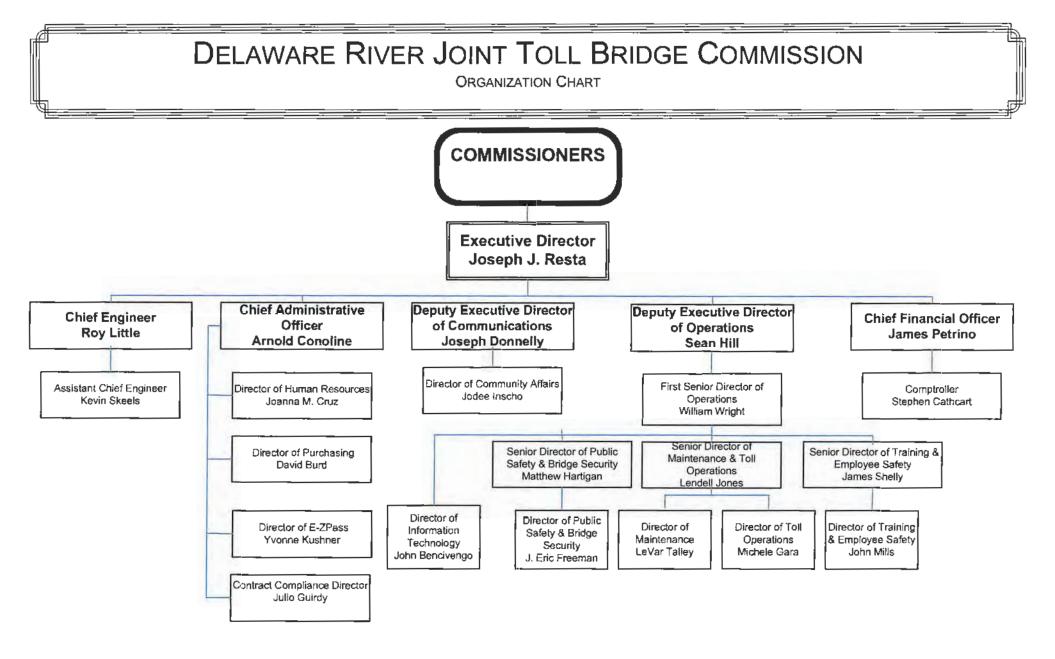

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being five members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

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EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, winter has been reluctant to let go of its grip of the Commission, as evidenced by multiple Nor'easter storms over the last few weeks;

"These storms are routinely full of precipitation and are accompanied by high winds, with snowfall rates sometimes reaching 2 to 3" inches per hour. Late winter snow is always trying for our maintenance crews, but especially when storms come back-to-back when we are low on the commodities to clear the roadways, and our folks are physically and mentally fatigued. It is these times when snow operations training and planning demonstrate their relative importance, along with the steady dedication of our crews that gets the job done. We commend them for their efforts this winter season;

"Today's agenda has two important construction awards for Commissioner's consideration;

"The New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Floor System Rehabilitation Project is indicative of the methodology that the Commission uses to take on a capital project. Biennial inspections are undertaken by our General Engineering Consultant, a need for rehabilitative work is identified by the inspection, Commissioners provide for funding in the Capital Budget, and a project is designed, then constructed. Six bids were received during the procurement process, with Allied Painting, Inc. for your consideration today as the lowest responsible bidder;

"As you know, we have been working diligently to design the replacement for our end-of-useful-life Administration Building in Morrisville. For your consideration today is the construction award for the Commission Administration Building at Scudder Falls and Adaptive Reuse of the 1799 Building. The construction procurement was very robust, with ten bidders competing for the contract. Bracy Construction, Inc. the lowest responsible bidder, is put forth for your consideration today. This project, along with the Southern Regional Maintenance Facility currently in design for our Morrisville location, are the building blocks for the near and long term need of the Commission as it works towards the completion of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project in 2021;

"Today's meeting also acknowledges the efforts of individuals whose actions helped saved the life of a troubled patron intent on doing themselves harm. These events are always tragic, but do not always end tragically. Today's proclamation recognizes the actions or our employees, but also recognizes the selfless actions of Elaine Johnson of Stockton, NJ. Mrs. Johnson cared for the troubled individual

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until further help arrived, saving another person's life. These moments are not commonplace, and when you come upon an event like this, it was Mrs. Johnson's empathy for others that guided her actions. So today, among other things, is a celebration of Elaine Johnson's humanity;

"Mr. Chairman, this concludes my report."

