MOMENT OF SILENCE

At this point in the Meeting Chairman Lavery requested everyone remain standing for a moment of silence for all the victims of Dallas and Baton Rouge.

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and three members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, as was the case three weeks ago, my report for this month is dominated by recent developments concerning our Scudder Falls location.

"Preparations for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project took a significant leap forward over the past two weeks with the rollout of a proposed toll schedule for the new bridge and the announcement of a corresponding public hearing process. The Commission also plans to gather comment on two narrowly defined adjustments in its current toll schedule as part of this process. The rollout was executed in accordance with the Commission's 2013 Toll Adjustment Public Hearing and Comment Policy. This will be the first toll adjustment to advance under this relatively recent Commission policy. The rollout involved the publication of the official Public Notice in the same daily newspapers that handle our Commission meeting notices. The Public Notice also was posted on our website along with separate web pages for the proposed Scudder Falls toll schedule and the two proposed adjustments in the toll schedule for our seven current toll bridges. Links to these postings also were established on the Scudder Falls project website, www.scudderfallsbridge.com. Letters for the first two hearings have been mailed to the respective elected officials, government agencies, and various stakeholders and residents affected by the Scudder Falls project. Finally, a press release issued last Monday has generated articles in a wide breadth of outlets locally, regionally, and even on some national outlets. The first two hearings are scheduled to take place in the host communities for the Scudder Falls Bridge this week: One at the West Trenton Volunteer Fire Company Ballroom in Ewing New Jersey on Tuesday evening; and the other at the William Penn Middle School in Lower Makefield Township on Thursday. sessions will involve informational open houses starting at 4:30 p.m. followed by respective toll hearings starting at 6 p.m. For the open houses, Commission and project staff have worked with the public involvement team to arrange displays of the various toll schedules and adjustments as well as display boards of major project elements. There also will be a PowerPoint presentation and a new video to educate the public about the all-electronic toll (AET) system that will be utilized to collect tolls in the southbound direction at the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge beginning sometime in 2019. The new video is just shy of three minutes long and will be aired along with the prior eight minute video that was produced to explain the Scudder Falls project. The additional four toll hearings required under the Commission's comment gathering policy will be held in Easton, Phillipsburg, Montague and East Stroudsburg in early August. These sessions will focus on the proposed toll adjustments and will not include open houses on the Scudder Falls project. We fully intend to provide Commissioners with the results of the toll hearing process shortly after the public comment period comes to an official close on August 29.

"Another Scudder Falls development that has moved forward in recent weeks is our proposed acquisition of the 10-acre parcel that Lower Makefield Township owns near our current bridge. Our negotiations with the township for purchase of the property have advanced to the point where we are presenting Commissioners today with a formal resolution to acquire the property. Under the resolution, the

Commission would pay the Township \$800,000 for the parcel and an additional \$250,000 to the township's environmental advisory council-administered Tree Bank to compensate for the trees that are being removed as part of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. We intend to use the property for construction of an appropriately sized building that would serve as our agency's administrative headquarters, replacing the cramped and woefully aging building adjacent to Route 1 in Morrisville. As part of the purchase, we also would commit to reconstructing the current park-and-ride lot at the location to accommodate 103 parking spaces. We would assume ownership of the lot, taking full responsibility for the future operation, maintenance, landscaping, and snow and trash removal in perpetuity. The current maintenance agreement for the lot involving PennDOT. the Township and our agency would be terminated. We also would construct, at Commission expense, a bicycle/pedestrian path from the reconstructed park & ride lot to the Delaware Canal Park towpath, which subsequently will be linked to the bike-ped facility to be constructed across the river as part of the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge. If the Commission were to approve this framework today. Lower Makefield Township supervisors could provide reciprocal action as early as Wednesday evening. I want to stress that this property acquisition is separate and apart from our impending bridge construction project. It is, however, an ideal location for what will be our agency's largest office building, especially since the new Scudder Falls Bridge stands to be a significant crossing into the foreseeable future.

