ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being five members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

PROCLAMATION OF THE COMMISSIONERS-STEPHEN CERRA, FOREMAN OF MAINTENANCE-DISTRICT III

"WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission is a bi-state transportation agency with a network of 20 bridges linking the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission employs roughly 350 full-time employees to operate, maintain, and protect its system of transportation facilities; and

"WHEREAS, retiring employee Stephen M. Cerra became a Commission maintenance worker on October 25, 1977 and his dedication, hard work resolve and incident-management skills earned him accolades, citations and four promotions over a 40-year career with the Commission; and

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"WHEREAS, he became an assistant maintenance foreman on April 2, 1989 and the District III's Foreman of Maintenance on April 29, 2013; and

"WHEREAS, Foreman Cerra endeavored throughout his career to help fulfill the Commission's overriding mission of providing safe and efficient movement of people and commerce across District III bridges linking the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and

"WHEREAS, owing to his considerable expertise in welding, vehicular maintenance, and auto body repair, Foreman Cerra successfully kept a wide array of equipment operational and personally fabricated discontinued parts for the Commission's under-bridge inspection vehicle; and

"WHEREAS, as Foreman, Cerra helped facilitate the implementation of expanded maintenance facilities at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge, the rehabilitation of approach ramps to the Portland-Columbia Toll Bridge, the installation of new sidewalks at the Milford-Montague Toll Bridge and the integration of emergency generator improvements at District III facilities; and

"WHEREAS, he responded to countless winter storms, vehicular breakdowns, medical situations, and public emergencies, including an apparent suicide attempt during his long career; and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission assembled for a Meeting at New Hope, PA this 27th day of March 2017: That this Commission hereby recognizes Stephen M Cerra; and

Commends his four decades of public service, leadership and commitment and his status as the longest-serving Commission employee at the time of his retirement; and

"NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Proclamation be included in the Minutes of this Meeting, a copy be placed in Foreman Cerra's personnel file, and a duly authenticated ceremonial copy be transmitted to Foreman Stephen M. Cerra."

Commissioner Siptroth addressed the meeting and said:

"Thank you very much. Just wanted to say for the public record, along with the proclamation, being a fellow employee with him for 23 years with the Commission I certainly learned a lot from him, and I know that he certainly met all the endeavors that needed to be done at the Commission and not only in district three, but up and down the river. He was very instrumental in getting a lot of projects and the repair of equipment, a lot of duct tape and bailing wire. In many instances, if we couldn't get a part for some of the older equipment, Steve would make sure that we got a suitable part that would keep things running. So again, thank you, Steve, for your 40 years plus."

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Mr. Stephen Cerra said:

"Thank You, John, and it was a pleasure working with you over those years"

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good morning. With the turn of weather to spring conditions, the Commission is shifting its focus away from winter storm response to other endeavors like the final ramp up to construction for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. We have secured all of the necessary permits to begin project construction. We completed the \$430 million sale of revenue bonds to finance the project on March 1st. Likewise, we recently closed on the final piece of property to carry out the project. The contractor is poised to initiate land-based work for this project in mid-to-late April. This initial work is expected to involve setup of traffic-safety measures for construction zones and traffic signal sequencing work in the area of Taylorsville and Woodside roads. In-water work cannot begin until after June 30, when the shortnose sturgeon spawning season ends. A series of other construction and planning activities are currently underway for this project. On March 13, work resumed on the installation of noise abatement walls along warranted portions of the bridge's Pennsylvania I-95 approach. Last week, advance relocations of utility lines got underway in the vicinity of the I-95/Taylorsville Road interchange in Lower Makefield. A series of trees also are being cleared and hoisted away from the river island that will be crossed by the upstream span of the new bridge. Behind the scenes, we expect the long-term project schedule to be submitted from the contractor shortly. Our engineering department and project consultants will then initiate a thorough review process, which we expect to be completed later next month. To further keep the momentum going, today's executive agenda includes a resolution that would authorize the purchase of the various insurance policies comprising the project's Owner-Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP). This comprehensive package is intended to protect the Commission by limiting liability and loss during the execution of this long and multi-faceted regional transportation improvement project; and

"Moving to other matters this morning, there is an executive agenda item worthy of mention – the 2016 Annual Bridge Inspection Report compiled by our General Engineering Consultant, Cherry Weber & Associates. As is the case in evennumbered years, this report focuses on our 13 toll-supported bridges. The report's findings were compiled through inspections conducted last year. These findings will help us update and prioritize our capital program. Two members of our engineering department – Ron Mieszkowski and Justin Bowers – were pivotal in the production of this report, which ultimately was overseen by Chief Engineer

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Roy Little. With Commission approval, this report will be made publicly available on our website; and

"In closing today, I want to commend our maintenance forces and ESS personnel for all of their storm response efforts this past winter. More than 20 separate storm events were recorded during the 2016-17 winter season. The majority of these were at our northernmost Milford-Montague location. But as the most recent snow storm – on March 14 – demonstrated, all of our districts were pressed into service at some time or another this year. It was a job well done, a testament to our operations personnel who pride themselves in keeping our facilities open through the harshest of weather conditions. I think it can be safely said that everyone welcomes the onset of spring and more seasonable travel conditions."

