MILFORD-MONTAGUE

Today you will vote to ratify the construction management and inspection contract for the rehabilitation of the Milford Montague Toll Bridge. The contract is awarded to STV of Douglassville, Pa., for an amount not to exceed \$2,009.379.04.

The rehabilitation will include repainting the bridge and replacing the existing bridge deck, approach roadway pavements and toll plaza. As you know, you awarded the construction contract at last month's meeting to IEW Construction Group of Trenton, N.J.

With both teams in place, construction is expected to begin by the end of this year.

NEW HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE

Effective Friday/today, the Commission has closed the outer (right) lane in each direction of the New Hope-Lambertville (Route 202) Toll Bridge pending the completion of repair work. The Commission does not expect any impact on traffic, as the remaining lanes on the bridge will be adequate to handle projected traffic volumes. The lane closures are projected to be in effect until February 2008, when the repairs are completed.

STATISTICS OF TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING OCTOBER 31, 2007 COMPARED WITH MONTH AND YEAR-TO-DATE PERIOD ENDING OCTOBER 31, 2006

The following provides a comparison of toll direction traffic volumes for the month and year-to-date periods ending October 31, 2007, as compared with the month and year-to-date periods ending October 31, 2006.

<u>Traffic Volume Comparisons – October 2007 versus October 2006</u>

In the month of October, total vehicular toll traffic for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges decreased by 17,600 vehicles or 0.5%, as compared to October 2006. Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges increased by 226,600 vehicles or 9.0% as compared to the previous year.

In District I, toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for October 2007 decreased by 47,700 cars and decreased by 1,100 trucks as compared to October 2006, resulting in a 7.2% decrease in total toll traffic. It is noted that roadway construction work for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in January 2007. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 3,100 cars combined with an increase of 100 trucks generated an overall increase in total toll traffic of 1.9% for October 2007 as compared to October 2006.

In District II, a 10,400 increase in cars combined with an increase of 3,800 trucks resulted in a 1.6% increase in total toll traffic at I-78 for the month of October 2007 as compared to October 2006. The Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge experienced an increase in traffic volume. An increase of 15,300 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 1,400 trucks generated an overall increase of 2.6% in total toll traffic for October 2007.

In District III, total toll traffic at Portland-Columbia (PC) reflected a decrease of 3.0% for the month of October 2007 as a result of a decrease of 3,900 automobiles and an increase of 200 trucks. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 8,600 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 9,000 trucks generated an increase in total toll traffic for the month of approximately 0.1% as compared to October 2006. Milford-Montague (MM) experienced an increase of approximately 700 passenger vehicles and an increase of 300 trucks, resulting overall in a 0.9% increase in toll traffic for the month.

E-Z Pass Penetration Rates

The following table provides a summary of E-Z Pass penetration rates experienced at the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges during October 2007, October 2006, 2007 year-to-date (YTD), and 2006 year-to-date. E-Z Pass penetration rates for all of the Commission's toll bridges was 57.5% for the month of October 2007 and is 55.8% 2007 year-to-date. Overall E-Z Pass penetration rates increased by 2.7% in October 2007 as compared to October 2006; including an increase of 2.5% in autos and an increase of 3.1% in trucks.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of October 2007 and the ten month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2007 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,537,507 for the month of October. For the fiscal year-to-date 2007, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$36,002,654 or 97.01% of the year-to-date operating budget. The positive variance between the operating budget and actual expenses is due to normal operating activity.

Several line items are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Unemployment Compensation is currently over its annual budget. Temporary salaries are running ahead of budget and are expected to end the year over budget as a result of higher than anticipated charges at the District II toll bridges and Administration. The OT expense for Administration is more than offset by salary savings from vacant positions. EZPass Operating expense is running ahead of budget due to higher than budgeted charges for transaction processing. This line item expense will end the year in excess of its original operating budget.

During the month of October, funds were received from FEMA, in the amount of \$80,452, as a result of claims made for earlier floods. These funds have been booked as a credit to emergency repairs and will be used to offset charges for the New Hope Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge apron repair.

October 2007

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of October 2007, showing the divisions chargeable for the expensed and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission.
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate.
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent.

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 87 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 44 price inquiries were sent out on 25 groups of inquiries during the month, or an average of 1.8 inquiries for each item or group of items.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

COMMUNITY AFFAIRS REPORT MONTH OF OCTOBER 2007

The following activities under the general heading of community relations/governmental affairs have recently taken place.

