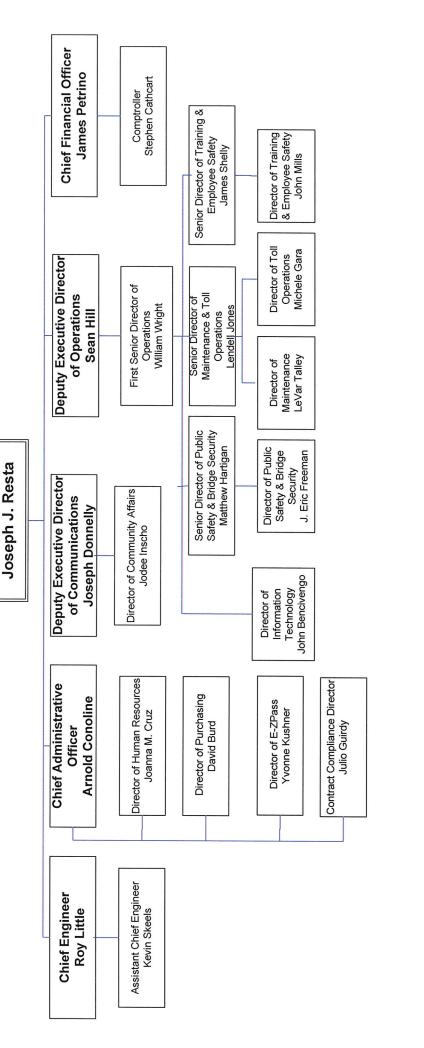

ROLL CALL

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting called the roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State of New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman, my comments today involve resolutions on today's agenda.

"The year-end Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission Meeting has traditionally been the month in which Commissioners establish an operating budget for the coming year and a capital plan for the coming two years. Although there have been times in the past where the respective budgets have not been in place at the start of the fiscal year in January, 2019 will not be one of those years;

"Despite the turmoil and polarization of many areas of government at the federal, state, and local levels, our Bridge Commissioners seem to find a way, when others cannot, to thoroughly review lengthy and sometimes complex material to reach

consensus and craft both an operating budget and capital plan that can be passed in time for the New Year. This process is a testament to Commissioner's dedication to public service and an acknowledgement that even though we can have our differences, we put aside those differences to fulfill our mission to the traveling public;

"The DRJTBC's Operating Budget for 2019 of over \$72 million dollars supports all of our operational activities such as: clearing our roadways and bridges of snow and ice in winter, maintaining our sections of highway, providing security monitoring at all of our locations, landscaping our properties along the 140 mile of Commission jurisdiction along the Delaware River, training and providing wages and benefits for all employees, and countless other tasks to facilitate safe and efficient crossing for cars, truck, motorcycles, bicycles, and pedestrians across our 20 main river bridges;

"The two-year 2019-2020 Capital Plan provides over \$362 million dollars to support the Commission's capital projects to keep all of our facilities in a good state of repair, provide renewal of our antique stock of bridges, and in the case of the Scudder Falls Bridge, provide replacement as that bridge is reaching the end of its useful life. 2019 will be an extremely busy year as the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project reaches the completion of Phase 1 activities and the commencement of all-electronic tolling; the administration building, adaptive reuse of the 1799 house and Park & Ride facility open for operation, and the Southern Operations and Maintenance Facilities projects get underway at our Morrisville and Langhorne site, supported by a resolution for the real estate acquisition on today's agenda;

"So to the Commissioners from all staff at the DRJTBC, we say a heartfelt thank you, Happy Holidays, and Happy New Year. And to our motoring public, we say please drive safely, we'll always keep the bridges clear, and you'll always be able to get to where you're going:

"Mr. Chairman, this concludes my report".

"WHEREAS, the Members of the Commission from the State of New Jersey, Yuki Moore Laurenti, Geoffrey Stanley, Garrett Van Vliet, Lori Ciesla and Chairman Michael Lavery along with the Members of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Daniel Grace, Pamela Janvey, Miriam Huertas, John Christy and Vice Chairman Wadud Ahmad, have met the responsibilities while functioning as the Commission's 'Executive Committee' and have thoroughly reviewed the aforementioned Final Draft of the said 2019 Budget supported by narrative details and schedules contained in the 2019 Budget, have satisfied themselves that such Budget, as presented contains all pertinent ramifications associated with the operation of the Commission are therein; and

"WHEREAS, such Members of the Commission, while functioning as the 'Executive Committee,' note and approve the 2019 Operating Budget in the amount of \$72,560,313 in addition, state herein, for the public record, satisfaction that such Budget, in such amount is set forth in its entirety and supported in all respects, by the details which are attached to such Budget; and

INVITE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery invited any Comments from the public.

