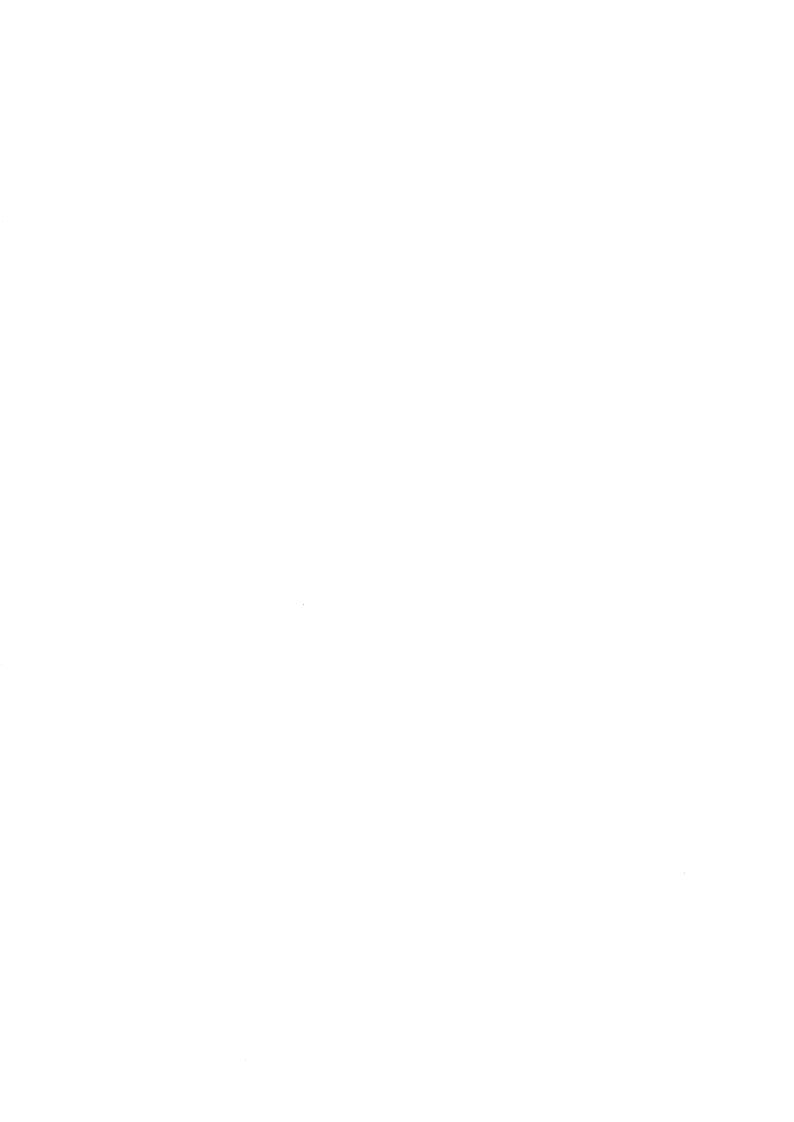

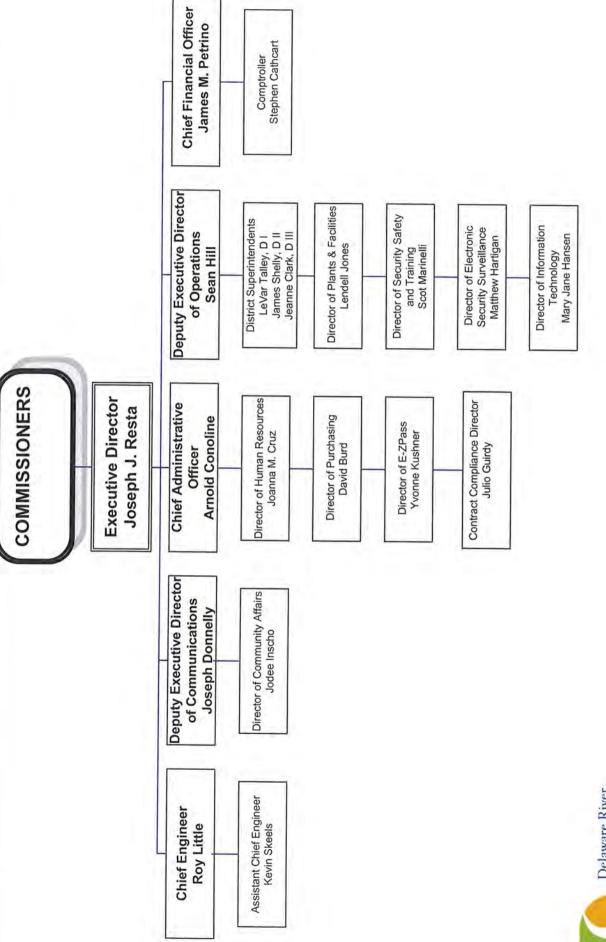

### ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

### WELCOMING REMARKS OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

### INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

### EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"While only three weeks have passed since our last meeting, there are several noteworthy recent developments to relay. First and foremost, we have a new New Jersey Commissioner — Lori Ciesla. Commissioner Ciesla brings experience in both the private and public sectors to the Commission. Her professional background is in finance/accounting and information technology. She currently works as Information Technology Business Analyst for the Chubb Group of Insurance Companies. She also served three years on the Lopatcong Township Council, so she is experienced in the challenges and responsibilities of public service. She is also the mother of two children that she and her husband have raised in Lopatcong, which is always an important experience. Commissioner Ciesla, we welcome your service to the Commission;

"Moving to capital program matters, we continue to make progress in advancing the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. The pace of installing noiseabatement walls along the bridge's Pennsylvania I-95 approach has stepped up in recent weeks. Additionally, the contractor has nearly completed efforts to outfit the underside of the current Scudder Falls Bridge with bird-prevention netting. The intent of this installation is to discourage peregrine falcons from nesting on the bridge before the replacement project gets underway next year. We fully intend to construct an elevated falcon nesting box on a nearby uninhabited island as an additional environmental mitigation measure. However, this additional work is being delayed due to the low water levels in the drought-stricken river. Once the river's water levels recover, the contractor should be able to shuttle the necessary equipment and materials out to the island to build the prospective falcon protonest. Stage 2 tree cutting also is advancing quickly along New Jersey's I-95 approach roadway and near the bridge's abutments on both sides of the river. A lot is going on behind the scenes, too. The project labor agreement (PLA) and owner controlled insurance program (OCIP) documents were made available for project bidders on November 10. An RFP has been posted for prospective engineering firms to provide construction inspection services for the project. Three separate contracts will be awarded off this single RFP. And, in Pennsylvania, utility relocation agreements have been fully executed with