- Representatives of the Community Affairs Department attended a full day partnering session for the I-78 Pavement Reconstruction Project. A project mission and goals were established and all parties signed a project charter establishing their commitment to the project. Potential issues and problems that may occur during the project were discussed in detail along with agreed upon methods for resolution. Community Affairs staff also attend project scheduling and progress meetings held on October 1 and 18.
- ❖ Community Affairs Department staff joined the Engineering and CAI staff in attending a stakeholder interview held on October 25th at NJ DOT central offices. The purpose of the interview was to review conceptual plans for the Route 29 Boulevard from Cass Street to north of the Calhoun Street Bridge and solicit feedback from the Commission. Information on the status of Commission projects within or near the Blvd project area was shared and potential coordination issues and concerns were discussed.
- Community Affairs staff participated in a meeting held on October 16, 2007 to review the public involvement scope of work for C-427B I-78 ORT Lanes Design and to refine the scope to align with currently anticipated needs of the project. The Commission's project manager, project area manager and Chief Engineer initiated and participated in the meeting.
- The Commission hosted the monthly meeting of the Lower Bucks County Chamber of Commerce Transportation Committee on October 19, 2007 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Operations facility. Community Affairs staff and the Commission's Project Manager for the Route 1 Trenton-Morrisville Rehab project presented a report on the status of current and planned projects in the Bucks-Mercer vicinity, followed by questions and answer session. The Chamber committee members were very appreciative of the effort to keep them informed and expressed interest in continued communication with the Commission.
- A successful kick-off meeting for the Public Involvement Guidelines Task Order Agreement C-449B-5 was held on October 26th, 2007. Working with the Engineering Department, project guidelines and time table were discussed and promulgated. This project is aimed at developing a series of guidelines or best

practices for community involvement based on experiences with a series of past commission projects.

- Community Affairs staff participated in the Annual Meeting of the Greater Mercer Transportation Management Association and used the occasion to recement existing relationships with elected officials and to generate a follow-on contact with the Chief of Operations NJDOT
- ❖ Community Affairs staff participated in a series of progress meetings for the T-380B Trenton Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehab, the I 78 repaving project and the New Hope Lambertville pier maintenance project. In addition the staff also participated in the half day senior partnering session for the T-380B, T-M Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary NB Lane.
- ❖ On October 26 Community Affairs staff attended a meeting of the Mercer Chapter of the Alliance for Action to hear a review of transportation and construction plans for Mercer County Government, the City of Trenton and Princeton University's massive capital improvement plan. Staff also represented the Commission at the Eagle Awards presentation for the NJ State Alliance for Action held in New Brunswick on October 17
- Community Affairs staff sat in on the meeting of the Delaware River Flooding Task force held in the Commission's Board Room on October 23 where progress on various initiatives to lessen the occurrence or impact of river flooding were addressed.

During the month of October, 2007 the Director of Policy and Planning participated in a number of communications and meetings that explored the following:

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's Planning Coordinating Committee and Regional Transportation Committee had two interesting informational presentations. The first presentation dealt with the examination of the Transportation Systems Management and Operations for two New Jersey transportation corridors (I-295 and the New Jersey Turnpike). The second presentation dealt with the Southeastern Pennsylvania Emergency Evacuation Transportation Plan.

The Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce Economic Development / Transportation Committee were updated by the Pocono Mountains Economic Development Corporation about projects in Monroe County.

The Director participated in the I-78 Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission and Tilcon Partnering Workshop.

The Lehigh Valley Transportation Study Coordinating Committee discussed the draft of the new PennDOT Project Development Process.

The Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce Government Affairs Committee featured Pennsylvania State Senator Robert J. Mellow (D-22). Senator Mellow, the Senate's Minority Floor Leader, gave a power point presentation on his recent trip to Taiwan. Senator Mellow's presentation included his experience with the country's high-speed rail transportation.

The Warren County Regional Chamber of Commerce Economic Development / Transportation Council discussed countywide economic development efforts, and the Director gave the council an update concerning our I-78 project.

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's (DVRPC) Board and Executive Committees' Meetings were highlighted by two presentations. Joung Lee of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) outlined the long-term surface transportation needs in the United States, and he described the share of highway and transit revenue collected at the federal, state and local levels. Joung discussed the looming funding crisis with the Federal Highway Trust Fund in Fiscal Year 2009, and he identified actions that could be taken to avoid insolvency and sustain long-term funding. The second presentation by the DVRPC was a draft document which describes twenty-three options for generating additional revenue to fill the region's transportation funding gap.

The Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce Public Policy Committee featured Pennsylvania's Secretary of Community and Economic Development Dennis Yablonsky. Secretary Yablonsky updated the group on the implementation of Governor Ed Rendell's Economic Stimulus Package. The Secretary also discussed some of the governor's other goals, such as streamlining local tax collection and the impact of impending electricity rate hikes we are likely to face in 2010 and 2011.

The Lehigh Valley Transportation Study Technical Committee was advised by PennDOT that in the summer of 2008 there will be resurfacing projects on Route 22. In Lehigh County both the east and westbound lanes of Route 22 between the I-78 split and the Lehigh River Bridge will be resurfaced. In Northampton County, only the eastbound lanes from Route 191 to the Farmersville Road overpass will be resurfaced.

