNOW system had to be transferred into Elation Systems, a period of data entering and gathering from the CCD files and registration from the contractors had to be uploaded. The Transitional Report will detail the total data uploaded to date. Next month's report will be more detailed and enhanced with more payments data and activities performed by the Primes and IBE subs on all active contracts.

CONTRACT AWARDS THAT HAVE IBE TARGETS PARTICIPATION:

• COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Commission Website Redesign - Worked with project manager Chip Stracciolini, acting IT Director John Bencivengo and the Commission's new website consultants Stokes Creative Group to go live with the new website on or about January 17-18. The change from the old site to the new site generated a wave of activity on the first day; this involved changes on the Scudder Falls project website to ensure new linkages for documents previously domiciled in the assets section of the Commission's former website's content-management system (CMS). A series of updates and corrections were needed on the new website, with legally and regulatory postings taking precedence over others. We have received uniform praise for the look and navigation of the new website. The Communications Department has since made other corrections and updates to the new site and has worked with the Contract Compliance Department to ensure completion of that page's functionality and envisioned improvements. To further ensure the continuing transition to the new website, Communications is working with former website consultants and Mr. Bencivengo to ensure continued access to the old CMS platform through a numeric IP address. Meanwhile, Mr. Stracciolini is closing out the project and transitioning the website's handling to the maintenance contract going forward. We expect to issue a press release on the new website in early February.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project — Announced the award of the construction contract to Trumbull Corporation of Pennsylvania. Initiated outreach to key reporters/editors at the Courier-Times and Trenton Times to ensure coverage. Posted the release with corresponding alerts on both the Commission website and the project website. Responded to inquiries from Philadelphia Inquirer business columnist/blogger Joe DiStefano regarding the construction contract procurement. Provided his organization with photographs and renderings as requested. Handled other various media and purported-media inquiries. Updated the banner posting on the project website once the contract bid deadline passed; initially returned to posting on toll rates and E-ZPass signup tie in and then to the contract award announcement. A variety of other changes were made to the website to ensure viability of document links that displayed 404 messages after the go-live date of the new dritbc.org website.

Annual Report – Held organizational conference call with the new design team for the Commission's annual reports. This is being facilitated through Bellevue Communication's Alex Styer and Marcia Perry of Perry Media Group. The initial draft design was submitted and reviewed in late January with another conference call scheduled for early February to close out the report. Community Affairs Report

January 2017

The following Community Affairs activity took place during January:

Scudder Falls Public Involvement

Assisted in review and response to messages received via the Commission and Scudder Falls project websites, as appropriate. Questions and concerns included the timing and location of sound wall installation, the possibility of extending a sidewalk along Route 29, which properties are scheduled for demolition and the results of the bid opening.

Participated in the market research phone conference on the usability of the project website.

Columbia/Knowlton Winter Maintenance

Received a copy of the Winter Maintenance Agreement for Columbia, Knowlton Township, which outlines the areas of responsibility for the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Warren County, Knowlton Township and the Commission and prepared supporting resolution for the Commission's consideration. Following the adoption of resolution at the January 27th Commission meeting, brought signed copies of the agreement to Knowlton Township for the Mayor's signature.

A meeting has been scheduled for February 27 by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Local Government Assistance unit of all involved agencies, to discuss the remediation options for the homes that have experienced elevated well-water sodium levels.

UBE/Milford Bridge Concern

Spoke to a Milford Borough, Hunterdon County, NJ resident concerned about overt drug use in that community and the surrounding area. The area has been greatly affected by the problem and has lost several young adults to overdoses. She believes there is drug activity being conducted in the vicinity of the Upper Black Eddy-Milford Bridge and is requesting additional monitoring or security cameras. Reviewed the situation with Deputy Executive Director of Operations Sean Hill, Director of Safety, Security and Training William Wright and members of the SS&T staff. The following day, the New Jersey State Police received a call reporting drug paraphernalia on bridge property. Commission maintenance staff and NJSP responded. Nothing was found on Commission property.