Kathleen Dieal, Mill Hill Resident from Trenton NJ, addressed the meeting and said;

"Good morning. My name is Kathleen Dieal. I live at 19 Greenwood Avenue in the Mill Hill section of Trenton. I appreciate you hearing from me today. I have started a petition in Mill Hill to do a noise study and remediation plan for the traffic that comes across your property adjacent to the Mill Hill section of Trenton. My back door is 30 feet from your highway. So I have downloaded an app on my phone from OSHA. I know it is not scientific to the Nth degree, but I regularly get decibel levels over a hundred inside my house on a daily basis and I'm asking permission to do a noise and air pollution study of that section of Mill Hill. I have 46 signatures from other residents that I collected in the past 24 hours and I will be continuing to circulate the petition from Mill Hill to see if I can get additional support for that."

Commissioner Janvey addressed the meeting and asked Ms Dieal Where Mill Hill is located

Meeting of December 17, 2018

Ms. Dieal then said:

"Mill Hill is between the Trenton Route One Bridge and Market Street. It is adjacent to your property and then it moves all the way to Mill Hill Park which is at Front Street and then it also borders Broad Street and Stockton, so it is a tenblock community in a historic district. The majority of the households were built before 1900 and it has historical significance is where George Washington defeated the Hessians. I don't know if anybody is planning to attend Patriots Week that's in the city, but it's a significant neighborhood."

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and asked if she has noticed an increase in traffic or noise?

Ms. Diel then said:

"I have. According to your own engineer's report that I've checked out on-line, there is an additional two million cars per year traversing that area since I bought my home in 2013."

Vice Chairman Ahmad then asked if when she bought the property in 2013, what was it like for you then?

Ms. Dieal then said:

"Obviously, when I had my home -- my open house that I attended, it was on a Sunday, so the traffic pattern was different on the weekend when I did my walk through and things like that. But after I moved in, there was definitely a notice of noise, but it has increased. There is a significant amount of large trucks that use Jake brakes on that section of the highway. When the Jake brakes occur, the house shakes tremendously. And I know that's been a complaint of several members of our community I repair cracks in the walls in the seams in my house regularly. I have spoken to Mr. Little previously who was able to fix a guardrail that was on Converse Alley which is adjacent to my house and he was very helpful in getting that repaired. I also have a retaining wall behind my house that is I believe on the Bridge Commission's property and he has shored up the retention wall because of the fact it is starting to buckle from the vibrations and from the higher end. So there has been communication with Mr. Little and the engineering team here, so I'm just asking for additional study and remediation plan from the Commission."

Chairman Lavery then invited any further comments from the public.

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DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of December 17, 2018 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (November, 2018)

Summary: The Commission experienced a decrease in total toll revenue for November 2018 in comparison to the November 2017 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic also reflected a decrease for the month. [It should be noted that for 2017, increases in commercial traffic through-out the Commission and passenger traffic in the Southern Region were directly related to the closure of the Delaware River Turnpike Bridge from January 21st, thru March 10th].

Analysis of November 2018 / November 2017 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 0.59 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month of November.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.09 percent increase for the month.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 2.53 percent decrease for the month.

Analysis of November 2018 / November 2017 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic decreased by 53,697 vehicles, or 1.60 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 8,582 vehicles, or 1.83 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic decreased by 62,279 vehicles, or 2.16 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for November 2018 was 109,774 total vehicles as compared to 111,564 total vehicles in November 2017.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for November 2018 decreased by 129,450 vehicles, or 4.96 percent as compared to the month of November 2017.

Traffic analysis for 2018 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 2.18 percent decrease through the first eleven months of 2018 as compared to the same period in 2017.
- Westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 3.53 percent decrease through the first eleven months of 2018 when compared to last year.

REGION REVIEW

Southern Region

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) reflected a 0.57 percent increase for November 2018 as the result of the decreases of 1,566 cars and the increase of 5,813 trucks when compared to November 2017. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 699 cars and an increase of 1,221 trucks combined to generate an increase in total toll traffic of 0.31 percent for November 2018 as compared to November 2017.