TRENTON-MORRISVILLE (ROUTE 1) TOLL BRIDGE REHABILITATION AND ADDITION OF ONE NB AUXILIARY LANE

DESIGN Contract No. C-380A

The Design Consultant, The Louis Berger Group, continues to provide services through the post-design/construction phase of the project.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-380B

The Construction Management/Construction Inspection Consultant, Hill International, has been coordinating field activities with the contractor, reviewing contractor schedules, conducting bi-weekly progress and scheduling meetings, preparing daily reports, tracking project submittals and developing public involvement and outreach efforts.

Hill's Public Involvement Consultant, Bergmaier Associates, continues to update the project website, answer customer generated questions via the toll free number and updating the quarterly newsletter.

As a result of the initial OSHA Compliance Inspection that took place in July 2007 one of the recommendations moving forward was for the Commission to perform follow-up safety inspections of the Contract T-380B, Rehabilitation of the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge and One Auxiliary Lane, jobsite.

Hill has hired an experienced Safety Professional (Applegate Associates, Inc.) to perform periodic OSHA Compliance Inspections on the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation construction site. At the conclusion of each site visit, Applegate will be providing the Commission with a report of their findings. The inspections will take place monthly for the remainder of 2007 and bi-monthly in 2008 & 2009.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-380B

Construction work is progressing on schedule. Stage 1 is underway and expected to last until the spring of 2008. Stage 1 work includes the rebuilding of the toll plaza, construction of the head house that connects the main building to the new toll tunnel, as well as demolition and rebuilding the downstream portions of the main river bridge. Pier cap extensions have been constructed, new structural steel has been set and deck demolition has been completed on the downriver portion of the main river bridge. The contractor is preparing to start the installation of the new bridge deck in these widened locations. The toll plaza demolition has continued with the removal of portions of the existing canopy and toll booths. New toll islands, booths and canopy sections are currently being installed. New structural steel girders are being placed on the widened portion of the PennDOT viaduct over Conrail & Delaware Canal adjacent to Pennsylvania Avenue. Numerous Commission owned overpass structures are also being reconstructed on both sides of the river.

A progress "Partnering Meeting" was held on October 23, 2007 at the Construction Manager's field office. Representatives from the Commission, Berger, Hill and Conti were in attendance. The session was run by a facilitator, FMI Corporation. The next session is scheduled for January 2008.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The preliminary Preferred Alternative is the inside widening of I-95 in Pennsylvania, Option 2 at Taylorsville Road and Option 1c – Modified (Roundabout) at Route 29. The Preferred Alternative also includes a total replacement of the Scudder Falls Bridge with the new bridge containing 5 northbound and 4 southbound lanes on an upstream alignment.

The Environmental Assessment (EA) document is being prepared and a draft will be submitted to the Commission for review late November. The EA will be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for review in early December. The EA will be distributed to the public for review in February and a public hearing is scheduled for March. The final decision document is expected by the end of June 2008.

NORTHERLY CROSSINGS CORRIDOR CONGESTION MITIGATION STUDY

STUDY Contract No. C-395A

The Commission has conducted a series of workshops with NJDOT and PennDOT intended to facilitate establishing a Task Force which will focus on building a consensus with respect to mitigating future traffic congestion along the I-80 corridor in both the eastbound and westbound direction.

Workshops were held on August 1, 2007 and September 20, 2007 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge facility and included discussions regarding the development of a Memorandum of Understanding for the Task Force. Each workshop was attended by representatives of NJDOT, PennDOT, PA Turnpike and the Commission.

A Memorandum of Understanding is currently being developed to include a Problem Statement, Mission Statement as well as Goals and Objectives for the Task Force.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

PROGRAM MANAGER Contract No. C-396A

Work includes the continuation of implementation oversight generally focused on coordinating preliminary matters and providing administrative support relating to the issuance of Notice-to-Proceed and the initiation of site surveys.

Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey continues to assist the Commission, together with Counsel, in discussions with Advanced Wireless Services (AWS) license holders who have bought rights to regional wireless frequencies through an FCC auction and determined that their proposed AWS networks will potentially interfere with the Commission's microwave communications system. Negotiations are in progress for an agreement to compensate the Commission for vacating its licenses to operate in the affected frequencies.

DESIGN-BUILD-MAINTAIN PROJECT DB-396A

A Project Kick-off Meeting was held on October 30, 2007 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge facility and was attended by representatives of Mass. Electric Construction Company, Jacobs Edwards & Kelcey, NJ State Police, PA State Police, Bellevue Communications Group and members of the Commission's staff.

Mass. Electric Construction Company is scheduled to initiate field surveys in mid November.

A Partnering Meeting is currently planned to be held in early December.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

NEW HOPE – LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING RENOVATIONS AND ADDITION

DESIGN Contract No. C-397B

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was publicly advertised on July 17, 2007. Seven (7) Contractors submitted their Statement of Qualifications (SOQs) on August 08, 2007. All seven (7) of the Contractors were deemed pre-qualified to bid.

Final construction bid documents were received from VITETTA on September 10, 2007. Construction bid solicitations were issued to all seven (7) firms on September 10, 2007 as construction Contract T-397B. A mandatory Pre-Bid Meeting was held at the New Hope - Lambertville Toll Bridge Administration Building on September 18, 2007. Six (6) out of the seven (7) Pre-Qualified Contractors attended the meeting.