AUTHORIZE REMARKETING/DIRECT PURCHASE OF 2007B BONDS

R: 3168-03-17- FIN-01-03-17

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Laurenti moved and Commissioner Janvey seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (the "Commission") has issued its Bridge System Revenue Bonds, Series 2007B in the aggregate principal amount of \$150,000,000 (the "2007B Bonds"), consisting of sub-Series 2007B-1 and sub-Series 2007B-2, each in the aggregate principal amount of \$75,000,000 (the "2007B-1 Bonds" and the "2007B-2 Bonds," respectively), pursuant to a Trust Indenture dated as of January 1, 2003 (the "General Indenture" and as amended and supplemented to date, the "Indenture"); and

"WHEREAS, the 2007B-1 Bonds and the Series 2007B-2 Bonds are multi-modal bonds presently in the SIFMA Index Rate Mode held by Wells Fargo Bank National Association and Wells Fargo Municipal Capital Strategies, LLC, respectively and both series of bonds currently bear interest at the SIFMA Index Rate plus a fixed spread; and

"WHEREAS, the 2007B Bonds are subject to mandatory tender upon the expiration of the current SIFMA Index Rate Period on May 1, 2017 (the "Mandatory Purchase Date"); and

"WHEREAS, the Commission desires to remarket the 2007B-1 Bonds and the 2007B-2 Bonds prior to the Mandatory Purchase Date and has previously issued its Request for Proposal dated February 24, 2017 (the "RFP") to fourteen financial institutions; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission received eight responses to the RFP and desires to select a direct purchaser for the 2007B-1 Bonds and 2007B-2 Bonds; and

"WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate for the Commission to authorize and approve the execution and delivery of such documents and instruments and the taking of such actions as are necessary or appropriate to effectuate the remarketing of the 2007B Bonds; and

"WHEREAS, capitalized terms used in this Resolution not otherwise defined shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Indenture; and

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission at its Regular Meeting assembled this 27th day of March, 2017, authorizes the selection of a Direct

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Purchaser of its Series 2007B Bonds and Authorizes such further actions and making such determinations as may be necessary or appropriate to effectuate the remarketing of its series 2007B Bonds as follows;

Section 1.01. The Commission selects Wells Fargo Bank, National Association as purchaser of the 2007B-1 Bonds and Wells Fargo Municipal Capital Strategies, LLC as the purchaser of the 2007B-2 Bonds ("Wells"), each to bear interest at a variable rate equivalent to the SIFMA Index plus 47 basis points, and on substantially the other terms set forth in their response dated March 15, 2017, subject to the final terms and conditions being negotiated to the satisfaction of the Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer of the Commission.

<u>Section 1.02.</u> The Executive Director and the Chief Financial Officer are authorized and directed to do and perform all things, to execute and deliver, all certificates, documents, contracts, forms and instruments in the name of the Commission, to take all actions necessary and proper, including any actions not otherwise determined herein, so that the Commission may carry out or effect the remarketing of the 2007B Bonds and all other matters authorized in this Resolution; provided, however, the execution of any agreement with Wells shall require the approval by resolution of the Commission.

<u>Section 1.03.</u> All actions heretofore taken and all documents and instruments heretofore prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Commission in connection with the remarketing of the 2007B Bonds and any matters related thereto are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

<u>Section 1.04.</u> A copy of this Resolution shall be filed for public inspection in the office of the Commission.

<u>Section 1.05.</u> All resolutions and parts of resolutions, to the extent the same are inconsistent herewith, are hereby rescinded and repealed.

Section 1.06. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of March 27, 2017 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (February, 2017)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for February 2017 in comparison to the February 2016 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the first month of the year. (It should be noted that 2016 was a leap year). Increases in commercial traffic through-out the Commission, and passenger traffic in District I are directly related to the closure of the Delaware River Turnpike Connector Bridge on January 21, 2017.

Analysis of February 2017 / February 2016 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 5.46 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 4.70 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 7.67 percent increase.

Analysis of February 2017 / February 2016 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 205,801 vehicles, or 7.10 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 24,944 vehicles, or 6.03 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 180,857 vehicles, or 7.28 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for February 2017 was 110,849 total vehicles as compared to 99,930 total vehicles in February 2016.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the eleven vehicular toll supported bridges for February 2017 increased by 61,397 vehicles, or 2.61 percent when compared to February 2016. Average daily westbound traffic at these bridges for February 2017 was 86,319 vehicles as compared to 81,225 for February 2016.

Traffic analysis for 2017 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 7.25 percent increase for the first two months of 2017 as compared to the same period in 2016.
- Westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 3.05 percent increase for the first two months of 2017 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for February 2017 reflected a 28.81 percent increase as the result of increases of 167,001 cars and 25,008 trucks when compared to February 2016. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), increases of 4,542 cars and 913 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 3.97 percent for February 2017 as compared to February 2016.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 2.25 percent in total toll traffic for the month of February 2017 compared to February 2016 as the result of increases of 9,637 cars and 9,069 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 14,629 passenger vehicles and 517 trucks combined to generate a 3.75 percent decrease in total toll traffic for February 2017.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.80 percent increase in total toll traffic during February 2017 as a result of the increase of 916 automobiles and the decrease of 211 trucks compared to February 2016. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the increase of 18,012 passenger vehicles combined with the decrease of 8,875 trucks to generate an overall increase of 1.34 percent in total toll traffic for February 2017 as compared to February 2016. At Milford-Montague (MM), decreases of 4,622 passenger vehicles and 443 trucks combined to produce a 5.62 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of February 2017.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of February, 2017 and February, 2016, and the year-to-date periods ending February 28, 2017 and February 29, 2016.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2017

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. TransCore finished revising the engineering design package. Revisions to the Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments is ongoing. TransCore facilitated weekly meeting as we continue to transition lanes at the Trenton-Morrisville, I-78 and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridges. Commission Staff are now operating toll lanes on the new system at the Trenton-Morrisville, New Hope-Lambertville, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. Weekly project status meetings will continue during the installation phase of the project.
- 3. The toll plaza canopy dynamic message signs (DMS) for the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges were delivered to the plazas. TransCore completed field visits of these sites with their electrician to confirm sequencing the installation.
- 4. Training for the Toll Collectors, Officers-in-Charge, Bankers, Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent from District 2 is complete.

