ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

As everyone probably knows, today is Halloween, for the Commission, though, this day falls during a period of readiness, planning, and year-end accomplishment. Our Administrative, Operations and Maintenance forces are hard at work preparing for the upcoming winter travel season. Our engineering department is wrapping up this year's construction season while setting the groundwork for several 2017 project kickoffs. Our financial personnel are fully engaged in budget preparations and a new bond offering for the Commission's next major project. Meanwhile, as this meeting will attest, the Board of Commissioners has its set of tasks to perform during this transitional period.

The stepped-up pace of current activities is perhaps most evident in the area of our Scudder Falls Bridge. Following the close of the Indiana bat foraging season on October 1, stage 2 tree cutting work is now fully underway on both the New Jersey and Pennsylvania sides of the bridge. The tree removal is dramatically changing the landscape in the vicinity of River and Woodside roads in Pennsylvania, giving the public a glimpse of the scale and scope of the upcoming bridge replacement project. Another advance construction activity currently changing the landscape is

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the installation of noise walls along the bridge's Pennsylvania I-95 approach. Work crews are now setting uprights and noise-abatement panels on a daily basis. As part of this advance noise wall contract, netting also is being installed beneath the current Scudder Falls Bridge to prevent bird nesting once the bridge replacement project begins next year. This work began in mid-October and should wrap up within two weeks. Unrelated to the tree-cutting and noise wall activities, utility relocation is in the process of getting underway. This work involves a variety of natural gas, electric, and telecommunications lines in the vicinity of the current bridge and the nearby Taylorsville Road Interchange in Pennsylvania. Various preparations for the upcoming bridge replacement project are taking place behind the scenes as well. Our engineers and consultants are pushing to secure general construction permits from the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Departments of Environmental Protection and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. We're also working under established agreements with the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Departments of Transportation so we can carry out upcoming construction activities along their roadways and facilities. Additionally, we're attempting to wrap up the permit process for the access ramp that will connect New Jersey's Delaware and Raritan Canal towpath to the new bridge's bike-ped path. This particular permit-acquisition process is complex and involves three separate agencies: the New Jersey DEP, the New Jersey DOT, and the Trenton Water and Sewer Authority. Looking ahead, we plan to install a peregrine falcon nesting box on an island a half mile upriver of the current Scudder Falls Bridge during November. A 16-inch-diameter, 30-foot-high steel pole is to be installed on the island to support the nesting box, enabling falcon eggs and nestlings to be safe from potential predators like cats and foxes. To do this work, we are in the process of acquiring the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission's permission to use its river-access ramp south of the Scudder Falls Bridge as a construction launch area. If all goes as planned, the contractor could have the falcon facility installed by Thanksgiving. There are two action items on today's executive agenda that will allow us to further prepare for the upcoming Scudder Falls Replacement Project. One is a proposed contract award for an engineering consulting firm to provide construction management services for the replacement project. This professional services procurement involves a variety of oversight tasks, including establishing and monitoring the project schedule and construction progress, reviewing shop drawings and administering invoicing and payments. The winning firm also will supervise the network of field inspectors we intend to bring on board to oversee the project's numerous construction tasks. The other related action item for Commissioners' consideration today involves the appointment of the various professional firms that will serve as part of the underwriting syndicate for the anticipated bond issue to finance the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. As all of these endeavors demonstrate, we continue to advance this project so that we might begin construction during the first half of 2017.

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Turning to matters not related to Scudder Falls, we are now entering the time of year when budget reviews become a primary focus of attention. Draft copies of the 2017 operating and capital budgets will be made available to Commissioners after today's meeting. These materials are voluminous. It takes an extraordinary amount of time and effort on the part of Commissioners to review the budgets and corresponding support documents. They deserve credit for conducting their fiduciary responsibilities on a volunteer basis without any measure of compensation. We truly appreciate their efforts performed in the spirit of public service.

Before I close today's remarks, I want to recognize a former employee, Richard McClellan, who served as the Commission's Director of Community Affairs until May of last year. Rich passed away two weeks ago after a brief illness. For seven years, he was the Commission's point person with host communities, local residents and elected officials. In this capacity, Rich played an important role in the successful execution and completion of Commission capital project and service improvements. It is with sincere regret that we extend our condolences to his family and many friends.

COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONER LAURENTI

Commissioner Laurenti addressed the meeting and said

"I would like to pay particular tribute to Rich McClellan, whose unexpected death at what I now view as the young age of 61 was a shock to us all in Mercer County.

"Rich brought a quiet effectiveness to his work with us at the Bridge Commission, reaching out to local communities that had long viewed the Commission as distant and perhaps even high-handed

"Moreover, he understood that "local communities" means more than just local elected officials, important as they are. Rich worked to build dialogue also with the business community and civic groups in the towns that our bridges serve. The Commission had recognized that many in our river towns felt a bit used and abused, and took a number of steps to build greater trust there. Hiring Rich McClellan was one such step. You might say that those who felt used and abused Rich respectfully schmoozed

"Rich McClellan brought "political savvy", in the best sense, to the Commissions dealings with local communities. He believed politics should be honorable and he saw public service at any level as a vocation. He served the people in all our river towns well."

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Laurenti moved and Commissioner Van Vliet seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

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"RESOLVED, the Commission appoints Phoenix Capital Partners for compensation not to exceed \$0.50/\$1,000 par amount of bonds issued, plus reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, to serve as transaction financial advisor in connection with the SFB Replacement Project bond issue and matters related thereto, and authorizes the Executive Director to execute an appropriate contract for the services to be provided and to take all other actions necessary and desirable to effectuate this appointment in the best interests of the Commission; and

"RESOLVED, the Commission appoints Academy Securities, Janney Montgomery Scott LLC, Jefferies LLC, Mischler Financial Group and Ramirez & Co., Inc. to serve as co-managing underwriters in connection with the anticipated SFB Replacement Project bond issue and matters related thereto and

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of October 31, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (September, 2016)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for September 2016 in comparison to the September 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of September.

Analysis of September 2016 / September 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 1.05 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.70 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 2.01 percent increase.

Analysis of September 2016 / September 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 72,290 vehicles, or 2.15 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 4,288 vehicles, or 0.91 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 68,002 vehicles, or 2.35 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for September 2016 was 114,507 total vehicles as compared to 112,098 total vehicles in September 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for September 2016 increased by 48,739 vehicles, or 1.89 percent as compared to September 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for September 2016 was 87,460 vehicles as compared to 85,835 in September 2015.

Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 3.70 percent increase through the first nine months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 0.77
 percent increase for the first nine months of 2016 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) reflected a 4.09 percent increase for September 2016 as the result of increases of 28,587 cars and 838 trucks when compared to September 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), decreases of 3,046 cars and 263 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 1.94 percent for September 2016 as compared to September 2015.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 1.32 percent in total toll traffic for the month of September 2016 compared to September 2015 as the result of increases of 11,078 cars and 1,988 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 12,668 passenger vehicles and 280 trucks combined to generate an increase of 2.94 percent in total toll traffic for September 2016.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 1.83 percent increase in total toll traffic during September 2016 as the result of the increase of 3,133 automobiles and the decrease of 1,180 trucks compared to September 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the combined increases of 7,614 passenger vehicles and 2,551 trucks generated an increase of 1.24 percent in total toll traffic for September 2016 as compared to September 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), increases of 7,968 passenger vehicles and 74 trucks produced a 6.78 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of September 2016.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of September, 2016 and September, 2015, and the year-to-date periods ending September 30, 2016 and September 30, 2015.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled **"Budget vs Actual"** covering the month of September 2016 and the nine month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2016 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$5,327,106 for the month of September. For the 2016 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$41,273,792 or 87.3% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Currently, EZPass operating expense is running \$145,406 above the year-to-date operating line budget. This increase is mainly due to larger than anticipated increases in EZPass traffic.

There were three payrolls during the month of September resulting in higher than usual operating expense. This payroll situation was accounted for in the monthly operating budget. There were no other unusual expenses or charges during the month.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

September 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of September, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 59 purchase orders in the total amount of \$1,358,406.22. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 46 price inquiries were sent out for 13 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.53 per order (46/13 = 3.53).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of September 2016 are shown below:

- Ten (10) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$700,026.00, for ESS camera upgrades at Commission Facilities.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$301,843.25, for radio system upgrades for the Commission.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$206,018.00 for WAN System router upgrades at all Commission Facility.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$36,100.00, for the Capital Equipment procurement of a tar applicator for the Commission's I-78 Toll Bridge Facility.
- A Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$10,044.31, for HVAC life extension repairs at the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