"There is one additional update regarding our Scudder Falls location a status update on the noise-abatement wall project now underway along the Scudder Falls Bridge's Pennsylvania I-95 approach in Lower Makefield. The project has completed the removal of brush and stumps along the northbound approach roadway and is in the process of completing the temporary construction of access roads in the northbound direction. This is allowing the contractor to redirect the lion's share of its field resources to the southbound direction this week. We anticipate foundation work to begin sometime next week. The delivery and installation of noise wall posts should follow shortly thereafter, setting the stage for the placement of noise-abatement panels. We remain on pace to complete this project shortly before the bridge reconstruction project moves into full construction mode in the first half of next year.

"Finally, there is one noteworthy capital program item on today's executive agenda: the award of the construction contract for the Riverton-Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge Critical Member Strengthening Project. Under this project, the contractor is to make a series of needed repairs to the two-lane truss bridge connecting Belvidere, N.J. with the Riverton section of Lower Bethel Township, PA. Work is to be performed on gusset plate connections, lower chord members, and end posts. Slope stabilization improvements in the area of the bridge also are

to be accomplished as part of the project. We are recommending that the contract be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, Road-Con, Inc. of West Chester, PA.

"In closing, I want to remind everyone that — as in past practice — the Commission's August meeting has been cancelled. The next Commission meeting is scheduled for September 26. Until then, please enjoy the rest of summer and drive safely."

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of July 18, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (June, 2016)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for June 2016 in comparison to the June 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of June.

Analysis of June 2016 / June 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 2.57 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 2.00 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 4.17 percent increase.

Analysis of June 2016 / June 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 131,240 vehicles, or 3.79 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 10,924 vehicles, or 2.27 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 120,316 vehicles, or 4.04 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for June 2016 was 119,750 total vehicles as compared to 115,375 total vehicles in June 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for June 2016 increased by 57,397 vehicles, or 2.10 percent as compared to June 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for June 2016 was 92,824 vehicles as compared to 90,911 in June 2015.

Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 5.28 percent increase through the first six months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 1.17 percent increase for the first six months of 2016 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for June 2016 reflected a 3.75 percent increase as the result of increases of 28,603 cars and 405 trucks when compared to June 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), increases of 2,522 cars and 1,182 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 2.16 percent for June 2016 as compared to June 2015.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 2.87 percent in total toll traffic for the month of June 2016 compared to June 2015 as the result of combined increases of 27,796 cars and 1,768 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 26,106 passenger vehicles and 4,846 trucks combined to generate a 6.95 percent increase in total toll traffic for June 2016.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 7.08 percent increase in total toll traffic during June 2016 as a result of the increase of 7,904 automobiles and the decrease of 421 trucks compared to June 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, increases of 22,990 passenger vehicles and 3,281 trucks combined to generate an increase of 3.21 percent in total toll traffic for June 2016 as compared to June 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), the increases of 4,395 passenger vehicles and the decrease of 137 trucks produced a 3.63 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of June 2016.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

June 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of June, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 52 purchase orders in the total amount of \$172,093.52. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 21 price inquiries were sent out for 7 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.0 per order (21/7= 3.0).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of June 2016 are shown below:

- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$33,780.96, for the approved Capital procurement of a truck-mounted attenuator for the Commission's I-78 Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$17,566.36 for Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) desktop computers for the needs of the Commission.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$14,915.00 at the request of the Electronic Security & Surveillance Department for card reader and camera installations at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$12,750.00 for HVAC repairs at the Commission's Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$10,046.70 for the kitchen renovations at the Commission's I-78 Toll Bridge Facility.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF JUNE 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Acquisition of the spare parts and consumables is underway by Xerox. Once all items are received, Commission Staff will review the inventory.
- 3. TransCore submitted the final System Detailed Design Document, final Installation and Transition Plan and the final Training Plan. Draft design plans for the New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge lanes were submitted for review and comment. A draft Disaster Recovery Plan was also submitted for review and comment. TransCore facilitated bi-weekly project status meetings.
- 4. Lane 2 at the New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge was closed and turned over to TransCore where they have installed a full lane that will be used for Factory Acceptance Testing. Commission staff and vehicles will be used for creating the test transactions both in dry runs and the official testing.
- 5. TransCore has mobilized their equipment and personnel to the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge where preparation of the open road tolling (ORT) Factory Acceptance Test is underway. TransCore will utilize the 17' wide right shoulder of the ORT zone for this testing.

