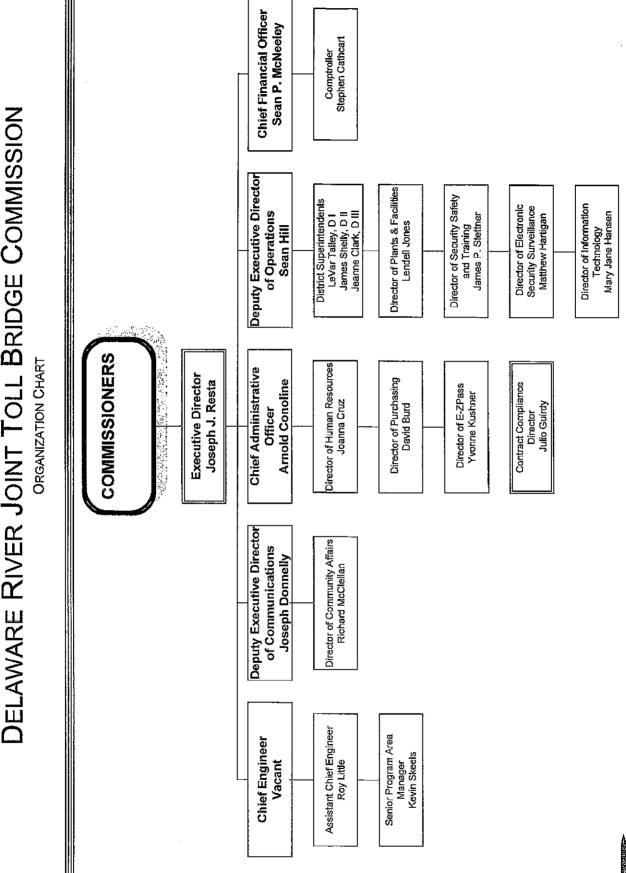

### ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State New Jersey.

### WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

### INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

"As is the case at these monthly Commission meetings, one of the items being presented for Commissioners' consideration today is the approval of the September Operations Report.

Each of these monthly reports chronicles the agency's performance in terms of finances, traffic numbers, capital projects, and the delivery of various services.

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Today, I want to drill down into one specific area of this report – the rise of truck traffic at our I-78 Toll Bridge.

As many of you know, our I-78 facility handles the most traffic of any our 18 vehicular crossings. But its significance in commercial traffic extends far beyond the Commission's jurisdiction.

It is one the most heavily utilized trucking routes in the entire country.

There are trucks originating from various points in New England, others are coming out of New York City's five boroughs or Long Island.

The lion's share, however, are driving from the shipping terminals at New Jersey's Port Newark & Port Elizabeth.

Many of these trucks are headed to warehouses in the Lehigh Valley, Harrisburg and York, Pa.

Others make their way to the Susquehanna Valley, where they head north up Route 15 to western New York and Canada.

Finally, others will eventually head south to Roanoke, Va. or to points further west along the Pennsylvania Turnpike or I-80.

Drive out to I-78 at any time of day - or night - on any day of the week and you will encounter dozens of 18 wheelers moving commerce in either direction across our toll bridge.

For well over a decade, our bridge has handled more than 2 million trucks each year in the westbound direction.

Even in the darkest depths of the recent recession in 2009, the bridge handled 2.2 million westbound trucks.

After a three-year downward trend in 2007, 2008 and 2009, truck traffic at our I-78 facility began a slow but steady rebound in 2010.

It has been gravitating upward ever since.

The numbers have even reached the point where they are exceeding the pre-recession highs of 2005 and 2006.

Last year, more than 2.5 million trucks went through our toll facility – the most ever for a single year.

This year, the numbers are tracking even higher.

### Meeting of October 28, 2013

More than 200,000 westbound trucks have travelled our I-78 segment in each of the past six months and in eight of the past nine months.

In August, we recorded the highest single monthly total of westbound truck crossings ever – nearly 237,000.

This brings me to the September Operations Report that I mentioned at the opening of my remarks. It shows truck crossings at I-78 are on such a strong pace that they stand to surpass last year's benchmark.