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ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Acquisition of the spare parts and consumables is underway by Xerox. Once all items are received, Commission Staff will review the inventory. Additionally, as the new electronic toll collection system is installed in a lane, the existing equipment will be added to the spare parts inventory.
- 3. Commission staff is working with Xerox to determine where to store the existing toll equipment as it is removed from the lanes. We will prepare a list of equipment and check with other toll agencies to see if they have a need for it.
- 4. For the Electronic Toll Collection System Replacement, TransCore is preparing the engineering design package, they finalized the training manuals and they are being printed, the revised Onsite First Installation Testing document was submitted and accepted, Disaster Recovery Plan is on-going and the draft Maintenance Plan was submitted for review. TransCore continues to facilitate bi-weekly project status meetings.
- 5. TransCore continues with the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge for preparation of the open road tolling (ORT) Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore will utilize the 17' wide right shoulder of the ORT zone for this testing. Xerox removed the existing equipment from the shoulder lane to make room for the new equipment. TransCore is also preparing for the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge.

Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC was expected to go live in February 2017, this date was changed to June 2017.

2. Commission Staff will execute the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA, as authorization was provided at the September 2016 Commission Meeting. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee meeting and Policy Committee meetings.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-ZPass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.
- 3. Mr. Stracciolini assisted the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission with the technical evaluation of proposals for their Cashless Tolling System Implementation and Maintenance procurement.

The CCD updated the construction guidelines to include information pertaining to prevailing wages and certified payrolls tracking. In addition, the CCD updated all its forms by clarifying the process on how contractors may increase their IBEs participation and meet or exceed the 25% target before and after submitting their bids package.

B2GNOW CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL REPORTING SYSTEMS

Through the B2GNOW system the CCD is able to generate dozens of reports to provide an array of information as to how the contracts are performing. The CCD has chosen three of these reports that identify the contracts being monitored and audited by the CCD through the B2GNOW program. The three reports are the Compliance Overview Report, the Primes and Subs on Active Contracts Report, and the IBE Quarterly Report. These reports provide significant amount of information pertaining to the types of certified IBEs being subcontracted by the Primes to complete the work awarded by the Commission. The reports illustrate pertinent information of each sub-consultant/subcontractor, including: gender, ethnicity, and payments compared to the 25% Commission target.

LCP TRACKER CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL CERTIFICATION SYSTEMS

The Contract Compliance Department continues to research and interview other agencies that provide tracking services for prevailing wages and certified payrolls for construction services as well as tracking payments to IBE sub-consultants by prime consultants providing professional services to the Commission.

Community Affairs Report

September 2016

The following Community Affairs activity took place during September:

Scudder Falls Bridge/Toll Adjustment Hearings

Assisted in review and response to all public comments received during the public hearing period of the proposed toll schedule adjustments.

Collected public comment via email, distributed to McCormick-Taylor and Commission staff for inclusion in final report. Assisted in developing responses to those messages which contained questions, as appropriate. Of particular note was a question from the owner of a bus company, disputing that buses are "trucks" instead of passenger vehicles. Responded with the proposed toll schedule and an explanation of the Commission's vehicle classifications. Forwarded the response to Senator Santarsiero's aide Ryan Bevitz, who was also contacted by the bus company owner.

Knowlton-Columbia Winter maintenance

Commission officials previously approved the revised map and agreement for winter maintenance of roadways in the village of Columbia; awaiting approval from Knowlton Township.

Coordinated and attended meeting between the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Transportation and the Commission for a presentation on the results of the DEP's study of the salt/groundwater issue in the area. The results show significant levels of sodium chloride in the wells, including in the area of the Township DPW garage and downstream to Columbia.

The DEP identified several possible sources of the sodium chloride as well as remediation options. The results will be presented at a public Township meeting in October, after which it is anticipated that all involved agencies will be meeting to discuss further action.

Riverton-Belvidere Attended construction status meeting for the Critical Member Strengthening project. Contacted the local fire departments and Public Safety Communications Centers to advise that the bridge officers will need as much notice as possible if an emergency vehicle will be approaching the bridge, to allow for clearing of crews and safe passage.