Central Region

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 4.10 percent in total toll traffic for the month of November 2018 when compared to November 2017 as the result of the combined decreases of 38,067 cars and 2,927 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, increases of 2,687 passenger vehicles and 2,582 trucks generated a 1.21 percent increase in total toll traffic for November 2018.

Northern Region

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.73 percent decrease in total toll traffic during November 2018 as a result of the decrease of 2,063 automobiles and the increase of 1,294 trucks compared to November 2017. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the decrease of 18,903 passenger vehicles combined with the increase of 172 trucks generated an over-all decrease of 2.38 percent in total toll traffic for November 2018 as compared to November 2017. At Milford-Montague (MM), the decrease of 3,668 passenger vehicles and the increase of 427 trucks produced a 3.16 percent decrease in total toll traffic for the month of November 2018 compared to November 2017.

E-ZPass Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the *E-ZPass* penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of November, 2018 and November, 2017, and the year-to-date periods ending November 30, 2018 and November 30, 2017.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of November 2018 and the eleven month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2018 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$5,219,614 for the month of November. For the 2018 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$54,257,109 or 86.2% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense categories are within their normal line item budgets. EZPass operating expenses are currently exceeding the YTD budget by \$302,108 or 8.4%, due to higher than projected fees for credit card and operating cost. Professional Services are exceeding their YTD operating budget by \$261,767 or 20.4% due to higher non-retainer legal fees.

There were no unusual expenses recorded during the month.

IBE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (Commission) established an IBE Program (MBE/WBE/SBE/DBE/DsBE/VBE) with a target of 25% for all Professional Services and Construction contracts awarded by the Commission effective July 1, 2014. To date, the Commission has awarded forty-nine (49) contracts, with the IBE Program requirements. Currently, there are 31 active contracts and 17 contracts that have been completed and archived.

Elation Systems

The Commission began using Elation Systems effective January 2017, as the online system for Payment Verification and Certified Payroll Reporting (CPR). All contracts awarded by the Commission to a Prime Consultant/Prime Contractor and their Subconsultants and Subcontractors use this service free of charge. Online training is available to vendors on how to use Elation Systems. The Contract Compliance Department and Elation Support Staff are available to assist all users.

The Contract Compliance Department (CCD) monitors, posts and reports data in regards to all payments. The CCD also reviews all Certified Payrolls submitted into Elation Systems.

The following are all mandatory requirements:

Company On-Line Registration:

- i. All Primes must register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems; and
- ii. All Primes must also ensure that all Subconsultants and Subcontractors register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems.

Payment Verification:

- i. Prime Contractors must post all payments to their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors in Elation Systems; *and*
- ii. Prime Contractors and their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors must confirm all payments received in Elation Systems.

Certified Payroll Reporting:

- i. All Prime Contractors are responsible for assigning someone from their staff with the responsibility to review, approve, and upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems; *and*
- ii. All Prime Contractors must also ensure that their Subcontractors upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems.