Activities for the E-Z Pass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in June 2017.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-Z Pass Executive Management Committee meeting and Policy Committee meetings.

IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

The Contract Compliance Program and IBE Target of 25% of the total Commission's contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of thirty-two (32) contracts, including Task Order Agreements with the new IBE program requirements.

STATUS UPDATES

During the month of February, the Contract Compliance Department (CCD) worked with Elation System staff, Rick Shi and Don Soria to ensure that prime construction contractors and consulting firms register in the tracking system. All prime construction contractors and their subcontractors as well as the consulting firms were able to register in Elation. Four contractors started successfully entering their certified payrolls information into Elation. This effort has proven to be a great success. Since all prime consulting firms are registered in Elation and payments from the Commission are now being reported in the system, the CCD with the support of the engineering department continues the assist consulting primes so that their subconsultants are also registered to verify their payments through Elation.

The CCD worked with Qiao Wo, a representative of Stokes Consulting and provided updates for the Contract Compliance Department and IBE information to be included in the Commission's CCD link of the new Commission website.

TRANSITIONAL REPORT

Due to the fact that the CCD acquired a new payroll verification system from Elation System, Inc. and all of the Commission contracts data already established in the previous B2GNOW system had to be transferred into Elation System, a period of data entering and gathering from the CCD files and registration from the contractors had to be uploaded. The Transitional Report will detail the total data uploaded to date. Next month's report will be more detailed and enhanced with more payments data and activities performed by the Primes and IBE subs on all active contracts.

Community Affairs Report

February 2017

The following Community Affairs activities took place during the month of February:

Scudder Falls Bridge Public Involvement

Assisted in review and response, as appropriate, to messages received via the Commission and Scudder Falls project websites. Questions and concerns included the construction schedule, property acquisition, and bridge design.

Reviewed and provided team members with public comments on a news article concerning the implementation of all electronic tolling at the Bayonne Bridge, as many of the same questions and comments can be anticipated on the Scudder Falls Bridge project.

Columbia/Knowlton Salt issue:

Attended meeting in Knowlton Township with representatives of the Township, Warren County, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Transportation and owners of Travel Centers of America. The Township is proposing all five entities equally share the cost of providing 53 home owners with reverse osmosis systems. This would only be a temporary measure to provide the residents with potable drinking water, with a long-term solution yet to be determined. Provided information to Executive Director Joseph Resta and New Jersey Counsel Reginald Jenkins and Douglas Steinhardt for review and consideration at the March 27 Commission meeting.

UBE/Milford Bridge Concern

Safety, Security and Training Manager John Mills followed up with statistics on the number of property checks by the New Jersey State Police, after a Milford resident expressed concern about possible drug activity in the area of the bridge. We have not received any sort of official communications on this issue from Milford officials.

Trenton-Morrisville Construction

Along with Deputy Executive Director of Communications Joseph Donnelly, canvased the area of the Trenton-Morrisville (Route 1) toll plaza, providing notice of the upcoming weekend construction work. Approximately 100 notices were distributed. Also contacted Morrisville Borough officials, providing them with the same information. This work is for the installation of the new Electronic Toll Collection System. Followup question from one resident asking if his road was going to be closed, which it is not. There has not been any contact from residents concerning the late night noise or construction activities.

Emergency Vehicles

Received a phone call from Mercer County Freeholder Lucy Walter, asking about the charging of tolls for emergency service vehicles when providing "non-emergency" mutual aid backup across the river for an incident. She had heard there was a recent change in the policy. Provided Freeholder Walter with the section 502 (b) of the Commission's General Indenture concerning Free Passage and Reduced Tolls and explained that the Commission's policy has not changed on this.

Received request from the Greenwich Township Emergency Squad, requesting dismissal of several E-Z Pass violations they received while in the course of responding to an emergency. E-Z Pass staff reviewed and dismissed the violations.

Workplace Safety

Local stakeholder meetings were held on February 1st & 2nd 2017 briefing attendees on the sign lighting concept and schedule moving forward. The designer has submitted pre-final design documents that are currently under review by Commission staff.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT FINAL DESIGN SERVICES

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

During the February reporting period Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (Baker) of Hamilton New Jersey reviewed and responded to various RFI submittals by the T-668A Project Contractor and the Construction Manager. Baker also continued their coordination with: the various PA and NJ utility companies to finalize the necessary utility relocation agreements for the project; the D&R Canal Commission for Project impact approval; and, NJDEP and NJSHPO for the remaining NJ environmental permit authorizations.

