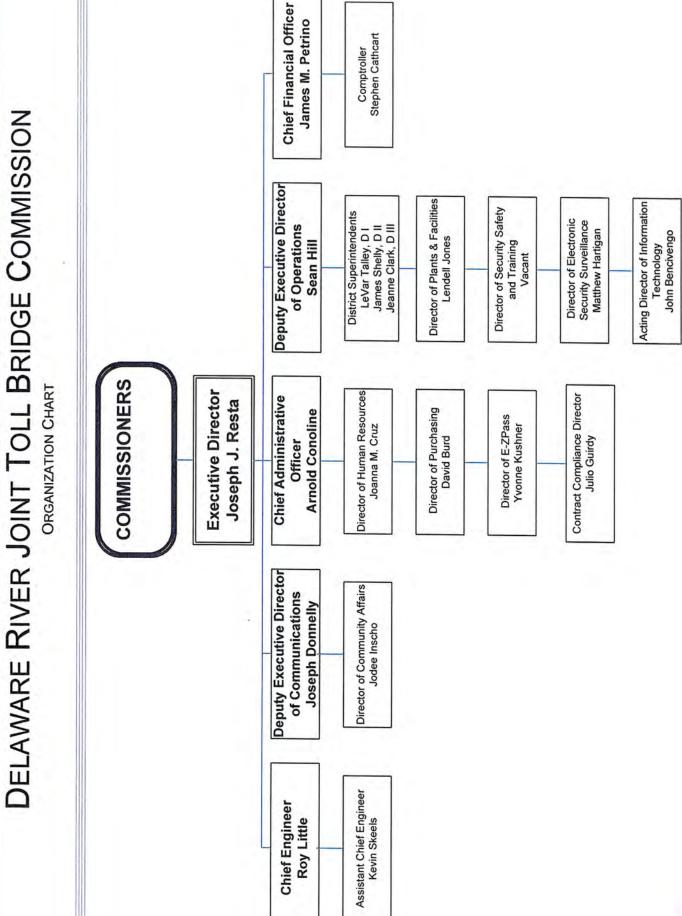

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"While we are nearing the countdown mode to the end of 2016, today's meeting promises to set the framework for the Commission's anticipated activities in 2017

"Front and center is the 2017 operating budget. This fiscal plan reflects a modest increase over 2016 expenditures and is reflective of the Commission's needs for next year. Our next 2017-2018 capital plan also is on today's agenda. As with prior capital plans, this one budgets the funds to carry out our various construction projects and capital purchases; it is the blueprint for our Engineering Department's activities. The various design and construction contracts for

individual projects will still require review and consent by Commissioners in specific resolution votes. Both the operating and capital budgets are the culmination of months of preparation and review by staff and Commissioners. There are a lot of people to credit, but I particularly want to acknowledge the Accounting Department for compiling the operating budget and making all the refinements that arose during the review process. On the capital budget, I would like to acknowledge the Engineering Department for its efforts on the Capital Plan and Program. Finally, I want to thank the Commissioners for their attention and hard work in this budget cycle. Our Commissioners serve without compensation and it takes an extraordinary amount of time on their part to pour over the various budget iterations, the corresponding spread sheets, and the array of back-up documents.

"As previously mentioned, passage of the new capital plan further positions us to keep moving the Scudder Falls project forward, several other preparatory milestones still need to be passed before major construction begins. First and foremost, we still need to complete the procurement process for a project contractor. The bid submittal date has been extended to January 10 and we remain optimistic of a highly competitive outcome. We also need to complete the process for securing project financing. In the wake of the January 10 date for opening bids, we will be setting a schedule for issuance and sale of bonds to carry out the project. This will consist of dates to provide information to investor community, as well as set the pricing of the bonds and finally close out the financial transaction. We and the finance team remain committed to completing this process in the soonest possible timeframe and be best prepared to conduct the bond sale under favorable market conditions. Meanwhile, out in the field, advance project activities continue to move along. The Stage 2 tree cutting work along the immediate New Jersey and Pennsylvania approaches reached substantial completion as scheduled on Friday. Over the next three weeks, we expect the contractor to complete a series of punch-list tasks such as repairing silt fencing and filtration socks, general cleanup and stabilization of cleared areas, final completion is anticipated January 6. A separate advance contract for the installation of noise walls at warranted areas of the Pennsylvania I-95 also remains underway. This work currently involves the fabrication and installation of posts and panels, with anticipated substantial completion in early May and final completion in June. The one remaining significant advance activity concerns the installation of a peregrine falcon proto- nest on an island upstream of the bridge. We are in the process of obtaining a variety of permits from state and federal agencies to advance this work once river levels rise to normal levels after the region's recent drought. Our overriding goal both behind the scenes and out in the field is to get all of various preparatory task completed so the main construction project can be fully underway during the first half of 2017.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of December 19, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (November, 2016)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for November 2016 in comparison to the November 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of November.

