ROLL CALL

Frank G. Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Meeting of October 25, 2010

Good Morning.
Thank you, Mr. Chairman...

I want to spend a few moments about the economy's residual effects on our traffic numbers and toll collections. Overall, we have seen a nearly unbroken series of steadily rising monthly traffic and toll-collection figures since the middle of 2009. September continued this trend of good outcomes, toll traffic for the month increased by 5.59 percent over what we experienced in September 2009. Concurrently, September's toll revenue was up 2.32 percent over Sept. 2009 As for year-to-date comparisons with 2009, toll revenue for the first nine months of this year is slightly more than 2.9 percent above last year's levels. Additionally, toll traffic numbers are running about 4 percent ahead of last year's figures. While the general trend has been a positive one over the past 18 months or so, commercial traffic – our most important revenue generator – has yet to recover to pre-recession levels.

A rededication ceremony was held at the Calhoun Street Bridge on October 12, attendees included Commissioners Heller and Laurenti, New Jersey Deputy Transportation Commissioner Joseph Mrozek, Trenton Mayor Tony Mack, Morrisville Mayor Rita Ledger, and council members from both communities. One of the highlights was the involvement of a military reenactors group from Trenton – the 6th Regiment U.S. Colored Troops Inc (My ears are working again). Many of the attendees gushed with praise about the completed project and the event received both newspaper and television coverage.

The most-challenging phase of the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Express E-ZPass Project – at least from a traffic perspective – ended a day earlier than expected on Thursday, October 14, that afternoon, a fifth toll collection lane was put back into service at the bridge's toll plaza. The additional lane has helped to relieve – though not eliminate -- project-related traffic backups at the bridge. The five-lane plaza configuration will remain in place during peak periods for the next month. Our goal remains unchanged – to open an Express E-ZPass lane at this location on November 22, just in time for the busy Thanksgiving Day Holiday Weekend.

The rehabilitation work at the Riegelsville Bridge continues to move forward. Bridge closures are being employed from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. on weeknights and on select weekends, the bridge is being shut down from 8 p.m. on Friday to 7 a.m. on Monday, the third such weekend shutdown occurred just this past weekend. The bridge closures are to end by December 1. We set this deadline so the project's closure periods would not overlap with work that will begin later this fall for a rehabilitation of the Upper Black Eddy-Milford Toll-Supported Bridge. The goal is for all of the Riegelsville project work to be completed by Christmas Eve.

Despite higher river levels, work continues on repairs and rehabilitations of the substructures at 12 of our 20 bridges. This project stems from the findings of underwater inspections reports and an assessment of substructure conditions following the 2006 flood. This may be an unglamorous project compared to our other capital initiatives, but it is by no means less important, scour – the undermining of the piers and abutments that support a bridge – is the number one cause of bridge failures in the United States, in fact, all of the other causes of bridge failures combined do not add up to scour as a cause.

I have a reason for listing the Scour Remediation Project as my last status update. The Commission witnessed an extraordinary event this past month when the remnants of a tropical storm inundated the Delaware River watershed with rain over a two-day period. On October 1, a construction barge that was being used in conjunction with the Scour Remediation Project went adrift in the river when water levels rose. This occurred during the early morning hours before the project's crew reported to the work site – in this case, at the New Hope-Lambertville (Route 202) Toll Bridge. Luckily for us, members of the New Hope Eagle Fire Company were already casting a wary eye at the river due to their years of flooding experience. One of the officers – Fire Chief Craig Forbes – noticed the wayward barge in the river and the potential threat it posed to the piers of our historic truss bridge down river between New Hope and Lambertville, this set in motion a six-hour emergency effort to bring the barge under control, navigate safely beneath the bridge, and then tow it into the New Hope shoreline where it could be safely secured out of harm's way. We are honored to have the firemen who carried out this mission with us here today.

- "WHEREAS the Commission and the communities of Lambertville and New Hope are profoundly grateful for the tireless, efficient and courageous actions that Chief Forbes and his colleagues performed in the execution of their volunteer community-service mission; now, therefore,

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of October 25, 2010 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (SEPTEMBER, 2010)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for September 2010 in comparison to the September 2009 traffic and revenue statistics. Toll revenue increased 2.32% for the month of September and was up 2.93% on a full year comparison.

Analysis of September 2010/September 2009 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increased of 2.32% percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 1.90 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 6.14 percent increase.

Analysis of September 2010/September 2009 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 175,904 vehicles, or 5.59 percent.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 7,651 vehicles, or 1.90 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 168.253 vehicles, or 614 percent
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for September 2010 decreased by 230,990 vehicles, or 8.80 percent as compared to September 2009.

Traffic analysis for 2010 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges through the first nine months of 2010 was 106,410 total vehicles as compared to 102,135 total vehicles for January through September 2009, an increase of 4.19 percent.
- Recorded westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for YTD 2010 is reflecting a 2.27 percent decrease as compared to the same nine month period in 2009.