Safety, Security and Training Manager John Mills has been in contact with the NJSP Liaison to make them aware of community concerns. They have provided him with information on the number of property checks and responses to calls for assistance in the area of the bridge. Will continue to work with SS&T and community officials as the situation warrants.

Workplace Safety

Attended the January Workplace Safety Committee meeting in Easton-Phillipsburg. Traffic speeding in the toll plazas continues to be a concern.

Winter Newsletter

Compiled information and photos for the winter newsletter, to be completed and distributed in February.

Rt. 78 Bridge and Approaches Rehab:

Attended the pre-proposal meeting on the Bridge and Approach Slabs Rehabilitation project. Will work with Vince Fisher of AECOM to identify any community outreach that may be needed.

IBE-PennDOT Contractor event

Attended the Allentown, PA Identified Business Enterprises event organized by Contract Compliance Director Julio Guridy in partnership with PennDOT. The event was well attended and provided an opportunity for general contractors, sub-contractors and contractor professionals to learn about the IBE program and the process for doing business with the Commission. Discussed with Mr. Guridy the possibility of hosting a similar event in New Jersey.

Misc. Community Relations

An out-of-area traveler at the Interstate 78 Welcome Center expressed concern to the PennDOT staff that the building is not ADA compliant. After discussion with Assistant District Superintendent Harry Brown, the customer's concern was taken under advisement, but a direct response to the traveler was unwarranted.

Dewberry was issued Notice to Proceed effective February 22, 2016. A project kick-off meeting was held with Dewberry and their sub-consultant, The Lighting Practice, on March 3, 2016. The designer is proceeding with required tasks. The initial draft concept report has been submitted and reviewed by Commission staff. The consultant revised and resubmitted the concept report as a result of staff comments. The revised report has been accepted by the Commission. This assignment is in the process of being closed out.

DESIGN Contract No. C-628A-7

Dewberry was issued Notice to Proceed effective November 29, 2016. A project kick-off meeting was held with Dewberry and their sub-consultants, The Lighting Practice & ACT Engineers, on December 2, 2016. Local stakeholder meetings were held on February 1st & 2nd 2017 briefing attendees on the sign lighting concept and schedule moving forward. The designer is proceeding with final design.

FEBRUARY 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

LOWER TRENTON TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE NJ APPROACH TRAFFIC SIGNAL UPGRADES

Contract No. C-627B-4

French & Parrello Associates (FPA) submitted final plans, specifications, estimate and schedule addressing all review comments. Notice to Contractors was posted on the Commission's website and advertised in the newspapers. FPA provided the plans and specifications on USB thumb drives for selling to potential bidders.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT FINAL DESIGN SERVICES

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

Bids were due on January 10, 2017 for Contract T-668A. Only one bid was received, and that was submitted by Trumbull Corporation in the amount of \$396,000,000. Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (MB) of Hamilton New Jersey analyzed the bid submittal as well as the Component Item Schedule submission for various structural lump sum pay items and provided an award recommendation. Baker also continued to coordinate with the various utility companies to finalize the necessary utility relocation agreements for the project as well as with the D&R Canal Commission, NJDEP and NJSHPO for the remaining NJ environmental permit authorizations.

Baker continued to participate in ongoing permit coordination with FHWA, the USACE, NJDEP and the Pennsylvania Game Commission regarding the Peregrine Falcon Mitigation Plan approval. Baker will investigate USACE-suggested mitigation sites for the Peregrine Falcon Nest Box location, in order to establish a location that meets the varying criteria between the agencies. The Baker Team continued to respond to contractor Requests for Information (RFI) and submittals associated with Contract T-666A, SFB Project PA Noise Walls Construction.

DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies.