With two-thirds of the year in the books at September's end, we were already on the cusp of passing the 2-million-truck-crossings threshold at I-78.

We are, in fact, running 4.25 percent above last year's record totals through September.

This is not an anomaly caused by the rehabilitation project at the nearby Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge.

Truck numbers at E-P are up so far this year as a whole and recent truck traffic declines at that location due to construction amount to only a small fraction of the increases at I-78.

Also, don't forget that I-78 experienced some diversions of trucks earlier this year when single-lane travel configurations were in place for the road work that was conducted along our Pennsylvania I-78 segment.

The reason I am relaying all this statistical information this morning because it underscores the various capital investments the Commission has made along its 6.6-mile portion of I-78 over the past six years.

The rehabilitations of the New Jersey and Pennsylvania approaches have provided a safer and more efficient crossing for commuters and shippers alike.

Likewise, the installation of two Express E-Pass lanes at the toll plaza area have greatly enhanced throughput, eliminating the daily queues that previously inundated the former sevenlane toll plaza barrier at this location.

The two open-road-tolling lanes that collect tolls at highway speeds are now handling 65 percent of collections at our I-78 facility.

This is effectively allowing E-ZPass-equipped truckers to save considerable driving time that previously would have been wasted sitting in a line to pay a toll.

The investments along our I-78 segment have made this river crossing a much more attractive travel alternative.

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This has occurred to such a degree that truckers are now consistently using this toll bridge more than our other six toll crossings combined.

The experience of rising truck crossings at I-78 is more than just numbers. It is shows why the Commission and other transportation agencies invest resources in improving its facilities for motorists.

There are many external factors for why I-78 truck traffic is rising, but there is no escaping the fact that we would not be as well positioned to handle these rising volumes were it not for the investments the Commission made over the past six years.

Likewise, we should be ready to handle the predicted wave of additional truck traffic once the Panama Canal widening is completed in the next couple years and larger post-Panamax ships begin making their way to New Jersey's container ports.

Mr. Chairman, that concludes my report, but there is a ceremonial matter for the Commission before we move back to the agenda.

As I explained in my report last month, one of our employees — District II Sgt. Scott Brumbaugh — took commendable action in August when the resident engineer for the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Project suffered what turned out to be a heart attack at our administration building in Phillipsburg.

We have Mr. Brumbaugh with us today to receive a proclamation from the Commission for his actions."

### PROCLAMATION OF THE COMMISSIONERS-SCOTT BRUMBAUGH, DISTRICT II TOLL SERGEANT

### R:2364-10-13

Chairman DeGerolamo stated at this point in the meeting he would like to present to District II Sergeant Scott Brumbaugh a Proclamation of the Commissioners, which will become an official component to the Minutes of this meeting;

"WHEREAS, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission is a bistate transportation agency serving a 140-mile jurisdiction between the states of New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission employs roughly 350 full-time workers to operate, maintain, and protect is network of 20 river bridges and related transportation support facilities; and

"WHEREAS, District II Sergeant Scott Brumbaugh joined the Commission's workforce as a bridge officer in 1985 and attained the rank of sergeant in 1998; and

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**"WHEREAS**, during the August 7, 2013 progress meeting for the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Project, the resident engineer exited the meeting room and collapsed in the hallway of the Commission's administration building in Phillipsburg, N.J.; and

"WHEREAS, Sgt. Brumbaugh was alerted and he immediately called 911 to request an ambulance; and

"WHEREAS, Sgt. Brumbaugh promptly secured a defibrillator and rushed to the resident engineer's side, taking full control of the situation; and

"WHEREAS, the resident engineer was delusional, had a cold body temperature, was unable to stand, and complained of pain running down his arm; and

"WHEREAS, Sgt. Brumbaugh ensured the individual did not go into shock, prepared the defibrillator for possible use and monitored the individual's heart rate until emergency responders arrived; and

"WHEREAS, the Phillipsburg Emergency Squad took the individual to nearby St. Luke's Warren Hospital where he was stabilized before being flown by medevac helicopter to another hospital where emergency heart surgery was performed; and

"WHEREAS, it was later confirmed that the resident engineer had suffered a heart attack; and

"WHEREAS, it was clear that Sgt. Brumbaugh's CPR training, communication skills and calm, professional demeanor enabled this medical emergency to have a good outcome; and

"WHEREAS, Sgt. Brumbaugh performs outstanding work on a daily basis and sets an exemplary standard of conduct in the performance of his duties.

"NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission assembled for a Meeting at New Hope, Pennsylvania this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 2013, that this Commission hereby Recognizes Scott Brumbaugh, Commends his selfless, life-saving actions in the performance of his duties; and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Proclamation be included in the Minutes of this Meeting, a copy be placed in Sgt. Brumbaugh's personnel file, and a duly-authenticated ceremonial copy be transmitted to Sgt. Scott Brumbaugh."

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### DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of October 28, 2013 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (September, 2013)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for September 2013 in comparison to September 2012. Total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month as the result of increases in both automobile and truck traffic.

### Analysis of September 2013 / September 2012 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 4.75 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 6.18 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 1.17 percent increase.

### Analysis of September 2013 / September 2012 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 50,928 vehicles, or 1.65 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 25,265 vehicles, or 6.39 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 25,663 vehicles, or 0.95 percent.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for September 2013 decreased by 55,890 vehicles, or 2.18 percent as compared to September 2012.

### Traffic analysis for 2013 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for September 2013
  was 104,568 total vehicles as compared to 102,871 total vehicles in September 2012.
  Total YTD toll traffic is reflecting a 0.49% decrease as compared to 2012.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the 11 toll supported bridges is reflecting a 1.12% decrease through the first nine months of 2013 as compared to the same nine-month period in 2012.

### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for September 2013 reflected a 3.75 percent increase as the result of combined increases of 17,658 cars and 6,472 trucks as compared to September 2012. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), increases of 6,309 cars and 1,483 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 4.83 percent for September 2013 as compared to September 2012.

### District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 2.79 percent in total toll traffic for the month of September 2013 when compared to September 2012 as the result of the increases of 10,072 cars and 14,994 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 29,033 passenger vehicles and 1,662 trucks combined to generate a 7.21 percent decrease in total toll traffic for September 2013. [It should be noted that the current Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Project has resulted in lane closures in both directions at the Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge].

### District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced an 8.12 percent decrease in total toll traffic for September 2013 as the result of decreases of 7,929 automobiles and 716 trucks compared to September 2012. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, total toll traffic for the month reflected an increase of 0.85% as the result of combined increases of 2,154 passenger vehicles and 4,250 trucks as compared to September 2012. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 26,432 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 444 trucks to produce a 26.33 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of September 2013.

### **E-ZPass** Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of September, 2013 and September, 2012, and the year-to-date periods ending September 30, 2013 and September 30, 2012.

### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of September 2013 and the nine month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2013 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,592,636 for the month of September. For the 2013 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$34,721,012 or 94.2% of the year-to-date operating budget. All of the expense line items are within their line item budget except for EZPass operating expense. A change in accounting procedure during June of this year for EZPass collection agency fees moved the charges from the operating revenue to operating expense. The net result of this change does not affect the net operating income.

There were no other unusual expenses during the month of September.

### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

### September 2013

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of September 2013, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 42 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 47 price inquiries were sent out for 19 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.47 per order  $(47 \div 19)$ . Some of the larger procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period are shown below:

- > Two Purchase Orders, in the total amount of \$237,837.30 were issued under the 2013 Capital Vehicles and Equipment Budget for the I-78 Toll Bridge Facility for a John Deere tractor with cab and flail mower and a 2014 Mack single axle chassis for dump/plow operations.
- ➤ A Purchase Order in the total amount of \$17,727.79 was issued for the air condenser coil replacement for the third floor at the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