Baker continued to participate in ongoing permit coordination with AECOM staff, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP), New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), and, the Pennsylvania Game Commission (PGC) regarding the Peregrine Falcon Mitigation Plan approval. As a result of this intense coordination effort by the project team, the following items were received in February 2017, which will permit the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Construction Contract T-668A to move forward:

- USACE/FHWA/PADEP/PGC/NJDEP Approval of the Peregrine Falcon Mitigation Plan – site location and timing of construction;
- USACE/PADEP Joint Permit for Construction in DRJTBC Jurisdiction;
- USACE/PADEP Joint Permit for Construction in PennDOT Jurisdiction;
- USACE & PADEP Approval of the Wetlands Mitigation Site in PA;
- USACE Section 404 Permit for Construction in NJDOT Jurisdiction;
- FHWA Approval of the Environmental Re-Evaluation Document.

MARCH 27, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Construction

Contract No. T-668A

Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh, PA (Trumbull) was awarded the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Construction Contract T-668A in the amount of \$396,000,000.00 at the Commission's January 30, 2017 Meeting. The Commission issued a Notice of Award/Limited Notice to Proceed on January 31, 2017. Trumbull attended the initial Scheduling Conference with Commission, AECOM, and the Construction Management firm, Hill International, on February 7th. Throughout February Trumbull submitted postaward documentation required to enter into an agreement with the Commission, and the Preliminary 60-day look-ahead contract schedule, which is under review by Commission and the Construction Management Consultant (CM-669A) staff; and, began to receive design-phase information supplemental to Conformed Design documents. A full Notice to Proceed is anticipated in early March, which will enable Trumbull to commence with the construction of the project.

Construction Management

Contract No. CM-669A

At the October 31, 2016 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract No. CM-669A, Construction Management Services for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project to Hill International (Hill) of Philadelphia, PA for an amount not-to-exceed \$25,015,066.98. Hill was provided with Notice of Award and Limited Notice to proceed on November 2, 2016. Hill was then issued a Full Notice to Proceed on January 31, 2017, in parallel with the award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Contract T-668A at the same meeting.

Hill participated in the initial Scheduling Conference with the T-668A General Contractor Trumbull Corporation and the Kick-off Meeting for their contract in early February. Throughout February, Hill began to establish their project field office located in Ewing, NJ, which will house CM staff as well as Construction Inspection (CI) staff from the three CI firms to be identified by award at the Commissions February Commissioners Meeting. Hill began generating and processing Requests for Information (RFI's) on the contract documents; and establishing the Project Management and Document Control system to be used on this project.

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Construction Inspection of PA Approach Contract No. CI-671A

At the February 27, 2017 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract CI-671A, Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Construction Inspection Services - PA Approach to TRC Engineers, Inc. of Plymouth Meeting, PA for an amount not-to-exceed \$6,515,220.03. Commission and AECOM staff will now solicit the submittals from TRC that are required to establish an Agreement with the Commission.

Construction Inspection of Main River Bridge Contract No. CI-672A

At the February 27, 2017 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract CI-672A, Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Construction Inspection Services – Main River Bridge to Parsons Brinckerhoff, Incorporated (PB) of Lawrenceville, NJ for an amount not-to-exceed \$7,776,718.32. Commission and AECOM staff will now solicit the submittals from PB that are required to establish an Agreement with the Commission.

Construction Inspection of NJ Approach

Contract No. CI-673A

At the February 27, 2017 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract CI-673A, Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Construction Inspection Services – NJ Approach to Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) of South Plainfield, NJ for an amount not-toexceed \$6,568,103.32. Commission and AECOM staff will now solicit the submittals from GF that are required to establish an Agreement with the Commission.

DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies.

Environmental permitting agency coordination by AECOM, in conjunction with Michael Baker International staff, continued in Pennsylvania with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition – one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction, as well as the USACE Permit application package. The PADEP Permit for the Commission's jurisdiction was issued on February 16, 2017;

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the PADEP Permit for the PennDOT jurisdiction was issued on February 17, 2017; and finally the USACE Permit for the Project was issued on February 24, 2017.

Coordination continued throughout February with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion (Project ROW Impacts) Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the maintenance and operation of the Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility to be constructed within NJDEP and NJDOT jurisdiction. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (Parkland Diversion) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. The Commissioners at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the MOA for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility on behalf of the Commission. A meeting was held with NJDEP – Green Acres Staff and Legal Counsel on February 28, 2017 to develop a plan and schedule for finalizing the outstanding items associated with the NJDEP – Green Acres approval. These items include the MOA, Right-of-Entry (ROE) Agreement, a Maintenance Agreement for the NJ pedestrian/Bicycle Facility, and the permanent easements for the Green Acres Parkland Diversion.

The ROW acquisition process continued during the month of February, which included coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date, in Pennsylvania, the Commission has purchased the full properties at 1140 Woodside Road, 185 River Road, and 1510 River Road (closing occurred on February 28, 2017) which are not required for construction; and, at 1149 Woodside Road, which is required for construction. In Pennsylvania, the Commission has also purchased partial easements from Lower Makefield Township; Lower Makefield Farmland Preservation; and from the Commonwealth of PA for the I-95 crossing over the PA Delaware Canal; all of which are required for construction. In November the Commission completed the purchase of the 10-acre property at 1199 Woodside Road, which currently hosts the I-95 Park-and-Ride lot, from Lower Makefield Township; and the adjacent, contiguous property at 1167 Woodside Road. The purchase of 1199 Woodside Road is required for the Commission's near future District I Administration Building. The 1167 Woodside Road Parcel purchase will allow the Commission to make a direct connection from the future I-295 Park-and-Ride lot to the existing Delaware Canal park system. This connection will accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists, and meets the stipulation for same set forth in the Agreement of Sale with LMT for the 1199 Woodside Road Property. In New Jersey condemnation paperwork was submitted for a partial taking in NJ (Block 423.01, Lot 13) located along River Road, Ewing Township, New Jersey. The Commission was notified in December that it now has possession of the portion of this property needed for the Project. Subsequent to this, the Commission has been notified by the property owner that they are ready to settle on the cost for the partial taking.