Activities for the E-Z Pass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

- 1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in February 2017.
- 2. Commission Staff reviewed the revised draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC. A conference call was facilitated by the NJTA to continue discussing the comments from the various agencies.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. The Commission hosted the IAG E-Z Pass Group's two day Executive Management Committee two day workshop.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-Z Pass Executive Management Committee workshop and Policy Committee meetings.
- 3. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-Z Pass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.

IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

Contract Compliance IBE Target of 25% of the total contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of twenty-five (25) contracts, including two Task Orders Agreements awarded with the new IBE program requirements.

STATUS UPDATES

During the month of June, the Contract Compliance Department worked very diligently with pertinent staff of the Engineering Department to assure that the apparent lowest bidder of contract number T-508A, who initially submitted an unacceptable IBE participation in their initial Good Faith Effort Plan. The amount of data provided to the Contract Compliance Department to verify the Good Faith Efforts plan submitted for the contract was very voluminous, but with the collaborative efforts and guidance from the CCD staff and support from the engineering department in the process before the commissioners approved the award of the project, the IBE participation was increased to a more acceptable level. This experience has prompted the CCD to consider revising the construction Guidelines to ascertain if another update is due.

B2GNOW CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL REPORTING SYSTEMS

- > The CCD staff added contract number T 508A, Construction Services for I-78 Maintenance garage Expansion that was awarded to Bracy Construction, Inc. and its numerous subcontractors. The CCD continues to work with the engineering department to complete audits for the Primes and their IBE subcontractors/sub-consultants companies through B2GNOW and assure that the prime companies pay and report their payments to the sub-consultants and sub-contractors through said system.
- The CCD has also scheduled B2GNOW system trainings for new contracts and those that have not followed-up with posting their payments in the system.

LCP TRACKER CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL CERTIFICATION SYSTEMS

The process of creating the Contract Compliance Program LCP Master List for the eight counties in PA and NJ, continues through the month of June. The CCD staff has been working with the staff from the LCP Tracker system to correct a significant number of discrepancies found in the initial template information provided to the Commission by LCP Tracker. This has been a daunting task as the amount of calculation and data needed to be manually entered in the system is in the thousands and must always be double checked by CCD staff to avoid encountering errors when auditing the contractors prevailing wages of the certified payrolls of the numerous crafts classifications provided by contractors in each counties.

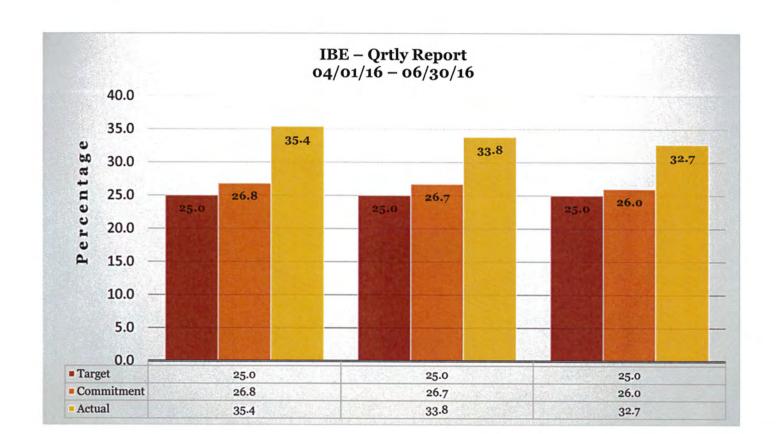

COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project Public Involvement – Worked with engineering department and public involvement consultant McCormick Taylor to begin preparations for rollout of possible toll schedule for the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge, once it is finalized. This involved meetings, creation and content drafting for a webpage, drafting and vetting of legal ads, working on an educational video about all-electronic tolling, reviewing the current SFB project video for possible changes/updates, reviewing narration samples for the video, identifying and drafting content for potential event display boards, and editing of the draft video script. Community Affairs Report June 2016