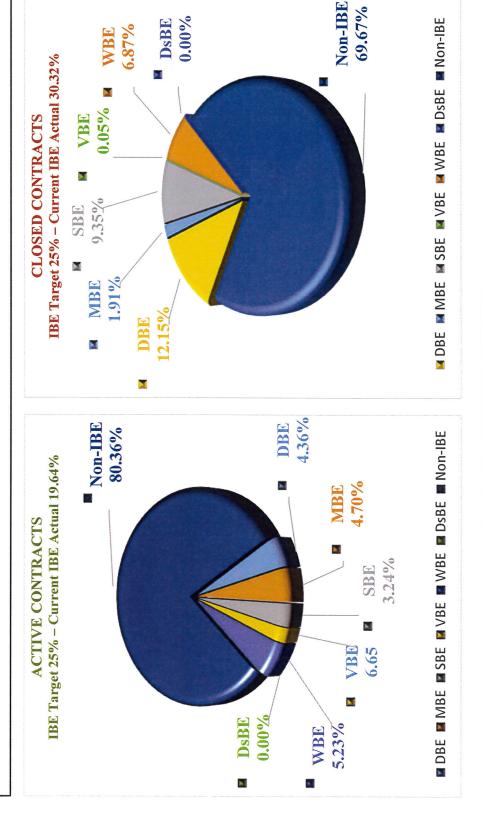

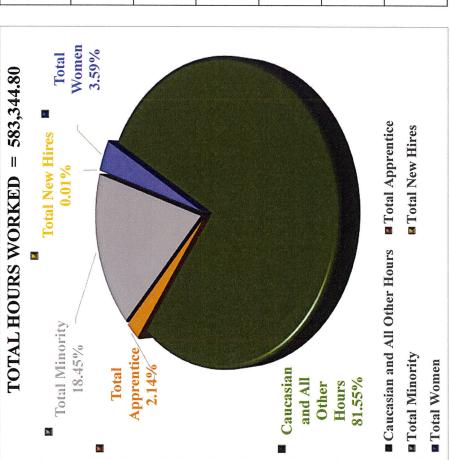

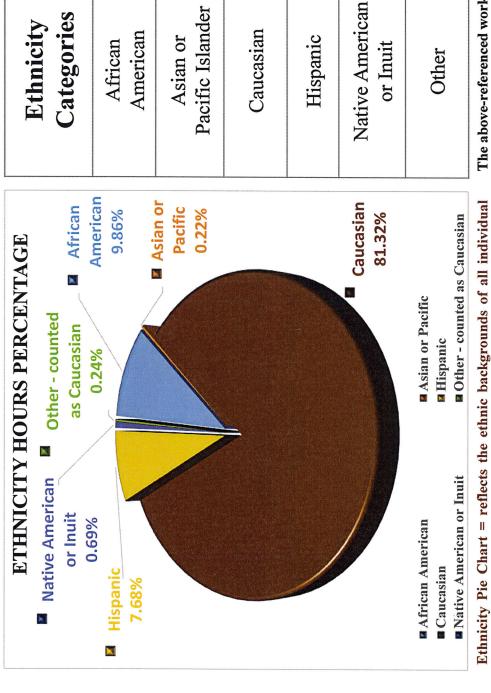

MINORITY, WOMEN AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission implemented a one-year Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) pilot program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) pilot program with a 3% goal. These goals applied to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program and were effective on September 1, 2008.

At its December 2008 Commission Meeting, the Commission revised the pilot program to specify a 25% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal to New Jersey assigned consultant contracts in lieu of the previously specified 7% MBE and 3% WBE goals.

At its December 2010 Commission Meeting, due to the success of the Commission's MWSBE Pilot Program, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission adopted a resolution for permanent status of the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) program with a 3% goal, and the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program with a 25% goal. These goals apply to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program.

The Contract Compliance Department continues to monitor, update and analyze the payments for the MWSBE diversity program.

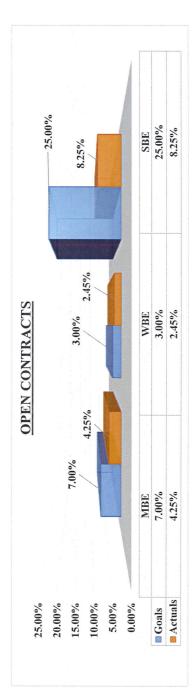

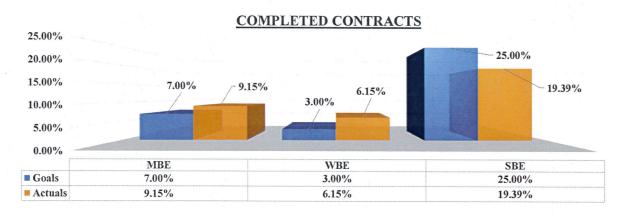

• COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:

I-78 Bridges and Approach Slabs Rehabilitation Project – Provided interviews and background on the approaching end of the 18-month-long I-78 Bridges and Approach Slabs Rehabilitation Project to reporters at the Express-Times/Lehigh Valley Live and WRNJ-AM. This closes out the public awareness and public involvement aspects of this project, which involved numerous lane closures and several weekend-long single-lane travel configurations. The coverage reinforces how the Commission is using toll revenues to upgrade its regional transportation network.

Public Awareness for Downstream Roundabout at I-295/NJ Route 29 Interchange – As a result of weather-related postponements, the opening of the downstream roundabout at the I-295/NJ Route 29 interchange was postponed from October into November. Public awareness and education efforts conducted in October were carried over into November, including additional press releases and social media postings.

2017 Annual Report – Completed article drafting for the annual report. This means the product preparations can now move into final editing and design in the month of December with the collection photographs and production of graphics. As has been the case in recent years, this will be a strictly online product. The traditional corresponding content materials – audit, bridge inspections report, and traffic engineering report – area all live on the website.

Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project Website Redesign – Completed fine-tuning efforts for the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project's redesigned website, which went public in early October 4. The fine tuning included the locating and posting of project press releases that were not carried over from the prior project website. Another corrective measure involved the prior gallery of project photographs that were voluminous, disjointed and not easily viewed. Instead, a new visuals link was created, consisting of the content already files in the construction progress section. The mis-classification of short alert messages as news items also was corrected and a better methodology for updating weekly travel advisory listing in the construction section also was achieved.

This contract is for Preliminary, Final and Post-Design Services for space utilization improvements at New Hope Lambertville Toll Bridge Executive Headquarters and the demolition and reconstruction of the Trenton Morrisville Toll Bridge Administration Building as identified under a Task Order Assignment for Space Utilization Program and Concept Study.

During the November reporting period Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (Baker) of Hamilton New Jersey, continued their coordination and support with the utility relocation effort in PA and NJ; continued to review and respond to various Requests for Information (RFIs) and submittals from the Contractor and the Construction Manager; and, attended Contract T-668A Progress Meetings and various technical meetings involving design issues with the Contractor and CM/CI team. Baker was also involved in the ongoing coordination with NJDOT regarding the need for long-term detours for the NJ Interchange 29 work and with PennDOT regarding long term detours needed for the Taylorsville Road Interchange ramp work.

CONSTRUCTION

Contract No. T-668A

Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh, PA (Trumbull) was awarded the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Construction Contract T-668A in the amount of \$396,000,000.00 at the Commission's January 30, 2017 Meeting. The Commission issued a full Notice to Proceed on March 3, 2017.

Weekly Meetings continued between the Contractor and the Commission's Project team to discuss Project schedule, progress, and planning for ongoing and/or upcoming construction activities. Trumbull continued to submit Requests for Information (RFI's) and make required project submittals throughout this reporting period for ongoing and upcoming construction activities. To date there have been a total of 639 Contractor RFIs and a total of 1,052 Contractor Submittals. Trumbull and the Construction Manager (Hill/Jacobs) have also been coordinating on the Baseline CPM Schedule progress updates.

During the November reporting period Trumbull continued construction in work areas extending throughout the project limits in order to complete parallel activities on the project.

In **Pennsylvania**, roadway work continued along Woodside Road and Taylorsville Road; pavement excavation and subbase work continued along WB I-295; construction continued on the I-295 Bridges over Taylorsville Road and the Delaware Canal as well as the PA Pedestrian Bridge; utility installation continued along Woodside and Taylorsville Roads; sandblasting and bridge painting work on a portion of the Quarry Road Bridge was completed; and, the wall construction continued for the Bridge Monitor/All Electronic Toll (BM/AET) Building, as well as the MSE Wall construction adjacent to the BM/AET Building site.

On the **Main River Bridge**, work continued on Abutment 2 in NJ; construction of the deck formwork, scuppers, and shear studs continued for spans 1 through 4 and deck rebar installation was ongoing for spans 5 through 7. Placement for the concrete deck is currently scheduled to begin the second week of December.

In **New Jersey**, work continued on the I-295 sound barriers; drainage and excavation work was ongoing within the I-295 median area, which allowed a traffic shift of the I-295 mainline in November; deck repairs and median barrier removal continued at the Main Approach Bridge; work continued on the I-295 NB exit Ramp G Bridge roadway construction; and, installation of sign structure foundations and highway lighting continued.

The Hill team continues to supply construction management personnel as necessary, monitor Trumbull's performance and progress, conduct bi-weekly progress meetings, oversee and coordinate the three (3) construction inspection firms, perform utility coordination in NJ & PA, perform schedule reviews, conduct bi-weekly scheduling meetings, maintain document control, perform health and safety inspections, adjust project staffing as required, address material testing and inspection plan requirements, prepare monthly contractor invoices and manage overall project budget.

CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION OF THE PENNSYLVANIA APPROACH Contract No. CI-671A

This Contract is for Construction Inspection (CI) Professional Services for the PA Approach Roadway Improvements portion of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Contract T-668A. TRC Engineers, Inc. (TRC) of Plymouth Meeting, PA was awarded this contract at the February 27, 2017 Commissioners' Meeting; and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective March 29, 2017.

McCormick Taylor, Inc. (MT) was awarded this Public Involvement (PI) Contract at the Commission's September 28, 2015 Meeting, and issued Notice to Proceed effective October 29, 2015. MT's public involvement effort focuses on regularly communicating project activities to officials, stakeholders and the public, as well as informing motorists of near-term construction stage travel implications, performing public involvement initiatives and market research activities and development of discussion guides and analysis related the implementation of the new toll, and payment options related to All-Electronic Tolling. MT has finalized a new project specific logo and has created a new project specific website that went live on October 4, 2018.