Portland property acquisition:

Advised Executive Director Resta and Deputy Executive Director of Operations Hill about property adjacent to the Portland storage garage that might be available for purchase and of use by the Commission.

Lambertville Area Chamber, Bridge lighting:

Coordinated and attended meeting with the Delaware River Towns Chamber of Commerce (formerly the Lambertville Area Chamber of Commerce) and New Hope officials to discuss decorative lighting at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge. Executive Director Resta told the representatives that the Commission would be receptive to the idea, and gave them direction on what other considerations will need to be addressed and how to proceed. The Chamber was appreciative of the feedback and will be back in touch with a proposal.

Misc. Community Relations:

Spoke to a resident about having a quick memorial service for a friend at the Lumberville-Raven Rock Pedestrian Bridge on October 2. Advised Department of Security, Safety and Training of same.

Provided Labor Day weekend's Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge traffic counts (obtained from Charles Stracciolini) to Senator Mario Scavello's office.

Received request from Greenwich Township Emergency squad regarding E-ZPass violations; forwarded to E-ZPass Director Yvonne Kushner, who processed the dismissal of same.

Reviewed correspondence from Phillipsburg Mayor Stephen Ellis regarding a previous Compact Authorized Investment grants. Received information from Michael Crane and forwarded to Joseph Donnelly for use in reply.

Reviewed traffic situation in Phillipsburg on the weekend of September 17-18, due to an event in Easton and prepared draft response. Response held, pending continued discussion and possible resolution in October.

Provided information on the number of employees at the Portland-Columbia facility (provided by Human Resources) to Portland Borough.

Responded to phone call from a local Penn State student, requesting permission to fund-raise at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Supported Bridge. Advised her that soliciting on the Commission property is prohibited.

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (MB) of Hamilton New Jersey was issued the Notice to Proceed effective March 11, 2015. During the month of September Baker addressed comments on the final design submission and submitted final contract bid documents for Contract T-668A that were posted for bid on September 13, 2016. The Pre-Bid Meeting for Contract T-668A was held on September 27, 2016. Baker also prepared and submitted the Application for Project Authorization under the New Jersey Register of Historic Places Act to the NJSHPO for their review and approval. The Baker Team continued coordinating the utility relocation agreement process with the various PA and NJ utility companies.

Baker attended bi-weekly field meetings for Contract T-666A SFB PA Noise Wall Construction, and responding to contractor Requests for Information (RFI) and submittals.

DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies.

Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition – one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the Commission's maintenance jurisdiction was submitted to the PADEP on February 29, 2016, and to the USACE on March 4, 2016. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for PennDOT's maintenance jurisdiction was submitted to PennDOT in early March and to the PADEP on March 25, 2016. Additional back-up information was provided to PADEP on May 18th to support the Joint Permit Application for the Commission's jurisdiction. A request for additional information was received from the USACE and the information provided on September 20th and September 28th.

Meeting of October 31, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (ROW impacts by the SFB project) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. The Commissioners at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the MOU for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility on behalf of the Commission. This MOU will be forwarded to the NJDEP for signature after it has been signed by the Commission.

The ROW acquisition process continued during September, which included coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date the Commission has purchased the following properties in Pennsylvania: Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road, an additional property not required for construction; Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road, an additional property not required for construction; and, Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001, at 1149 Woodside Road, both parcels required for construction. The Commission has also purchased a partial easement on Parcel 20-027-007 and an easement for property over the PA Delaware Canal, which are necessary for construction.

The Commission continues to pursue the remaining properties in Pennsylvania and New Jersey in support of this project. An agreement of sale was reached with Judith Sackheim for Parcel 20-030-057 in the amount of \$420,000. The property closing occurred on September 28, 2016. The DMC also performed an inspection of the property and the various structures prior to closing. We are awaiting final signatures by Lower Makefield Township for the easement agreement associated with Parcel 20-028-116. The Agreement of Sale for Parcel 20-030-056 (I-95 Park and Ride site) has been fully executed. Commission Counsel is scheduling the closing on the property.

DMC Staff continue to provide Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. The contractor remobilized in September and began silt fence and RCE installation work in advance of the Phase 2 tree clearing work that will begin in October of this year. The DMC also coordinated the demolition of the dwelling located at 1140 Woodside Road (former Ferrante property) with the T-667A contractor.