DMC Staff completed Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. The Phase 2 work was substantially complete on December 16, 2016. Final Completion occurred in January 2017. Final asbuilt plans are currently being prepared.

The DMC continued to assist the Commission during the post-award phase of Contract T-668A. In addition, ongoing coordination continued with the Baker Team and

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the various utility companies regarding the Utility Relocation Agreements in Pennsylvania. In Pennsylvania, Utility Relocation Agreements have been fully executed with Verizon PA, Comcast PA, Sunesys, and PECO Electric. The PECO Gas Service Agreement has been finalized and submitted to the Commission for signature. It will then be forwarded to PECO Gas for their signature. In New Jersey, due to complications on NJDOT's end in being able to develop agreements with the NJ utility companies, the Commission has moved forward in negotiating and entering into separate agreements with PSE&G and Comcast NJ for their required utility relocation work. The Utility Relocation Agreement with PSE&G Electric has been signed by them and forwarded to the Commission for signature.

The RFP for the Construction Inspection (CI) Services associated with the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project was posted on November 1, 2016. Three (3) separate CI contracts will be procured under this one RFP solicitation. Eleven (11) proposals were received on December 14, 2016. After Technical Proposal reviews and Consultant interviews, Authorization to Negotiate was received at the January 30, 2017 Commission Meeting for the three contracts; CI-671A, CI-672A, and CI-673A. Contract awards were made at the February 27, 2017 Commission Meeting.

PA NOISE WALLS CONTRACT FOR THE SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Construction Management Contract No. CM-664A

This Contract is for Construction Management (CM) Professional Services for the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge, Contract T-666A. Greenman Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) of Lebanon, NJ was awarded this contract at the February 29, 2016 Commissioners' Meeting; and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective March 18, 2016.

During February GPI's CM tasks continued with GPI scheduling and holding the Contract T-666A's Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and scheduling and holding Pre-Construction Activity Meetings as required. GPI continued to handle the processing of submittals, correspondence and Requests for Information from the T-666A Contractor. GPI, through their material inspection sub consultant, Key Tech, continued to perform quality assurance inspections of the noise walls post and panel fabrication at the fabricator's shops. GPI also developed the contractor's monthly pay estimate for Commission processing; and, continued oversight and coordination of the inspection efforts of the CI Consultant, Jacobs Engineering Group.

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CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-666A

PKF-MARK III, Inc. (PKF) of Newtown, PA was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's May 2016 Meeting, and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective June 10, 2016.

During February PKF continued to maintain the construction access routes from I-95 into and along the various Noise Wall locations along with their Erosion and Sediment Controls; setting noise wall posts and panels which are being fabricated off site by their fabricator, Faddis, was very limited due to weather considerations, as was the caulking of the noise wall panels and the grouting of the bases of the noise wall posts. PKF also continued grading along the finished wall sections with some of the final graded areas mulch matted and seeded as weather permitted. PKF participated in the Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and any Pre-Construction Activity Meetings held. PKF continued to submit shop drawings and Requests for Information (RFI's) for review and approval as necessary.

Construction Inspection Contract No. CI-665A

This Contract is for Construction Inspection (CI) Professional Services associated with the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge, Contract T-666A. Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (Jacobs) was awarded this professional services contract at the Commission's May 2016 Meeting; and, issued a full Notice to Proceed effective June 17, 2016.

During February Jacobs attended the Contract T-666A's Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and any Pre-Construction Activity Meetings held. Jacobs' Inspectors continued working on site out of the CM Field Office monitoring the T-666A Contractor's field activities, and also performing random inspections of the two (2) fabricator plants where the concrete noise wall post and panel components are being fabricated.

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SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT TREE CLEARING CONTRACT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-667A

This Contract is for the clearing of trees in advance of the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge being installed under Contract T-666A and also additional tree clearing in both Pennsylvania and New Jersey in advance of the Main River Bridge contract work. A.P. Construction Company, Inc. (AP) was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's November 2015 Meeting and was issued a Notice to Proceed effective December 23, 2015.

AP completed all tree clearing in Stage 1 reaching Substantial and Final Completion in the Spring of 2016. AP completed all tree clearing in Stage 2 reaching Substantial Completion for this Stage on December 16, 2016 and Stage 2 Final Completion on January 13, 2017.

During this reporting period, invoice no. 7 was issued and is being processed. AP submitted their final certified payroll and the back-up information and costs for the tree removal and stabilization of the cleared area along the river in PA by alternate means. Allowance Reduction No. 3 for the area cleared along the river in PA was developed and issued to AP Construction for signature.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT SERVICES

FINAL DESIGN

Contract No. C-662A

McCormick Taylor, Inc. (MT) was awarded this Public Involvement (PI) Contract at the Commission's September 28, 2015 Meeting, and issued Notice to Proceed effective October 29, 2015. A kickoff meeting was held with MT on November 25, 2015. The Commission provided comments to MT's draft PI plan and is awaiting a revised draft. MT has attended numerous C-660A progress meetings, and has successfully taken responsibility of maintaining the project hotline and website. MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township and April 27, 2016 Pennsylvania Noise Walls Update Meeting. MT organized and participated in the July 19th & 21st District I Open House/Toll Hearings held in Ewing Township (NJ) and Lower Makefield Township (PA) respectively. MT also organized and participated in August 2nd & 4th District II Toll Hearings in Easton (PA) and Phillipsburg (NJ) respectively also and the August 9th & 11th District III Toll Hearings held in Montague (NJ) & East Stroudsburg (PA) respectively. MT has finalized the open house/toll hearing summary report from these events. MT is also working with the Commission to develop additional outreach activities anticipated to take place prior to construction commencing.