FEBRUARY 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition — one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction, as well as the USACE Permit application package. These three (3) permit application packages were submitted earlier in the year. The DMC continues to work with each of these agencies to address any comments and concerns related to the applications. The primary focus of the comments were related to the location of the Peregrine Falcon Nesting Box. Resolution of the Peregrine Falcon Mitigation Plan is now precedent to the issuance of these permits.

Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (ROW impacts by the SFB project) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. The Commissioners at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the MOU for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility on behalf of the Commission. The Commission is awaiting the final MOU from the NJDEP – Green Acres for signature.

The ROW acquisition process continued during January, which included coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date, in Pennsylvania, the Commission has purchased the full properties at 1140 Woodside Road and 185 River Road, which are not required for construction; and. at 1149 Woodside Road, which is required for construction. In Pennsylvania, the Commission has also purchased partial easements from Lower Makefield Township; Lower Makefield Farmland Preservation; and from the Commonwealth of PA for the I-95 crossing over the PA Delaware Canal; all of which are required for construction. In November the Commission completed the purchase of the 10-acre property at 1199 Woodside Road, which currently hosts the I-95 Park-and-Ride lot, from Lower Makefield Township; and the adjacent, contiguous property at 1167 Woodside Road. The home will be occupied by the former owner, under a lease agreement with the Commission, until The purchase of 1199 Woodside Road is required for the January 31, 2017. Commission's near future District I Administration Building. The 1167 Parcel purchase will allow the Commission to make a direct connection from the future I-295 Park-and-Ride lot to the existing Delaware Canal park system. This connection will accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists, and meets the stipulation for same set forth in the Agreement of Sale with LMT for the 1199 Woodside Road Property. In New Jersey condemnation paperwork was submitted for a partial taking in NJ (Block 423.01, Lot 13) located along River Road, Ewing Township, New Jersey. The Commission was notified in December that it now has possession of the portion of this property needed for the Project.

DMC Staff completed Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. The Phase 2 work was substantially complete on December 16, 2016. Final Completion is scheduled for early January 2017.

FEBRUARY 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The DMC continued to assist the Commission during the bid phase for Contract T-668A. In addition, ongoing coordination continued with the Baker Team and the various utility companies regarding the Utility Relocation Agreements in Pennsylvania. In Pennsylvania, Utility Relocation Agreements have been fully executed with Verizon PA, Comcast PA, Sunesys, and PECO Electric. The PECO Gas Service Agreement was reviewed and comments forwarded to PECO Gas for their consideration. In New Jersey, due to complications on NJDOT's end in being able to develop agreements with the NJ utility companies, the Commission is moving forward in negotiating and entering into separate agreements with PSE&G and Comcast NJ for their required utility relocation work. The Utility Relocation Agreement with Comcast NJ was fully executed in January. The draft Utility Relocation Agreement with PSE&G Electric was forwarded to them for review. Comments were received and are being reviewed by Legal Counsel.

The RFP for the Construction Inspection (CI) Services associated with the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project was posted on November 1, 2016. Three (3) separate CI contracts will be procured under this one RFP solicitation. Eleven (11) proposals were received on December 14, 2016. After Technical Proposal reviews and Consultant interviews, Authorization to Negotiate was received at the January 30, 2017 Commission Meeting for the three contracts; CI-671A, CI-672A, and CI-673A. Contract awards are anticipated at the February 27, 2017 Commission Meeting.

DMC ADVANCED ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR PRIORITY ITEMS OF WORK

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2D

All of the remaining DMC environmental activities are now being completed under Task Order Assignment C-502A-2G. This Task Order Assignment remains open for any Right-of-Way (ROW) technical support that is needed as part of the ROW acquisition process for the project

Construction Management Contract No. CM-664A

This Contract is for Construction Management (CM) Professional Services for the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge, Contract T-666A. Greenman Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) of Lebanon, NJ was awarded this contract at the February 29, 2016 Commissioners' Meeting; and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective March 18, 2016.