PRESENTATION OF "PROCLAMATION OF THE COMMISSIONERS ELAINE JOHNSON

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and read the following Proclamation.

"WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission is a bistate transportation agency with a network of 20 bridges linking the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission's service area includes dozens of riverside communities with residents committed to the ideal of making this world a better place in which to live; and

"WHEREAS, early on the morning of February 28, 2018, Stockton resident Elaine A. Johnson was crossing the Centre Bridge-Stockton Toll-Supported Bridge's pedestrian walkway when she passed a young woman acting in a peculiar manner; and

"WHEREAS, Mrs. Johnson became increasingly concerned about the woman's conduct and safety upon reaching the canal path on the bridge's Pennsylvania side; and

"WHEREAS, Mrs. Johnson used her cell phone to call 9-1-1 and report her observations and concerns to an emergency dispatcher; and

"WHEREAS, Hunterdon County's 9-1-1 Communications Center relayed Mrs. Johnson's information to the Commission's Primary Control Center; and

"WHEREAS, PCC Monitors Nicholas Knechel and Kevin Raike utilized Commission security cameras to observe the woman standing alone on the bridge's walkway, thereupon dispatching police, fire and rescue forces to the scene along with nearby available Commission personnel; and

"WHEREAS, in the interim before first responders could arrive at the scene, Mrs. Johnson exercised personal initiative by returning to the bridge's walkway and finding the distraught woman with a noose around her neck and the rope tethered to the bridge's railing; and

"WHEREAS, Mrs. Johnson intuitively attempted to calm and reassure the woman, talking her out of an apparent suicide attempt and remaining at her side until responders could arrive; and

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"WHEREAS, Southern Region Maintenance Supervisor Daniel Pasciullo and Toll Corporals Robert Capaldi and Casey Clark arrived at the scene to take control of the situation; and

"WHEREAS, local police and rescue personnel arrived a short time later to transport the woman to a nearby hospital for evaluation; and

"WHEREAS, Mrs. Johnson displayed extraordinary compassion, determination, and courage in preventing a tragedy that might have claimed the life of a fellow human being; now therefore

"BE IT RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission assembled for a meeting at New Hope, PA. this 26th day of March 2018, That this Commission hereby recognizes Elaine A. Johnson, commends her decisiveness, her self-initiative, and her life-saving actions that are a testament to the Golden Rule of doing unto others as you would have them do unto you; and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Proclamation be framed for formal presentation to Elaine A. Johnson, a copy be transmitted to the Borough of Stockton, N.J., and the text be included in the minutes of this meeting

It was sent to Mr. Resta. Within ten days, I received a letter from Mr. Resta. Nice letter. Somewhat. It did say that he's glad that I'm doing well. On the same token, also said he wants no more information from my doctors, which I can understand. But I am here today to explain any questions you have for me and I ask that you consider rehiring me. Is there any questions?"

Executive Director Resta explained to Mr. Flanagan, that this portion of the meeting is for public comment, it is not for question and answer, so Commissioners will not be asking any questions.

Mr. Flanagan then said:

"Okay. On June 24th of 2016 I approached Mrs. Cruz, and I had said to Ms. Cruz that I am no longer allowed to drive. My license was being suspended. Part of my job duty is to drive the vehicles and gas them up as an operations support technician. So my response from what I still remember is that is your job duty. So I happen to go out on short-term disability. My license was then suspended for six months. In August of the same year another seizure happened and it was pretty bad. So six more months I lost my license. In that one year that I was out, I must have come to the Bridge Commission a half dozen times, whether it was to speak co-workers or pick up information from Ms. Cruz, so it is not like I just was out for a year and never came back. I took the bus. Again -- well, actually, I didn't say this yet. When I received my letter on August 17th by FedEx and also next day by mail I contacted my doctor and I said, "I was terminated because you didn't answer the information that was sent to you." Her answer to me was, "I will take