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for September 2010 reflected a 22.42 percent increase as a result of an increase of 124,732 cars and an increase of 4,646 trucks when compared to September 2009. It should be noted that roadway construction work preparation for the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Rehabilitation and One Auxiliary Northbound Lane (T-380B) began in September 2006, with full lane closures commencing in September 2007. This project was substantially completed in September 2009. Closure of the Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge for rehabilitation, has resulted in diversion of normally non-toll bridge traffic onto the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge during the period of May 24, 2010 through September 24th, when the bridge reopened to traffic. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 3,463 cars combined with an increase of 97 trucks to generate an overall increase in total toll traffic of 2.14 percent for September 2010 as compared to September 2009.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an overall increase of 5.59 percent in total toll traffic for the month of September 2010 compared to September 2009 as the result of an increase of 40,830 cars and an increase of 6,453 trucks. It should be noted that the two new ORT lanes at I78 opened on May 13, 2010. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 3,942 passenger vehicles and 3,987 trucks combined to generate a 1.59 percent decrease in total toll traffic for September 2010.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 12.16 percent increase in total toll traffic during September 2010 as a result of an increase of 11,938 automobiles and an increase of 1,788 trucks compared to September 2009. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, combined decreases of 10,425 passenger vehicles and 1,533 trucks generated a 1.46 percent decrease in total toll traffic for September 2010 as compared to September 2009. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 1,657 passenger vehicles combined with an increase of 187 trucks to produce an overall 1.49 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of September 2010.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of September, 2010 and September, 2009, and the year-to-date periods ending September 30, 2010 and September 30, 2009.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of September 2010 and the nine month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2010 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,380,711 for the month of September. For the 2010 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$32,643,022 or 94.5% of the year-to-date operating budget. Most of the expense line items are well within their year-to-date operating budget.

There are several line items that are currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Salary expense is currently running about .21% or \$28,000 over budget. The current operating budget anticipates a 3.5% vacancy rate for all salary classes but currently less than 2% of budgeted positions are vacant. Overtime is 1.7% or \$4,000 over budget due to the significant snow events in early 2010. Health Care Benefit cost is 2.76% or \$125,000 due to higher than budgeted rates for the premium based healthcare plan. EZPass Operating Expense is 1.2% or \$29,000 due to higher credit card cost for Violation Processing and higher replenishment cost due to higher revenue. All other expense line items are within their budgets

There were no unusual expenditures during the month of September.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

September 2010

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of September 2010, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Conmission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 90 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 117 price inquiries were sent out for 50 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.34 per order (117÷50). Significant procurements for the period are highlighted below:

- ➤ One Purchase Orders was let in the amount of \$109,904.05 for additional radios and spares.
- ➤ One Purchase Order in the amount of \$72,000.00 was issued for E-ZPass electronic toll collection system spare parts.
- ➤ One Purchas Order was issued at the request of IT, in the amount of \$15,156.84, for desktop PC upgrades.
- > Two Purchase Orders were let totaling \$14,640.00 for two (2) quarters of maintenance of four (4) USGS river gauges sponsored by the Commission. These gauges showed their real value during the recent storm event.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

• COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

Reopenings of Calhoun Street and Washington Crossing Toll-Supported Bridges: Generated broad media coverage – television, radio, newspaper and Internet – and raised public awareness of the reopenings of the Calhoun Street and Washington Crossing Toll-Supported Bridges on Friday, September 24. News release issued in advance of the reopening the respective bridge closings ended as the Commission's promised target date. Work crews reported that motorists and pedestrians were on hand at the Calhoun Street Bridge to be among the first to travel across the rehabilitated structure. Worked with project team and Community Affairs Director Richard McClellan to craft a final newsletter for the Calhoun Street Bridge project.

Delaware Water Gap Express E-ZPass Project: Issued a series of press releases and took part in several television/radio interviews throughout the month to raise public awareness of the onset of traffic impacts arising from Express E-ZPass construction activities at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge. The public awareness effort has resulted in feature postings on the NJ511 Travel Alert network and expanded motorist warnings on Metro Networks traffic reports in northern New Jersey and on New York metropolitan radio stations. A special project update also was developed and issued toward the end of the month to spread the word about the likelihood intensified peak-travel-time traffic delays from October 1 through October 15.

Riegelsville Toll-Supported Bridge Rehabilitation Project: Edited a draft project newsletter and made extensive updates — including adding new photographs — to the webpage for the Riegelsville Toll-Supported Bridge Rehabilitation Project. Also issued a series of press releases regarding full bridge closure periods during the month of September.

Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Inspections: Generated news coverage and feature photographs of the detailed inspection work that took place in mid-September at the Easton-Phillipsburg (Route 22) Toll Bridge. The work involved engineers and inspectors using ropes and cables to access the upper truss work of the 72-year-old bridge. The goal of this public awareness effort was to prevent hysteria and misinformation about the presence of the bridge climbers; this goal was achieved.