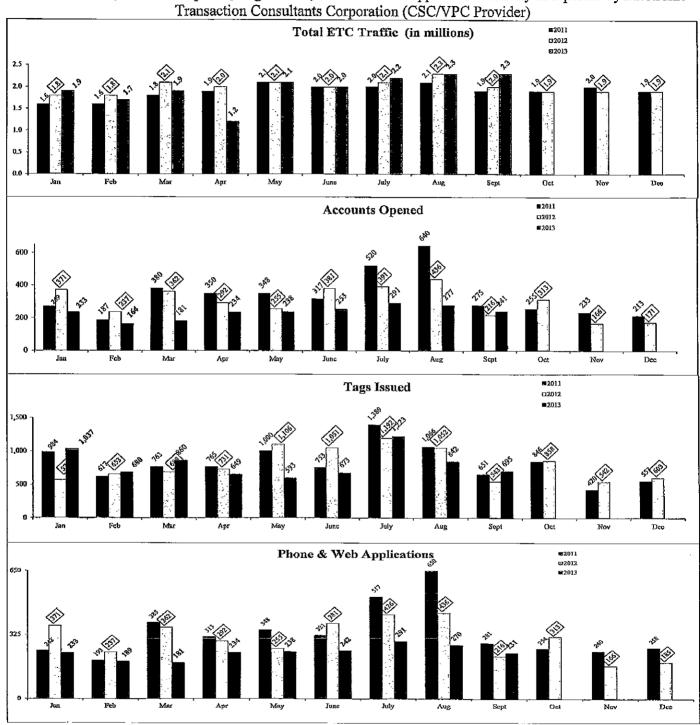

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

#### Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox continues to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system.
- 2. Xerox submitted the annual ORT System Certification report and it was reviewed by Commission Staff. Comments were submitted to Xerox and a revised document is under review.
- 3. Replacement of treadle frames in the conventional toll lanes at the I-78 Toll Bridge (lanes 2 & 3), the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge (lanes 5, 6 and 7) and a repair of a treadle frame at the I-78 Toll Bridge (lane 4) is on-going.
- 4. Acquisition of the 2013 spare parts is complete. Commission Staff completed an inventory check and invoices have been processed for payment. The 2014 Spare Parts/Consumable list was prepared and included in the 2014 Electronic Toll Collection budget.
- Xerox technicians have made several adjustments to the VES cameras at the I-78 Toll
  Bridge to enhance image capture quality. Analysis of update to the Optical Character
  Recognition is on-going by Xerox.
- 6. The Commission at the September 2013 Meeting approved the final one year option of the maintenance agreement with Xerox. A letter has been prepared and issued to Xerox informing them of the action and requesting a meeting to discuss submission of a proposal for continued maintenance service.

1. ETC participated in weekly CSC/VPC Operations Calls.

#### General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

The month of September 2013 the Contract Compliance Department was busy with a number of activities in an effort to establish a comprehensive and inclusive program geared to effectively increase the number of minority/women/veterans/disadvantaged and small business enterprises' ability to do business with the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission. In 2008, the Commission adopted a MWSBE Pilot Program with two separate resolutions to award a percentage of the contracts to Minority Business Enterprise (MBE - 7%); Women Business Enterprise (WBE - 3%) for contracts in Pennsylvania, and Small Business Enterprise (SBE - 25%) for contracts in New Jersey. The Commission adopted a resolution for the MWSBE Program to permanent status December 2010.

According to records kept by CCP Manager, Christine Baker 64 contracts with M/W/SBE requirements were awarded in the Capital Program. Out 30 contracts completed and closed, 19 (17 MWBE and 2 SBE) met the M/W/SBE goals and 11 contracts (9 MWBE and 2 SBE) did not.

As the CCP department continues to gather information for the policies that will guide how the program will operate, the Director and the Manager have been researching other existing peer agencies' programs that support M/W/S/D/VBE subcontractors in an effort to obtain the best practices in the industry. The Contract Compliance Programs Department has developed a draft document with proposed guidelines that has been forwarded to the Executive Director. In addition, The CCP department has begun conversations with members of the engineering department in an effort to be more proactive in gathering the necessary information and data that will assist in developing the guidelines.

The CCP has also begun the process of collecting subcontractors' information that will be useful to develop a data base of certified and verifiable M/W/S/D/VBE.

The Contract Compliance Manager also continues to performed Technical Evaluation reviews for M/W/SBE compliance for prospective bidders of Commission upcoming projects, monitors payments, and prepares reports on a monthly basis. The CCP department attended oral interviews meetings for contracts C-549AR, C-556A and C-628B that were conducted by the respective project managers of the Engineering Department.