The following Community Affairs activity took place during June:

Scudder Falls

Attended project status meetings with Commission staff and McCormick-Taylor, focusing this month on the proposed toll hearings, All Electronic Tolling and related public awareness pieces. Prepared letter to stakeholders advising of issuance of Pennsylvania sound wall contract and construction schedule.

Received a phone call from the Pennsylvania State Parks Department, inquiring about the sound walls in relation to the Delaware Canal. Engineering will be providing info to share with the Parks Department.

Continued to coordinate with McCormick-Taylor and Commission staff on messages received through project website to ensure all inquiries are answered.

Knowlton-Columbia Along with District III Superintendent Jeanne Clark and Foreman James

Gower, attended meeting to discuss winter maintenance of roadways in the Columbia section of Knowlton Township. The meeting included representatives of the NJ Department of Transportation, Warren County and Knowlton Township officials. The agreement is necessary to avoid duplication of work. Several areas were adjusted, based on continuity of routes. The Commission will no longer be plowing or salting the section of Decatur Street that we had maintained in the past.

Upon discussion with Deputy Executive Director of Operations Sean Hill, the Commission agrees with the proposed map, with the caveat that each agency will maintain the roadways in accordance with their operations plan, and no agency will dictate to another how to perform their operations. I relayed this information to Debbie Hirt of the DOT for inclusion in the Memorandum of Agreement being prepared.

While it was made clear that this agreement is only for the purpose of winter road maintenance, there remains the wider question of which agencies legally own what roads? This will need to be addressed as well.

There has been no further information from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection on its study of the salt issue in the area.

Water Gap cameras The National Park Service is conducting a river usage survey, with assistance from a Clemson University research student, They requested permission to place "trail cams" on the Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague bridges. Made arrangements with NPS representative Leslie Morlock and District III Superintendent Clark to meet them on-site. Maintenance staff assisted in securing the cameras in accessible, yet nonobtrusive locations off of the walkways. The student will be checking on the cameras periodically and they will be removed by the end of the summer.

Workplace Safety

Attended the June Workplace Safety Committee meeting at Portland-Columbia and participated in safety review of the facility.

Host communities:

Delivered proclamation to Riegelsville for their anniversary celebration.

Reviewed request from Morrisville Borough for financing assistance of security cameras. Prepared response for Executive Director's approval.

Replied to request from former Knowlton Mayor Frank Van Horn requesting information on amount of grants to the township in the past.

Misc. Customer relations

A Lambertville business owner had items damaged by a tree falling from Commission property and submitted an insurance claim. Received a call from Lambertville City Clerk's office on his behalf, asking what is needed to prove antique value of the items. Working with Insurance Administrator Arne Larsen to determine status of claim.

An Easton resident and business owner inquired about rumble strips on Route 22. The Commission filled in the strips last October. The resident thought that the fourth set of strips, farthest west near 4th Street, had not been filled in and was still creating a noise issue. The area was reviewed by District II Superintendent Shelley and maintenance staff, who provided photos showing the area had been filled in previously. Responded to the resident with photos and followed-up with phone call. He was very pleased with the Commission's responsiveness and assistance. He will be in touch.

Received an inquiry from District 1 Superintendent Lavar Talley regarding having the toll bridges noted on GPS navigation systems. A toll collector told him that many times commuters are not aware of a toll because their GPS did not inform them of such and they do not have cash or EZPass. I looked into it and learned that Apple navigation does not include any include any mention of tolls. Google maps has a toll warning when obtaining directions from the website but I don't believe they are included on the mobile app. There are user-based apps such as Waze, where commuters can add items such as traffic, speed trap or detour, so perhaps a toll notification could be added. I will continue researching and will advise accordingly.

Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition — one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the Commission's maintenance jurisdiction was submitted to the PADEP on February 29, 2016, and to the USACE on March 4, 2016. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for PennDOT's maintenance jurisdiction was submitted to PennDOT in early March and to the PADEP on March 25, 2016. Additional back-up information was provided to PADEP on May 18th to support the Joint Permit Application for the Commission's jurisdiction. Minor changes to the permitting conditions that have resulted from the final design development are being prepared under contract C-660A by Michael Baker Jr. through June. These will be incorporated into an addendum document to these applications and submitted to the respective agencies for final approval with the originally submitted permit application packages.

Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (ROW impacts by the SFB project) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting.

The Commission is still awaiting preliminary approval of the Revised Jurisdictional Determination (JD) Plans that were submitted to the USACE on December 11, 2015.

The ROW acquisition process continued during the month of June, including coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date the Commission has purchased the following properties in Pennsylvania: Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road, an additional property not required for construction; Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road, an additional property not required for construction; and, Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001, at 1149 Woodside Road, both parcels required for construction. The

Commission also purchased a partial easement on Parcel 20-027-007, necessary for construction. The Right-of-Way Easement Agreement for the property over the PA Delaware Canal was signed by the Commission during the month of June and has been forwarded to the Pennsylvania DCNR for final execution.

The Commission continues to pursue properties in Pennsylvania and New Jersey in support of this project.

DMC Staff completed the coordination and oversight of Contract T-661, Geotechnical Boring Contract for the SFB Project. All work under the call-back phase of the contract, which included thirty-four (34) additional borings, was completed during the month of May. The DMC continue to provide Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. Phase 2 work will begin in October of this year.

Various design submittals by Baker were reviewed by the DMC Staff during the month of June. In addition, coordination meetings with the PA and NJ utility companies that are being impacted by the proposed construction were held throughout the month. Utility Agreements will be required with each of the impacted utility companies. The Utility companies are currently preparing cost estimates for the relocation of their facilities. The Commission is working with NJDOT on the NJ utility relocation effort and coordinating the necessary utility agreements with them for the impacted NJ utility companies. The Commission will reimburse the NJDOT for the costs associated with relocating the impacted NJ utility companies.

In Pennsylvania, the draft utility agreement for PECO Electric was submitted and reviewed by the DMC, Engineering and the Commission's Legal Counsel. Commission comments to this agreement has been forwarded to PECO Electric for their review.

Final comments were received from PennDOT on the Draft Inter-governmental Agreement (IGA) between the Commission and PennDOT to address coordination efforts required during design and construction. Engineering as well as the Commission's Legal Counsel have reviewed the final comments and minor edits were provided to and subsequently approved by PennDOT. Authorization to execute thIGA was received at the June 27, 2016 Commission Meeting.

The Commission received a copy of the fully executed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Commission and NJDOT, to address coordination efforts required during design and construction, on June 6, 2016.

The request for proposals (RFP) for the CM Services associated with the main construction contract for the SFB Project (Contract CM-669A) was posted on June 7th. The Pre-Proposal Meeting was held on June 28th. Proposals are scheduled to be submitted on July 28th.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT

NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLAND-COLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES

Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

RK&K submitted final plans, specifications and estimate for the I-78 approach roadway sign overlay. The plans and specifications were provided to J. Flectch Creamer & Son for pricing. Commission Staff reviewed pricing to complete this work during a daytime closing. Commission Staff requested an estimate of the traffic impact from RK&K during the one day anticipate double lane closure.

TransCore continues to work with their electrician on a cost to complete the toll plaza canopy signs.

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

STUDY FOR SELECT VEHICULAR BRIDGES Contract No. C-556A

Pennoni Associates submitted their final report outlining opportunities for implementation of structural health monitoring as well as overweight / oversized vehicle detection, deterrence and enforcement through the long term application of sensor type technologies together with a data acquisition / reporting system to function as an integrated Bridge Monitoring System.