telephone, cable TV, and fiber-optic companies; an additional agreement is pending with PECO for relocation of electric lines. Although not directly project related, we have kicked off the process of designing and constructing a new administration building in close proximity to the replacement bridge in Lower Makefield, PA. As you may recall, we closed on the purchase of the administration building property and park and ride lot from Lower Makefield Township in late October. Finally, the project financing work is speeding ahead. The financial team the Commission established in October has already held a series of meetings. And today's executive agenda contains a final measure to round out this process: a resolution for the appointment of NJ disclosure counsel;

"Elsewhere in our jurisdiction, we have a project completion to report. The structural repair and slope stabilization project that began in late August at our Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported Bridge officially reached completion on November 11. The undertaking involved repairs of gusset plate connections, lower-chord members, and end posts. Many of these bridge members had been damaged as a result of the disproportionate number of overweight truck crossings that occur at this bridge. The project also involved slope stabilization along Commission parcels at both ends of the bridge;

"There are three important insurance renewals on today's executive agenda. Health insurance for our employees and retirees; a full array of business insurance policies; and workers compensation coverage. Approval of these three

items will further enable us to advance the drafting of next year's operating budget, which we hope to present for Commissioners' consideration next month;

"With the Thanksgiving holiday travel period fast approaching, it seems an appropriate time to briefly talk about how 2016's traffic counts are trending. Our 18 vehicular bridges have handled in excess of 2.7 million more crossings from January through October of this year than they did during the same 10-month period in 2015 – and 2015 was our highest traffic volume year on record, so that's roughly a 2.3 percent increase. Even when accounting for the extra day of travel this year due to leap year, the size of the increase to date virtually guarantees that the Commission will end the year with a new traffic record. We will discuss this more fully – including revenue data – next year when the final numbers come in along with the next traffic engineering report;

"In closing, AAA is predicting that this year's Thanksgiving holiday weekend will see the highest number of travelers in nine years. Please drive carefully and have the safest of holidays."

