# **ROLL CALL**

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State of New Jersey.

Vice Chairman Ahmad welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

# INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Vice Chairman Ahmad addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

# **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good morning. As you all are aware, the Commission has completed the Stage 1 tree cutting along the Pennsylvania I-95 approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge as of March 31<sup>st</sup>. This was confined to 15 acres of the highway right-of-way in Lower Makefield Township between the Taylorsville Road interchange and the Route 332 interchange. This has cleared the way for installation of noise abatement walls at locations that meet federal and state Penn DOT-prescribed sound thresholds indicating where sound mitigation actions are warranted. We are now poised to go from tree clearing to wall construction. Today's executive agenda includes two noise wall resolutions. One is the approval of the contract for the construction of six sections of noise-abatement walls along the aforementioned I-95 bridge approach segment. The total length of noise walls to be installed under this contract is approximately 12,500 linear feet. This work will involve the installation of 640 noise wall posts, 163,500 square feet

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of actual wall panels and 9,600 feet of drilled foundations. The work also will include grading, drainage, and relocation of utilities. Lastly, the contract calls for installation of bird-deterrent netting beneath the current Scudder Falls Bridge, where a pair of falcons had nested periodically in years past. The contractor also is to install a new permanent peregrine falcon shelter in the area of the bridge. The other noise wall item set for consideration today is the construction inspection contract. Under this contract, the selected engineering consulting firm will be responsible for monitoring and overseeing the noise wall construction field activities, ensuring the work and materials conform with our plans and specifications. Once these contracts are signed and executed, we expect noise wall construction can get underway in early summer and reach completion later this year,

"Moving upriver, the slope stabilization project on the Phillipsburg side of our Easton-Phillipsburg (Route 22) Toll Bridge reached completion on May 10. This project addressed a variety of hazardous conditions on the steep slope adjacent to Route 22 exit ramp immediately east of the toll bridge. A major element of the project was the installation of a two-tier rock-fall catchment system along the rocky wooded slope next to the exit ramp. This heavily reinforced containment system is designed to protect motorists from rocks or trees tumbling down onto the exit ramp. This project was finished three weeks ahead of the original June 2 completion date and the cost is expected to come in about 10 percent less than the originally contracted amount

"Switching gears here, we have two special guests with us: District II Toll Corporals Rachael Stocker and Kenneth Hockenbury whose actions clearly helped save a woman's life in April. The corporals responded to an emergency call of a woman reportedly suffering from diabetic shock in the parking lot of the I-78 Welcome Center. Following their Commission training and procedures, they administered CPR and set up a defibrillator unit while simultaneously questioning the victim's two male companions. Over a relatively short period of time, our two employees became increasingly suspicious of the evasive answers the men gave. Persistent questioning by Stocker and Hockenbury eventually generated an admission that the woman had ingested an opiate overdose. Armed with this info, Stocker, Hockenbury and the EMTs from the Easton Emergency Squad were able to revive the woman, administer the proper antidote and get her transported to a nearby hospital. We are very proud of the way Corporals Stocker and Hockenbury performed during this challenging situation last month. Their selfless actions are indicative of the men and women who work at all levels of our agency. More importantly, their life-saving efforts underscore the value of the training that is provided to our bridge, maintenance and toll personnel on a regular basis

"In closing, I want to remind everyone that the summer driving season unofficially kicks off with the upcoming Memorial Day weekend. Due in large measure to some of the lowest motor fuel prices in a decade, AAA is estimating that this will be the busiest Memorial Day weekend travel period since 2005. And this weekend's travel blitz is only the kickoff

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to the period of the year when Americans take to the roads for family vacations and longdistance trips. Overall, driving volumes this summer could end up being the highest on record. This would continue a trend that we have been witnessing for some time now at the Commission. Not only did we reach new highs for traffic and toll receipts in 2015, but the upsurge has continued through the first four months of this year. Two-way traffic at our 18 vehicular bridges is up 5 % through the first four months of this year compared to the same period in 2015. Meanwhile, revenues at seven toll bridges are up a little more than 5-3/4 % percent for the same four month comparison period. So, if you're driving this weekend — or this summer — remember there are a lot of other people out there. Please drive safely"

# DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of May 23, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (April, 2016)

**Summary:** The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for April 2016 in comparison to the April 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of April.

