ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being three members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman. My report for this month is heavy on the latest developments for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. This is probably going to be the case with many future reports to Commissioners, as this project is going to be our largest capital program endeavor for the next five years. The final design of this multi-faceted project is now turning into the homestretch. The constructability review and independent cost estimate preparations based on the 60-percent design documentation submissions from late winter have now been completed. Our design engineers – Michael Baker, Jr., Inc. – are on pace to complete the core objective of the final design process by the late summer/early fall schedule target. Meanwhile, a host of other preparations for the project are coming together. The New Jersey Green Acres Parkland Diversion Permit

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Application has been placed on the NJ Statehouse Commission's June 30 meeting agenda. The easement agreement with Pennsylvania's Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the Delaware Canal has been forwarded to us for signature. And the intergovernmental agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation concerning the execution of Scudder Falls project activities on PennDOT facilities is positioned for formal approval by the Commission at today's meeting.

"On the construction side of this project, field preparations for Pennsylvania Noise Wall installations are now fully underway. This week, the contractor will be engaged in clearing and grubbing activities in the warranted noise abatement areas. This work will start along I-95 northbound, beginning at the Route 332/Newtown interchange and then progressing to the Taylorsville Road interchange. The contractor will then switch to the I-95 southbound direction to proceed back to the end of the project area. Drilling of foundations for the noise walls is expected to begin in the early July. We are on track to complete this advance construction contract before the main contract for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project gets underway in the first half of 2017.

"Moving to other projects, today's executive agenda includes a resolution on the construction contract award for the I-78 Maintenance Garage Expansion Project. This expansion is critical because of the strategic importance of our I-78 Toll Bridge and flanking I-78 approaches in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Our I-78 facilities have ranked first for annual traffic volumes among our 18 vehicular bridges since 2005. In 2015 alone, the I-78 Toll Bridge handled two-way traffic of more than 24 million vehicular crossings. There is regional and even national implications to this project because our I-78 location serves as the critical link between Northern New Jersey's port shipping terminals and Pennsylvania's expanding warehouse destinations in the Lehigh Valley all the way out westward to Harrisburg. Our bridge has become one of our nation's most heavily travelled commercial truck crossings because of this dynamic. An estimated 5.7 million trucks utilized our I-78 corridor in both directions last year. The need for improving and expanding our I-78 support capabilities cannot be overstated. The project includes 18 specific improvements identified in prior space-utilization and concept studies. These include such items as a roughly 13,000-square-foot maintenance building addition, renovations to nearly 6,000 feet of existing space. high efficiency and fully automated lighting, heating and ventilation systems. expansion to the current salt storage dome vestibule to maximize its capacity and improvements to the fueling area and I-78 emergency access. The project also will make some improvements to other buildings at our I-78 location, including construction of a canopy between our toll plaza and Welcome Center to enhance safety to our employees. Other new initiatives include installation of a Commission wide fuel management system headend to increase accountability of our fleet fuel spending, as well as the installation of a floor heating system to reduce energy spending, allow for mechanical repairs in winter weather, and increase our snow

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plowing operation productivity during freezing temperatures. Once underway, we expect it take 1-1/2 years to complete this project.

"There is one additional project worthy of mention this month – our Electronic Toll Collection System Replacement Project. As you may recall, we need to completely replace our electronic and manual toll collection systems. Much of the current system's hardware and software was installed back in 2002. The design of this various system components dates back even farther – to the 1990s. We increasingly have had difficulty acquiring replacement parts and the existing system clearly has reached the end of its useful life. Under the multi-vear design-build-maintain contract the Commission awarded last year, the project has reached the stage where the contractor is preparing for testing of new system components at two of our locations. Last week, this testing preparation work started here at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge. This week, preparations for a separate testing site on the Express E-ZPass lane shoulder at the Delaware Water Gap (I-80) Toll Bridge will get underway. There should be only minor traffic impacts, if any at all, as a result of this early-stage field testing. If all goes according plan, the project should advance to full-scale installation of new, improved toll collection hardware and software this fall and completion of each facility early next year. This modernization project will touch virtually every aspect of our toll system – manual cash collections, conventional toll lane E-ZPass transactions, highway speed open-road tolling and future all-electronic tolling at the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge.

"In closing today, we are only a week away from Independence Day and one of the busiest travel weekends of the year. Please have an enjoyable and safe holiday. Drive carefully."

SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Janvey moved and Commissioner Stanley seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS: On April 26, 2010, the Commission adopted a Statement of Intent (Item Number ADM-05-04-10), on the subject of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, authorizing the Executive Director to move expeditiously to accomplish the goals and activities enumerated in the Statement of Intent; and

"WHEREAS: The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation ("PennDOT") has jurisdiction over multiple State highways throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including I-95 and Taylorsville Road; and

"WHEREAS: The Commission has determined that the Scudder Falls Bridge, located in Bucks County, Pennsylvania and in Mercer County, New Jersey ("Bridge"), is in need of replacement to accommodate the increased traffic on the Bridge, provide safer, more efficient traffic flow, and improve the structural integrity of the crossing; and

"WHEREAS: The Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project is being advanced by the Commission in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA"), the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, and the NJDOT; and

"WHEREAS: The Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project includes the replacement of the Scudder Falls Bridge and the reconstruction of 4.4 miles of I-95 roadway in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, including improvements to the Taylorsville Road Interchange; and

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"WHEREAS: The Commission proposes to replace the existing Scudder Falls Bridge with anew wider bridge that includes three (3) travel lanes and adequate outside and inside shoulders in each direction and additional auxiliary lanes to accommodate entry and exit from the adjoining interchanges, including the Taylorsville Road Interchange within PennDOT's jurisdiction in Lower Makefield Township, Bucks County (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"); and

"WHEREAS: The Project also includes highway improvements necessary to transition to the existing four (4) lane section of I-95 extending approximately 2.2 miles west from the westerly abutment of the Scudder Falls Bridge to the PA Route 332 Interchange, as well as improvements to the Taylorsville Road Interchange in Pennsylvania; and

"WHEREAS: The Project also includes a Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility across the Delaware River that will interconnect the recreational facilities on each side of the Delaware River and the two Canal parks and would provide a regional pedestrian/bicycle connection; and

"WHEREAS: The Commission will provide the funding for the Project, including initial and final design, procurement and construction, environmental permitting, right-of-way acquisition, construction management, and inspection subject to the provisions outlined in the proposed IGA; and

"WHEREAS: The Project has undergone a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review for which a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) was issued by the FHWA on June 14, 2012; and

"WHEREAS: The Project necessitates the Commission's access to PennDOT right-of-ways, mutual coordination of traffic operations on State highways, and general cooperation between the Commission and PennDOT to ensure safety and minimize disruption to the public during the progress of the Project; and

"WHEREAS: PennDOT has agreed to permit the Commission, its agents, servants, employees, contractors, consultants, subcontractors, and assignees, including utility companies and their respective contractors and agents performing work necessary under the Project, to have ingress and egress to use PennDOT's right-of-way to perform any and all activities necessary to facilitate the Project; and

"WHEREAS: The IGA would authorize the Commission, its contractors, and agents to access PennDOT highway right-of-ways to perform any work associated with the Project, subject to providing prior written notice to the PennDOT; and

"WHEREAS: The Commission proposes to execute the IGA in order to permit the Commission, its agents, servants, employees, contractors, consultants subcontractors, and assignees, including utility companies and their respective contractors and agents performing work necessary under the Project, to have ingress and egress to use PennDOT's right-of-way to perform any and all activities necessary to facilitate the Project; and

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"WHEREAS: The Commission proposes to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement in order to permit the Commission, its agents, servants, employees, contractors, consultants, subcontractors, and assignees, including utility companies and their respective contractors and agents performing work necessary under the Project, to have ingress and egress to use PennDOT's right-of-way to perform any and all activities necessary to facilitate the Project; and

"**RESOLVED**, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission at its Regular Meeting assembled this 27th day of June, 2016, that the Commission authorizes the Executive Director to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement with Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project that defines each party's responsibilities moving forward with the Project as it relates to Impacts to I-95 in PA and the Taylorsville Road Interchange.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of June 27, 2016 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (May, 2016)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for May 2016 in comparison to the May 2015 traffic and revenue statistics. In addition, total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of May.

Analysis of May 2016 / May 2015 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 0.70 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.89 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 0.19 percent increase.

Analysis of May 2016 / May 2015 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 4,547 vehicles, or 0.13 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 3,288 vehicles, or 0.71 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 1,259 vehicles, or 0.04 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for May 2016 was 113,800 total vehicles as compared to 113,654 total vehicles in May 2015.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for May 2016 decreased by 67,090 vehicles, or 2.38 percent as compared to May 2015. Average daily westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for May 2016 was 88,784 vehicles as compared to 90,949 in May 2015.

Traffic analysis for 2016 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 5.62 percent increase through the first five months of 2016 as compared to the same period in 2015.
- Recorded westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 0.97 percent increase for the first five months of 2016 as compared to last year.