The CCP Director has joined the TEC committee and will participate in the review process for bidders of upcoming Commissions projects.

The CCP is also in the process of developing an outreach plan to assure that the M/W/S/D/VBE can maximize the opportunity for participation and performance engagement in Commission's projects.

The table below reflects the total MBE/WBE/ and SBE projections, actual and anticipated amount paid for 2010 - 2013. The CCP is anticipating that with the development of the department, this numbers will significantly increase.

#### COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

2012 Annual Report – Completed submission of all copy and photographs to Brabender Cox media consultants for design of 2012 annual report, which will be a thumb-drive-based product. Oversaw photoshop corrections to the Commissioners' photograph. Vetted all copy with other departments and respective project managers. Obtained a variety of third-party photographs to round out the design options for report entries. The report is expected to consist of 44-pages, including the four-page cover section.

Suicide Crisis Intervention Signs — Due to a spate of reported suicide attempts and threatened suicides at various bridges, a proposed crisis-intervention-phone-line sign campaign was accelerated in September. A draft sign concept was put forward based using the toll free number of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. Working with Community Affairs, Engineering and Operations, the signs are to be produced in the coming weeks and posted at bridge's that have experienced suicides or suicide threats.

New Hope-Lambertville Bridge Crossing Anniversary – Issued press release to advance next year's 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the first bridge to link New Hope and Lambertville across the Delaware River. The original wooden covered bridge at the location opened September 13, 1814.

# PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

#### STUDY Contract No. C-393A

On June 14, 2012 FHWA issued the NEPA decision a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project in Bucks County, Pennsylvania and Mercer County in New Jersey. This is a determination that the Proposed Action will have no significant impact on the human environment.

The Commission submitted a formal request for the final approval of the project's Point of Access Study Report on July 6, 2012. A conditional approval of this report was issued by NJDOT, PennDOT and FHWA in November 2011. This conditional approval permitted the circulation of the Addendum to the Environmental Assessment for public review in December 2011. Final approval of this document typically occurs after the NEPA decision for a project. On September 21<sup>st</sup> correspondence was received from PennDOT accepting the Final Point of Access Report for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project. NJDOT acceptance of the Final Point of Access Report was received via letter dated November 19, 2012. The PennDOT and NJDOT approval letters were packaged with the Final Point of Access Report and submitted to FHWA – Pennsylvania Division for their final approval, which was received January 14, 2013. This completes the Preliminary Design and Environmental Documentation Phase of the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project.

The final invoice for this contract has been submitted and the contract is in the process of being closed out. Further work efforts for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Project are being performed, and tracked, under various Task Order Assignments associated with Contract C-502A Capital Program Management Consultant & I-95/Scudder Falls TS Bridge Improvement Design Management Consultant Professional Services, by AECOM.

# FINANCIAL/LEGAL ADVISORY SERVICES FOR A P3 FOR SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

### STUDY Contract No. C-393G-1R

The Commission's Financial/Legal Advisory Services consultant KPMG/Nossaman, completed their analysis of the P3 project delivery method on schedule, and presented their preliminary findings to the Commission in November 2011. These findings are currently under review by the Commission with a final decision pending.

#### **CPMC SERVICES - YEAR 2012**

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-1G

Capital Program Management Consultant (CPMC) Services and Design Management Consultant Services (DMC) for the SFB Project continued through the 2012 year under this Task Order Assignment. The CPMC continued to support the Commission in its Capital Improvement Program by providing program management and project management services for various engineering and construction contracts. The DMC continued to support the Commission in advancing the Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project through to design and construction, including supporting the Commission through a traditional Design-Bid-Build procurement or a Public-Private Partnership (P3) procurement. The services included ongoing coordination efforts with the Transportation Agencies (FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT) and development of the documentation (reports, agreements, etc.) that is necessary to advance the project.

CPMC services on this Task Order Assignment concluded in April 2013. All work remaining to be performed in 2013 will be done under new Task Order Assignment C-502A-1H.