Five (5) Bids were received on October 18, 2007. The bids are being reviewed.

I-78 ROADWAY REHABILITATION CONTRACT

DESIGN Contract No. C-424A

PB Americas, Incorporated (PB) continues to provide post design support for the project. PB is continuing to respond to Contractor requests-for-information (RFIs), reviewing and responding to shop drawings and other submissions from the contractor and attending the bi-weekly Progress Meetings

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-424A

Greenman-Pedersen, Inc (GPI) continues to provide CM/CI services for this contract which includes monitoring and coordinating field activities with the contractor, reviewing contractor schedules, preparation and processing of contractor invoicing, conducting bi-weekly Progress and Scheduling Meetings, preparing daily reports, tracking project submittals along with public information efforts. The development of the first project newsletter continues as has the responding to customer generated questions obtained via the toll free project hotline phone number. The Project information on the Commission's website has been updated.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-424A

Tilcon New York, Incorporated has completed establishing the CM/CI field office and construction on October 15, 2007. A Partnering Session was held on October 15, 2007. Work continues on the drainage channel stabilization along County Route 519 under I-78, videoing and inspecting the drainage laterals and repaving of the right shoulders in advance of shifting traffic onto the shoulder for Stage 1 work. Slurry Grouting has begun in the test area. The baseline construction schedule (CPM) has been approved.

NJDEP & PADEP MUNICIPAL STORM WATER COMPLIANCE PROGRAM CONSULTING SERVICES

Contract No. C-425A

STORM SEWER OUTFALL PIPE MAP

DESIGN Assignment #7

Under this Task Order Assignment T&M Associates was tasked with finding, inspecting, and mapping all Commission sewer outfalls in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

The consultant mapped and inspected all outfalls in Districts 1, 2 and 3 and an internal meeting was held to discuss and finalize the Outfall Inspection Report.

T & M Associates recently obtained additional information with respect to the ownership of various outfalls previous identified as "Commission owned". This information is being incorporated into the final version of the Outfall Inspection Report and related maps.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

PORTLAND BOROUGH SEWER FORCE MAIN CONNECTION LOCATION

DESIGN Assignment #9

The Borough of Portland has been ordered by the PA DEP to provide a sewage treatment plant to service residential and other facilities within the Borough. The Borough has requested an easement to construct a sewer force main to the treatment plant within Commission property. The Commission and Commission Counsel have been working with the Borough to prepare the requested easement documentation.

The Commission requested T & M Associates prepare a proposal to review the proposed sewer force main plans prepared by the Borough engineering consultant, Brinjac Engineering, and determine the best location for stub connection to which the Commission will ultimately connect our P-C Toll facility. As part of the connection, the Commission is required to install a grinder pump provided by the Borough, and construct a lateral connection from our building to the sewer tap location.

The final report was submitted and comments were provided. The revised report has been submitted by T & M Associates and is currently under review. It is expected that this Task Order Assignment will be closed by the end of the year.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

I-78 OPEN ROAD TOLLING (ORT) LANES DESIGN

DESIGN Contract No. C-427B

I-78 ORT Lanes Design (Infrastructure Project)

HNTB is continuing with the preliminary design effort and preparing plans and specifications for the preliminary (60% complete) PS&E submission in December 2007. HNTB is proceeding with the preliminary design of the stormwater management system and in doing so has been discussing the project's stormwater management design with the agencies that will be required to review the design for compliance. Per the new Pennsylvania Stormwater Manual and the updated Williams Township Stormwater and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO), testing must be completed in the proposed retention areas, even if the area is karst, meaning a limestone region where there is a high potential of sinkholes forming. This requirement is a result of an attempt to reduce surface runoff as much as possible by completing testing and therefore possibly finding areas within a karst area that could accept infiltration. HNTB requested a proposal from DelVal Soils, which performs this testing. Upon receiving the proposal, HNTB and the Commission will meet to discuss the proposed stormwater management system and proposal from DelVal Soils. It is noted that this work (testing by DelVal Soils) is considered to be out of scope by HNTB and will have to be discussed with the Commission.

HNTB is analyzing the support details for the proposed LED signs on the canopy at I-78 Toll Plaza. The plans will include replacing the existing toll plaza canopy flip signs with a changeable message sign, with one (1) sign installed over each of the seven (7) toll lanes. Additionally, the existing lane indicator signal (green downward point arrow and red X) mounted below the canopy will remain as is. Yellow flashing beacons will be installed above each changeable message sign.

<u>Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Design-Build-Operate-Maintain Project</u>

HNTB submitted the draft final CSC/VPC DBOM RFP. This document was routed for approval internally and to the Commission's Counsel. HNTB and the Commission met to discuss final review comments and plans for advertising the document.