September 2010

During the month of September, 2010 the Director of Policy and Planning participated in a number of communications and meetings that explored the following:

The Director attended the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission Communications Department Meeting.

The Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce Transportation Committee continued its draft policy discussion concerning why transportation funding is critically required. The committee received transportation updates from Joe Gurinko, Lehigh Valley Planning Commission's Chief Transportation Planner; and Ron Young, PennDOT District 5's Chief Press Officer. The Director reminded the committee that the Commission's I-80/Delaware Water Gap Bridge Open Road Tolling Project would begin after Labor Day.

The Greater Pocono Chamber of Commerce Government Relations and Public Policy Committee received a Harrisburg update from Pennsylvania State Representative John Siptroth (D-189). The Director distributed to the committee the Commission's most current press release regarding the I-80/Delaware Water Gap Bridge Open Road Tolling Project.

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) Planning Coordinating Committee and Regional Transportation Committee were updated by Joseph Hacker, DVRPC Manager, Office of Transit, Bicycle, and Pedestrian Planning and Greg Krykewycz, DVRPC Senior Transportation Planner on transit projects completed in 2010, transit projects ongoing, and transit work programmed for 2011.

The Greater Pocono Chamber of Commerce Economic Development/Transportation Committee heard and discussed updates from representatives of the following agencies/organizations: Pocono Mountains Economic Development Corporation, Pennsylvania Northeast Regional Railroad Authority, Monroe County Transportation Authority, Monroe County Planning Commission, C.A.R.E (Citizens Against Regulatory Excess), Safe80, PennDOT District 5, and the Director reporting on the Commission's I-80/Delaware Water Gap Bridge Open Road Tolling Project.

The Easton Area Chamber of Commerce featured a Senatorial Update presented by Pennsylvania State Senator Bob Mensch (R-24). Senator Mensch highlighted the major issues, including transportation, facing the General Assembly in Harrisburg.

The Pike County Road Task Force was updated by Pennsylvania State Representatives Michael Peifer (R-139) and John Siptroth (D-189) concerning the Commonwealth's transportation funding issue. Dennis Giordano, PennDOT District 4 Assistant District Executive – Maintenance, Harold Hill, PennDOT District 4 Bridge Engineer, and Robert Collins, PennDOT District 4 Pike County Maintenance Manager discussed countywide transportation projects. The Director reported on the Commission's I-80/Delaware Water Gap Bridge Open Road Tolling Project

The Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce Public Policy Committee discussed updates from the Chamber's four subcommittees: Energy/Environment, Healthcare, Tax, and Transportation.

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) Board Meeting, Executive Committee Meeting, and 24th Annual Board Retreat were held at the ACE Conference Center in Lafayette Hill, Pennsylvania. 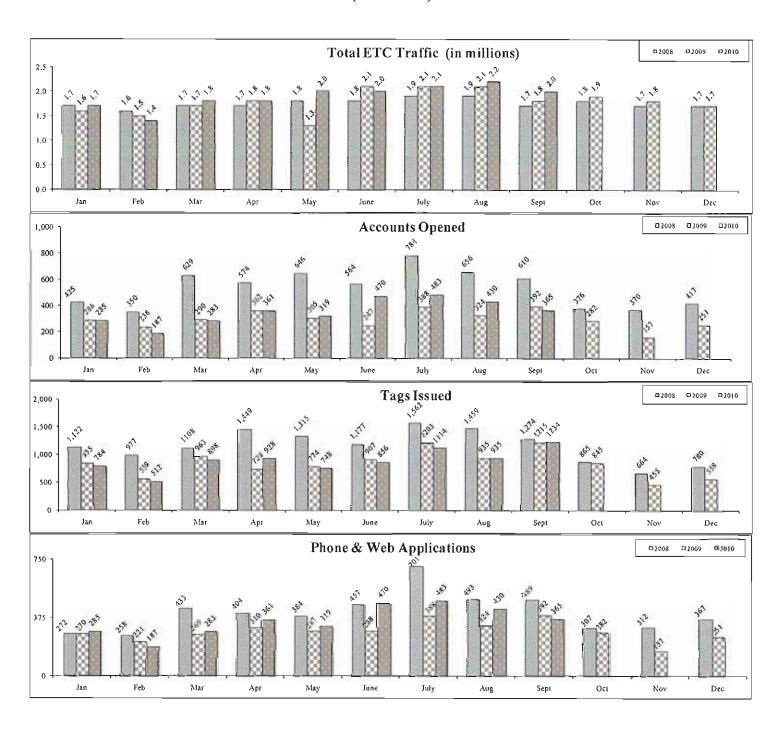

PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION FOR I-95/SCUDDER FALLS TOLL SUPPORTED BRIDGE

STUDY Contract No. C-393A

The Environmental Assessment (EA)/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation for the project was circulated for public comment on 12/9/09 and was made available for public review on the Commission's project website and at a number of publicized locations. Public comments were accepted until 2/4/2010, the end of the requisite public comment period.