Analysis of November 2016 / November 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 5.00 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 6.08 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 2.06 percent increase.

Analysis of November 2016 / November 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 70,599 vehicles, or 2.16 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 27,421 vehicles, or 6.25 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 43,178 vehicles, or 1.52 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for November 2016 was 111,373 total vehicles as compared to 109,019 total vehicles in November 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for November 2016 increased by 32,972 vehicles, or 1.30 percent as compared to November 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for November 2016 was 85,460 vehicles as compared to 84,361 in November 2015.

Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 3.35 percent increase through eleven months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 0.71 percent increase for the first eleven months of 2016 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) reflected a 3.96 percent increase for November 2016 as the result of increases of 24,420 cars and 3,672 trucks when compared to November 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), the decrease of 4,256 cars and the increase of 410 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 2.29 percent for November 2016 as compared to November 2015.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 2.21 percent in total toll traffic for the month of November 2016 compared to November 2015 as the result of increases of 6,919 cars and 14,812 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 9,857 cars and 1,349 trucks combined to generate an increase of 2.60 percent in total toll traffic for November 2016.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 3.75 percent increase in total toll traffic during November 2016 as the result of increases of 3,625 automobiles and 127 trucks when compared to November 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the combined increases of 4,482 cars and 6,923 trucks generated an increase of 1.47 percent in total toll traffic for November 2016 as compared to November 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), the decrease of 1,869 passenger vehicles and the increase of 128 trucks produced a 1.68 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of November 2016.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of November, 2016 and November, 2015, and the year-to-date periods ending November 30, 2016 and November 30, 2015.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of November 2016 and the eleven month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2016 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,849,760 for the month of November. For the 2016 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$50,756,469 or 89.1% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Currently, EZPass operating expense is running \$343,343 above the year-to-date operating line budget. This increase is mainly due to larger than anticipated increases in EZPass traffic.

There were no unusual expenses or charges during the month.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

November 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of November, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 67 purchase orders in the total amount of \$378,914.37. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 41 price inquiries were sent out for 13 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.15 per order (41/13=3.15).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of November 2016 are shown below:

- Five (5) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$133,773.50, for banking equipment upgrades at Commission Facilities.
- Three (3) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$96,539.98, at the request of the IT Department, for the Commission's software renewal needs.
- Four (4) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$68,198.00, for guide rail repairs/replacements at Commission Facilities.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$5,503.71, for a fence screening project off I-95 in New Jersey.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. Xerox provided a list of existing equipment that will be removed from the lanes as the new electronic toll collection system is installed. This list may be shared with other IAG agencies to see if there is a need for this equipment after we replenish our spare parts inventory. Commission staff is working with Xerox to determine where to store the existing toll equipment as it is removed from the lanes.
- 3. TransCore is revising the engineering design package, Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments. TransCore continues to facilitate biweekly project status meetings and we will transition to weekly meetings during the installation phase of the project.
- 4. TransCore continues completed the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge open road tolling (ORT) and the Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore also completing the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge. They are now working to address the puch list items.
- 5. Advanced system installation work was completed at the Milford-Montague and Portland-Columbia Toll Bridges. This included the removal of the existing treadle frame and placing a new concrete roadway slab in each of the toll lanes. To minimize lane down time, an accelerated concrete was used. Once the concrete reached the allowable strength to open the lane to traffic, TransCore is installed temporary surface mounted treadle strips that work with the legacy electronic toll system to return the lane to operation.
- 6. TransCore and Commission Staff conducted a one day lane opening with the new system at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge, Lane 2. This soft opening allowed Commission Staff to work directly with the system and gain firsthand

experience. TransCore is addressing items that were observed during this soft opening.