The DMC reviewed the final design submission prepared by the Baker Team and provided comments that were incorporated into the final bid documents for Contract T-668A. In addition, ongoing coordination continued with the Baker Team and the various utility companies regarding the Utility Relocation Agreements in Pennsylvania. The Utility companies are currently finalizing cost estimates for the relocation of their facilities. The Commission is working with NJDOT on the NJ utility relocation effort and coordinating the necessary utility agreements with them for the impacted NJ utility companies. We are awaiting PECO Electric's signature on their utility agreement, and are coordinating with PECO Gas to have them prepare the design of the gas line extension to provide service to both the Commissions future Bridge Monitor building and future District I Administration Building

The Commission has received a copy of the fully executed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Commission and NJDOT, to address coordination efforts required during design and construction, on June 6, 2016. The Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Commission and PennDOT is with PennDOT for execution.

The request for proposals (RFP) for the CM Services associated with the main construction contract for the SFB Project (Contract CM-669A) was posted on June 7th. The Pre-Proposal Meeting was held on June 28th. Four (4) proposals were received on July 28th. Oral Presentations with the four firms are scheduled for September 7, 2016. Authorization to Negotiate with Hill International was received at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting. Negotiations with the Hill Team are currently taking place.

The DMC prepared the draft RFP for the Construction Inspection (CI) Services associated with the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project and the draft RFP is currently being reviewed by Engineering. The Commission will be procuring three (3) CI contracts under this one RFP solicitation, with the RFP posting anticipated in early October.

DESIGN

Contract No. C-663A

Pennoni Associates, Inc. (Pennoni) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015. This Contract is for professional traffic engineering services for a pre-construction traffic study required prior to construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, in accordance with the Interagency Agreement (IA) dated April 30, 2012 between the DRJTBC, PennDOT and NJDOT. This study will serve as the baseline for purposes of determining the traffic diversion impacts from tolling the new Scudder Falls Bridge. As prescribed in the IA, the study area includes bridge crossings, various County and State road networks, intersections and interchanges that may be affected by the tolling of the new bridge. ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM

DESIGN-BUILD Contract No. DB-427

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Acquisition of the spare parts and consumables is underway by Xerox. Once all items are received, Commission Staff will review the inventory. Additionally, as the new electronic toll collection system is installed in a lane, the existing equipment will be added to the spare parts inventory.

Commission staff is working with Xerox to determine where to store the existing toll equipment as it is removed from the lanes. We will prepare a list of equipment and check with other toll agencies to see if they have a need for it.

DB-584

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC was expected to go live in February 2017, this date was changed to June 2017.

Commission Staff will execute the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA, as authorization was provided at the September 2016 Commission Meeting. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC.

Meeting of October 31, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

We received some of the equipment and installation of the count stations is underway in District 2. Coordination with Verizon for activation of the wireless modems is on-going.

Signal Service submitted the draft reports that will be produced by the new system and they were reviewed by Commission Staff. Signal Service is addressing the review comments.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its design of the replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended biweekly status meetings and the Factory Acceptance Testing (FAT) at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge. RK&K reviewed the finalized training manuals, the revised Onsite First Installation Testing document, and the draft Maintenance Plan.

DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore is preparing the engineering design package, they finalized the training manuals and they are being printed, the revised Onsite First Installation Testing document was submitted and accepted, Disaster Recovery Plan is on-going and the draft Maintenance Plan was submitted for review. TransCore continues to facilitate bi-weekly project status meetings.

TransCore continues with the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge for preparation of the open road tolling (ORT) Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore will utilize the 17' wide right shoulder of the ORT zone for this testing. Xerox removed the existing equipment from the shoulder lane to make room for the new equipment. TransCore is also preparing for the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge.

Meeting of October 31, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT

NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLAND-COLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

Commission Staff received a fair and reasonable price through the on-call agreement with J. Flectch Creamer & Son for the I-78 approach roadway sign overlays. A shop drawing was submitted and reviewed by the design engineer, RK&K. Comments were addressed and a final shop drawing was submitted. The work was completed through a nighttime, two lane closure to minimize impact on traffic. RK&K completed a field inspection of the sign overlays and submitted their findings to the Commission.