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CAPITAL PROGRAM MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT (CPMC) & DESIGN MANGEMENT CONSULTANT (DMC) SERVICES FOR THE I-95/SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

CPMC SERVICES – YEAR 2016

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-1L

Task Order Assignment 502A-1L, Capital Program Management Consultant (CPMC) Services for 2016, was executed in April 2016. Services began in July 2016. AECOM is currently providing one (1) part-time Project Manager to oversee and manage various design and construction projects that are being advanced in the Capital Improvement Program. CPMC Staff are currently providing the management and oversight of Contract C-644A, I-78 Roadway Approach/Transition Slabs Rehabilitation and the Rehabilitation of the Cedarville Road Overpass. CPMC Staff have also been assisting with the procurement of Contract CM-644A, CM/CI Services for the I-78 Roadway Approach/Transition Slabs Rehabilitation, as well as the TEC review effort.

AECOM is also providing technical support to the Commission in connection with its implementation of a more robust and cost efficient WAN that supports both the ESS and internal DRJTBC network requirements involving a communication solution provider, managed services vendor and equipment supplier.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE INTERIM DECK REPAIRS

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-677A

Sparwick Contracting, Inc. (SCI) completed all deck repairs and roadway striping by September 8, 2015. SCI is now in their second year of their on-call and emergency spall repairs phase of the contract on an as-needed basis, as part of their construction contract. This contract includes an optional call-back period ending in November 2018.

COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AT SCUDDER FALLS Contract No. C-707A

A Notice of Award / Limited Notice to Proceed was issued to USA Architects. Insurance certificates were received and are under review. Contract documents were prepared and will be executed once the insurance is found acceptable. A project kick off meeting has been scheduled.

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I-78 TOLL BRIDGE MAINTENANCE GARAGE PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-508A

This contract is for Preliminary, Final and Post-Design Services for renovations and expansion at the I-78 Maintenance Garage as identified under a Task Order Assignment for Space Utilization Program and Concept Study provided by Buchart Horn, Inc. / BASCO Associates.

Burns Engineering Inc. (BE) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015, Final Design Submission and Bid Set were received on April 5, 2016, Bids were open on May 10th, reviewed by the Consultant, Commission Counsels and Contract Compliance and a Construction Contract Award was made at the June 2016 Regular Monthly Commission Meeting.

Consultant is currently providing Post Design services, reviewing Contractor's Request for Information, submittals, issuing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, and attending Bi-Weekly Progress Meetings.

CODE COMPLIANCE PLAN REVIEW AND INSPECTIONS Task Order Assignment No. C-696A-1

Utilizing the Commission's current Facilities Task Order Agreement with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson (JMT), this Task Order Assignment is to provide Code Plan Reviews, and Code Compliance Inspections on as needed basis for the I-78 Maintenance Garage Expansion Project. Said services will be provided by a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry (PA L&I) Certified Third-Party Agency in the appropriate building trade categories and in accordance with the current Uniform Construction Code Inspection Procedures UCC-9.

Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JMT on February 25, 2016, and the Consultant provided Peer and Code Plan reviews of the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended the pre-final design submission review meeting, reviewed and certified the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

Consultant attended Construction Kick-Off meeting on July 12, and is currently attending periodic construction progress meeting and providing all required UCC inspections.

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CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES CM-508A

This contract is for Construction Management (CM) Services in connection with the renovations and expansion of I-78 Maintenance Garage Project. As part of the CM services the Consultant scope of work includes Constructability Review of the Bid Documents during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A.

STV Inc. (STV) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective March 1, 2016. A meeting was held with the Consultant on March 2nd to review the Commission's expectations of the consultant's services during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A. Constructability Review was provided by the Consultant on the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended its design review meeting on March 21, and reviewed the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

STV attended the Pre-Construction Meeting on July 12, and is currently providing construction field inspections, conducting bi-weekly progress meetings along with processing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, Contractor's Submittals and Request for Information as part of providing construction management services.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-508A

Bracy Construction Inc., was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's June 2016 Meeting. Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed letter was issued effective June 28, 2016. Pre-Construction Meeting was held on July 12th and a Notice to Proceed effective date of July 25th was issued in accordance with the Contract Specifications.

Contractor completed set-up of the field trailers and temporary facilities, set-up Erosion and Sediment Controls in accordance with the County Conservation District's approved permit, started the demolition activities for Phases 1 & 2 of the Project. Phase 1 Construction Substantial Completion was reached November 11, 2016 as relates to the Commission's salt, brine & magnesium chloride operation. Phase 2 footings, foundation walls, new bearing walls, steel erection has been completed, and construction activities are currently focused on the installation of all underground and under-slab utilities, floor slab, watertight and close the new building.

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I-78 BRIDGES AND APPROACH SLAB REHABILITATION

DESIGN

Contract No. C-644A

Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) was awarded this design contract at the Commission's February 2016 Meeting and their Notice of Award/Limited Notice to Proceed was issued effective March 1, 2016. This design project is for the repair of various bridge, pavement and other miscellaneous deficiencies associated with the 13 bridges and approach roadways located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction on I-78.