In conjunction with the EA review process, a Public Hearing was conducted in compliance with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Act of 1970, and Section 128 Title 23 of the United States Code, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as well as New Jersey Department of Transportation policies and procedures. The design consultant AECOM, with HNTB as their Environmental Team Sub-consultant, have prepared responses to the comments received during the public comment period, which have been reviewed by the Commission. To initiate the process of requesting a FONSI from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), these responses have been submitted to PennDOT, PennDOT HDAQ (Legal), NJDOT, and FHWA Metro Philadelphia and PA Division offices for review.

At a meeting held with FHWA and PennDOT representatives on June 11, 2010 the Commission was informed that tolling will have to be made part of the proposed action for the project and the impacts from tolling the bridge will have to be addressed as part of the current EA process. The FHWA will not issue a FONSI for the project until the impacts from tolling have been assessed. A subsequent meeting/conference call on August 25, 2010 with FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT representatives confirmed that an addendum to the current EA document will have to be prepared to address the tolling impacts to the project, and make tolling of the SFB part of the proposed action for the project.

The EA/Draft 4(f) Document was also distributed to each of the involved transportation agencies and the Cooperating Agencies (US Army Corps of Engineers, ES EPA, PA DEP and the National Marine Fisheries Service) for their review. The Section 4(f) Evaluation, which is part of the EA, was forwarded by FHWA to their Washington D.C. Office for the Conditional Legal Sufficiency Review. This review has been completed by FHWA, and the request for the final executed Programmatic Agreement has been made by FHWA to issue Legal Sufficiency. , The EA/Draft 4(f) Document will now need to address all comments received from the review agencies and to reflect tolling of the SFB as part of the proposed action. The final EA/4(f) Document will then be submitted to the FHWA's Washington D.C. Office along with a fully executed copy of the Programmatic Agreement for a final Legal Sufficiency review.

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Meeting of October 25, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Both NJ and PA State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) have issued determinations of effects for project effects on historic and archaeological resources. A Draft **Programmatic Agreement** to stipulate future actions required under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act was reviewed by FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT. This document identifies the mitigation measures to be taken as a result of the finding of Adverse Effect to the Delaware & Raritan Canal cultural resource and potential for adverse effect to archaeological resources in PA and NJ.

The Commissioners, at the February 22, 2010 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the Programmatic Agreement on behalf of the Commission. Subsequent to this authorization the Programmatic Agreement was distributed to all signatory agencies on February 25th, 2010. Signatures were received from one (1) of the three *executing signatories* – Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Officer (PHMC); and all (three in total) of the *concurring signatories* – Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), and Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT).

During the signature process the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office (NJSHPO) indicated that they had an issue with certain language within the Programmatic Agreement and therefore could not sign the agreement as written. On August 4, 2010 Commission Staff met with representatives from the New Jersey Governors Office, NJDEP and NJSHPO to resolve the issue with the language in the Programmatic Agreement. Subsequent to this meeting the NJSHPO drafted revised language to the one paragraph in the agreement that was in question. The revised language was forwarded to the Commission for review and comment and has now been agreed to by all parties to the Programmatic Agreement. The Commissioners at the September 27, 2010 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute the modified Programmatic Agreement on behalf of the Commission. The revised Programmatic Agreement will now be distributed to all signatory parties for new signatures.

The FHWA recommended additional consultation with the NMFS on the EA. Accordingly, a **Biological Assessment Report** (BA) was prepared for threatened and endangered (T&E) species impacts and was submitted to the NMFS in September 2008. A major concern to the Cooperating Agencies was the causeway construction method and the associated impacts to the T & E species habitat in the vicinity of the Scudder Falls Bridge. At a meeting held on July 17, 2009 all of the agencies agreed that the trestle causeway is the preferred method of construction in the river. As a result of this meeting, a letter was prepared and submitted to NMFS (dated 9/10/09) that revised the causeway recommendation made in the BA document. On June 11, 2010 the Commission received the final Biological Opinion from NMFS, which includes a determination of 'No Jeopardy' from NMFS. This completes Section 7 consultation.

FINANCIAL/LEGAL ADVISORY SERVICES FOR A P3 FOR SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

STUDY Contract No. C-393G-1

At the Commission's special meeting on August 17, 2010 the Commission announced the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Financial/Legal Advisory Services for a P3 for Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge project. This RFP was posted on the Commissions web site on August 20, 2010.

On August 27, 2010 a Non-mandatory Pre-proposal conference call with interested financial/legal firms was held at the Commission's New Hope Facility. Twenty-two (22) firms participated in the conference call. An additional 38 firms listened to a digital replay of the conference call which was available through September 3, 2010.