However, in view of (1) the necessity for the Commission to take a vote on the renewal of NEBCO insurance benefits for retirees, and (2) the fact that without my vote the Commission would not have the required quorum to take a vote on this issue, I am advised by Commission counsel that I am permitted to vote on this matter pursuant to the doctrine called the "Rule of Necessity". Counsel has advised that without my vote, there would not be the required quorum, there is a need to conduct this vote, and the time constraints of this vote require that this vote be taken at this meeting."

# DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of November 21, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (October, 2016)

**Summary:** The Commission experienced a decrease in total toll revenue for October 2016 in comparison to the October 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic however reflected an increase for the month of October.

### Analysis of October 2016 / October 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 0.45 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 1.40 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 2.23 percent increase.

### Analysis of October 2016 / October 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 52,658 vehicles, or 1.53 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 6,547 vehicles, or 1.34 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 59,205 vehicles, or 2.00 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for October 2016 was 112,978 total vehicles as compared to 111,279 total vehicles in October 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for October 2016 decreased by 11,619 vehicles, or 0.42 percent as compared to October 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for October 2016 was 88,151 vehicles as compared to 88,526 in October 2015.

### Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 3.47 percent increase through the first ten months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 0.65 percent increase for the first ten months of 2016 as compared to last year.

### DISTRICT REVIEW:

### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) reflected a 3.48 percent increase for October 2016 as the result of the increase of 26,422 cars and the decrease of 231 trucks when compared to October 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), decreases of 3,365 cars and 640 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 2.22 percent for October 2016 as compared to October 2015.

### District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 1.53 percent in total toll traffic for the month of October 2016 compared to October 2015 as the result of the increase of 17,286 cars and the decrease of 1,587 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, the increase of 4,561 cars and the decrease of 1,641 trucks combined to generate an increase of 0.64 percent in total toll traffic for October 2016.

### District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 7.59 percent decrease in total toll traffic during October 2016 as the result of decreases of 6,363 automobiles and 2,459 trucks when compared to October 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the combined increases of 25,121 cars and 146 trucks generated an increase of 3.14 percent in total toll traffic for October 2016 as compared to October 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), decreases of 4,457 passenger vehicles and 135 trucks produced a 3.96 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of October 2016.

### **E-ZPass** Penetration Rates

### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of October 2016 and the ten month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2016 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,632,918 for the month of October. For the 2016 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$45,906,709 or 88.2% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Currently, EZPass operating expense is running \$238,781 above the year-to-date operating line budget. This increase is mainly due to larger than anticipated increases in EZPass traffic.

There were no unusual expenses or charges during the month.

### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

### October 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of October, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 76 purchase orders in the total amount of \$905,518.09. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 37 price inquiries were sent out for 12 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.08 per order (37/12= 3.08).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of October 2016 are shown below:

- Twelve (12) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$514,195.00, for ESS camera upgrades at Commission Facilities.
- > Two (2) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$93,699.00, for WAN System upgrades at all Commission Facility.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$71,555.60, for the foot walk replacement project at the Centre Bridge-Stockton Toll-Supported Bridge.
- ➤ Three (3) Purchase Orders were let, in the total amount of \$37,292.59, for Toll Collector Counting Stations and other banking equipment needs for District I Facilities.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$19,240.00, at the request of the IT Department, for the annual renewal of the VMware Software.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

#### ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF OCTOBER 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

#### Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Acquisition of the spare parts and consumables was completed by Xerox. Commission Staff reviewed the inventory and it was found acceptable. Additionally, as the new electronic toll collection system is installed in a lane, the existing equipment will be added to the spare parts inventory.
- 3. Commission staff is working with Xerox to determine where to store the existing toll equipment as it is removed from the lanes. We will prepare a list of equipment and check with other toll agencies to see if they have a need for it.
- 4. For the Electronic Toll Collection System Replacement, TransCore is preparing the engineering design package, training manuals were submitted, Disaster Recovery Plan is on-going and the draft Maintenance Plan comments are being addressed. TransCore continues to facilitate bi-weekly project status meetings.
- 5. TransCore continues with the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge for preparation of the open road tolling (ORT) Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore will utilize the 17' wide right shoulder of the ORT zone for this testing. Xerox removed the existing equipment from the shoulder lane to make room for the new equipment. TransCore is also completing the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge.
- 6. Advanced system installation work is being completed at the Milford-Montague Toll Bridge. This includes the removal of the existing treadle frame and placing a new concrete roadway slab in each of the toll lanes. To minimize lane down time, an accelerated concrete is being used. Once the concrete reaches the allowable strength to open the lane to traffic, TransCore is installing a temporary surface mounted

treadle strip that works with the legacy electronic toll system to return the lane to operation.

#### Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

- 1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC was expected to go live in February 2017, this date was changed to June 2017.
- 2. Commission Staff will execute the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA, as authorization was provided at the September 2016 Commission Meeting. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC.

#### General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

- 1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee meeting and Policy Committee meetings.
- 2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-ZPass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.
- 3. Mr. Stracciolini assisted the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission with the technical evaluation of proposals for their Cashless Tolling System Implementation and Maintenance procurement.

#### IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

The Contract Compliance Program and IBE Target of 25% of the total Commission's contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of twenty-seven (27) contracts, including four (4) Task Order Agreements with the new IBE program requirements.

#### STATUS UPDATES

In preparation of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project, the Contract Compliance Department staff has steadfastly been actively working with Mr. Arnold Conoline, Chief Executive Officer and the advice of the Commission's New Jersey labor counsel to assure that the best and most effective prevailing wage and certified payroll tracking system is utilized. Hence, during the month of November the CCD will be ready to present the company identified to appropriately provide the Commission with the needed tracking software for our construction and professional services.

The CCD continues to work with other Commission departments in assuring that the construction and professional services firms are working on meeting the required 25% targets of the Commission's IBE program.

#### B2GNOW CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PAYROLL REPORTING SYSTEMS

The CCD continues to manage the auditing services of the B2GNOW system and to generate the CCD reports to provide statistics on the contract performance status of the prime contracts payments to their IBE subconsultants and professional services. The CCD has chosen three of these reports that identify the contracts being monitored and audited by the CCD through the B2GNOW program. The three reports are the Compliance Overview Report, the Primes and Subs on Active Contracts Report, and the IBE Quarterly Report. These reports provide significant amount of information pertaining to the types of certified IBEs being subcontracted by the Primes to complete the work awarded by the Commission. The reports illustrate pertinent information of each subconsultant, including: gender, ethnicity, and payments compared to the 25% Commission target.

## CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT PREVAILING WAGES AND PAYROLL CERTIFICATION SYSTEM

# Community Affairs Report October 2016

The following Community Affairs activity took place during October:

#### Scudder Falls Public Involvement

Assisted in review and response to messages received via the Commission and Scudder Falls project websites, as appropriate. The focus of the messages have changed from tolls rates to construction related questions. Those questions are forwarded to Engineering for response.

Met with Chris Rood at the home of a neighboring property owners, concerned about the impact of the drilling for sound walls is having on her business of horse riding lessons. We determined an acceptable schedule for the loudest work, which Mr. Rood relayed to the contractor. He will keep in touch with the property owner so that she can schedule her activity accordingly.

#### Knowlton-Columbia Salt/Groundwater issue

Subsequent to the September meeting with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to review the results of their groundwater study, delivered a sample of the substance (provided by District III Assistant Foreman James Gower) that was mistaken identified as road salt by the homeowners and DEP. The material is actually tiny plastic beads that give road line paint its reflective quality. After examination of the material, the DEP officials accepted that this is the material that was spilled on the road and photographed in the spring.

The DEP presented its finding at the Knowlton Township Committee on October 27. The Township is taking action to correct the conditions at their DPW salt storage building. A representative of a water treatment company was also in attendance at the meeting to discuss reverse osmosis systems.

#### Easton-Phillipsburg Special Event traffic

In response to an earlier traffic situation in Phillipsburg caused by a special event in Easton, Commission officials have facilitated talks between the two towns. The particular problem is when an event closes Larry Holmes Drive South, and where to direct the center lane of traffic coming off of the Northampton Street Bridge. We have relayed to the towns that the Commission is happy to assist with what they decide is the best traffic management, including use of the Commission electronic message boards.

There was a newspaper report of one customer having to use the Rt. 22 toll bridge instead of Northampton Street during the Phillipsburg-Easton Halloween parade of October 30. The man did not have money for the toll and was concerned about receiving a violation.