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project

Commission staff, HNTB and STV met to discuss how the maintenance of the existing Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) system should be incorporated into the In-Lane Toll System RFP. HNTB is incorporating this requirement into the document and preparing a draft to submit for review and comment.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGE REHABILITATION CONTRACT

DESIGN Contract No. C-430A

The Design Consultant, Modjeski and Masters, reviewed the five bids for completeness and accuracy and recommended that the contract be awarded to the low bidder, IEW Construction Group of Trenton, NJ.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-430A

At the September 24, 2007 Commission Meeting the Commission resolved (R:1280-09-07) "That the Commission authorize the Executive Director, in consultation with the Chair and Vice Chair of the Commission, to award the contract to the Consultant whose proposal has been deemed qualified through the LOI/RFP procurement process and determined to be fair, reasonable and in the best interest of the Commission.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-430A

The Commission awarded the Milford-Montague Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Contract to the lowest responsible bidder, IEW Construction Group of Trenton, New Jersey for an amount of \$15,219,728.90, pending review by Commission Legal Counsel.

MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGE FACILITY WATER SUPPLY UPGRADE

COST REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACT Contract No. T-432A

The Milford Water Authority's Contractor is satisfactorily progressing with the installation of the water line. Substantial completion is on schedule.

Meeting of November 19, 2007 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS OF THE CALHOUN STREET TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-447A

This project is for the in-depth inspection, structural analysis and comprehensive concept study for the Calhoun Street Bridge. It is anticipated that the concept study will be used to develop the scope of a future design and subsequent construction contract.

Lichtenstein Consulting Engineers commenced inspection of the bridge. Commission forces provided access rigging, lift equipment and traffic control in support of the inspection.

STRUCTURAL / CIVIL TASK ORDER AGREEMENT CONSULTANT Contract No. C-449A

PORTLAND COLUMBIA SIGN STRUCTURE REPAIR

DESIGN Assignment #2

Under this Task Order Assignment the Commission asked The Louis Berger Group, Incorporated to develop design documents to repair a damaged cantilevered sign structure at the Portland Columbia Toll Bridge Facility. The Louis Berger Group, Incorporated submitted final design plans on August 17, 2007.

Procurement of the sign structure repair materials is underway. The Commission's District III maintenance forces are performing the construction work required to repair the sign structure. This work is expected to be completed by the end of November.

NEW HOPE LAMBERTVILLE TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE INTERIM INSPECTION AND REPAIR DESIGN

Assignment #4

Subsequent to the GEC inspection of the New Hope - Lambertville Toll Bridge (NHLTB) in August, a letter report was submitted to the Commission outlining the inspection findings. The report noted that ten (10) cantilever floor beam brackets exhibited small cracks in the tie-plate/top flange connections. The report recommended an interim inspection within (3) months and repairs to arrest the cracks within six (6) months.

The purpose of this Task Order Agreement Assignment is to implement the recommendations made by the GEC to inspect and design repairs for the superstructure. This assignment will include an In-Depth Interim Inspection focusing on the cantilever floor beam brackets recommendations for a means of arresting the existing cracks, design and post design services for the crack repairs and recommendations for all necessary floor beam bracket retrofit repairs. The assignment will also include a second Interim Inspection following the repairs.

Utilizing the standing Task Order Agreement will allow the Commission to perform the interim inspections and repairs within the recommended time frame. This Task Order Assignment will result in bid documents for a construction contract to implement the recommended repairs.

Under this Task Order Assignment the Commission requested Greenman-Pederson, Incorporated to develop a series of guidelines or best practices for community involvement based on contractor's public participation experiences with a series of past commission projects.

A successful kick-off meeting was held on October 26, 2007. Working with the Engineering Department, project guidelines and time table were discussed and promulgated.

NEW HOPE – LAMBERTVILLE TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE PIER 2 APRON PRIORITY REPAIRS - 2007

Contract DB-457A

In accordance with Resolution ENG-08-09-07, New Hope - Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge, Pier 2 Priority Repairs – 2007, Contract No. DB-457A was awarded to W.J. Castle P.E. & Associates, P.C. in an amount not-to-exceed \$157,500.

The project includes Design-Build services to be provided by specialty engineer/contractor to perform high priority repairs of the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge. Services include engineering inspection, design, permitting, and construction for the repair of damage to the apron of Pier 2 to avoid possible significant additional deterioration from a future flood event.

Project kick-off meeting and follow-up progress meetings have been held. Underwater inspection work has commenced and repairs are expected to be completed in early December.

EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG TOLL BRIDGE FACILITY ROOF REPLACEMENT

DESIGN Contract No. C-413A-4

Brinjac Engineering is providing post-design services reviewing the Contractor's submittals. Urban Engineers, as a subconsultant to Brinjac, is providing CM/CI services.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-465A

De Sapio Construction Incorporated was awarded the construction contract at the March 2007 Commission Meeting and mobilized to start work in May. Substantial completion was achieved ahead of schedule on September 17, 2007. The project is in the process of being closed out.