On September 17, 2010 ten (10) proposals were received in response to this RFP. The proposals are now being evaluated with Oral Presentations scheduled for early October.

Hill International continues to provide CM/CI services for this contract which includes: monitoring and coordinating the field activities of the contractor associated with Contract DB-427B (punch list work); preparation of contractor invoices; holding and documenting meetings as required; preparing inspection reports for days that the contractor works on site along with finalizing the project documentation. The CM/CI continues Project Close Out.

In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project DB-427C

ACS State and Local Solutions (ACS), Commission staff and STV continue to participate in bi-weekly progress meetings. As needed, ACS participates in coordination conference calls with Commission staff, STV and ETC (Customer Service Center / Violation Processing Center DBOM) to coordinate the VES implementation at the New Hope – Lambertville, Portland – Columbia and Milford – Montague Toll Bridges and the ORT implementation at the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge.

ACS continues to participate in bi-weekly progress meetings with all involved parties for the Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge ORT project. ACS removed the electronic toll collection equipment from Lanes 1 & 2 at the plaza. Additionally, ACS removed the lane control gates in Lanes 4 through 8 and the VES was placed in operations. ACS was on-site during a planned power outage associated with the facilities power upgrade to monitor the health of the toll collection system during the outage.

ACS completed the VES Commissioning Test at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and had placed the system into operation and has removed the lane control gates. VES equipment wiring termination is underway at the Milford-Montague Toll Bridge. ACS is preparing for internal testing followed by Commissioning Testing at this location. VES equipment installation work is underway at the Portland – Columbia Toll Bridge. ACS continues to prepare documentation, and submitted the revised Disaster Recovery Plan, System User Manual and Administrator's User Manual for review.

ACS and TransCore submitted a proposal the revise the software used in the conventional toll lanes system to reduce the occurrence of Cash Lane Violations. This proposal is being evaluated by Commission Staff. Additionally, ACS and TransCore submitted a proposal to replace the lane controllers of the system. This proposal is under review by Commission Staff with the expectation of completing the replacement in 2011.

ACS continues to complete predictive and preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Additionally, ACS is working with Commission Staff to procure the spare parts for this year.

These priority tasks include environmental permitting, right-of-way (ROW) acquisition, archeological work necessary to obtain cultural resource clearance for the project and transition of key public involvement tasks from the Environmental Assessment Phase (Commission Contract C-393A) to the Design Management Consultant (DMC; C-502A). These professional services will include completion of those priority tasks started under DMC Services Task Order Assignment (TOA) C-502A-2B.

In addition, this TOA includes DMC Services to support the Commission's twostep Professional Services procurement process. This process includes the preparation of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) document and a Request for Proposal (RFP) document.

A Limited Notice-to-Proceed (NTP) was issued by the Commission on May 14, 2010 effective April 26, 2010. The Limited NTP allowed for certain tasks to be initiated while the final scope of work and costs for this Task order Assignment were being finalized. The Limited NTP allowed work on the following tasks;

- Phase I/II Archaeological Reports Preparation;
- Phase III Archeological Work Plan Preparation for PHMC approval;
- Commencement of permit support activities;
- Scheduling and participating in Property Owner Meetings;
- Preparation of the RFQ for procurement of a Scudder Falls Project Final Design Consultant, and procurement support.

Meeting of October 25, 2010 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

This TOA was fully executed by the Commission on July 1, 2010. Permit Preapplication Meetings have been held with the Pennsylvania DEP, USACE, NJDEP, the D&R Canal Commission, NJDEP Green Acres and the Bucks County Soil Conservation District. A review meeting was also held with Lower Makefield Township to discuss their stormwater design requirements. The Phase I/II Archeological Reports have been prepared and submitted to PHMC and NJSHPO for review and approval. These reports contain the data recovery work plans for the Phase III archeological field work. The Phase III data recovery for the NJ site is scheduled to begin in early October. In conjunction with the Phase III work effort, the Commissioners at the September 27, 2010 Commission Meeting authorized the Executive Director to execute a License Agreement with AECOM that allows for the use of the Commission owned house along River Road in PA as a field office for the required archaeological activities. Work has begun on the property surveys associated with impacted properties. Work also continues on the stormwater design and the various other tasks associated with this Task Order Assignment.

COMPACT AUTHORIZED INVESTMENT DEPARTMENT September 2010

General

As the end of this year's construction season approaches, the CAI department is starting to receive notices from the representatives of various municipalities in both states indicating that they that would like to request an extension to complete their projects in the Spring of 2011. The CAI department is reviewing each request and determining each project status. Nonetheless, there were a lot of activities with CAI Contract Agreements, projects being bid for construction, and construction projects awards during the month of September. In September a meeting was held at the City of Trenton with representatives from the City, engineers with the AECOM, Mercer County representatives and contractor of the Mercer County Courthouse construction to discuss staging plans with both construction jobs working simultaneously in the same area and the CAI project status.