#### **Fall Newsletter**

Gathered material for inclusion in the fall Commission newsletter, including attending several of the employee training sessions and new Bridge Monitors training.

#### **Misc. Community Relations:**

Attended the Pike County Road Task Force meeting, and shared the outcome of the recent toll adjustments. A representative of the Milford PA DPW asked about cooperative activities between the town and the Commission. He was disappointed that some services previously provided have been discontinued.

Received request from PA Representative Emrich on behalf of a constituent who received a toll violation in error; forwarded to E-ZPass Director Yvonne Kushner, who processed the dismissal of same.

Coordinated with District II Foreman Mark Dilts on the notification to Pennsylvania Department of Transportation of work on a drainage inlet on Route 32 at the Uhlerstown-Frenchtown Bridge.

Replied to the Montague Association for the Restoration of Community History regarding installation of directional signage at the Milford-Montague Bridge.

Follow-up on other various website inquires to ensure all customer concerns are being responded to.

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (MB) of Hamilton New Jersey submitted final contract bid documents for Contract T-668A that were posted for bid on September 13, 2016. The Pre-Bid Meeting for Contract T-668A was held on September 27, 2016. During the month of October the Baker Team was involved in preparing responses to contractor inquiries and Addendum No. 3 that was issued on October 21, 2016. Baker also continued to coordinate with the various utility companies to finalize the necessary utility relocation agreements for the project.

As part of the ongoing permit acquisition process: Baker presented a Project update to the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation of Natural Resources (DCNR) on October 13<sup>th</sup>; and, presented a project update in a meeting with the NJ Historic Sites Council on October 21, 2016, wherein project approval was received for project improvements within the historic boundary of the D&R Canal. The Baker Team continued to respond to contractor Requests for Information (RFI) and submittals associated with Contract T-666A, SFB Project PA Noise Walls Construction, and Contract T-667A SFB Advanced Tree Clearing contract; and provide responses to contractor inquiries and addenda preparation for the T-668A SFB Replacement Bridge contract bid documents.

#### DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies.

Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the two (2) Joint Permit application packages for the final build condition – one (1) for PennDOT maintenance jurisdiction, and one (1) for Commission maintenance jurisdiction, as well as the USACE Permit application package. These three (3) permit application packages were submitted earlier in the year. The DMC continues to work with each of these agencies to address any comments and

concerns related to the applications. The USACE issued a 30-day Public Notice for comments on the Commission's USACE application on October 18, 2016.

Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP – Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. NJ Statehouse Commission approval of the conveyance of State lands (ROW impacts by the SFB project) was received at the June 30, 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. The Commissioners at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the MOU for the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility on behalf of the Commission. The Commission is awaiting the final MOU from the NJDEP – Green Acres for signature.

The ROW acquisition process continued during September, which included coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date the Commission has purchased the following properties in Pennsylvania: Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road, an additional property not required for construction; Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road, an additional property not required for construction; and, Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001, at 1149 Woodside Road, both parcels required for construction. The Commission has also purchased partial easements on Parcel 20-027-007, and on Parcel 20-028-116 as well as an easement for property over the PA Delaware Canal, which are necessary for construction. Parcel 20-030-057 was also acquired on September 28, 2016. The home will be occupied by the former owner, under a lease agreement with the Commission, until January 31, 2017. The Agreement of Sale for Parcel 20-030-056 (I-95 Park and Ride site) has been fully executed and closing occurred on October 26, 2016.

DMC Staff continue to provide Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. The contractor remobilized in September and began Phase 2 of the tree clearing work in early October.

The DMC continues to assist the Commission with the Responses to Contractor Inquiries and the preparation of Addenda for Contract T-668A. In addition, ongoing coordination continued with the Baker Team and the various utility companies regarding the Utility Relocation Agreements in Pennsylvania. Utility Relocation Agreements have been fully executed with Verizon PA, Comcast PA, Sunesys, and PECO Electric. A field meeting was held with PECO Gas to discuss the design requirements for providing gas service to the BM/AET Building and to the future District I Administration Building. The Commission is also working with NJDOT on the NJ utility relocation effort and coordinating the necessary utility agreements with them for the impacted NJ utility companies. The Commission will reimburse the NJDOT for the costs associated with relocating the impacted NJ utility companies.