During January GPI's CM tasks continued with GPI scheduling and holding the Contract T-666A's Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and scheduling and holding Pre-Construction Activity Meetings as required. GPI continued to handle the processing of submittals, correspondence and Requests for Information from the T-666A Contractor. GPI, through their material inspection sub consultant, Key Tech, continued to perform quality assurance inspections of the noise walls post and panel at the fabricator's shops. GPI also developed the contractor's monthly pay estimate for Commission processing; and, continued oversight and coordination of the inspection efforts of the CI Consultant, Jacobs Engineering Group.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-666A

PKF-MARK III, Inc. (PKF) of Newtown, PA was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's May 2016 Meeting, and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective June 10, 2016.

During January PKF continued to maintain the construction access routes from I-95 into and along the various Noise Wall locations along with their Erosion and Sediment Controls; continued setting noise wall posts and panels which are being fabricated off site by their fabricator, Faddis, along with caulking of the noise wall panels and grouting of the bases of the noise wall posts. PKF also continued grading along the finished wall sections with some of the final graded areas mulch matted and seeded. PKF participated in the Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and any Pre-Construction Activity Meetings held. PKF continued to submit shop drawings and Requests for Information (RFI's) for review and approval as necessary.

Jacobs' Inspectors continued working on site out of the CM Field Office monitoring the T-666A Contractor's field activities, and also performing random inspections of the two (2) fabricator plants where the concrete noise wall post and panel components are being fabricated.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-667A

This Contract is for the clearing of trees in advance of the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge being installed under Contract T-666A and also additional tree clearing in both Pennsylvania and New Jersey in advance of the Main River Bridge contract work. A.P. Construction Company, Inc. (AP) was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's November 2015 Meeting and was issued a Notice to Proceed effective December 23, 2015.

AP completed all tree clearing in Stage 1 reaching Substantial Completion for Stage 1 on April 6, 2016 and Stage 1 Final Completion on April 11, 2016.

During this reporting period, AP, along with their subcontractor Colonial Tree Services, completed the Stage 2 tree clearing with the removal of the remaining felled trees along the River in PA, completed the installation of the silt fence and filter sock in PA and NJ and worked on punchlist items. A meeting was held with the Bucks County Conservation District on January 3, 2017 to review the progress of the installed erosion control measures. AP completed all tree clearing in Stage 2 reaching Substantial Completion for Stage 2 on December 16, 2016 and Stage 2 Final Completion on January 13, 2017.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT SERVICES

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-662A

McCormick Taylor, Inc. (MT) was awarded this Public Involvement (PI) Contract at the Commission's September 28, 2015 Meeting, and issued Notice to Proceed effective October 29, 2015. A kickoff meeting was held with MT on November 25, 2015. The Commission provided comments to MT's draft PI plan and is awaiting a revised draft. MT has attended numerous C-660A progress meetings, and has successfully taken responsibility of maintaining the project hotline and website. MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township and April 27, 2016 Pennsylvania Noise Walls Update Meeting. MT organized and participated in the July 19th & 21st District I Open House/Toll Hearings held in Ewing Township (NJ) and Lower Makefield Township (PA) respectively. MT also organized and participated in August 2nd & 4th District II Toll Hearings in Easton (PA) and Phillipsburg (NJ) respectively also and the August 9th & 11th District III Toll Hearings held in Montague (NJ) & East Stroudsburg (PA) respectively. MT has finalized the open house/toll hearing summary report from these events. MT is also working with the Commission to develop additional outreach activities anticipated to take place prior to construction commencing.

CAPITAL PROGRAM MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT (CPMC) & DESIGN MANGEMENT CONSULTANT (DMC) SERVICES FOR THE I-95/SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

CPMC SERVICES - YEAR 2016

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-1L

Task Order Assignment 502A-1L, Capital Program Management Consultant (CPMC) Services for 2016, was executed in April 2016. Services began in July 2016. AECOM is currently providing one (1) part-time Project Manager to oversee and manage various design and construction projects that are being advanced in the Capital Improvement Program. CPMC Staff are currently providing the management and oversight of Contract C-644A, I-78 Roadway Approach/Transition Slabs Rehabilitation and the Rehabilitation of the Cedarville Road Overpass.