During this reporting period, GF submitted the final design plans and specifications and DRJTBC/AECOM provided GF with comments to this submission which included the final I-78 toll plaza merge restriping plans as developed by Malick & Scherer under Task Order Assignment No. C-628A-8. GF incorporated these revisions and made the final submission on March 1, 2017. The I-78 Bridges & Approach Slab Rehabilitation Construction Contract T-644A was advertised on March 2, 2017.

RESTRIPING OF THE MERGE LANES EXITING THE I-78 TOLL PLAZA

DESIGN

Task Order Agreement Contract No. C-628A-8

Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (DE), through a standing Consultant Engineer Agreement, was requested to provide Engineering Services to design modifications to the existing striping of the merge area west of the I-78 westbound toll plaza. DE was requested to utilize Malick & Scherer, PC. (M&S) for this design effort due to their current involvement as a sub-consultant to Gannett Fleming on the C-644A I-78 Bridges and Approach Slab Rehabilitation Project, whose tasks include the restriping of the entire I-78 mainline located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction. The purpose of this restriping design is to provide dedicated through lanes for the two left ORT E-Z Pass lanes continuing after the toll plaza, and have the four right toll lanes merge with the right high speed lane in the vicinity of the Morgan Hill Road Interchange.

This design has been incorporated by Gannett Fleming, under Professional Services contract C-644A, into the I-78 Bridges & Approach Slab Rehabilitation Construction Contract T-644A, which was advertised on March 2, 2017.

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RIVERTON-BELVIDERE TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE CRITICAL MEMBER STRENGTHENING

POST DESIGN

Contract No. C-650A

Ammann & Whitney continues to provide post design services in support of the construction phase of the Riverton-Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge Critical Members Strengthening (Contract TS-650A) project. Activities included preparing project closeout documentation and as-built drawings.

APPROACH SLOPE STABILIZATION DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C. 628A-3

Task Order Assignment No. C-628A-3 (WMC/RWL)

Dewberry Engineers continues to provide post design services in support of the construction phase of the storm water treatment and slope stabilization facilities portions of the Riverton-Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge Critical Members Strengthening (Contract TS-650A) project. Activities included preparing project closeout documentation and as-built drawings.

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

ESS MAINTENANCE CONTRACT Contract No. DB-575A

Schneider Electric Building Americas, Inc. continues to provide maintenance services in support of the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System under the direction of the Commission's Electronic Security and Surveillance Staff, who operate the system from the Primary Control Center located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, New Jersey.

WIRELESS VIDEO NETWORK SPECIFICATION AND PEER REVIEW Contract No. C-621A-5

Sentinel Consulting has provided a revised design-build type performance specifications document as part of plans to upgrade the wireless communication system at the I-78/611 site to address current and future needs.

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ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM

DESIGN-BUILD Contract No. DB-427

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

DB-584

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in June 2017.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

All sites (toll and toll supported bridges) were installed by Commission Staff with assistance from Signal Service. Signal Service continues to visit each site to conduct manual traffic counts and compare them to the traffic counter. All sites are nearly calibrated and sending data to the server. In order to improve data collection for the Scudder Falls Bridge, Signal Service and Commission Staff installed a second radar unit. The sever set-up has not been completed. Upon completion, the server will be installed at the Commission's Administration Building.

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DISTRICT 2 & 3 PHASE 1 TOLL COLLECTION COUNTING FACILITIES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th, 2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's comments with the Consultant. Final Design Submission was received December 30, 2016 and a design submission review meeting was conducted on January 9, 2017 and revised documents were received January 19, 2017.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION / TOLLING TASK ORDER CONSULTANT

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended weekly status meetings. RK&K reviewed the revised engineering plans, the revised maintenance plan, and worked with the installation team on the next steps for the transition of the lanes. Upon receiving the final invoice for this Task Order assignment, it will be closed out.

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ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore finished revising the engineering design package. Revisions to the Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments is on-going. TransCore facilitated weekly meeting as we continue to transition lanes at the Trenton-Morrisville, I-78 and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridges. Commission Staff are now operating toll lanes on the new system at the Trenton-Morrisville, New Hope-Lambertville, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. Weekly project status meetings will continue during the installation phase of the project.

The toll plaza canopy dynamic message signs (DMS) for the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges were delivered to the plazas. TransCore completed field visits of these sites with their electrician to confirm sequencing the installation.

Training for the Toll Collectors, Officers-in-Charge, Bankers, Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent from District 2 is complete.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT IMPLEMENTATION CM Task Order Assignment No. C-701A-1

RK&K is providing on-site construction inspection/management services for the replacement of the electronic toll collection system. Services provided included inspection of the concrete roadway slab replacements at the Trenton-Morrisville, I-78 and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridges. Review of concrete specifications, placement, and cylinder breaks is on-going.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLAND-COLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

RK&K responded to request for information from TransCore as they prepare for the installation of the Daktronics LED signs and the interface with the new electronic toll collection system replacement.

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BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015; kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visits to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed.