care of it." Well, excuse me. She did take care of it, but not until October. September 25th I needed to have another surgery done. I have what is called a VNS, which is for seizures. The battery had died on me. I had a new one put in September 25. October 9th I believe that is the date I was allowed to come back to work but, but, unfortunately, I'm still terminated. Any questions? Okay. Like I said, I'm here to ask if you can consider rehiring me back to the Bridge Commission. Thank you."

Chairman Lavery thanked Mr. Flanagan and asked if there were any further comments from the public. No further comments were presented and the meeting continued

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of March 26, 2018 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (February, 2018)

Summary: The Commission experienced a decrease in total toll revenue for February 2018 in comparison to the February 2017 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected a decrease for the month. [It should be noted that for 2017, increases in commercial traffic through-out the Commission and passenger traffic in District I were directly related to the closure of the Delaware River Turnplke Bridge on Jan. 21, 2017].

Analysis of February 2018 / February 2017 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 3.94 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 1.47 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 10.90 percent decrease.

Analysis of February 2018 / February 2017 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic decreased by 296,467 vehicles, or 9.55 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 12,316 vehicles, or 2.81 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic decreased by 284,151 vehicles, or 10.66 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for February 2018 was 100,261 total vehicles as compared to 110,849 total vehicles in February 2017.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for February 2018 decreased by 149,427 vehicles, or 6.18 percent as compared to the month of February 2017.

Traffic analysis for 2018 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 7.08 percent decrease for the first two months of 2018 as compared to the same period in 2017.
- Westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 3.12 percent decrease through the first two months of 2018 when compared to last year.

REGION REVIEW

Southern Region

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for February 2018 reflected a 20.82 percent decrease as the result of decreases of 153,367 cars and 25,345 trucks when compared to February 2017. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), decreases of 10,873 cars and 2,140 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 9.10 percent for February 2018 as compared to February 2017.

Central Region

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 4.75 percent in total toll traffic for the month of February 2018 compared to February 2017 as the result of combined decreases of 37,018 cars and 3,392 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 12,134 passenger vehicles and 4,191 trucks combined to generate a 4.20 percent decrease in total toll traffic for February 2018.

Northern Region

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.02 percent increase in total toll traffic during February 2018 as a result of the decrease of 374 automobiles and the increase of 388 trucks compared to February 2017. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 68,968 passenger vehicles combined with the increase of 22,475 trucks to generate an overall decrease of 6.74 percent in total toll traffic for February 2018 as compared to February 2017. At Milford-Montague (MM), decreases of 1,417 passenger vehicles and 111 trucks combined to produce a 1.80 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of February 2018.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of February, 2018 and February, 2017, and the year-to-date periods ending February 28, 2018 and February 28, 2017.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled **"Budget vs Actual"** covering the month of February 2018 and the two month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2018 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$5,324,004 for the month of February. For the 2018 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$9,543,870 or 79.6% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Overtime wages are currently exceeding budget by \$13,121 or 13.0%, mainly due to snow removal related cost. Professional Services are exceeding their YTD operating budget by \$71,451 or 24.3% due to higher non-retainer legal fees.

There was a \$516,000 increase in Encumbrances during the month of February due to issuing annual Purchase Orders for Fuels, Salt, Service Contracts and other various items.