TransCore provided a cost proposal for the installation and programming of the Daktronics LED signs to be installed over each toll lane at the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. TransCore and Commission Staff prepared a contract Change Order for the installation of the signs. Since these signs will be integrated into the new toll system and TrasnCore will be on site with their electrician, there is an opportunity to reduce risk and achieve a savings by completing the installation of the signs with TransCore. The Change Order request will be submitted for Commission consideration at the October 2016 Commission Meeting.

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

STUDY FOR SELECT VEHICULAR BRIDGES Contract No. C-556A

Pennoni Associates submitted their final report outlining opportunities for implementation of structural health monitoring as well as overweight / oversized vehicle detection, deterrence and enforcement through the long term application of sensor type technologies together with a data acquisition / reporting system to function as an integrated Bridge Monitoring System.

The Commission is currently evaluating the recommendation to recommission the monitoring equipment at New Hope-Lambertville and Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported bridges.

Meeting of October 31, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Since the final toll rate schedule for the Scudder Falls Bridge was accepted at the September 2016 Commission Meeting, Jacobs Engineering was requested to finalize their traffic and revenue forecast and submit a report.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2016 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering and CWA.

Bridge and Facility Inspections have been completed at the toll-supported bridges. Inspection of Scudder Falls was completed during the third week of August, after the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle (no Falcons were nesting on the bridge this year).

CWA submitted the draft Maintenance Report on September 9. Review meetings were held with District 1 Operations & Maintenance staff on September 30 in Morrisville and Districts 2 & 3 Operations & Maintenance Staff on September 28 in Phillipsburg.

CWA is currently revising the Maintenance Report based on comments received during these meetings. CWA submitted the Draft Annual Inspection report on September 30 and it is currently under review by Engineering Staff.

Sign retroreflectivity testing will be performed for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in October.

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTHS OF SEPTEMBER 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

Radio System

- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel worked with the Districts to continue installing the new radios in various trucks and equipment. Plans are being made to install the new base station radios in the various facilities once they are received. The new Stockton Repeater site continues to progress along.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

Access Control System

- During the months of September 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel continued working with Schneider Electric to explore the benefits of a new enhanced access control system to upgrade Commission security.
- In September 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees.
- During the month of September 2016, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employees, contractor cards and summer employees. Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel worked with the Districts to install new card readers at designated locations.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

ESS

- During the month of September 2016, ESS and Schneider Electric personnel continued to explore the use of the Genetec video management system. Schneider Electric provided the Commission with a proposal for the cut over which will be formally presented to Mr. Resta on October 14, 2016 by Schneider Electric.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel, along with Engineering, Schneider Electric and Sentinel Consultants' continued to work on the I-78 wireless renovation project. Schneider Electric continues to diligently work to identify cameras that will work on the current video management system. However, the prospects remain limited. On Monday, August 29, 2016, all parties involved tested a new Sony camera at I-78 which proved very successful.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel continued the dialogue with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. The plan to upgrade cameras and add cameras in problem or high incident areas has been finalized and is awaiting estimates from Schneider Electric.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering and Purchasing to implement the new Comcast communications network.
- At the September 26, 2016, Commission Meeting the Commissioners approved the fourth year extension to Schneider Electric's maintenance contract.
- ESS personnel reviewed and purged the ESS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- ESS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous ESS issues and problems raised by Commission members.

- The ESS Primary Control Center continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel worked with several police departments on active investigations. As a result, ESS personnel investigated and processed sixteen video requests. Please see the attached "ESS Request Video" Report for a summary of information on each request.

Miscellaneous

- On September 20 and 21, 2016, ESS personnel, along with District personnel, attended a snow operations course.
- On September 29, 2016, ESS held a Department Meeting and invited a representative from Security, Safety and Training to attend to ensure communications between both departments for operational efficiency and the safety of Commission employees.
- During the month of September 2016, the ESS Department initiated a quest for a more efficient method to record radio transmissions, dispatch assets, and send out reports. To date it appears that a Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system would greatly benefit the Commission. Vendors are being solicited to see what system would best suit the PCC.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel arranged for and coordinated several meetings to develop a new vehicle for the Motorist Assistance Program (MAP). Updates were provided to Mr. Resta via a PowerPoint presentation.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with the Districts to review, update and develop incident response plans for each toll bridge.
- During the month of September 2016, ESS personnel, along with the Districts and Engineering worked to develop new security procedures that will be associated with the new toll collection system. Plans for new banking facilities also continue to be reviewed.