- 7. Transitioning of Lane 1 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge is underway.
- 8. Training for the Toll Collectors, Officers-in-Charge, Bankers, Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent from District 3 is underway. Additionally, access to the electronic toll collection system has been provided to all necessary Commission Staff.

Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC was expected to go live in February 2017, this date was changed to June 2017.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee meeting and Policy Committee meetings.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-ZPass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.

IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

The Contract Compliance Program and IBE Target of 25% of the total Commission's contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of twenty-eight (28) contracts, including four (4) Task Order Agreements with the new IBE program requirements.

STATUS UPDATES

The Contract Compliance Department researched firms from which the Commission can obtain quotes to provide a cloud-based system that would be able to provide dual services for Prevailing Wage/Certified Payrolls and Payments Verification for construction and consulting contracts participating in Identified Business Enterprise (IBE) program managed by the CCD staff. Following the identification of appropriate national firms that met the needs of the CCD, three firms were shortlisted by a technical evaluation committee, and through the Purchasing Department a Request for Quotation (RFQ) was sent to them.

In the month of December, the CCD will be ready to present a resolution to the Commission with the chosen firm that best meets the needs of the CCD to manage the compliance of the Commission's contracts.

The CCD continues to work with other Commission departments in assuring that the construction and professional services firms are working on meeting or exceeding the required 25% targets of the Commission's IBE program.

B2GNOW CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL REPORTING SYSTEMS

Although, the CCD continues to manage and audit the payments verification of the engineering consulting firms through the services of the B2GNOW system, this firm was advised that as of the end of their contract, on December 31, 2016, the Commission will no longer utilized its services. As indicated above, these services will be obtained with the same firm that the commission contract for Prevailing Wage/Certified Payroll system.

The three reports provided below are generated using B2GNOW. These reports are: (1) the Compliance Overview Report, (2) the Primes and Subs on Active Contracts Report, and (3) the IBE Quarterly Report. These reports provide significant amount of information pertaining to the types of certified IBEs being subcontracted by the Prime firms with commission contract awards. The reports illustrate demographic and other pertinent information of each subconsultant, including: gender, ethnicity, and payments compared to the 25% Commission target.

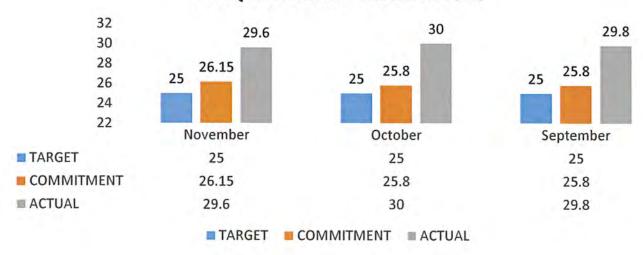

The following Community Affairs activity took place during November:

Scudder Falls Public Involvement

Participated in Public Involvement Plan status meeting with Commission and McCormick-Taylor staff, focusing on the project website and upcoming focus groups.

Assisted in review and response to messages received via the Commission and Scudder Falls project websites, as appropriate. The focus of the messages remain construction related. There have been several questions about the noise walls, regarding their locations and installation schedule. A Ewing resident has expressed ongoing concern about the removal of trees creating a safety issue. Working with Engineer Chris Rood to identify the merits of the concerns and will be contacting NJ Department of Transportation if warranted.

Easton-Phillipsburg Special Events

The number and size of special events and festivals in Easton is a challenge for traffic at the Northampton Street Bridge and its approaches. District Superintendent Shelley and Assistant Superintendent Brown have established communication with the police departments in both cities. I will be reaching out to festival organizers to offer assistance and request that the Commission receive more advance notice of future events.

Riverton-Belvidere

The critical member strengthening project is complete. All affected agencies were notified of such. There was no feedback about the lane closures during the course of the project.

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT FINAL DESIGN SERVICES

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (MB) of Hamilton New Jersey submitted final contract bid documents for Contract T-668A that were posted for bid on September 13, 2016. The Pre-Bid Meeting for Contract T-668A was held on September 27, 2016. During the month of November the Baker Team was involved in preparing responses to contractor inquiries and three addenda for Contract T-668A: Addendum No. 4 issued on November 4, 2016; Addendum No. 7 issued on November 22, 2016 and Addendum No. 8 to be issued on December 2, 2016. Baker also continued to coordinate with the various utility companies to finalize the necessary utility relocation agreements for the project.