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of February, 2018, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month of February 2018, culminated in the preparation and placement of 59 purchase orders in the total amount of \$708,319.14. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 18 price inquiries were sent out for 6 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.0 per order (18/6=3.0).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of December 2017 are shown below:

- ➢ Four (4) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$342,947.00, for the liquid fuel needs of the Commission for the remainder of the 2018.
- Six (6) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$193,500.00 for roadway salt for Commission Facilities.
- Two (2) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$38,184.80, for tower lease Agreements.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$21,163.20, at the request of the IT Department for the replacement of computer workstations at the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➢ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$16,325.00, for the I-78 Welcome Center Banking Room security needs.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2018

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. TransCore is addressing punch list items, final project documentation and as-built drawings. Project Provisional Acceptance was issued on August 16, 2017 and the project is transitioning into the maintenance phase.
- 2. TransCore implemented a plan to improve system performance, focusing on vehicles classifications. The plan included revisiting each lane, checking all equipment connections/configurations and tuning the equipment to increase performance levels. The RK&K team conducted several additional system audits to determine the level of performance. The vehicle classification system is still performing lower than the requirements included in the contract. Commission staff met with the executive management team from TransCore to discuss our on-going concerns regarding the system performance. TransCore developed an action list and is working to implement system changes to increase performance.
- 3. TransCore replaced the primary hard drive at each lane controller. This was completed to address reoccurring lane system freezes. TransCore also replaced the hard drives in the AVI blades for the transponder readers.
- 4. TransCore and Commission Staff met to review the remaining open issues related to the system generated reports. A list was provided to TransCore to address. TransCore addressed the remaining report issues and Commission staff is confirming.
- 5. Commission Staff, TransCore and the RK&K team meet monthly to review and discuss system operational and maintenance items.

1. The new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is live. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Conduent.

IBE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (Commission) established an IBE Program (MBE/WBE/SBE/DBE/DsBE/VBE) with a target of 25% for all Professional Services and Construction contracts awarded by the Commission effective July 1, 2014. To date, the Commission has awarded forty-three (43) contracts, with the IBE Program requirements. Currently there are 30 active contracts and 13 contracts that have been completed and archived.

Elation Systems

The Commission began using Elation Systems effective January 2017, as the online system for Payment Verification and Certified Payroll Reporting (CPR). All contracts awarded by the Commission to a Prime Consultant/Prime Contractor and their Subconsultants and Subcontractors use this service free of charge. Online training is available to users on how to use Elation Systems. The Contract Compliance Department and Elation Support Staff are available to assist all users.

The Contract Compliance Department (CCD) monitors, posts and reports all data in regards to all payments. The CCD also reviews all Certified Payrolls submitted into Elation Systems.

The following are all mandatory requirements:

Company On-Line Registration:

- i. All Primes must register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems; and
- ii. All Primes must also ensure that all Subconsultants and Subcontractors register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems.

Payment Verification:

- i. All Prime Contractors must post all payments to their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors in Elation Systems; *and*
- ii. All Prime Contractors and their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors must confirm all payments received in Elation Systems.

Certified Payroll Reporting:

- i. All Prime Contractors are responsible for assigning someone from their staff with the responsibility to review, approve, and upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems; *and*
- ii. All Prime Contractors must also ensure that their Subcontractors upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems.