The overall DMC support and coordination services for the Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project on Task Order Assignment C-502A-1G concluded at the end of April with the authorization of Task Order Assignment C-502A-2F. These services will be continued under the new Task Order Assignment C-502A-2F, DMC Services for 2013. Task Order Assignment C-502A-1G will remain open to cover scope items of technical support for the construction staging and grading/drainage plan effort as well as final design for the PA wetlands mitigation site. This effort includes development of the grading and drainage plans associated with each construction stage for the work in PA. This is required for the Bucks County Soil Erosion Permit and the PADEP permit process. The soil borings and monitoring well installation work associated with the PA wetlands mitigation site remains on hold due to site access issues with the property owner.

#### **CPMC SERVICES - YEAR 2013**

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-1H

Capital Program Management Consultant (CPMC) Services are continuing in year 2013 under this Task Order Assignment. The CPMC is continuing to support the Commission in its Capital Improvement Program by providing program management and project management services for various engineering and construction contracts. CPMC Staff began work on this new Task Order Assignment in April 2013. During this reporting period, CPMC Staff continued to provide a full-time Resident Engineer in the CM/CI oversight of Contract T-543A, NH-L Toll Bridge Pavement Rehabilitation and Approach Bridges Repairs. The CPMC also provided construction inspection oversight for the treadle frame replacements at the I-78 TB and the DWG TB Toll Plazas under Contract T-633A.

# DMC TOLLING STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT SERVICES

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2C

The federal transportation funding reauthorization (MAP-21), signed into law on July 6, 2012, eliminates the need for a tolling agreement. In a letter dated September 21, 2012 the FHWA confirmed that a tolling agreement is not required for the project. With the issuance of the FONSI for the Project, all work under this Task Order Assignment is complete. The final invoice for this assignment has been submitted and this Task Order Assignment is now in the process of being closed out.

# DMC ADVANCED ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR PRIORITY ITEMS OF WORK

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2D

Environmental Permitting - NJDEP issued the following permits in June for the SFB Project: Flood Hazard Area Verification, Flood Hazard Area Individual Permit, Freshwater Wetlands Individual Permit, and Water Quality Certificate Approval. These permit approvals are effective June 20, 2013 and expire June 19, 2018. The Delaware & Raritan Canal Commission (D&RCC) issued a Certificate of Approval for the project on July 15, 2013. On July 30, 2013 a pre-application meeting was held with the Bucks County Soil Conservation District (BCSCD) to discuss details with the permit application package that is planned to be submitted in late September. A draft NJ riparian zone mitigation plan was submitted to NJDEP, in August, for review in accordance with the approved NJDEP Flood Hazard Area Individual Permit. Engineering is also reviewing the New Jersey wetlands and riparian zone mitigation options recommendation memo prepared by AECOM.

AECOM continued to perform Public Involvement activities, including monitoring of the Project Hotline and updates to the Project Website.

#### Meeting of October 29, 2013 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The Right of Way (ROW) impacts to adjacent property owners have been reassessed for the proposed project, based on the final grading and drainage plan detail that has been developed. The draft easement language for the existing NJDEP – Green Acres easements over the D&R Canal was submitted to NJDEP – Green Acres on April 24, 2013 for review and comment. The DRJTBC is planning on expanding the existing easement over the canal as part of the NJDEP – Green Acres property diversion process. In July the right-of-way plan and easement description documents for the Green Acres Diversion were submitted to NJDEP – Green Acres for final review and were subsequently approved by their Right-of-Way Group. Draft ROW Plans for the Pennsylvania section of the project were submitted to Engineering for review and comment. The process for moving forward with the ROW acquisition process, including property owner outreach and Legal Counsel involvement, is currently being planned internally by Commission staff. ROW efforts beyond those of AECOM and Commission staff are on hold pending a GO/NO-GO decision on the P3 procurement process.

### STAFF AUGMENTATION - P3 SUPPORT SERVICES

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2E

AECOM was issued a Notice to Proceed on the Task Order Agreement (TOA) on November 16, 2010. Under this TOA, AECOM provided professional services, in a staff augmentation format, in support of the P3 Financial/Legal Advisory Services contract C-393G-1R. Efforts on this task order assignment are currently on hold pending a GO/NO-GO decision on the P3 procurement process.