As part of the ongoing permit acquisition process, Baker continued to coordinate with the D&R Canal Commission, NJSHPO and NJDEP on the various permit application submittals. The Baker Team continued to respond to contractor Requests for Information (RFI) and submittals associated with Contract T-666A, SFB Project PA Noise Walls Construction, and Contract T-667A SFB Advanced Tree Clearing contract.

DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition – one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction, as well as the USACE Permit application package. These three (3) permit application packages were submitted earlier in the year. The DMC continues to work with each of these agencies to address any comments and concerns related to the applications. The USACE issued a 30-day Public Notice for comments on the Commission's USACE application on October 18, 2016. The public notice period ended November 29, 2016. A Field Meeting is being scheduled with the various environmental agencies to inspect the proposed PA Wetlands Mitigation Site and discuss comments received during the public comment period related to the design of the wetlands site.

Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (ROW impacts by the SFB project) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. The Commissioners at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the MOU for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility on behalf of the Commission. The Commission is awaiting the final MOU from the NJDEP – Green Acres for signature.

The ROW acquisition process continued during November, which included coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date, in Pennsylvania, the Commission has purchased the full properties at 1140 Woodside Road and 185 River Road, which are not required for construction; and, at 1149 Woodside Road, which is required for construction. In Pennsylvania, the Commission has also purchased partial easements from Lower Makefield Township; Lower Makefield Farmland Preservation; and from the Commonwealth of PA for the I-95 crossing over the PA Delaware Canal; all of which are required for construction. In November the Commission completed the purchase of the 10-acre property at 1199 Woodside Road, which currently hosts the I-95 Par-and-Ride lot, from Lower Makefield Township; and the adjacent, contiguous property at 1167 Woodside Road. The home will be occupied by the former owner, under a lease agreement with the Commission, until January 31, 2017. The purchase of 1199 Woodside Road is required for the Commission's near future District I Administration Building. The 1167 Parcel purchase will allow the Commission to make a direct connection from the future I-295 Park-and-Ride lot to the existing Delaware Canal park system. This connection will accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists, and meets the stipulation for same set forth in the Agreement of Sale with LMT for the 1199 Woodside Road Property. In New Jersey condemnation paperwork was submitted for a partial taking in NJ at 201 River Road, Washington Crossing, Pennsylvania.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DMC Staff continue to provide Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. The contractor remobilized in September and began Phase 2 of the tree clearing work in early October. The Phase 2 work is scheduled to be substantially complete by December 16, 2016.

The DMC continues to assist the Commission with the Responses to Contractor Inquiries and the preparation of Addenda for Contract T-668A. In addition, ongoing coordination continued with the Baker Team and the various utility companies regarding the Utility Relocation Agreements in Pennsylvania. Utility Relocation Agreements have been fully executed with Verizon PA, Comcast PA, Sunesys, and PECO Electric. Updated costs were submitted by PECO Gas for their required utility work along with a draft Service Agreement that is currently being reviewed. Due to complications on NJDOT's end in being able to develop agreements with the NJ utility companies, the Commission is moving forward in negotiating and entering into separate agreements with PSE&G and Comcast NJ for their required utility relocation work on the NJ side of the Project.

The RFP for the Construction Inspection (CI) Services associated with the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project was posted on November 1, 2016. Three (3) separate CI contracts will be procured under this one RFP solicitation. The Pre-Proposal Meeting was held on November 17, 2016 with twenty (20) consultants in attendance. Proposals are due on December 14, 2016. Authorization to Negotiate is scheduled for the January 30, 2017 Commission Meeting, with award of contract scheduled for the February 27, 2017 Commission Meeting.

DMC ADVANCED ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR PRIORITY ITEMS OF WORK

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2D

All of the remaining DMC environmental activities are now being completed under Task Order Assignment C-502A-2G. This Task Order Assignment remains open for any Right-of-Way (ROW) technical support that is needed as part of the ROW acquisition process for the project

Greenman Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) of Lebanon, NJ was awarded this contract at the February 29, 2016 Commissioners' Meeting; and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective March 18, 2016.