INTERSTATE 80 RESURFACING PROJECT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-492B

NJDOT has a contractor on I-80 milling and resurfacing from MP 0.50 to MP 8.2. Construction of the eastbound and westbound lanes within the Commission's New Jersey jurisdiction have been milled with both the asphalt base coarse and surface coarse completed along with the line stripping. Additionally, the asphalt drainage curb lips, the shoulder rumble strips and plowable pavement markers have all been completed. The project work including the punch list work has been completed and the project is being closed out.

COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT

General

In October, the CAI department continued its series of meetings with municipalities to get a project status update. These municipalities included: Holland Township, NJ; Belvidere, NJ; Pohatcong, NJ; Milford, NJ; Phillipsburg, NJ; Delaware Water Gap, PA; Smithfield Township, PA; Lower Mount Bethel, PA; Yardley, PA; and Easton, PA. The outcome of these meetings is discussed below in the individual municipality summaries. Bi-monthly meetings have been scheduled with each municipality to continue to discuss their progress in the remaining 14 months or until the projects are completed.

Two meetings were also held with the NJDOT regarding the Trenton Route 29 Boulevard project. These meetings were to provide input on the boulevard on how the construction and development plans were going to affect the Commission.

The CAI department also prepared a presentation for the Commissioners' Committee for grant requests from four municipalities in New Jersey. During its October regular meeting, the Commissioners awarded a \$645,390 grant to Hopewell Township, New Jersey.

Update of some of the most significant efforts with the grantees during this month

Pennsylvania

- 1. Milford Borough, PA Great progress has been made in the ongoing construction of the CAI project in the Borough. Two DRJTBC CAI construction signs were erected at both ends of the project, and a ribbon cutting ceremony is being coordinated by the CAI department for January 2008.
- 2. Smithfield, PA On October 10th a meeting was held in Smithfield Township with representatives from Penn DOT, the project electrician, the township's team leaders of this project (which included Boucher & James engineering and Simone-Collins architects), the CAI Director and the due diligence engineer. The meeting centered on the discussion of the blinking light proposal, the anti-graffiti paint on the underpass structure, and the crossing of the RR tracks. The Township engineer and the architects have done considerable amount of work to bring the project up to date with the previously adopted schedule. It is still unclear of whether an HOP is needed for some of the work being done; however, a flashing warning device permit will be required from Penn Dot. The County Rail Authority indicated that if utility power will be placed under the RR tracks, a PUC permit will be required. The Township is contemplating using solar power instead of using power lines on both sides of the underpass and off from the RR tracks. The pending schedule still remains for the project to be bid in January and to start construction in April 2008. Bi-monthly meetings were set up to review the status updates of the project.

Pennsylvania (Continued)

- 3. Delaware Water Gap, PA A meeting was held on October 2nd with the DWG to discuss the status of the projects. The project engineer is Douglas Olmstead with Boucher and James, Inc. He provided a project plan that appeared to be 80% complete. He indicated that the project cost estimates are under budget and that he will bid the two projects separately. Mr. Olmstead does not believe that an HOP is required for these projects. The CAI department engineer provided the Borough with a list of requirements they must provide answers for both projects. Boucher and James, Inc. is working on the Delaware Water Gap's projects and the adjacent Smithfield Township's project
- 4. Portland Borough, PA Contact was made with Mayor Bucci, who indicated that the Township is working with Penn DOT to obtain the HOP permit for the Park and Walk project. However, the Mayor also reported that the Fireworks Company they have been working with to acquire the land for the Park and Ride construction has still not been able to purchase the land. The Mayor said that they are still looking for an alternate site for the project. The Mayor will be speaking with another property owner in an effort to ascertain if the Park and Ride project is still a viable project.
- 5. Lower Mount Bethel, PA On 10/17/07 a meeting was held with the project team of Lower Mount Bethel Township (LMBT), the CAI director and the due diligence engineer. LMBT has provided acceptable deliverables information for its first reimbursement request for the municipality. John Mouser, the project manager presented a revised budget and contract from its engineer. According to the latest cost estimates, the Township will seek to reduce construction costs by getting donated work from the public work department. The project is now on budget and moving forward. If the municipality stays on course the project will be completed by the third quarter of 2008. The project manager is still working on obtaining the necessary permits, especially a permit from DEP. The property deed for the visitor center has not been signed; however, this project and the trail project are still in motion. The team claims that bids are about 80% complete and the engineering is about 95% complete.
- 6. Williams Township, PA The DRJTBC Engineer is reviewing the latest plans received from the Township as well as detailed cost estimates. There is an additional traffic signal added to the scope of work that was not in the initial application. The due diligence engineer will review the 3rd light application. Penn DOT is requesting additional comments in order to issue a HOP. The CAI department is waiting for a construction schedule. No significant progress has been made since the last meeting.
- 7. Easton, PA On October 23rd a meeting was held with the CAI director and the deputy executive director of operations of DRJTBC and the Mayor Phil Mitman of Easton. During the meeting a conference call was held with the Parking Authority's attorney who indicated that The City is advertising the project and that bids will be in on October 31st. They intend to award the project by the end of November as they have to hold a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) 30 days period for public comments. The attorney also indicated that they will be able to complete the project by December 31, 2008. He pointed out that even though the River Keeper group has petitioned the court for an injunction on the project that no court order has been issued by a judge. The CAI due diligence has the following concerns about the project:

- 1. Contract construction schedule is 14 months, and it will require substantial completion within 14 months, and allow 30-60 days for final cleanup/punchlist items to be completed.
- 2. If the project is awarded on November 1st, it would put substantial completion of the project at December 31, 2008, with additional time required to finalize.
- 3. Currently, the municipality still needs FTA approval for use of funds, and a public meeting is scheduled for November 5th. If everything is ok at the public meeting, it can award the contract; otherwise further delay means little or no chance of project completion on or by December 2008.

The CAI department is also waiting for the final plans, cost estimates, and a concept plan to approve before the City can move ahead with the traffic calming project. The project manager and project supervisor must provide the CAI department with the necessary information before further reimbursement requests can be approved. The City must send a letter of request which combines the bike path project and the trail projects. The Trolley project is complete for this year and a reimbursement request was submitted by the City.

- 8. Riegelsville Borough, PA A meeting with DCNR Commission was held and a permit is pending in order for the project to move ahead for bids. The CAI department received drawings for the pedestrian bridge project. The steps to the towpath have been designed to minimize the impact to both the towpath and the Saxton property. The Borough engineer is completing its E&S plan for submission to the County Conservation District which is expected to be submitted by the first week of November. Upon receiving the approval, the engineer will submit the Joint Permit Application to DEP and concurrently submit our final design drawings to DCNR at that time as well.
- 9. Solebury Township, PA Both projects are in good shape. Bucks County conservation district needs to be approved. They think that they can bid by December. The project needs official PICO approval for the park. Bridge and parking lot are in our grant as well as the trail. The organization, Friends of the Canal Park is against the project. The due diligence engineer met with the project team and got a lot more information from them. The DCNR has not given them approval for the prefab bridge. They don't need the DEP chapter 105 approval. Penn Dot permit and the right-of-way transfer are the biggest issues. Julianne Dargan completed the plan review. Solebury received Penn DOT comments. There were three received by the CAI department and are under review. The only significant change since the last report is that the Commission received a letter from Robert Sugarman, an attorney representing the Friends of the Canal Park opposing he project. A reply letter sent to them clarified that the Commission is not funding the proposed park.
- 10. New Hope Borough, PA A status report from the municipality indicated that the project bids came in over the grant amount. The CAI is asking for copies of the bids to verify the reasons for the excess amount.

Pennsylvania (Continued)

- 11. Falls Township, PA –No significant changes this month. The CAI department is still waiting for reimbursement request from them to close out the project.
- 12. Upper Makefield Township, PA The project, is expected to be advertised and awarded by Penn DOT in late October or early November. The approval of this project, which is termed by the board of the Township as the *Washington Crossing Gateway*, has two phases, the DRJTBC is funding part of Phase I. The projects need approval from Penn DOT, PHMC, and the Bucks County Conservation District. The commencement for construction is Mach 2008 with duration thru October 2008. Phase II has not been approved by Penn DOT yet and additional funding for this phase is needed.
- 13. Lower Makefield, PA –The Traffic signal project is completed and the Township is getting all the necessary paper work together for a close out. The Township has alluded that it wants to send another project application to the CAI department. The CAI department is waiting for the last reimbursement request. No significant changes have been made since the last report.
- 13. Bristol Borough, PA the Borough received its approval on the plans from Penn DOT. There is a pre-bid meeting scheduled for October. The bids for this project have not come in yet.
- 14. Yardley, PA held a meeting on October 11 with Bill Winslade of Yardley and the CAI due diligence engineer to discuss the project status. The CAI director summarized the content of the agreement and all its appendices. The project bidding process was also discussed at this meeting. The project is on schedule and should be completed on time.

New Jersey

- 1 Montague, NJ Insurance certificate matter between required by the Commission agreement was resolved and the contract agreement is in its way to be completed as adequate insurance will be provided to cover the Commission from possible liability.
- Knowlton, NJ No quarterly report yet. The due diligence will call regarding the status of their paperwork and the new project they wish to fund. The foot trail study will be done in December and the municipality may ask for funds to complete the trail. The CAI department encouraged the municipality file an application. The CAI department received a letter with copy of deed and property insurance for the property that was purchased to construct a park adjacent to the Portland Columbia pedestrian bridge. No significant changes were made during this month.
- Belvidere, NJ A meeting was held on October 15th with the Borough engineers and the president of Borough council. The Council President requested that the utilities be placed under ground and indicated that the Borough is now willing to assume jurisdiction over the portion of Water Street from the Commission and that there is no need to remove the concrete for the ROW transfer. The Borough engineer was to send a new cost estimate for the project with the new Council President's requests. As of the end of October, the CAI department had not received a new cost estimate or budget. The Borough engineer did sent an email to the CAI director

indicating that the Borough Council did not come to an agreement on the CAI project. Subsequently, the Borough engineer requested that the Commissioners award the increment of the fund with the cost estimate of the previous request with Water Street jurisdiction being transferred to the County instead of the Borough. The request has not been granted.