The Commission is currently evaluating the recommendation to recommission the monitoring equipment at New Hope-Lambertville and Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported bridges.

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations.

Meeting of July 18, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Due to the departure of personnel Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Jacobs Engineering submitted several draft model runs summarizing the expected revenue from the Scudders Falls Bridge using various toll rates. The results of the various alternatives were provided to the Commission's Finance Advisor, NW Finance, to develop the overall project financing plan. This information was presented at the June 2016 Committee Meeting.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2016 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering and CWA.

Inspections have been completed at the toll-supported bridges, with the exception of Scudder Falls. Scudder Falls is scheduled to be inspected in August because of the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle.

CWA will be required to update the PennDOT BMS and NJDOT Combis system for each of the scheduled bridges within 30 days of the completion of the field inspection of each bridge. Facilities Inspections were held on June 14in District 1 and June 15 in Districts 2 & 3. The facilities at Riverton – Belvidere TSB were skipped due to time constraints. (The officer's shelter was recently rehabilitiated by maintenance, the garage roof was recently replaced, and there is a current Engineering project to strengthen the bridge and address water runoff on the approaches). Two findings during the facilities inspection required immediate action. The first was finding of deteriorated wood in a column nad header beam in on the porch at the Lumberville – Raven Rock house and the second was a damaged light pole on the New Jersey approach of the Lower Trenton TSB. District 1 maintenance forces shored up the porch with additional supports and removed the light damaged light pole until a new one can be installed. Sign retroreflectivity testing has been tentatively scheduled for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in June.

A Kick-Off Meeting was held on June 9, 2016 with the Commission's communication solution provider, Comcast Cable Communications Management, LLC, and initial site surveys are underway.

AECOM is providing technical support to the Commission in connection with its implementation of a more robust and cost efficient Wide Area Network (WAN) that supports both the ESS and internal DRJTBC network requirements involving a communication solution provider, managed services vendor and equipment supplier.

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF JUNE 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel started labelling and assigning the new radios to vehicles, bridges, and personnel. Installation work has begun at the Stockton Repeater site and the in-building antenna systems at Milford-Montague, Easton-Phillipsburg, Trenton-Morrisville, and New Hope-Lambertville has been upgraded.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's lock smith) to address various lock issues and install new door locks at various facilities.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric and Delmor Security to install a new change fund locker at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility.
- During the month of June 2016 ESS personnel worked with the Districts to upgrade security for the new toll collection system by preparing to install new card reader door locks and cameras.
- In June 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges and/or toll swipe cards for new employees, summer employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees.
- During the month of June 2016, the ACS database was audited and the system
 was purged of invalid employee and contractor cards. Various other employee
 ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.

• Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of June 2016, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management and access control system. Schneider is expected to provide the Commission with a proposal for the potential change over.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. Schneider Electric is scheduled to perform a "camera shootout" or comparison of new cameras.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering to design the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel also worked with District II and Engineering to create a design for turning the I-78 administrative garages into offices.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new and pending construction projects. Security enhancements are in the process of being reviewed at the banks of the various toll bridges.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel worked with Engineering and Purchasing to conduct site surveys at the various bridges so Comcast can start equipment installation for the Commission's new broadband communications system.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.

- The ESS Primary Control Center continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of Month 2016, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed fourteen video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video Report" for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On June 21, 2016, ESS personnel attended an Operations Meeting regarding vehicle replacement.
- Commission personnel are in the process of designing a new vehicle for the toll
 officers to respond to accidents, incidents, and execute the MAP (Motorist
 Assistance Program) program. As a result, on June 24, 2016, ESS arranged for
 NJDOT Traffic Operations Personnel to bring one of their Emergency Service
 Patrol Vehicles to the Commission for viewing.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel continued to provide "Active Shooter" training to Commission personnel.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with the Districts to review, update and develop incident response plans for each toll bridge.
- During the month of June 2016, ESS personnel assisted Human Resources and the Districts with various internal issues, investigations, and terminations.