During November GPI's CM tasks continued with GPI scheduling and holding the Contract T-666A's Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and scheduling and holding Pre-Construction Activity Meetings as required. GPI continued to handle the processing of submittals, correspondence and Requests for Information from the T-666A Contractor. GPI, through their safety sub consultant, Safegate, continued to perform bi- weekly safety inspections of the contractor's work; and, through their material inspection sub consultant, Key Tech, continued to perform quality assurance inspections of the noise walls post and panel at the fabricator shop. GPI also developed the contractor's monthly pay estimate for Commission processing; and, continued oversight and coordination of the inspection efforts of the CI Consultant, Jacobs Engineering Group.

PKF-MARK III, Inc. (PKF) of Newtown, PA was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's May 2016 Meeting, and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective June 10, 2016.

During November, PKF continued to maintain the construction access routes from I-95 into and along the various Noise Wall locations; continued drainage installation; continued with the bird netting installation on the Main River Bridge; completed the noise wall drilled caisson foundations installation; continued setting noise wall posts and panels, which are being fabricated off site by their fabricator, Faddis; and, continued grading along the finished wall sections. PKF participated in the Bi-Weekly Schedule Update and Progress Meetings and any Pre-Construction Activity Meetings held. PKF continued to submit shop drawings and Requests for Information (RFI's) for review and approval.

Construction Company, Inc. (AP) was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's November 2015 Meeting and was issued a Notice to Proceed effective December 23, 2015.

AP completed all tree clearing in Stage 1 reaching Substantial Completion on April 6, 2016 and Stage 1 Final Completion on April 11, 2016.

AP continued with the Stage 2 phase of this project by completing the installation of the Rock Construction Entrances (RCE) and continued the silt fence installation and tree clearing during the month of November. AP, along with their subcontractor, Colonial Tree Services, cleared trees with multiple crews in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Two progress meetings were held in November.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-677A

Sparwick Contracting, Inc. (SCI) completed all deck repairs and roadway striping by September 8, 2015. SCI is now in their second year of their on-call and emergency spall repairs phase of the contract on an as-needed basis, as part of their construction contract. This contract includes an optional call-back period ending in November 2018.

I-78 TOLL BRIDGE MAINTENANCE GARAGE PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-508A

This contract is for Preliminary, Final and Post-Design Services for renovations and expansion at the I-78 Maintenance Garage as identified under a Task Order Assignment for Space Utilization Program and Concept Study provided by Buchart Horn, Inc. / BASCO Associates.

Burns Engineering Inc. (BE) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015, Final Design Submission and Bid Set were received on April 5, 2016, Bids were open on May 10th, reviewed by the Consultant, Commission Counsels and Contract Compliance and a Construction Contract Award was made at the June 2016 Regular Monthly Commission Meeting.

Consultant is currently providing Post Design services, reviewing Contractor's Request for Information, submittals, issuing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, and attending Bi-Weekly Progress Meetings.

CODE COMPLIANCE PLAN REVIEW AND INSPECTIONS Task Order Assignment No. C-696A-1

Utilizing the Commission's current Facilities Task Order Agreement with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson (JMT), this Task Order Assignment is to provide Code Plan Reviews, and Code Compliance Inspections on as needed basis for the I-78 Maintenance Garage Expansion Project. Said services will be provided by a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry (PA L&I) Certified Third-Party Agency in the appropriate building trade categories and in accordance with the current Uniform Construction Code Inspection Procedures UCC-9.

Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JMT on February 25, 2016, and the Consultant provided Peer and Code Plan reviews of the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended the pre-final design submission review meeting, reviewed and certified the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Consultant attended Construction Kick-Off meeting on July 12, and is currently attending periodic construction progress meeting and providing UCC inspections.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES CM-508A

This contract is for Construction Management (CM) Services in connection with the renovations and expansion of I-78 Maintenance Garage Project. As part of the CM services the Consultant scope of work includes Constructability Review of the Bid Documents during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A.

STV Inc. (STV) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective March 1, 2016. A meeting was held with the Consultant on March 2nd to review the Commission's expectations of the consultant's services during the Pre-Construction phase of T-508A. Constructability Review was provided by the Consultant on the Pre-Final Design Submission, attended its design review meeting on March 21, and reviewed the Final Design Submission to confirm all comments have been addressed.