DISTRICT REVIEW:

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for May 2016 reflected a 0.11 percent increase as the result of the increase of 1,778 cars and the decrease of 949 trucks when compared to May 2015. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 3,883 cars and an increase of 426 trucks combined to generate a decrease in total toll traffic of 1.96 percent for May 2016 as compared to May 2015.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an increase of 0.08 percent in total toll traffic for the month of May 2016 compared to May 2015 as the result of combined increases of 552 cars and 262 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 7,929 passenger vehicles and 1,784 trucks combined to generate a 2.12 percent increase in total toll traffic for May 2016.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.02 percent increase in total toll traffic during May 2016 as a result of the increase of 994 automobiles and the decrease of 973 trucks compared to May 2015. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the decrease of 3,324 passenger vehicles combined with the increase of 2,974 trucks to generate an overall decrease of 0.04 percent in total toll traffic for May 2016 as compared to May 2015. At Milford-Montague (MM), decreases of 2,787 passenger vehicles and 236 trucks produced a 2.52 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of May 2016.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of May, 2016 and May, 2015, and the year-to-date periods ending May 31, 2016 and May 31, 2015.

May 2016

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of May, 2016, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 38 purchase orders in the total amount of \$369,845.37. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 30 price inquiries were sent out for 10 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.0 per order (30/10=3.0).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of May 2016 are shown below:

- ➢ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$228,078.00, for the Commission's Radar Traffic System Upgrade.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$30,848.63 for 2016 E-ZPass spare parts.
- A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$30,459.71 for uniform needs at our Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➢ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$14,070.00 for replacement entry doors at the Commission's Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility.
- ➢ A Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$11,520.00 for the installation of flag poles at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge Facility.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION PROGRAM MONTH OF MAY 2016

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

- 1. Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.
- 2. Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Xerox began the process of acquiring the spare parts and consumables. Once all items are received, Commission Staff will review the inventory.
- 3. TransCore submitted the revised System Detailed Design Document, finalized Business Rules Document, the revised submission of the Installation and Transition Plan and the revised Training Plan for review and comment. TransCore facilitated bi-weekly project status meetings. TransCore installed a new JANUS Multiprotocol Reader (MPR) at the New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge. They worked closely with Kapsch, the provider of the JANUS MPR, to trouble shoot the creation of duplicate transactions and higher than normal violations. These duplicate transactions were dismissed at the Customer Service Center. TransCore's design engineer reviewed drawings of the Commission's existing toll booths and banking rooms for each of the seven (7) bridges to assist in preparing their electrical plans.

Activities for the E-Z Pass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

- 1. The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in February 2017.
- 2. Commission Staff reviewed the revised draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC. A conference call was facilitated by the NJTA to continue discussing the comments from the various agencies.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

1. Mr. Stracciolini participated in the IAG E-Z Pass Executive Management Committee and Policy Committee meetings.
2. Mr. Stracciolini served on the Non-toll Opportunities subgroup for the IAG. This subgroup is preparing a policy and procedure document that provides a method for the IAG to follow for non-toll opportunities, such as use of the E-Z Pass transponder system at parking garages or drive-thru services.

STATUS UPDATES:

In the month of May 2016, the Contract Compliance Department (CCD) continued to populate the required fields for the LCP Tracker software program's Master List for all crafts and the hundreds of classifications that are included in construction contracts issued by the Commission in the eight (8) county-territory covered in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

B2GNOW and LCP TRACKER CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT SYSTEMS

- The CCD staff continues to work with the engineering department to complete audits for the Primes and their IBE sub-contractors/sub-consultants companies through B2GNOW and assure that the prime companies pay and report their payments to the sub-consultants and sub-contractors through said system.
- During the process of creating the Contract Compliance Program LCP Master List for the eight counties in PA and NJ, Ms. Christine Baker and Ms. Wanda Montalvo noticed that there were significant discrepancies in the template information provided to the Commission by LCP Tracker staff. The most significant errors encountered were in calculations pertaining to the counties prevailing wages for crafts classifications that included, asphalt laborers, air and refrigeration, bricklayers, carpenter as well as inconsistencies in the apprentice rates. Hence, both agencies agreed to a process of check and balance established by the CCD to ensure that all information is correct and consistent with the states and counties voluminous data and wage decisions.

IDENTIFIED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (IBE) PROGRAM

Contract Compliance IBE Target of 25% of the total contract award became effective on July 1, 2014. From the start of the IBE program to date, the Commissioners have awarded a total of twenty-four (24) contracts, including two (2) task orders awarded with the new IBE program requirements.