#### **DMC SERVICES - YEAR 2013**

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2F

Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are continuing in year 2013 under this Task order Assignment. The DMC is continuing to provide coordination and support services to the Commission in advancing the Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project. The work effort includes public involvement program support and coordination/support with the environmental permitting effort, the ROW plan development, the PennDOT/NJDOT Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) process, the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility MOA process, and, when a P3 decision is made, coordination and support in advancing the project into final design and construction.

#### Meeting of October 29, 2013 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

During this reporting period coordination continued with NJDEP and NJDOT regarding the Draft MOA for the Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility in NJ. The DMC continued to provide project hotline support as well as coordination with the environmental permitting and ROW plan development effort. The DMC also provided support in developing back-up materials related to the Interim Decision documentation and the ongoing coordination with PA and NJ. A meeting was held on August 13<sup>th</sup> with representatives from PA and NJ to discuss a coordinated process of moving forward with the SFB Project. As a follow-up to this meeting, electronic copies of more than 60 reports and documents, prepared in conjunction with the SFB Project, were provided to the PA and NJ Commission representatives.

# NEW HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE PAVEMENT REHABILITATION & APPROACH BRIDGES REPAIRS

#### DESIGN Contract No. C-543A

Cherry, Weber and Associate's (CWA) continued their post-design phase services of their contract, including submittal review, providing answers to RFIs, and meeting participation as needed.

# CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT / CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-543A

Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. (JMT) continued their CM/CI services for the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge, Route 202, Pavement Rehabilitation and Approach Bridges Repairs Project. JMT's current staff consists of a Project Manager, Office Engineer and three (3) inspectors. The Resident Engineering position is being filled by AECOM's CPMC Project Manager. Field Staff continue to inspect/monitor the remaining concrete roadway improvements including spall repairs, and saw cutting and sealing of the concrete joints. The Route 29 bridge work continued including cleaning and painting of the superstructure, bearing replacement, substructure spall repairs, construction of new bearing pedestals and installation of new deck joints. JMT is also inspecting the cleaning and painting of the highway lighting poles and overhead sign structures; deck/parapet sealing of the all three bridges; spall repairs to the median barrier and the underside of the Route 32 Bridge. JMT continues tracking submittals, RFIs, correspondence, developing pay estimates, monitoring the construction schedule and providing minutes of project meetings.

#### Meeting of October 29, 2013 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

#### CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-543A

James D. Morrissey, Inc. (JDM) was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's March meeting and full Notice to Proceed was issued effective April 30, 2013. JDM has completed the majority of US 202 roadway repairs including the concrete slab replacements and joint sealing. JDM also continued cleaning and painting the highway light poles, overhead sign structures and the superstructure of the Route 202 Bridge over NJ Route 29. The replacement of the bearings under the NJ 29 Bridge continues, including the construction of new bearing pedestals at the piers and abutments. Spall repairs on these piers and abutments also continue and the replacement of the deck joints at the abutments to this bridge have begun.

# LUMBERVILLE-RAVEN ROCK TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE REHABILITATION & RETAINING WALL RECONSTRUCTION

#### DESIGN Contract No. C-443A

The engineering design firm of Amman & Whitney (A &W) has completed their task of providing post-design services. The contract is being closed out.

# CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION Contract No. CM-443A

STV Inc. is concluding their CM efforts with the submission of the project files, final as-built drawings and final contract quantities to the Commission. The final construction contract Change Order was approved at the September Commissioners' Meeting. STV developed and submitted the final construction invoice for processing.

#### Meeting of October 29, 2013 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

#### CONSTRUCTION Contract No. TS-443A

James J. Anderson Construction Company, Inc. (JJA) reached substantial completion on May 24<sup>th</sup> with the punch list work completed by May 31<sup>st</sup>. JJA has agreed to settle the outstanding change orders for a negotiated amount of \$208,031.00. The negotiated change order is for the additional effort involved with removing concrete from the deck edge mortar joint and obstructions encountered during the drilling of the retaining wall piles. The final project closeout change order was approved at the September Commission Meeting, which increased the final contract amount by \$126,361.12 for a total contract value of \$2,588,336.12. The final invoice is currently being processed.