- Phillipsburg, NJ A meeting was held with the Town of Phillipsburg on October 15th. The engineering plans are complete; however, the Town is still working on the ROW transfer and the approval of stream encroachment and soil erosion control. The traffic signal study essentially completed, but will not be done as initially submitted. SHPO gave a verbal approval to the project. The brick cross walk and utility are still issues that need to be resolved. The Town engineer is ready to go to bids. The engineer will send the CAI department a set of plans. The engineer will have a letter of acceptance for the ROW transfer to be completed for the Town.
- Pohatcong, NJ On October 15th a meeting with the Pohatcong was held at the Easton Phillipsburg office with the Township engineer. The Township is ready to complete its plans, but is waiting for the approval of the Warren County engineer as Route 627 and 627 spur are County roads. The Township is also waiting for the soil erosion permit. The engineer is ready to go to bids in December and to start construction in April.
- Milford, NJ On October 28th, the CAI department held a meeting with the Borough engineer who provided substantially complete engineering plans. The Borough is just waiting for a signed contract from approved utilities agreement to issue bids for the relocation of the utilities. There will be 2 different contracts issued. One contract will be for utilities relocation and the other for the actual project construction.
- Frenchtown, NJ an insurance certificate and a resolution to hire Van Cleef engineering for the projects was received by the Commission in October. Bimonthly meetings will be held with the Borough to monitor the projects progress status.
- Stockton, NJ Stockton has applied for all permits and has received approval from the D&R Canal and NJDOT. Attorneys for Stockton and Commission have been conversing on right-of-way transfer issues. The Borough also received the stream encroachment permit and possible detour in PA. The DRJTBC engineer is looking at the PA side of traffic pattern during construction. The Borough now wants to buy the parcel owned by the Rail Road station Deli to make it a parking lot. There will be an increase construction cost due to permit requirement from SHPO and the NJ DOT. The Borough's engineer will send the CAI department an explanation on the additional cost and reason for increase. The only issue the engineers are now dealing with is the MPT that may affect traffic flow across the bridge and in Pennsylvania.
- Lambertville, NJ Mt. Hope St. project is complete; Ferry St. project has made great progress and is on scheduled to be completed by the beginning of November. The CAI is working on a ribbon cutting ceremony for November 19th. The mapping for Quary Street and Swan Street is complete and the George St. plan is moving along, and the Traffic Calming project pans are also near completion and getting ready to go to bids in the December. The City is contemplating submitting another grant application for the re-pavement of approximately 50 feet on Klein Street that was not paved with the Ferry Street project.

New Jersey (Continued)

- Ewing, NJ Agreement will be reviewed to rescind original grant. The CAI department is waiting for a new application to rehabilitate several county bridges. Nothing has been received to date. No change since the last report.
- 11 Trenton, NJ —. The final plans are completed and NJDOT indicated that the project is actually under budget as an \$800,000 retaining wall that was to be completed was deleted from the final plans. The agreement between the City of Trenton and the NJ DOT has not been completed due to disagreements on several terms of the contract. NJDOT is looking to order bids by December 2007, but the project completion is now pushed back to about June 2009. A letter was sent by the Commission Executive Director to set up a meeting with Mayor of the City of Trenton and the Commissioner of NJDOT to resolve this issue. The CAI director also attended a meeting at NJDOT with the Commission engineering representative and the Director and Assistant Director of the Community Affairs department to discuss the effect on the reconstruction of Rt. 29 in Trenton.
- Morrisville, PA The first reimbursement request has been completed and paid. The traffic impact with work on West Bridge Street is being reviewed by the DRJTBC engineering department. The Borough engineer is getting ready to complete the plans for the West Bridge Street project and go out to bids. It is pending Commission's engineering comments.
- 13. Delaware Twp., NJ These projects were completed during September. The CAI department is waiting for a report from the Township engineer as there has not been any reimbursement requests submitted to date. The Township needs to justify the payments and the payment tickets. Coring will be used as the construction work was completed by the Township public works department. The only significant change was that the application submitted by the Township for a repair project on Lower Creek Road was not approved.
- 14. Hopewell, NJ the new grant application submitted by the Township for \$645,390 was approved for funding by the Commissioners at their October meeting. Project includes an ADA ramp, a side walk and parking at the Washington Crossing Park area.
- 15. West Amwell, NJ The base plans are complete and the engineer is working on preliminary plans. The new application submitted by the municipality is still pending consideration by the Commissioners.
- 16. Holland Township in October, the CAI department met with the Township and discussed the terms of the contract agreement and its appendices. The CAI department is expecting a signed agreement to be delivered by the Township.