AECOM is also providing technical support to the Commission in connection with its implementation of a more robust and cost efficient WAN that supports both the ESS and internal DRJTBC network requirements involving a communication solution provider, managed services vendor and equipment supplier.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE INTERIM DECK REPAIRS

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-677A

Sparwick Contracting, Inc. (SCI) completed all deck repairs and roadway striping by September 8, 2015. SCI is now in their second year of their on-call and emergency spall repairs phase of the contract on an as-needed basis, as part of their construction contract. This contract includes an optional call-back period ending in November 2018.

I-78 TOLL BRIDGE MAINTENANCE GARAGE PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-508A

This contract is for Preliminary, Final and Post-Design Services for renovations and expansion at the I-78 Maintenance Garage as identified under a Task Order Assignment for Space Utilization Program and Concept Study provided by Buchart Horn, Inc. / BASCO Associates.

Burns Engineering Inc. (BE) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015, Final Design Submission and Bid Set were received on April 5, 2016, Bids were open on May 10th, reviewed by the Consultant, Commission Counsels and Contract Compliance and a Construction Contract Award was made at the June 2016 Regular Monthly Commission Meeting.

Consultant is currently providing Post Design services, reviewing Contractor's Request for Information, submittals, issuing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, and attending Bi-Weekly Progress Meetings.

CODE COMPLIANCE PLAN REVIEW AND INSPECTIONS Task Order Assignment No. C-696A-1

Utilizing the Commission's current Facilities Task Order Agreement with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson (JMT), this Task Order Assignment is to provide Code Plan Reviews, and Code Compliance Inspections on as needed basis for the I-78 Maintenance Garage Expansion Project. Said services will be provided by a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry (PA L&I) Certified Third-Party Agency in the appropriate building trade categories and in accordance with the current Uniform Construction Code Inspection Procedures UCC-9.

FEBRUARY 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JMT on February 25, 2016, and the Consultant provided Peer and Code Plan reviews of the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended the pre-final design submission review meeting, reviewed and certified the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

Consultant attended Construction Kick-Off meeting on July 12, and is currently attending periodic construction progress meeting and providing all required UCC inspections.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES CM-508A

This contract is for Construction Management (CM) Services in connection with the renovations and expansion of I-78 Maintenance Garage Project. As part of the CM services the Consultant scope of work includes Constructability Review of the Bid Documents during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A.

STV Inc. (STV) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective March 1, 2016. A meeting was held with the Consultant on March 2nd to review the Commission's expectations of the consultant's services during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A. Constructability Review was provided by the Consultant on the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended its design review meeting on March 21, and reviewed the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

STV attended the Pre-Construction Meeting on July 12, and is currently providing construction field inspections, conducting bi-weekly progress meetings along with processing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, Contractor's Submittals and Request for Information as part of providing construction management services.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-508A

Bracy Construction Inc., was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's June 2016 Meeting. Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed letter was issued effective June 28, 2016. Pre-Construction Meeting was held on July 12th and a Notice to Proceed effective date of July 25th was issued in accordance with the Contract Specifications.

Contractor completed set-up of the field trailers and temporary facilities, set-up Erosion and Sediment Controls in accordance with the County Conservation District's approved permit, started the demolition activities for Phases 1 & 2 of the Project. Phase 1 Construction Substantial Completion was reached November 11, 2016 as relates to the Commission's salt, brine & magnesium chloride operation. Phase 2 footings, foundation walls, new bearing walls and steel erection has been completed, and construction activities are currently focused on the installation of all underground and under-slab utilities, watertight and close the new building.