# Analysis of April 2016 / April 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 0.35 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.21 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 1.96 percent increase.

# Analysis of April 2016 / April 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 52,468 vehicles, or 1.61 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 999 vehicles, or 0.22 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 51,469 vehicles, or 1.84 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for April 2016 was 110,094 total vehicles as compared to 108,345 total vehicles in April 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for April 2016 decreased by 30,171 vehicles, or 1.12 percent as compared to April 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for April 2016 was 88,447 vehicles as compared to 89,453 in April 2015.

# **Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:**

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 7.29 percent increase through the first four months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 1.93
  percent increase for the first four months of 2016 as compared to last year.

### **DISTRICT REVIEW:**

### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for April 2016 reflected a 4.42 percent increase as the result of the increases of 30,376 cars and 1,023 trucks when compared to April 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 4,294 cars and an increase of 211 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 2.47 percent for April 2016 as compared to April 2015.

### **District II**

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 0.15 percent in total toll traffic for the month of April 2016 compared to April 2015 as the result of a small increase of 94 cars and the decrease of 1,559 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 5,532 passenger vehicles and 1,160 trucks combined to generate a 1.53 percent increase in total toll traffic for April 2016.

### **District III**

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 2.73 percent increase in total toll traffic during April 2016 as a result of increases of 1,483 automobiles and 1,276 trucks compared to April 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the increase of 15,113 passenger vehicles combined with the decrease of 1,251 trucks to generate an overall increase of 1.81 percent in total toll traffic for April 2016 as compared to April 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), increases of 3,165 passenger vehicles and 139 trucks combined to produce a 3.22 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of April 2016.

### **E-ZPass** Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of April, 2016 and April, 2015, and the year-to-date periods ending April 30, 2016 and April 30, 2015.

### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of April 2016 and the four month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2016 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$5,373,396 for the month of April. For the 2016 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$18,866,183 or 86.2% of the YTD operating budget.

All of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets.

The month of April was a three payroll month. This resulted in a higher than usual monthly expense. This extra pay was accounted for in the Commission's operating budget for April. There were no other unusual expenses or charges during the month.

### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

### **APRIL 2016**

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of April, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 75 purchase orders in the total amount of \$375,086.12. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 107 price inquiries were sent out for 33 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.24 per order (107/30= 3.24).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of April 2016 are shown below:

- > Two Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$175,853.87, for a Volvo Wheel Loader and a John Deere Gator under the approved 2016 Capital Budget for the I-78 Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, at the request of the IT Department, in the total amount of \$31,788.38 for Commission laptop upgrades.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$11,975.00 for an outside storage shed at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$11,601.66 for vinyl sheeting for the Commission's sign making needs.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$7,340.00 for replacement entry doors at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Facility.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

## Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

- 3. ## COMMUNICATIONS REPORT April 2016

#### COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Mid-Jersey Chamber of Commerce Scudder Falls Bridge Project **Presentation** – Worked with engineering department and the SFB project team (Baker International, McCormick Taylor, and Stokes Creative Group) to prepare a presentation to Mercer County business owners and executives at a breakfast hosted by the Mid-Jersey Chamber of Commerce. The presentation included five New Jersey open house project display boards (Project Manager Kevin Skeels answered questions), the New Jersey project video, a PowerPoint by Executive Director Joseph Resta, and a brief question and answer period. The PowerPoint reinforced three aspects of the video: the reasons why the current bridge needs replacement, how I-95 traffic will continue moving across the river during construction, and toll hearings will be held once a toll schedule is developed. Only five questions were raised: offpeak noise at a nearby school, whether bicyclists can ride their bikes across the new bridge's walkway, the design of roundabouts in New Jersey, potential traffic diversion to Titusville, and changes planned for Woodside Road in Lower Makefield, PA. There were roughly 50 attendees for the event. Attendees included two local news reporters who subsequently produced articles for the Ewing Observer and U.S. 1/Princetoninfo.com. presentation will be refined and updated as needed for other outreach events.