STV attended the Pre-Construction Meeting on July 12, and is currently conducting bi-weekly progress meetings along with processing Architectural Supplementary Instructions, Contractor's Submittals and Request for Information as part of providing construction management services.

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-508A

Bracy Construction Inc., was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's June 2016 Meeting. Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed letter was issued effective June 28, 2016. Pre-Construction Meeting was held on July 12th and a Notice to Proceed effective date of July 25th was issued in accordance with the Contract Specifications.

Contractor completed set-up of the field trailers and temporary facilities, set-up Erosion and Sediment Controls in accordance with the County Conservation District's approved permit, started the demolition activities for Phases 1 & 2 of the Project. Construction is currently near substantial completion of Phase 1 as relates to the Commission's salt, brine & magnesium chloride operation. Construction is also focused on the installation of all underground utilities as well as Phase 2 new building footings and foundation walls construction.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

I-78 BRIDGES AND APPROACH SLAB REHABILITATION

DESIGN Contract No. C-644A

Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) was awarded this design contract at the Commission's February 2016 Meeting. Notice of Award/Limited Notice to Proceed was issued effective March 1, 2016 and a full Notice to Proceed was issued effective May 3, 2016 with the approval of their Insurance. This design project is for the repair of various bridge, pavement and other miscellaneous deficiencies associated with the 13 bridges and approach roadways located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction on I-78.

GF participated in one (1) progress meeting during the month of November and continued developing the base plans and specifications for the pre-final design submission during this period. GF participated in the I-78 toll plaza merge restriping meeting under Task Order Assignment No. C-628A-8presented by Malick & Scherer. GF will provide a review of the final merge restriping plans and incorporate the restriping plan sheets into the final C-644A design plans.

RESTRIPING OF THE MERGE LANES EXITING THE I-78 TOLL PLAZA

DESIGN Task Order Agreement Contract No. C-628A-8

Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (DE), through a standing Consultant Engineer Agreement, was requested to provide Engineering Services to design modifications to the existing striping of the merge area west of the I-78 westbound toll plaza. DE was requested to utilize Malick & Scherer, PC. (M&S) for this design effort due to their current involvement as a sub-consultant to Gannett Fleming on the C-644A I-78 Bridges and Approach Slab Rehabilitation Project, including the restriping of the entire I-78 mainline. The purpose of this restriping design is to provide dedicated through lanes for the two left ORT E-Z Pass lanes continue after the toll plaza, and have the four right toll lanes merge with the right high speed lane in the vicinity of the Morgan Hill Road interchange.

Notice to Proceed for this Task Order Assignment was issued effective November 1, 2016. M&S conducted traffic counts on the PA Visitors Center exit ramp and I-78 exit ramp to Morgan Hill Rd. during the first week in November; did a sign inventory; summarized their findings including the traffic data provided by the Commission through the toll lanes; evaluated the operational characteristics of the existing geometry and provided two proposed alternatives at a meeting with the Commission on November 21, 2016. M&S is moving forward with the plan development of one of the design alternatives with modifications.

RIVERTON-BELVIDERE TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE CRITICAL MEMBERS STRENGTHENING

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-650A

Road-Con, Inc. of West Chester, PA continued to provide construction services associated with the Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported Bridge Critical Member Strengthening project.

Work involved rivet replacement and heat straightening as well as slope stabilization work on both the Pennsylvania and New Jersey approaches while traffic operates under the condition of single-lane alternating traffic.

Field work was substantially completed on November 3, 2016.

DESIGN Contract No. C-650A

Ammann & Whitney continues to provide post design services in support of the construction phase of the Riverton-Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge Critical Members Strengthening (Contract TS-650A) project.

Activities included responding to RFI's, review / approval of construction contractor submissions and preparing project closeout documentation.

APPROACH SLOPE STABILIZATION

DESIGN Task Order Assignment No. C-628A-3

Dewberry Engineers continues to provide post design services in support of the construction phase of the storm water treatment and slope stabilization facilities portions of the Riverton-Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge Critical Members Strengthening (Contract TS-650A) project.

Activities included responding to RFI's and review / approval of construction contractor submissions and preparing project closeout documentation..