During the September 27th meeting the Commissioners approved a resolution for a change in the scope of work for the CAI project in the Township of Solebury, PA to include the repaving of the entire length of Walton Drive.

Update of some of the most significant activities with the grantees during the month of June

Pennsylvania

- 1. **Milford Borough, PA** In September, the Borough sent their signed Contract Agreement to the CAI department for completion of full execution. The Borough continues work on getting the necessary permits to try to complete the project by the due date of December 31, 2010. The grant is for a Storm Water Drain System and Street Restoration project and was approved in the amount of \$163,475.00.
- 2. **Smithfield, PA** The Township has signed its contract agreement with DRJTBC and is working in getting all necessary permits to do the project this year. The project consists of developing a pedestrian/bicycle trails system in both the Township of Smithfield and the Borough of Delaware Water Gap. At the April 2010 Commissioners meeting, this application was approved. The Township has been notified of their grant award and the CAI department has executed the grant agreement with the Township.

The construction of the first Pedestrian Improvement project is substantially complete and is waiting for a PennDOT final inspection. The contractor, Grace Industries, has installed the ADA improvements as part of the grant approved by the Commission for the project. As indicated in the past, the ADA features that were installed include detectable warning surfaces at various locations, along with a colored surface overlay for the sidewalk underneath the River Road

Pennsylvania (continued)

underpass. Only a few minor punch list items remain to be completed for the project, including a potential alternate material for the ADA sidewalk treatment near the overpass.

3. Delaware Water Gap, PA – in September the Borough's Mayor requested to change the scope of work from the previously awarded project of a *Route 611 Traffic Signalization Project* approved by the Commissioners at their meeting on January 25, 2010 to three other projects. 1) Replacement of Well House #4 at an estimated cost of \$90,000.00. This well house #4 request did not qualify for the CAI project grant characteristics, and now the Mayor is requesting an extension of the grants until next spring 2011. He is still willing to maintain the Sidewalks construction and repaving of Waring Drive, Traffic Calming along Broad Street and Main Street in the Borough of Delaware Water Gap at an estimated cost of \$10,000.00. 3) Continuation of sidewalk and streetscape improvements along the frontage of the Castle Inn on Waring Drive at an estimated cost of \$30,000.00.

The funded project includes the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of Foxtown Hill Road (SR 0611) & the Martz Trailways Terminal. The CAI department has executed the grant agreement and financial documents with the Borough. To date, the traffic study component of the project has been completed. The other two original projects were completed.

- 4. **Portland Borough, PA** The Borough resubmitted a new application for streetscape improvements on State Street with some modifications in the hope to get it reconsidered by the Commissioners for funding. The application was discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but has not been awarded to date. The three other CAI funded projects have been completed. Only the crosswalk section of the Park and Walk project is waiting for final Penn Dot inspections.
- 5. **Lower Mount Bethel, PA** The Township is working on the Agreement execution of the Park and Ride and Transportation Center Trail project that was approved on June 28th for \$80,191.
- 6. **Easton, PA** The City of Easton continue its work on Riverside Park and Scott Pak. It is also completing all clearances to start new project for the traffic improvements in the North 3rd St. Corridor, which was approved by the Commissioners with some modifications at its general meeting on April 26th.

In January a change order was approved by the CAI department to include new lighting and signage along Larry Holmes Drive south of the Northampton Street Bridge. This work has been completed.

The construction contracts for Phases 1 and 2 of the *Waterfront Improvements* project has been ongoing through the summer months. This includes a "road diet" for Larry Holmes Drive, high visibility pedestrian crosswalks, intersection improvements at Northampton Street and Larry Holmes Drive to improve pedestrian accommodation, along with a sewer line connection from the Commission's

Construction of the ADA Curb Ramps and Decorative Crosswalks, which is part of the *Pedestrian Pathways/Intersection Enhancements and Northampton St. Bridge Bike Path* grant, was completed in September 2009. The City has also purchased and installed the materials for the Bike Path Extension. The curbs and sidewalks abutting the Northampton Street Bridge have been reconstructed. The change order submitted to the CAI department to add new lighting poles in the Scott Park area of the project was approved and completed.

7. **Williams Township, PA** – The *I-78 & Morgan Hill Road Interchange Traffic Signalization project* was completed in August 2008. To date, \$374,014.13 of \$430,590.00 (87% of total grant amount) has been reimbursed to the Township by the CAI Department. In addition, Gary Hillegass Contracting completed the ADA curb ramp work that was required by Penn DOT at the project intersections was repaired. The Township is currently in the process of preparing their final reimbursement request submission to the CAI department for the project.