New Traffic Counting System Procurement – Worked with the Commission's new media consultant – Bellevue Communications Group – to produce and distribute a press release publicizing the Commissioners' April 25 approval of a planned overhaul of the agency's 20-year-old traffic counting system. The release general regional, national and even international coverage for the Commission.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project 2016 PA Noise Study Findings – Worked with the engineering department, the project team, design engineers Michael Baker Inc., Stokes Creative Group and public involvement consultants McCormick Taylor to complete preparations for an April 27 presentation in Lower Makefield. The event's target audience were residents of three Lower Makefield neighborhoods that did not warrant – and still do not warrant – noise-abatement walls based on noise readings collected in 2007 and again in 20016. Communications drafted the invitation letters for eligible residents and local elected officials. A press release also was prepared to promote the meeting. Between 35 and 40 members of the public attended the meeting, which consisted of a small display of noise-wall/project items, a project fact sheet, and the presentation of noise findings with a subsequent question and answer period. A stringer from the Courier-Times newspaper attended and produced an article that appeared in the next day's edition.

Titusville Village Traffic Study Group — Provided two responses to inquiries from Hopewell Township Business Administrator/Engineer Paul Pogorzelski regarding the Titusville section's ongoing opposition efforts to Mercer County's planned reconstruction of two failed culvert-type bridges north and south of the neighborhood. Some Titusville residents have made unsubstantiated claims that their village will be impacted by traffic diverting from a tolled Scudder Falls Bridge as an argument against replacing the two washed out culverts. The communications to Mr. Pogorzelski explain why the Titusville does not figure to be impacted by diverted traffic from the tolled Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge. Various research was conducted to craft the responses to Mr. Pogorzelski.

Columbia Salt Issue – Edited Jodee Inscho communications to New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection regarding Knowlton's salt study assertions.

## April 2016

The following Community Affairs activities took place during April:

#### **Scudder Falls**

Attended public meeting to share results of additional sound wall studies with residents of Lower Makefield. Received some follow-up questions from Representative Santarsiero's office, which was referred to Joe Donnelly for response. Another area resident called upset that she had heard that the Commission was not going to install a sound wall near her home as previously planned. Joe Donnelly responded and assured her husband that all sound walls previously planned will be constructed.

Attended Mid-Jersey Chamber of Commerce meeting on April 12, which included a presentation on the project by Joe Resta.

Researched possible venues for toll hearings, particularly in District 3, assisting the Public Involvement consultants who were not as familiar with the region. Forwarded information to Katie Carver, of McCormick-Taylor.

Continued to coordinate with McCormick-Taylor and Commission staff on messages received through project website to ensure all inquiries are answered and chronicled.

#### Knowlton/Columbia salt issue

Attended meeting on April 1 with representatives of the Commission, Knowlton Township DPW and NJ DOT to review each agency's role in winter maintenance of the roads in the township's Columbia section. The written agreement for plowing/salting responsibilities currently in place is from 1970 and needs to be updated. Based on discussions, NJ DOT will prepare an updated maintenance map of the area.

Obtained copies of tax maps from the Warren County Board of Taxation, showing the limits of Commission property in the area. The maps are consistent with the Commission's information and bridge maps.