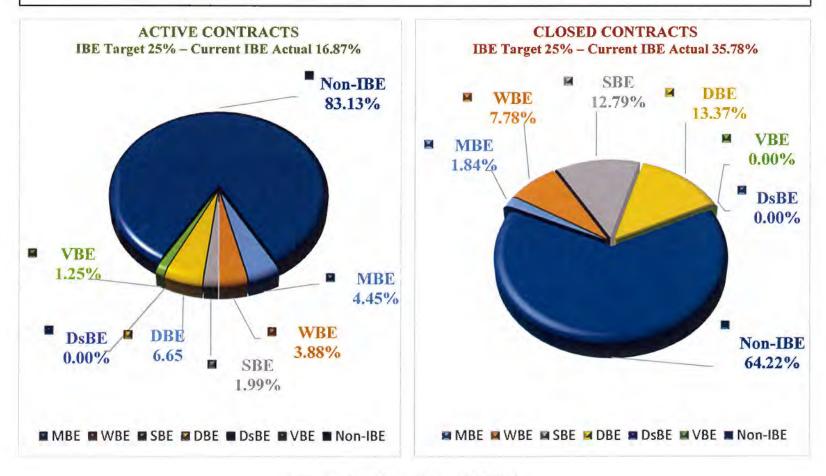

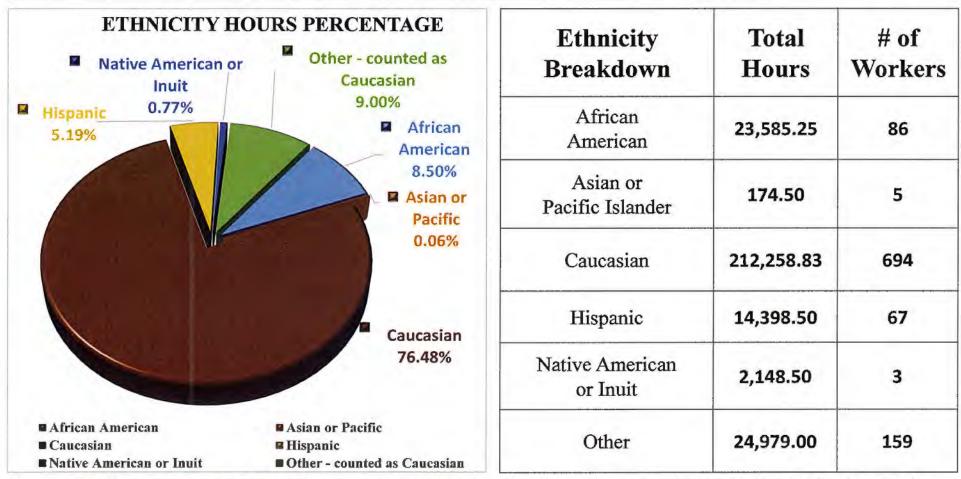

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MINORITY, WOMEN AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission implemented a one-year Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) pilot program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) pilot program with a 3% goal. These goals applied to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program and were effective on September 1, 2008.

At its December 2008 Commission Meeting, the Commission revised the pilot program to specify a 25% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal to New Jersey assigned consultant contracts in lieu of the previously specified 7% MBE and 3% WBE goals.

At its December 2010 Commission Meeting, due to the success of the Commission's MWSBE Pilot Program, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission adopted a resolution for permanent status of the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) program with a 3% goal, and the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program with a 25% goal. These goals apply to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program.

The Contract Compliance Department continues to monitor, update and analyze the payments for the MWSBE diversity program.

COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Carr & Duff submitted a price for this work and a change order was issued. All equipment installation is complete and work on punch list items is underway.

A second RFQ includes the removal and disposal of asbestos containing materials located within the 1799 House. RFQ's were issued to contractors from state lists. Upon receipt of quotations a Purchase Order was issued to the low bidder for the tree cutting work. The design team delineated the area to be cleared in preparation of the contractor mobilizing to the site. Tree cutting is complete.

Commission Staff worked with Aon and the contractor for the 1799 House asbestos removal on their insurance submission and approval. The asbestos removal work is complete.

At the September 25, 2017 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract T-717A, Milford-Montague Toll Bridge, Salt Storage Building to Bracy Construction, Inc. The Commission issued a Limited Notice to Proceed effective September 25, 2017.

An on-site project coordination meeting was held with Bracy and their subcontractors on October 3, 2017. The Commission issued the full Notice to Proceed effective October 12, 2017.

A project kick-off meeting was held with Bracy on October 19, 2017. The new salt storage building which is substantially complete and is being used to store salt for the remainder of the winter. Bracy will return in mid-March to complete the remaining weather sensitive contract items.

Task Order Assignment C-715A-1

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Pennoni, Inc. (Pennoni), is providing professional services for the design of approach roadway improvements at the Centre Bridge – Stockton, New Hope – Lambertville, and Uhlerstown – Frenchtown Toll-Supported Bridges. Improvements include select roadway repaving, re-striping, three (3) ADA ramps, replacement of six (6) inlets, curbing repair and patching/coating of a retaining wall. Notice to proceed was given on September 25, 2017. A kick off meeting was held on October 3, 2017. Field visits occurred September 28 through October 3. Progress Meeting No. 1 was held on Friday, November 3. A progress / 60% submission review meeting was held on November 29. On 1/30, Supplement No. 1 was approved to use \$4,265.75 of the \$8,000 Unforeseen Allowance for work related to the NH-L PA north roadway retaining wall that was not included in the original scope of work. As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th, 2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's comments with the Consultant. Final Design Submission was received December 30, 2016 and a design submission review meeting was conducted on January 9, 2017 and revised documents were received January 19, 2017.

TAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

March 26, 2018 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The server that includes the software and traffic database currently resides with RTI for on-going configuration and we are accessing the data remotely. RTI is upgrading the software on the server. Upon completion of the upgrade, the server will be delivered to the Commission.

Commission Staff prepared packages to be placed in the control cabinet at each site. The package includes relevant information for maintaining the equipment. Commission Staff will be issuing a change order to Signal Service that includes a data gap filling software and annual maintenance of the system.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore is addressing punch list items, final project documentation and as-built drawings. Project Provisional Acceptance was issued on August 16, 2017 and the project is transitioning into the maintenance phase.

TransCore implemented a plan to improve system performance, focusing on vehicles classifications. The plan included revisiting each lane, checking all equipment connections/configurations and tuning the equipment to increase performance levels. The RK&K team conducted several additional system audits to determine the level of performance. The vehicle classification system is still performing lower than the requirements included in the contract. Commission staff met with the executive management team from TransCore to discuss our on-going concerns regarding the system performance. TransCore developed an action list and is working to implement system changes to increase performance.

TransCore replaced the primary hard drive at each lane controller. This was completed to address reoccurring lane system freezes. TransCore also replaced the hard drives in the AVI blades for the transponder readers.

TransCore and Commission Staff met to review the remaining open issues related to the system generated reports. A list was provided to TransCore to address. TransCore addressed the remaining report issues and Commission staff is confirming.

Commission Staff, TransCore and the RK&K team meet monthly to review and discuss system operational and maintenance items.

During the transition, system commissioning tests were performed and the Commission conducted on-going reviews of system performance on an ad-hoc basis, identifying issues for TransCore to review and resolve. As part of the Technical Requirements an Operational Test is required to ensure that the software and hardware function with intended and required availability and performance. Under this task order assignment, the RK&K team will verify that the toll system accurately calculates toll charges, accurately processes violations, E-ZPass transactions, vehicle classification and license place capture.

TransCore implemented a plan to improve system performance, focusing on vehicles classifications. The plan included revisiting each lane, checking all equipment connections/configurations and tuning the equipment to increase performance levels. The vehicle classification system is still performing lower than the requirements included in the contract. TransCore developed an action list and is completing system enhancements to improve performance. Once this is complete, we will request the RK&K team to verify its success by completing additional transaction audits.

The sign installation is complete and they are integrated with the electronic toll collection system. The RK&K team reviewed the as-built drawings and comments were provided to TransCore to address.

(Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015; kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visits to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed.

Based on review comments, locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel, Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission. Meeting is being scheduled to revise scope and discuss utilization of new communication infrastructure. As a result of the recent critical fracture of a truss member resulting in the closing of a PA Turnpike bridge, the scope of this contract was expanded. It has been decided to install sensors on all five bridges in the task order and to add the Milford Montague Bridge to the assignment. A revised scoping meeting was held on February 28th and a revised cost will be submitted. Cost for revised scope was submitted March 22 and was deemed excessive. Revised cost estimate was submitted on March 28 and has been accepted. Pre-Final Plans were submitted on Wednesday, November 1, 2017. The prefinal plans where not as complete as required. Comments were given to the Consultant and revised plans and specifications are scheduled to be resubmitted the end of January. Final check of field conditions was done the last week of January. The prefinal plans will be resubmitted the first week of March.

Contractor currently continues to prepare submittals for review by the engineer and performing site reconnaissance at Each Toll Bridge facility. Long lead delivery material had been ordered. Interior lighting replacement activities is near completion and Contractor have is currently working at all Toll Bridges' exterior lighting replacement.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND BRIDGE SECURITY MONTH OF February 2018

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Public Safety and Bridge Security Department:

Radio System

- PSBS reviewed the radio user fees with NJSP
- PSBS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- PSBS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System
