

IMPROVING E-ZPASS

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission has improved its electronic toll collection system, giving motorists new reasons to obtain E-ZPass accounts.



During 2010, the Commission removed the gates from the E-ZPass lanes at its seven toll bridges. This means E-ZPass customers no longer need to come to a complete stop when paying a DRJTBC toll, although they will need to slow down when travelling through conventional barrier toll plazas.

The Commission also has established Express E-ZPass service (electronic toll paying at highway speeds) at its two busiest toll bridges. A two-lane Express E-ZPass facility opened at the I-78 Toll Bridge (photo above) in May 2010. A single-lane Express E-ZPass facility opened at the Delaware Water Gap (I-80) Toll Bridge in November 2010 (photo below).

E-ZPass is now used by 24 different toll agencies spread across 14 states.

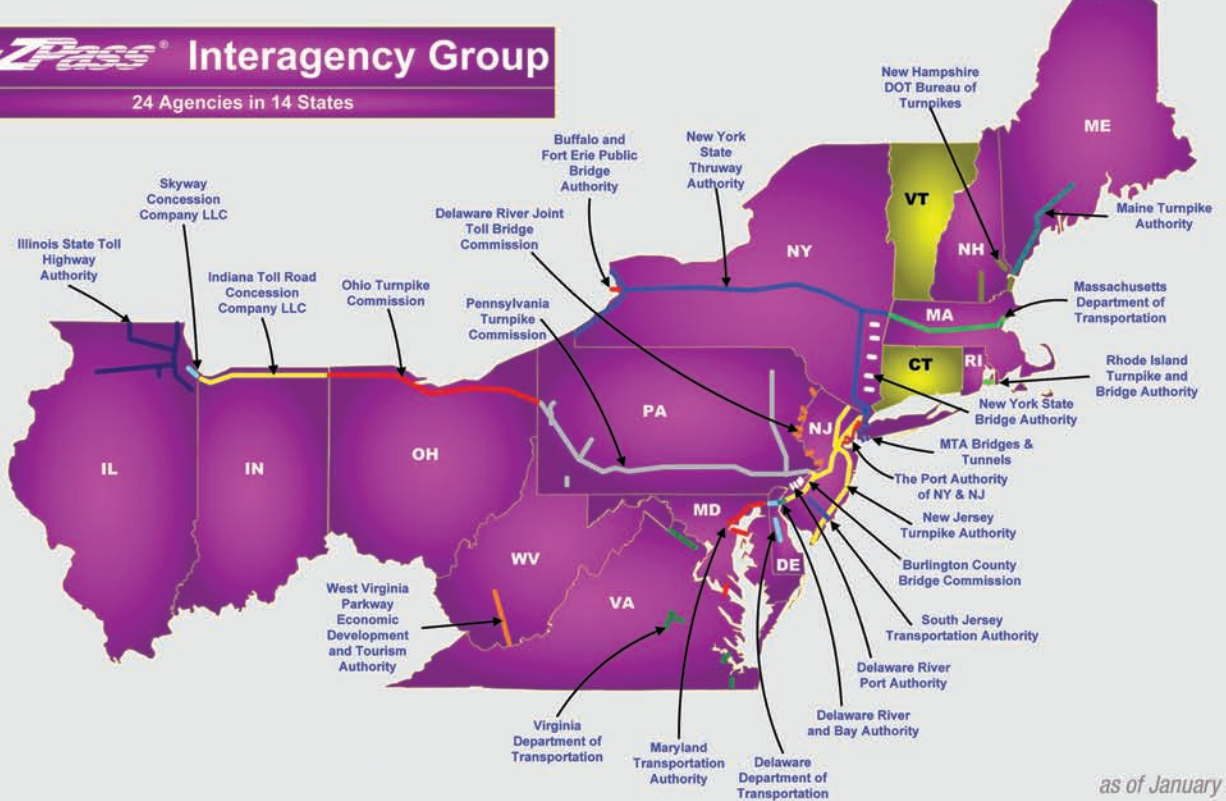

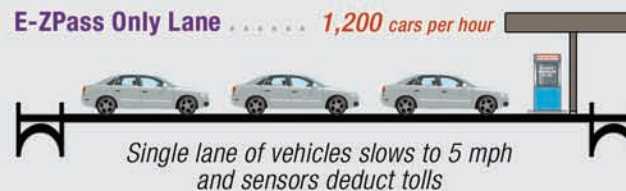
24 Agencies in 14 States

DRJTBC E-ZPass Discounts

The Bridge Commission provides E-ZPass toll discounts to commuters who frequently use the agency's toll bridges and truck drivers who travel during off-peak hours.

Commuter Discounts ➤ 40-percent discount is automatically applied when an E-ZPass account holder makes 20 trips through a DRJTBC toll plaza in a 35 day period. The discount reduces the \$1.00 base automobile toll to 60 cents.

Truck Discounts ➤ All Class 2 thru Class 7 vehicles (vehicles with commercial license plates) that are equipped with E-ZPass transponders qualify for automatic 10-percent discounts during off-peak periods (9:01 p.m. - 5:59 a.m.)

E-ZPass Plus

Bridge Commission E-ZPass customers who automatically replenish their accounts with credit cards are eligible to pay parking fees at select locations. The list currently includes Atlantic City's New York Avenue Parking Garage, NJ; Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR), NJ; and John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK), NY. There is no additional charge for the E-ZPass Plus program.