At the April 1 meeting, Knowlton Twp. Mayor Adele Starrs referenced a NJ DEP report that she said would be released at the end of the month (April.) She alluded that the report would state that the Commission is over-salting the area. Contacted John Hazen, Legislative Liaison at the NJ DEP, and requested a copy of said report. He replied that while the Department is reviewing the matter, that there is no such report prepared at this time.

At the request of Executive Director Joe Resta, prepared comprehensive summary of the issue. Information included all relevant correspondence between the Commission, Township officials and local residents, copies of meeting minutes of the Knowlton Township Committee, other documents and maps. District 3 Superintendent Clark and Assistant Foreman Gower provided valuable assistance in the matter.

**Riverton-Belvidere** In preparation for the upcoming critical member strengthening project, arranged site visit with Project Engineer Michael Cane to meet with affected property owners Sal and Antoinette Cavaliere. The project includes replacement of a privacy fence on the property line. Mr. and Mrs. Cavaliere were very accommodating. Coming from Staten Island, they were very pleasantly surprised the Commission reached out to them and only asked that the length of time between removal of the old fence and installation of new one be limited.

## Lehigh Valley Chamber Transportation Committee

Attended the April 7 meeting of the Transportation Committee and presented 2015 year-end traffic counts for area bridges. Main topics of discussion were the idea of a Lehigh Valley-New York City commuter train and planned construction projects well outside of the Commission's Lehigh Valley service jurisdictions.

#### **Host Communities**

Attended Ewing Township Mayor's "State of the Township" address hosted by the Mid Jersey Chamber of Commerce. Those members I spoke with were interested and supportive of the Scudder Falls project.

Received a call from Tinicum Township, relaying information that a resident wants "Welcome to Pennsylvania" signs at or near the bridge. I spoke to Teri Lewis at the municipal offices and explained that those type of signs are not placed on Commission property.

Commissioner Van Vleit asked that I forward a copy of Use of Facilities form to Phillipsburg Mayor Stephen Ellis, not for a specific event, just to be aware of the process. Received form from Superintendent Shelly and forwarded to Mayor Ellis.

**Workplace Safety** 

Attended the April 21 Workplace Safety Committee meeting at Delaware Water Gap and participated in safety review of the facility.

Newsletter

Continued to gather content and photos for a spring Commission newsletter. To be completed and distributed by the end of May.

#### Misc. Customer relations

Received a website comment message from NJ DEP's Pequest Fish Hatchery regarding an upcoming Youth Fishing event. Despite several phone messages and emails, I have not heard back from the individual.

District 3 Superintendent Clark and Assistant Foreman Gower advised me of a couple potential issues with neighboring property owners, one in Columbia and one in Portland. #### DESIGN Contract No. C-628A-5

Dewberry was issued Notice to Proceed effective February 22, 2016. A project kick-off meeting was held with Dewberry and their sub-consultant, The Lighting Practice, on March 3, 2016. The designer is proceeding with required tasks. The draft concept report has been submitted and is currently under review by Commission staff.

## SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT FINAL DESIGN SERVICES

## FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (MB) of Hamilton New Jersey was issued the Notice to Proceed effective March 11, 2015. The latest Progress Meeting was held with Baker on April 12<sup>th</sup> to review the status of the contract and progress of the work completed to date. As of March 3rd, Baker is reported to be approximately 74% complete with approximately 76% of the budget expended. The Baker progress submittals made during the month of March included the following: Design Schedule Update No. 9, the Draft Construction Protection Control Plans for the PA Delaware Canal and the NJ D&R Canal, the Draft NEPA Environmental Reevaluation, Progress Plans for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Ramp Structure, and the 60% AET Gantry Structural Plans. The draft meeting minutes for Progress Meeting No. 13 were also received and are being reviewed by Engineering and DMC staff.

Meetings continued with NJDOT and the various PA/NJ impacted utility companies to review the utility and ITS facility relocation schemes. A meeting was held on April 6, 2016 with MB and the Greenman-Pederson, Incorporated (GPI) and Parsons Brinckerhoff (PB) Team to discuss the findings and results of the constructability and cost estimate review performed under Commission Contract No. CM-664A.

## CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR THE SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Construction Management Contract No. CM-664A

This Contract is for Construction Management Professional Services associated with the installation of sound barriers along the Pennsylvania approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge. Included in the scope is a constructability review and preparation of an Independent Engineers Estimate using the 60% Design Documents for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project prepared by Michael Baker, International under Commission Contract No. C-660A. Greenman Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) of Lebanon, NJ was awarded this contract at the February 29, 2016 Commissioners' Meeting, and full Notice to Proceed was issued effective March 18<sup>th</sup>.

On April 6<sup>th</sup> a Meeting was held with representatives from the Commission Engineering Department, Baker, GPI, PB, and AECOM whereby GPI and PB presented the results of their efforts associated with the aforementioned constructability review. GPI submitted their Constructability Review comments and Draft Independent Estimate Report (Report) on April 12<sup>th</sup>, which was reviewed by Commission Staff with comments returned. On April 21<sup>st</sup>, Rev. 1 of the Draft Report was submitted and being reviewed by Commission and AECOM staff. GPI also submitted their Draft Project Specific Quality Assurance Plan, Draft Inspection Plan and Draft project Specific Health and Safety Plan, which are currently under review.

## SUBSURFACE BORING AND SAMPLING CONTRACT FOR SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Construction
Contract No. T-661A

TRC Engineers, Inc. (TRC) has completed all of the Contract Phase 1 boring work, which included borings for the noise walls, the main river bridge, the sign structures, the retaining walls, the approach bridges and the pedestrian/bike bridge, and also the taking of pavement cores and bulk sampling. TRC reached Contract Substantial Completion on Phase 1 on November 23<sup>rd</sup>, two weeks ahead of schedule. The SFB Final Design Engineer, Michael Baker, has developed a list of thirty four (34) additional borings and pavement cores needing to support the final design. This list has been passed onto TRC for them to schedule as part of their contract recall phase, which ends with the Contract Completion date of May 18, 2016.

# PRE-CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC STUDY FOR THE SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

## DESIGN Contract No. C-663A

Pennoni Associates, Inc. (Pennoni) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015. This Contract is for professional traffic engineering services for a pre-construction traffic study required prior to construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, in accordance with the Interagency Agreement (IA) dated April 30, 2012 between the DRJTBC, PennDOT and NJDOT. This study will serve as the baseline for purposes of determining the traffic diversion impacts from tolling the new Scudder Falls Bridge. As prescribed in the IA, the study area includes bridge crossings, various County and State road networks, intersections and interchanges that may be affected by the tolling of the new bridge. The scope of services includes traffic counts, data collection and traffic analysis.

The Pennoni team has completed the traffic data collection, the base modelling of the regional traffic network and they have finalized the Pre-Construction Traffic Study Report addressing all previous Commission comments. Copies of the report were provided to PennDOT and NJDOT for their information, on April 20, 2016 in accordance with the Interagency Agreement for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. The work under this assignment has been completed.

### SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT SERVICES

## FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-662A

McCormick Taylor, Inc. (MT) was awarded this Public Involvement (PI) Contract at the Commission's September 28, 2015 Meeting, and issued Notice to Proceed effective October 29, 2015. A kickoff meeting was held with MT on November 25, 2015. The Commission provided comments to MT's draft PI plan and is awaiting a revised draft. MT has attended numerous C-660A progress meetings, and has successfully taken responsibility of maintaining the project hotline and website. MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township and April 27, 2016 Pennsylvania Noise Walls Update Meeting. MT is currently working with the Commission to schedule and plan additional outreach events anticipated over the next several months.

AP has completed all tree clearing in Stage 1 reaching Substantial Completion on April 6, 2016 and Stage 2 Final Completion on April 11, 2016. Due to the Indian Bat restriction, the Stage 2 tree clearing cannot start until October 1, 2016. Stage 1 Punch list work continued through April.