In the spring, the Township submitted six applications that were discussed at the June Commissioners meeting, but have not been awarded to date. We would also note that it was determined that the Belmont Street Reconstruction and the Hilton Street Improvements projects do not satisfy the required characteristics of the CAI program as they cannot be completed by the December 31, 2010 deadline.

- 8. Riegelsville Borough, PA The Commissioners approved a request by the borough to complete the safety lighting portion of the Pedestrian Bridge project was approved in the amount of \$45,000.00. The Borough has been working on completing the contract requirements for this project.
- 9. Solebury Township, PA Walton Drive Bridge Replacement Project In January the Commissioners approved the Township's new grant application for \$660,000.00 to replace a deteriorated, undersized bridge located in a residential neighborhood in Solebury Township. During the month of June, the Township received bids for the project and the construction contract was awarded to the low bidder, Hale Built Construction. It is anticipated that project will be completed in the Fall 2010. In the September's meeting a resolution was approved for alternate #2 of the original project that permitted a change of scope to repave the entire length of Walton Drive. This work is being constructed.

Construction of the *Route 202 Trail and Park* project began on August 4, 2008 by K.C. Construction, and was completed in September 2009. To date, \$1,204,444.60 of \$1,755,150.00 has been reimbursed by the CAI Department (69%). A reimbursement request, in the amount of \$326,958.65, is currently under review, awaiting further documentation from the Township.

10. **New Hope Borough, PA** – The Borough is working on purchasing the lights fixtures and poles through COSTARS for the Main St. Bridge Lighting project that was approved this Summer in the amount of \$84,815.00.

The construction of the *Bridge St. Traffic Signals project* to Armour & Sons Electric is anticipated to be completed in the Summer 2010 due to the need to include ADA compliant pedestrian facilities as per the direction of PennDOT.

To date the Borough has been reimbursed \$371,705.26 of \$446,404.00 (83% of total grant amount). The Borough recently submitted a reimbursement request in the amount of \$24,168.53, which is currently under review.

- 11. **Falls Township, PA** The original traffic signal installation and modernization project is complete and a final reimbursement request in the amount of \$77,876.00 was approved in December 2008. The Township utilized \$332,571.00 of the \$335,000.00 grant award.
- 12. **Upper Makefield Township, PA** –The Township submitted a new grant application for the completion of the Gateway Park-Village Streetscape Phase 2 project, in the amount of \$54,000.00 that was awarded in the Summer.

The Washington Crossing Gateway project was completed in the Spring 2010. To date the Township has been reimbursed \$1,447,000.00 of \$1,447,000.00 (100% of total grant amount).

13. **Lower Makefield, PA** – The Township submitted a new grant application for the completion of the Black Rock Pedestrian Trail project, in the amount of \$170,877.00 that was awarded. The Township is diligently working on completing this project by the due date of December 31, 2010.

The Traffic Signal project at the intersection of Yardley-Newtown Rd & Creamery Rd is complete. A final reimbursement request has been processed by the Commission and the original grant is closed out.

14. **Bristol Borough, PA** – The construction of the *Traffic Signals Revitalization* project was completed by Armour & Sons Electric in July 2009 and the project has been closed out. The Borough utilized \$1,333,843.28 of \$1,334,450.00 grant (99.9% of total grant amount).

The Borough submitted two new requests for CAI funding that did not meet the characteristics of the CAI program and were not considered for a grant award.

15. Yardley, PA – The CAI department has reimbursed the entire grant amount of \$234,217.00 to the Borough for its Yardley's Borough road Improvements project and the project has been closed out.

The Borough of Yardley in conjunction with the Landmark Towns organization submitted an application to install Wayfinding Signage to/from and through New Hope Borough, Bristol Borough, and Morrisville Borough in the amount of \$872,969.00 This application was discussed at the commissioners June meeting, but was not awarded.

16. Morrisville, PA – The Borough recently submitted eight new roads, lighting, and traffic signal improvements applications. The Borough agreed to submit a new grant application for the Moreau Street Rehabilitation project, in the amount of \$360,000, and one for Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk replacement project. Both of these applications were approved. Work is going well on the Moreau Street Rehabilitation project and the contract agreement is being completed for full execution of the Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk Replacement project.

The four originally funded projects in Morrisville are completed.

New Jersey

- 1. Montague, NJ There was a change in the engineering company for the municipality which has delayed the completion of the projects. However, the construction work has started. Montague submitted 10 change orders requests for approval for a total of \$101,000. The CAI department has requested additional backup information to justify those requests. The CAI has been in discussions with Montague regarding the cost extras and the additional information needed.
- 2. **Knowlton, NJ** After acquiring all the necessary permits, including the DEP permit, the municipality bid the job construction, but only one qualified bid came in and the committee will re-advertise the job with an opening date of October 15th. Some interested contractors are asking if there is a chance the Commission would extend the deadline if weather becomes a factor for the completion date of 12/31/10.
- 3. **Belvidere, NJ** The Water Street Improvements project was completed and closed out in May of 2010. In May the final reimbursement request has been processed and the project is in the process of being closed out.
- 4. **Phillipsburg, NJ** The second phase of the project started construction in May. The sidewalk reconstruction part of the project was completed, only pending part of this job are the trees planting and few punch list items. The agreement for the Extension of South Main Street project –Phase 3 is next, but the municipality is contemplating asking for a project completion extension until the Spring of 2010. This project was awarded a grant for \$997,962 at the Commissioners' February meeting.