Scudder Falls Bridge Project Noise Wall Contract Award - Worked with engineering department and staff at media consultant Bellevue Communications to produce press release announcing the Commission's May 23 contract award for constructing noise walls along Pennsylvania's I-95 approach to the Scudder Falls Bridge. LOWER TRENTON TOLL-SUPPORTED BRIDGE TRENTON MAKES SIGN CONCEPT STUDY

DESIGN

Contract No. C-628A-5

Dewberry was issued Notice to Proceed effective February 22, 2016. A project kick-off meeting was held with Dewberry and their sub-consultant, The Lighting Practice, on March 3, 2016. DMC SERVICES FOR MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF FINAL DESIGN SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2G

AECOM's Design Management Consultant (DMC) Services are being continued under this Task Order Assignment that was authorized on January 16, 2015. The DMC services being provided under this Task Order Assignment include management and oversight of final design for the project through award of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project main construction contract. The DMC Services also include support to the Commission with the following: agency coordination, ROW acquisition plan development, ROW acquisition process coordination, environmental permitting, public involvement support, and coordination of necessary agreements with outside agencies. Environmental permitting agency coordination continued with the USACE and PADEP regarding the Joint Permit application packages. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the project within the Commission's jurisdiction was submitted to the PADEP on February 29, 2016. The USACE Permit application Package was submitted to the USACE on March 4, 2016. The Joint USACE/PADEP Permit Application Package for the portion of the Project within PennDOT's jurisdiction was submitted to PennDOT in early March and then subsequently submitted to the PADEP on March 25, 2016. Additional back-up information was provided to PADEP on May 18th to support the Joint Permit Application for the Commission's jurisdiction. Coordination has also been ongoing with NJDEP - Green Acres regarding final approval of the Parkland Diversion Permit, and the draft Memorandum of Understanding for the maintenance and operation of the NJ Pedestrian/Bicycle Facility. We are awaiting NJ Statehouse Commission approval for these items, at the anticipated June 2016 Statehouse Commission meeting. We are still awaiting preliminary approval of the Revised Jurisdictional Determination (JD) Plans that were submitted to the USACE on December 11, 2015.

The ROW acquisition process continued during the month of May, including coordination between Commission staff and the Commission's NJ and PA Legal Counsel. To date the Commission has purchased the following properties in Pennsylvania: Parcel 20-030-084 at 1140 Woodside Road, an additional property not required for construction; Parcels 20-030-083 and 20-030-096, at 185 River Road, an additional property not required for construction; and, Parcels 20-030-059 and 20-030-059-001, at 1149 Woodside Road, both parcels required for construction.

The Commission continues to pursue properties in Pennsylvania and New Jersey in support of this project.

Meeting of June 27, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

DMC Staff continued with the coordination and oversight of Contract T-661, Geotechnical Boring Contract for the SFB Project. All work under the call-back phase of the contract, which included thirty-four (34) additional borings, was completed during the month of May. The DMC continued providing Resident Engineer and Construction Inspection services for the T-667A, Advanced Tree Clearing Contract. Phase 1 work began in early January and all tree cutting work was completed by March 31, 2016. Phase 2 work will begin in October of this year.

A draft RFP has been prepared for the CM Services associated with the main construction contract for the SFB Project (Contract CM-669A). The draft RFP is being reviewed internally by the Engineering Department with an anticipated posting date of June 7, 2016.

This Contract is for professional traffic engineering services for a pre-construction traffic study required prior to construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, in accordance with the Interagency Agreement (IA) dated April 30, 2012 between the DRJTBC, PennDOT and NJDOT. This study will serve as the baseline for purposes of determining the traffic diversion impacts from tolling the new Scudder Falls Bridge. Sparwick Contracting, Inc. was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's March 2016 Meeting; issued Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed effective March 29, 2016; and issued Notice to Proceed effective April 28, 2016 upon the approval of Sparwick's insurance. Field repairs associated with this contract were successfully performed during the week of May 23, 2016. The contract is in the process of being closed out.

Schneider Electric Building Americas, Inc. continues to provide maintenance services in support of the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System under the direction of the Commission's Electronic Security and Surveillance Staff, who operate the system from the Primary Control Center located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, New Jersey.

DESIGN-BUILD

Contract No. DB-427 In-Lane Toll System Design-Build-Maintain Project TO-427C

Xerox and TransCore continue to perform preventative maintenance for the electronic toll collection system and violation enforcement system. Commission Staff met with Xerox and TransCore to review maintenance activity for the month.