Based on review comments, locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel, Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission. Meeting is being scheduled to revise scope and discuss utilization of new communication infrastructure. As a result of the recent critical fracture of a truss member resulting in the closing of a PA Turnpike bridge, the scope of this contract was expanded. It has been decided to install sensors on all five bridges in the task order and to add the Milford Montague Bridge to the assignment. A revised scoping meeting was held on February 28th and a revised cost will be submitted the week of March 6th.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Jacobs Engineering submitted a final traffic and revenue forecast report for the Scudder Falls Bridge replacement and the Commission's existing seven (7) toll bridges addressing comments from the bond/financing team. Jacobs also participated in the meetings with the bond/financing team to continue answering questions that they had regarding the report. Jacobs participated in meetings with the rating agencies and provided additional model sensitivity tests per their requests.

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BUILDINGS & FACILITIES ENERGY CONSERVATION MEASURES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-657A-3

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with Joseph Jingoli & Son, Inc. (JJS), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to implement the Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) identified in an ASHRAE Level 3 Energy Audit prepared under Task Oder Assignment No. C-657A-1 at all of the Commission's seven (7) Toll Bridge facilities.

A Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JJS on November 21, 2016, record room site visits, and field surveys of the seven toll bridges has been completed. Progress meeting was conducted on February 1, 2017, reporting field observations and conditions in advance of a Schematic Design submission was received February 28, 2017 and currently under review by the Commission.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2018 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. On November 21, 2016, the Commission, via Resolution 3090-11-16, extended CWA's contract to perform GEC services and inspections in 2017 & 2018. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering, and CWA.

Bridge and Facility Inspections have been completed at the toll-supported bridges. Inspection of Scudder Falls was completed during the third week of August, after the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle (no Falcons were nesting on the bridge this year).

CWA submitted the draft Maintenance Report on September 9. Review meetings were held with District 1 Operations & Maintenance staff on September 30 in Morrisville and Districts 2 & 3 Operations & Maintenance Staff on September 28 in Phillipsburg.

CWA will submit the Final Annual Inspection in March for acceptance by the Commission. The Maintenance Report will be finalized upon acceptance of the Annual Inspection Report by the Commission.

CWA has updated the PennDOT BMS and NJDOT Combis system for each of the scheduled bridges within 30 days of the completion of the field inspection of each bridge. CWA updated the PennDOT BMS2 with rating information from the Underwater Inspections in Districts 1, 2 & 3.

Sign retroreflectivity testing was performed for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in October.

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UNDERWATER INSPECTIONS

2016 UNDERWATER INSPECTION OF THE TOLL AND TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGES - DISTRICT 1 Task Order Assignment C-628A-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (Dewberry), is providing underwater inspection services at all of the Commission's main river bridges in District 1, except the Scudder Falls Toll Supported Bridge. Notice to proceed was given on July 15, 2016. A kick-off meeting was held on July 22, 2016. Inspections of all the District 1 bridges (except Scudder Falls – which is due in 2017) were completed between August 2 and August 31. Dewberry performed follow-up site visits at all the bridges on November 2. Dewberry submitted the final report on December 23. This TOA will be closed out upon receipt of the final invoice.

2016 UNDERWATER INSPECTION OF THE TOLL AND TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGES – DISTRICTS 2 & 3 Task Order Assignment C-628B-7

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing underwater inspection services at all of the Commission's main river bridges in Districts 2 & 3. Notice to proceed was given on July 15, 2016. A kick-off meeting was held on July 21, 2016. ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2017

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel continued working to complete the radio upgrade. The new base station radios continue to be programed and installed at the various bridges. Planning and acquisition continues for the microwave portion of the upgrade. Currently the NJ State Police Radio Engineer is reviewing alternate relay sites to replace the Commission's "Corn Hill" site in West Amwell, NJ. To date a radio tower in Solebury, PA has been identified as a possible alternative.
- On February 14, 2017, ESS personnel, Purchasing, and the New Jersey State Police met with the owner of the Gravel Hill Radio Tower Site regarding contractual issues.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues.
- In February 2017, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants.
- During the month of February 2017, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employees and contractor cards. Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of February 2017, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management system. ESS personnel recently attended a workshop with various Genetic representatives to further explore the benefits of their system.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. On February 22, 2017, a wireless survey was performed by Schneider Electric and Firetide Wireless Solutions to determine a course of action for upgrading the current wireless system.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel continued working with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility. ESS personnel are also working with the West Trenton, NJ Fire Company regarding their inquiries about emergencies at the new bridge.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. Various cameras at the Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges are in the process of being upgraded.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel have been working with representatives from Telegra Analytics to create a "trial period" to test their product.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Purchasing to implement the new Comcast communications network. ESS test cut overs have been performed at one toll and one toll supported bridge and look promising.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.

- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.
- The ESS Primary Control Center (PCC) continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents. The PCC continues to report on the traffic congestion the Commission is experiencing in District I due to the closing of the PA/NJ Turnpike River Bridge in Florence, NJ. The PCC has also been very active working with the Districts during snow operations.
- During the month of February 2017, PCC personnel trained a new ESS Monitor.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. In particular, ESS worked with the New Jersey State Police trying to locate an Amber Alert victim that was transported through the Delaware Water Gap. The actor who took the child was subsequently arrested by PA State Police. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed twenty video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video" Report for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On February 15, 2017, ESS held a department meeting.
- During the month February 2017, ESS personnel continued to work on a new response vehicle for the toll officers.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS and SS & T met with the Phillipsburg, NJ Police Department to discuss operational procedures.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS updated the Snow Operations reporting procedures.
- During the month of February 2017, ESS personnel continued to work with Operations and Engineering to develop new toll and banking facilities that will afford the Commission and its employees more security and protection from theft. ESS is currently developing a Standard Operating Guideline for the new "Panic Button" located on the toll collection screen.