Environmental permitting agency coordination continues as well as preparation of the USACE and PADEP permit application packages, including all back-up documentation. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the project within the Commission's jurisdiction was submitted to the PADEP on February 29, 2016. The USACE Permit application Package was submitted to the USACE on March 4, 2016. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the Project within PennDOT's jurisdiction was submitted to PennDOT in early March and then subsequently submitted to the PADEP on March 25, 2016. Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP - Green Acres regarding the final application package for the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. The NJDEP - Green Acres 30-day public comment period for the application process ended on April 7<sup>th</sup>. No comments were received during this second public comment period. documentation for the Public Comment Period process were submitted to NJDEP on April 22<sup>nd</sup>. We are awaiting NJ Statehouse Commission approval, scheduled for June We are still awaiting preliminary approval of the Revised Jurisdictional Determination (JD) Plans that were submitted to the USACE on December 11, 2015. The PA Wetlands Mitigation Site Design was completed and was submitted to the PADEP and the USACE as part of the Joint Permit Applications.

### Meeting of May 23 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The ROW acquisition process continued during the month of January, including coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. The Commission closed on Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road during the month of January and now owns that parcel. An April 15, 2016 closing was held for Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road in Pennsylvania. On February 24<sup>th</sup> an Agreement of Sale was executed for the Morris property (Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001) with closing held on April 28, 2016.

Coordination and support with the Public Involvement process for the Project, including oversight of the Project Website and Project Hotline was completed in January and all responsibilities turned over to the Commission's Public Involvement Consultant.

DMC Staff are coordinating and overseeing the performance of Contract T-661, Geotechnical Boring Contract for the SFB Project that was awarded at the May 18, 2015 Commission Meeting. The boring work began June 22<sup>nd</sup>. All work under the initial phase of the boring contract was substantially complete on November 24, 2015. Under the call-back phase of this contract thirty-four (34) additional borings will be taken. These were started in April and will be completed by the call back date of May 18, 2016. The DMC is also providing RE and CI services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. Phase 2 work will begin in October of this year.

Various design submittals by Baker were reviewed by the DMC Staff during the month of April. In addition, coordination meetings with the PA and NJ utility companies that are being impacted by the proposed construction were held throughout the month. Utility Agreements will be required with each of the impacted utility companies. The Utility companies are currently preparing cost estimates for the relocation of their facilities. The Commission is working with NJDOT on the NJ utility relocation effort and coordinating the necessary utility agreements with them for the impacted NJ utility companies. The Commission will reimburse the NJDOT for the costs associated with relocating the impacted NJ utility companies.

# ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF APRIL 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

## Radio System

- During the month of April 2016, delivery plans for the new radios have been prepared and are in the process of being executed. The radio tower sites are being prepared for new components and the switch over to the P25 system.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

# Access Control System

- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's lock smith) to address various lock issues.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric to complete the installation of the card readers and biometric locks at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge Shelters.
- In April 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees.
- During the month of April 2016, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employee and contractor cards. Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

• During the month of April 2016, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management and access control system.

- During the month of April 2016, the new ESS Primary Control Center (PCC) at the New Jersey State Police Regional Operations Intelligence Center (ROIC) continued to operate. Once the Commission acquires adequate bandwidth for the ESS system the PCC's operational capabilities will be expanded.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continue to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. Schneider Electric has agreed to perform a "camera shootout" or comparison of new cameras that will potentially provide the best roadway coverage and clarity.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering to design the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel met with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on the various other pending and current construction projects.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.
- The ESS Primary Control Center continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of April 2016, ESS personnel investigated and processed thirteen video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video" Report for a summary of information on each request.

## Miscellaneous

• During the month of April 2016, the Director of ESS also supervised the Security, Safety, and Training Department. In April, a new Toll Booth Robbery Course was developed.