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE / DETECTION SYSTEM

ESS MAINTENANCE CONTRACT Contract No. DB-575A

Schneider Electric Building Americas, Inc. continues to provide maintenance services in support of the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System under the direction of the Commission's Electronic Security and Surveillance Staff, who operate the system from the Primary Control Center located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, New Jersey.

WIRELESS VIDEO NETWORK SPECIFICATION AND PEER REVIEW Contract No. C-621A-5

Sentinel Consulting has provided a revised design-build type performance specifications document as part of plans to upgrade the wireless communication system at the I-78/611 site to address current and future needs.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM

DESIGN-BUILD Contract No. DB-427

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

Xerox provided a list of existing equipment that will be removed from the lanes as the new electronic toll collection system is installed. This list may be shared with other IAG agencies to see if there is a need for this equipment after we replenish our spare parts inventory. Commission staff is working with Xerox to determine where to store the existing toll equipment as it is removed from the lanes.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DB-584

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC was expected to go live in February 2017, this date was changed to June 2017.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

All sites (toll and toll supported bridges) were installed by Commission Staff with assistance from Signal Service. Signal Service will revisit each site to conduct manual traffic counts and compare them to the traffic counter. Once all sites are calibrated and sending data to the server, the server will be relocated the Commission's administration building and installed.

Signal Service submitted the draft reports that will be produced by the new system and they were reviewed by Commission Staff. Signal Service is addressing the review comments.

DISTRICT 2 & 3 PHASE 1 TOLL COLLECTION COUNTING FACILITIES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th,2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's

comments with the Consultant. Advanced footings and foundation design package is expected to be finalized by middle of December.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended bi-weekly status meetings and the Onsite First Article Testing (OFAT) at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge and New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. RK&K reviewed the engineering plans, compiled a punch list from testing, and developed next steps for the transition of the lanes.

DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore is revising the engineering design package, Disaster Recovery Plan and the Maintenance Plan to address review comments. TransCore continues to facilitate bi-weekly project status meetings and we will transition to weekly meetings during the installation phase of the project.

TransCore continues completed the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge open road tolling (ORT) and the Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore also completing the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. They are now working to address the puch list items.

Advanced system installation work was completed at the Milford-Montague and Portland-Columbia Toll Bridges. This included the removal of the existing treadle frame and placing a new concrete roadway slab in each of the toll lanes. To minimize lane down time, an accelerated concrete was used. Once the concrete reached the allowable strength to open the lane to traffic, TransCore is installed temporary surface mounted treadle strips that work with the legacy electronic toll system to return the lane to operation.

TransCore and Commission Staff conducted a one day lane opening with the new system at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge, Lane 2. This soft opening allowed Commission Staff to work directly with the system and gain firsthand experience. TransCore is addressing items that were observed during this soft opening.

Transitioning of Lane 1 at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge is underway.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Training for the Toll Collectors, Officers-in-Charge, Bankers, Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent from District 3 is underway. Additionally, access to the electronic toll collection system has been provided to all necessary Commission

IMPLEMENTATION CM Task Order Assignment No. C-701A-1

RK&K is providing on-site construction inspection/management services for the replacement of the electronic toll collection system. Services provided included inspection of the concrete roadway slab replacements at the Milford-Montague, Portland-Columbia and New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridges. Review of concrete specifications, placement, and cylinder breaks is on-going.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLANDCOLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES

Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

RK&K and responded to a request for information from TransCore regarding the installation and programming of the Daktronics LED signs to be installed over each toll lane at the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges.

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

STUDY FOR SELECT VEHICULAR BRIDGES Contract No. C-556A

Pennoni Associates submitted their final report outlining opportunities for implementation of structural health monitoring as well as overweight / oversized vehicle detection, deterrence and enforcement through the long term application of sensor type technologies together with a data acquisition / reporting system to function as an integrated Bridge Monitoring System.

The Commission is currently evaluating the recommendation to recommission the monitoring equipment at New Hope-Lambertville and Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported bridges.

DECEMBER 19, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Since the final toll rate schedule for the Scudder Falls Bridge was accepted at the September 2016 Commission Meeting, Jacobs Engineering submitted a draft updated traffic and revenue forecast report and review is underway.