The request for proposals (RFP) for the CM Services associated with the main construction contract for the SFB Project (Contract CM-669A) was posted on June 7<sup>th</sup>. The Pre-Proposal Meeting was held on June 28<sup>th</sup>. Four (4) proposals were received on

July 28<sup>th</sup>. Oral Presentations with the four firms are scheduled for September 7, 2016. Authorization to Negotiate with Hill International was received at the September 26, 2016 Commission Meeting. The DMC prepared the draft RFP for the Construction Inspection (CI) Services associated with the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project and the draft RFP is currently being reviewed by Engineering. The Commission will be procuring three (3) CI contracts under this one RFP solicitation.

# PRE-CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC STUDY FOR THE SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

DESIGN Contract No. C-663A

Pennoni Associates, Inc. (Pennoni) was issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective July 28, 2015. This Contract is for professional traffic engineering services for a pre-construction traffic study required prior to construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, in accordance with the Interagency Agreement (IA) dated April 30, 2012 between the DRJTBC, PennDOT and NJDOT. #### TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE

DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

#### November 21, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

We received some of the equipment and installation of the count stations is underway in Districts 2 and 3. Coordination with Verizon for activation of the wireless modems is on-going.

Signal Service submitted the draft reports that will be produced by the new system and they were reviewed by Commission Staff. Signal Service is addressing the review comments.

# DISTRICT 2 & 3 PHASE 1 TOLL COLLECTION COUNTING FACILITIES PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25<sup>th</sup> at all three locations. Advanced Pre-Final footings and foundation design submission is expected to be received early November with a Final Design Submission for this advanced design package is anticipated to be received by Middle of November.

#### ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended bi-weekly status meetings and the Factory Acceptance Testing (FAT) at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge. The team also is attending the Onsite First Installation Testing at the Delaware Water Gap and New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridges. RK&K reviewed the finalized training manuals, the revised Onsite First Installation Testing document, and the draft Maintenance Plan.

#### November 21, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

#### DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore is preparing the engineering design package, training manuals were submitted, Disaster Recovery Plan is on-going and the draft Maintenance Plan comments are being addressed. TransCore continues to facilitate bi-weekly project status meetings.

TransCore continues with the tuning and equipment setup at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge for preparation of the open road tolling (ORT) Factory Acceptance Test and Onsite First Installation Testing. TransCore will utilize the 17' wide right shoulder of the ORT zone for this testing. Xerox removed the existing equipment from the shoulder lane to make room for the new equipment. TransCore is also completing the Onsite First Installation Testing at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge.

Advanced system installation work is being completed at the Milford-Montague Toll Bridge. This includes the removal of the existing treadle frame and placing a new concrete roadway slab in each of the toll lanes. To minimize lane down time, an accelerated concrete is being used. Once the concrete reaches the allowable strength to open the lane to traffic, TransCore is installing a temporary surface mounted treadle strip that works with the legacy electronic toll system to return the lane to operation.

#### TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT

NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLAND-COLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES

Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

TransCore provided a cost proposal for the installation and programming of the Daktronics LED signs to be installed over each toll lane at the New Hope-Lambertville, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. TransCore and Commission Staff prepared a contract Change Order for the installation of the signs. Since these signs will be integrated into the new toll system and TrasnCore will be on site with their electrician, there is an opportunity to reduce risk and achieve a savings by completing the installation of the signs with TransCore. The Change Order request will be submitted for Commission consideration at the October 2016 Commission Meeting.

#### November 21, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

#### **BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM**

STUDY FOR SELECT VEHICULAR BRIDGES Contract No. C-556A

Pennoni Associates submitted their final report outlining opportunities for implementation of structural health monitoring as well as overweight / oversized vehicle detection, deterrence and enforcement through the long term application of sensor type technologies together with a data acquisition / reporting system to function as an integrated Bridge Monitoring System.

The Commission is currently evaluating the recommendation to recommission the monitoring equipment at New Hope-Lambertville and Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported bridges.

#### **BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM**

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission.

# LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Since the final toll rate schedule for the Scudder Falls Bridge was accepted at the September 2016 Commission Meeting, Jacobs Engineering prepared a draft their traffic and revenue forecast report and review is underway.

#### GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2016 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. ### **Meeting of November 2016**

### ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF OCTOBER 2016

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Electronic Security and Surveillance Department:

### Radio System

- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel worked with the Districts to finish installing the new radios in various trucks and equipment. Plans are continuing for the installation of the new base station radios. In the near future all the old radios will be collected and stored. The radio portion of the new Stockton Repeater site is on line. The microwave portion is still being worked on.
- ESS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- ESS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

### Access Control System

- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues.
- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel continued working with Schneider Electric to explore the benefits of a new enhanced access control system to upgrade Commission security.
- In October 2016, ESS personnel created ID badges and toll swipe cards for new employees and consultants. Additionally, ESS continued making "Essential Employee" ID badges for current employees.
- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric and Transcore to develop a method to download the current employee ID badge database into the Transcore system. Once complete, toll employees will be able to utilize their ID badge to open a lane and collect tolls.

Schneider Electric and the Commission have identified suitable cameras for this location and Schneider Electric is exploring installation options.
- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel continued to work with Engineering regarding the ESS and fire alarm components for the new I-78 maintenance facility.
- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel continued the dialogue with Engineering reference the new Scudder Falls facility.
- During the month of October 2016, ESS personnel worked with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects. The plan to upgrade cameras and add cameras in problem or high incident areas has been finalized and Schneider Electric has started the upgrades.

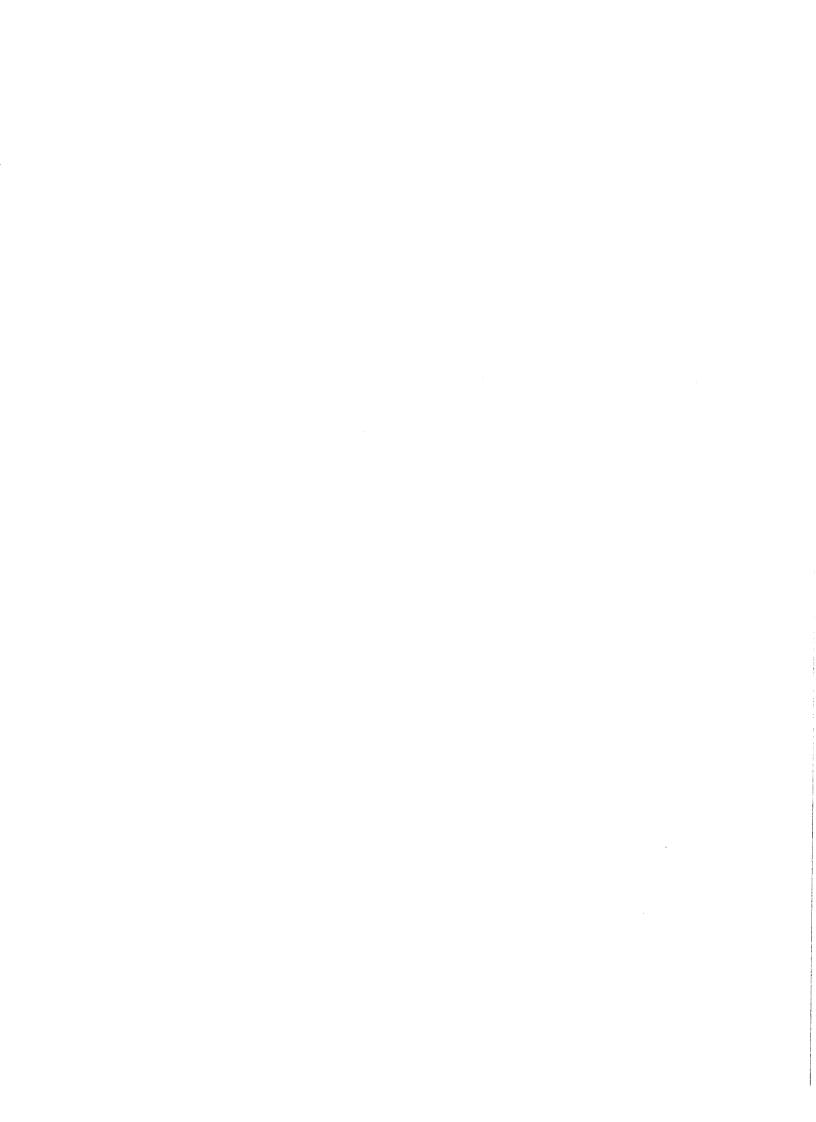