I-78 BRIDGES AND APPROACH SLAB REHABILITATION

DESIGN Contract No. C-644A

Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) was awarded this design contract at the Commission's February 2016 Meeting and their Notice of Award/Limited Notice to Proceed was issued effective March 1, 2016. This design project is for the repair of various bridge, pavement and other miscellaneous deficiencies associated with the 13 bridges and approach roadways located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction on I-78.

During this reporting period, the DRJTBC/AECOM provided GF with comments to the pre-final design submission which included the final I-78 toll plaza merge restriping plans as developed by Malick & Scherer under Task Order Assignment No. C-628A-8. GF is incorporating these revisions into the final submission.

RESTRIPING OF THE MERGE LANES EXITING THE I-78 TOLL PLAZA

DESIGN

Task Order Agreement Contract No. C-628A-8

Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (DE), through a standing Consultant Engineer Agreement, was requested to provide Engineering Services to design modifications to the existing striping of the merge area west of the I-78 westbound toll plaza. DE was requested to utilize Malick & Scherer, PC. (M&S) for this design effort due to their current involvement as a sub-consultant to Gannett Fleming on the C-644A I-78 Bridges and Approach Slab Rehabilitation Project, whose tasks include the restriping of the entire I-78 mainline located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction. The purpose of this restriping design is to provide dedicated through lanes for the two left ORT E-Z Pass lanes continuing after the toll plaza, and have the four right toll lanes merge with the right high speed lane in the vicinity of the Morgan Hill Road Interchange.

During this reporting period, the DRJTBC/AECOM reviewed and provided comments to the plans and specifications of the preferred merge design alternative developed by M&S and incorporation into the C-644A pre-final design submission. DE submitted their first invoice for this Task Order effort, which is under review by Commission staff.

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month. Xerox transitioned two (2) lane technicians to TransCore to provide maintenance service and support of the new toll lanes.

Xerox and Commission staff transferred the spare parts inventory from the Xerox warehouse to the Commission's Morrisville Administration Building garage as the lease for the current warehouse has expired and was not renewed since Xerox will no longer be maintaining the Commission's lanes. Additionally, staff from the NJTA searched items from the spare parts that we no longer have use for and these items were transmitted to them.

DB-584

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in June 2017.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

All sites (toll and toll supported bridges) were installed by Commission Staff with assistance from Signal Service. Signal Service revisited each site to conduct manual traffic counts and compare them to the traffic counter. All sites are calibrated and sending data to the server. In order to improve data collection for the Scudder Falls Bridge, Signal Service and Commission Staff will install a second radar unit. The sever set-up has not been completed. Upon completion, the server will be installed at the Commission's Administration Building.

FEBRUARY 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DISTRICT 2 & 3 PHASE 1 TOLL COLLECTION COUNTING FACILITIES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th, 2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's comments with the Consultant. Final Design Submission was received December 30, 2016 and a design submission review meeting was conducted on January 9, 2017 and revised documents were received January 19, 2017.

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended weekly status meetings and final review of the punch list for the Onsite First Article Testing (OFAT) previously conducted at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge and New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. RK&K reviewed the revised engineering plans, maintained a punch list from testing, and worked with the installation team on the next steps for the transition of the lanes.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT IMPLEMENTATION CM Task Order Assignment No. C-701A-1

RK&K is providing on-site construction inspection/management services for the replacement of the electronic toll collection system. Services provided included inspection of the concrete roadway slab replacements at the Milford-Montague, Portland-Columbia and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridges. Review of concrete specifications, placement, and cylinder breaks is on-going.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT

RK&K responded to request for information from TransCore as they prepare for the installation of the Daktronics LED signs and the interface with the new electronic toll collection system replacement.

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission. Meeting being scheduled to revise scope and discuss utilization of new communication infrastructure.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Jacobs Engineering submitted a revised draft updated traffic and revenue forecast report for the Scudder Falls Bridge replacement and the Commission's existing seven (7) toll bridges addressing comments from the bond/financing team. Jacobs also participated in the meetings with the bond/financing team to answer questions that they had regarding the report. Jacobs completed additional sensitivity analysis as requested by the rating agencies.