Commission staff issued a Purchase Order for the 2016 Annual Spare Parts / Consumables. Xerox began the process of acquiring the spare parts and consumables. Once all items are received, Commission Staff will review the inventory.

Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center Project DB-584

The design of the new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is on-going. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Xerox. The new CSC is expected to go live in February 2017.

Commission Staff reviewed the revised draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) prepared by the NJTA. This document includes the terms and conditions for all the agencies that operated within the NJ CSC. A conference call was facilitated by the NJTA to continue discussing the comments from the various agencies.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE DR-550A

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Services, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Services is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT

IMPLEMENTATION ADVISOR Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-4

The RK&K team continues to support the Commission in its design of the replacement Electronic Toll Collection System (DB-540A). Team members attended biweekly status meetings and reviewed and compiled all comments for the revised System Detailed Design Document, finalized Business Rules Document, the revised Installation and Transition Plan and the revised Training Plan prepared by TransCore.

DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore submitted the revised System Detailed Design Document, finalized Business Rules Document, the revised submission of the Installation and Transition Plan and the revised Training Plan for review and comment. TransCore facilitated bi-weekly project status meetings. TransCore installed a new JANUS Multiprotocol Reader (MPR) at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. They worked closely with Kapsch, the provider of the JANUS MPR, to trouble shoot the creation of duplicate transactions and higher than normal violations. These duplicate transactions were dismissed at the Customer Service Center. TransCore's design engineer reviewed drawings of the Commission's existing toll booths and banking rooms for each of the seven (7) bridges to assist in preparing their electrical plans.

TOLL PLAZA SIGN REPLACEMENT

NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG, PORTLAND-COLUMBIA, MILFORD-MONTAGUE TOLL BRIDGES

Task Order Assignment No. C-621A-3

RK&K submitted final plans, specifications and estimate for the I-78 approach roadway sign overlay. The plans and specifications were provided to J. Flectch Creamer & Son for pricing. Commission Staff is working with J. Fletcher Creamer on developing an acceptable cost for this work. RK&K also submitted final plans, specifications and estimate for the toll plaza canopy signs. These plans and specifications were provided to TransCore for pricing.

Meeting of June 27, 2016 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

BRIDGE MONITORING SYSTEM

STUDY FOR SELECT VEHICULAR BRIDGES Contract No. C-556A

Pennoni Associates submitted their final report outlining opportunities for implementation of structural health monitoring as well as overweight / oversized vehicle detection, deterrence and enforcement through the long term application of sensor type technologies together with a data acquisition / reporting system to function as an integrated Bridge Monitoring System.

The Commission is currently evaluating the recommendation to recommission the monitoring equipment at New Hope-Lambertville and Riverton-Belvidere Toll Supported bridges.

DESIGN FOR SELECT BRIDGES

Task Order Assignment C-628B-6

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, the Louis Berger Group. Inc. (Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015. Kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visit to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed. Based on review comment locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations.

LEVEL 3 – INVESTMENT GRADE TRAFFIC AND REVENUE FORECASTS Contract No. C-549AR

Jacobs Engineering submitted several draft model runs summarizing the expected revenue from the Scudders Falls Bridge using various toll rates. Xerox, the provider of the NJ E-ZPass Customer Service Center (CSC) provided a rough order of magnitude estimate for the processing of the video tolls from the Scudder Falls Bridge. This information was provided to Jacobs Engineering to use in calculating the revenue estimates.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2016 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS

C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. A kick-off meeting was held on February 25, 2016 for the 2016 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, Operations, Engineering and CWA.

Inspections have been completed at the Calhoun Street, Lower Trenton, New Hope – Lambertville, Centre Bridge – Stockton, Washington Crossing, Upper Black Eddy – Milford, Riverton – Belvidere, Uhlerstown – Frenchtown, Toll-Supported bridges. Inspections are underway at the Riegelsville Toll-Supported Bridge. . Inspections will continue on into June for the remaining toll-supported bridges, with the exception of Scudder Falls. Scudder Falls is scheduled to be inspected in August because of the Peregrine Falcon nesting cycle.

CWA will be required to update the PennDOT BMS and NJDOT Combis system for each of the scheduled bridges within 30 days of the completion of the field inspection of each bridge. Facilities Inspections will have been scheduled for June 14-16 in Districts 1, 2 and 3. Sign retroreflectivity testing has been tentatively scheduled for the toll-supported bridges sans Scudder Falls in June.

Radio System