BUILDINGS & FACILITIES ENERGY CONSERVATION MEASURES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-657A-3

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with Joseph Jingoli & Son, Inc. (JJS), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to implement the Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) identified in an ASHRAE Level 3 Energy Audit prepared under Task Oder Assignment No. C-657A-1 at all of the Commission's seven (7) Toll Bridge facilities.

A Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JJS on November 21, 2016, record room site visits, and field surveys are expected to be conducted during the month of December.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2016 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS

C-684A (RFM/RWL)

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering and CWA.

Bridge and Facility Inspections have been completed at the toll-supported bridges. Inspection of Scudder Falls was completed during the third week of August, after the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle (no Falcons were nesting on the bridge this year).

CWA submitted the draft Maintenance Report on September 9. Review meetings were held with District 1 Operations & Maintenance staff on September 30 in Morrisville and Districts 2 & 3 Operations & Maintenance Staff on September 28 in Phillipsburg. CWA is currently revising the Maintenance Report based on comments received during these meetings.

CWA submitted the Draft Annual Inspection report on September 30 and it is currently under review by Engineering Staff.

CWA will be required to update the PennDOT BMS and NJDOT Combis system for each of the scheduled bridges within 30 days of the completion of the field inspection of each bridge. CWA updated the PennDOT BMS2 with rating information from the Underwater Inspections in Districts 1, 2 & 3.

Sign retroreflectivity testing was performed for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in October.

UNDERWATER INSPECTIONS

2016 UNDERWATER INSPECTION OF THE TOLL AND TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGES - DISTRICT 1 Task Order Assignment C-628A-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (Dewberry), is providing underwater inspection services at all of the Commission's main river bridges in District 1, except the Scudder Falls Toll Supported Bridge. Notice to proceed was given on July 15, 2016. A kick-off meeting was held on July 22, 2016. Inspections of all the District 1 bridges (except Scudder Falls – which is due in 2017) were completed between August 2 and August 31. Dewberry performed follow-up site visits at all the bridges on November 2. Dewberry has submitted a draft final report to the Commission and it is under review by Engineering staff.

Berger has submitted draft underwater inspection reports for all bridges and they have been reviewed and comments have been provided by Engineering staff to Berger. Berger is compiling a draft of the final report.

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued working to complete the radio upgrade. All the old radios have been collected and plans are underway for the installation of the new base station radios. Furthermore, the Commission, N.J. State Police, Motorola and American Towers continue to discuss the best way to complete the microwave portion of the upgrade.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues. The annual door and lock maintenance was completed at all the toll bridge facilities and toll supported bridge shelters.
- In November 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees. ESS personnel also received permission from the New Jersey State Police to issue essential Commission employees State of New Jersey, Office of Emergency Management, Essential Employee badges. These badges would be utilized during a state of emergency or other times when free movement on highways are restricted.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Transcore to develop the new toll swipe card(s) that will operate the new toll system.
- During the month of November 2016, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employees and contractor cards.

Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.

 Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of November 2016, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management system. Recently it was learned that the Genetec video management system also has features similar to a Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System. Efforts are being made to explore this further in an attempt to prevent the Commission from having to buy a separate CAD program for the Primary Control Center.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. Schneider Electric and the Commission have identified suitable cameras for this location and Schneider Electric is exploring installation options.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued working with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. Traffic cameras at the Calhoun Street, Washington Crossing, and New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridges have been upgraded and have greatly enhanced the viewing capabilities of the Primary Control Center and Bridge Monitors.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Purchasing to implement the new Comcast communications network.

- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.
- The ESS Primary Control Center continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed twenty video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video" Report for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On November 3, 2016, ESS personnel attended the DRJTBC Staff Meeting and held an ESS Departmental Meeting.
- On November 9, 2016, the ESS Department facilitated a Snow Operations meeting with District personnel.
- On November 14, 2016, ESS personnel facilitated a meeting with the Districts to enhance the current Incident Report.
- During the month of November the ESS Department conducted several tours of the Primary Control Center for Commission employees.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Operations and Engineering to develop new toll and banking facilities that will afford the Commission and its employees more security and protection from theft.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel continued to coordinate the effort to design and purchase a new vehicle for the Motorist Assistance Program (MAP). Currently the Commission has met with three vendors and are working with a graphic designer to come up with a color scheme.
- During the month of November 2016, ESS personnel assisted Human Resources and the Districts with various internal issues, investigations, and terminations.