New Jersey (continued)

The original project is complete, and a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on December 3, 2008.

- 5. **Pohatcong NJ** A new application was received by the CAI Department for *Resurfacing of River Road*. This application was presented to the Commissioners at their February 2010 meeting. This request was not awarded. The two granted projects to Pohatcong Township have been completed.
- 6. **Holland, NJ** Holland was awarded a CAI grant for the resurfacing of Mt. Joy Road and has requested an extension for the work to be completed by the spring of 2011.

Holland completed and was fully paid for its previous CAI project. This project is in the process of being closed out.

- 7. **Milford, NJ** –The Borough was awarded a grant for the repair and resurfacing of Honeysuckle Lane off Bridge Street. The Borough's staff is working on completing the final designs for this project. It appears that they would need an extension until next year to complete this project. The Bridge Street Improvements project is complete.
- 8. **Frenchtown, NJ** The Park and Ride project is complete. However, no major development has been noted during this period regarding the acquisition of the property for the Village Green Park. Last year the Mayor requested an extension until 2010 for this project, but no significant progress has been made.
- 9. Lambertville, NJ During the June's Commission meeting the Commissioner's approved a new grant for Lambertville's Perry St. Road Reconstruction project. The CAI department has been advised that the City would like an extension for this project until the Spring of 2011. The other outstanding projects are geared to be completed by December 31, 2010. These projects are: Delevan Street Rd. Reconstruction project, McGreary's Alley Reconstruction project, and South Franklin Street Traffic calming project. Construction work is in progress during the Fall until completion by the December 31, 2010 deadline.

The City of Lambertville has completed eight projects since the beginning of the CAI program.

- 10. **Stockton, NJ** The funded CAI projects for the Bridge Street Improvements project is completed. The municipality received a transportation construction project award for its CAI project.
- 11. West Amwell, NJ An application for *Rocktown Hill Road Improvement Project* to the approach to the intersection of Route 31 was approved for \$100,000 by the Commissioners at their January 25, 2010 meeting. The Township is working on completing the project by the deadline of December 31, 2010.

New Jersey (continued)

Meeting of October 25, 2010

The Section 11 of Rocktown-Lambertville Road Reconstruction project is now completed. The Section 12 and Section 13 Road Reconstruction project are also completed. Reimbursement requests continue to be processed for sections 12, and 13 of the completed projects.

12. **Delaware Twp, NJ** – The Township received a new grant for the Improvements and Resurfacing of Federal Twist Rd. and to install drainage improvements and erosion control within the existing road right of way. The Agreement is being process.

The Previous CAI projects were completed. The CAI department and the municipality are in the process of closing out the projects. The municipality has made a request to utilize the remainder of their grant to chip seal the grant project and the Due Diligent engineer is still working with the municipality to ascertain the CAI qualification of this additional project cost.

13. **Hopewell, NJ** – The Township was approved for a grant application for the design and construction of sidewalk replacement in the Village of Titusville. This application was awarded a grant by the Commissioners at their April 2010 meeting. The Township has alluded to the fact that an extension may be needed until the spring of 2011 to complete this project.

The ADA Ramps and Walkway project was complete. The CAI department is in the process of closing out of the project.

- 14. **Ewing, NJ** The Township was awarded a grant Wilburtha Rd. Improvement project. The project will be awarded in October 2010 and it is expected to be completed by December 31, 2010.
- 15. **Trenton, NJ** CAI Director and the due diligence engineer met with representatives of the City, the County, the NJDOT, representatives from the new Mercer County Courthouse development in Trenton, and the City engineers from AECOM to discuss the status of the project and coordinate staging of both projects. A subsequent meeting is to be held with Commission engineers to discuss proposed configurations of the three traffic signals owned by the Commission on Warren Street in Trenton and the traffic analysis on the construction area completed by EACOM engineers. There has been over \$200,000 worth of work done in this project and the reimbursement request is in the process.
- 16. Alpha NJ The Alpha's and Pohatcong's Reconstruction of Edge Rd. project has been completed and is in the process of been closed out.
- 17. **Kingwood, NJ** The Township's Reconstruction of Tumble Falls Road was awarded a grant for \$373,000.00 and the contract agreement has been executed. The project has been awarded and should be completed by the deadline of December 31, 2010.