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with Joseph Jingoli & Son, Inc. (JJS), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to implement the Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) identified in an ASHRAE Level 3 Energy Audit prepared under Task Oder Assignment No. C-657A-1 at all of the Commission's seven (7) Toll Bridge facilities.

A Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JJS on November 21, 2016, record room site visits, and field surveys of the seven toll bridges has been completed. Progress meeting was conducted on February 1, 2017, reporting field observations and conditions in advance of a Schematic Design submission that is anticipated to be received by the end of February 2017.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2018 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. On November 21, 2016, the Commission, via Resolution 3090-11-16, extended CWA's contract to perform GEC services and inspections in 2017 & 2018. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering, and CWA.

Bridge and Facility Inspections have been completed at the toll-supported bridges. Inspection of Scudder Falls was completed during the third week of August, after the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle (no Falcons were nesting on the bridge this year).

CWA submitted the draft Maintenance Report on September 9. Review meetings were held with District 1 Operations & Maintenance staff on September 30 in Morrisville and Districts 2 & 3 Operations & Maintenance Staff on September 28 in Phillipsburg.

CWA submitted the Draft Final Annual Inspection and Maintenance reports on December 22 and they are currently under review by Engineering and Operations Staff.

CWA has updated the PennDOT BMS and NJDOT Combis system for each of the scheduled bridges within 30 days of the completion of the field inspection of each bridge. CWA updated the PennDOT BMS2 with rating information from the Underwater Inspections in Districts 1, 2 & 3.

Sign retroreflectivity testing was performed for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in October.

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF JANUARY 2017

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued working to complete the radio upgrade. The new base station radios are being programed and installed at the various bridges. The planning of the microwave portion of the upgrade continues. Currently the NJ State Police Radio Engineer is reviewing alternate relay sites to replace the Commission's "Corn Hill" site in West Amwell, NJ. This site appears to be structurally unsound to hold the necessary equipment and would have to be reinforced to do so.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues.
- In January 2017, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants.
- During the month of January 2017, the ACS database was audited and the system
 was purged of invalid employees and contractor cards. Various other employee
 ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of January 2017, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management system. Recently it was learned that the Genetec video management system also has features similar to a Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System. On January 9, ESS personnel met with a Genetic Engineer at the Primary Control Center to review the Commission's operation. In February 2017, ESS personnel will attend a workshop with various Genetic representatives to further explore the benefits of their system.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued working with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. Various cameras at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge and the Lower Trenton Toll Supported Bridge have been upgraded.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel have been working with representatives from Telegra Analytics to test their product.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Purchasing to implement the new Comcast communications network. The team anticipates testing cut overs during the month of February 2017.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.

- The ESS Primary Control Center (PCC) continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents. Recently, the PCC has been actively reporting on the traffic congestion the Commission is experiencing in District I due to the closing of the PA/NJ Turnpike River Bridge in Florence, NJ. The PCC has also been very active working with the Districts during snow operations.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed eleven video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video" Report for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On January 12, 2017, ESS personnel attended the DRJTBC Staff Meeting and Operations Meeting.
- On January 24, 2017, ESS personnel facilitated a meeting with District personnel
 to discuss a vehicle that will be utilized by toll officers to patrol and respond to
 incidents on Commission property.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Operations and Engineering to develop new toll and banking facilities that will afford the Commission and its employees more security and protection from theft. ESS is currently developing a Standard Operating Guideline for the new "Panic Button" located on the toll collection screen.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel conducted an analysis pertaining to the frequency the Commission utilizes wrecker services on its bridges and roadways.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel conducted job interviews for two vacancies at the Primary Control Center. ESS personnel also revised the Primary Control Center training curriculum to enhance the training of new personnel hired as ESS Monitors.
- During the month of January 2017, ESS personnel continued to review the various emergency operations plans for the toll bridges.