During this reporting period, CPMC Staff continued to provide the management and oversight of Professional Services Contract C-644A, CM/CI Services Contract CM-644A, and Construction Contract T-644A for the I-78 Roadway Approach/Transition Slabs Rehabilitation and the Rehabilitation of the Cedarville Road Overpass, as well as Contract T-707A for the New Commission Administration Building and the associated CM/CI Contract CM-707A.

December 17, 2018 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AT SCUDDER FALLS

Design Contract No. C-707A

The design team attended bi-weekly project status meetings, reviewed submittals and responded to request for information from the contractor. The design team also completed on site observations as requested by the construction manager.

The design team developed and issued field bulletins and clarification for the contractors use. Additionally, a file furniture specification was prepared and submitted to the Purchasing Department for acquisition.

Construction Management Contract No. CM-707A

Joseph Jingoli & Son, Inc. facilitated the bi-weekly project status meetings and various field meeting as needed for the project. Jingoli continues to facilitate document processing that includes receiving and distributing project submittals and requests for information from the contractor. The construction management team issued their monthly project status report and continues to release three-week look ahead schedules. Staff from the construction manager are on site daily as field work by the contractor continues.

Construction Contract No. T-707A

Project submittal items continue to be submitted by the contractor and are being reviewed by the design team along with various requests for information. The contractor submitted project schedule update number five. Bracy Construction has completed pier and foundation installation. Under slab utilities (plumbing and electrical) have been completed and all Slab on Grade work has been completed, except for a few minor repairs. Bracy has completed the installation of the structural steel for the eastern half of the building. The steel erection for the western half of the building is now underway. Additionally, installation of exterior metal studs, roof parapets and sheathing, second floor concrete slab preparation and interior block wall installation are all underway.

The 1799 building interior was framed out with walls and flooring, and rough electrical, mechanical, and plumbing systems installed. Additionally, the existing roof was removed, and the roof was made watertight. The wall and floor tiling is complete for both restrooms. All window and door installation is also finished. The new water line is installed from the corner of Woodside and Taylorsville Roads to the 1799 home. The retaining wall for the exterior steps to the basement is complete.

IH Engineers was issued Notice to Proceed effective August 21, 2018. A project kick-off meeting was held with IH on August 29, 2018 with operations and supervisory staff in attendance. This Task Order Assignment is to perform final design for constructing a new salt storage facility to meet the needs at NH-L Toll Bridge and to be constructed adjacent to the existing barn/salt storage building.

I-78 BRIDGES AND APPROACH SLABS REHABILITATION

Design Contract No. C-644A

Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) was awarded this design contract at the Commission's February 2016 Meeting, and Notice to Proceed issued March 1, 2016. This design project is for the repair of various bridge, pavement and other miscellaneous deficiencies associated with the 13 bridges and approach roadways located within the DRJTBC's jurisdiction on I-78.

During this reporting period, GF continued their post-design phase services of this contract, responding to RFIs and reviewing submittals and participating in conference calls as necessary. GF participated in the project's final walk-thru on November 28, 2018 and will prepare the final asbuilts base on the redline drawings provided by Greenman-Pedersen, Inc.

December 17, 2018 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Construction Management/Construction Inspection Contract No. CM-644A

Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) was awarded this Construction Management/Construction Inspection Services contract at the Commission's April 2017 Meeting with the Notice to Proceed issued effective May 24, 2017.

During this reporting period, provide GPI continued to construction management/inspection of the remaining roadway improvements of this project. GPI conducted two (2) Progress Meetings and one final walk-thru meeting during this period. GPI continued tracking correspondence, submittals and shop drawings. GPI evaluated the revised Potential Change Order (PCO) submission by JDE and their Painting Subcontractor. GPI provided their recommendation on the PCO based on the actual impact to the cleaning/painting work at the Carpentersville Rd. and Edge Rd. Bridges. These cost impacts to approach slab and bridge painting work were initiated by the loss of the single westbound lane closure 24/7 as originally provided in the contract and offset by the approval of a 57 hour double lane closure over several weekends. GPI's current staff includes the Resident Engineer, one (1) full time construction inspector/office engineer and one (1) part time Project Manager. A part time scheduler and safety consultant, both from Envision, Inc. are providing schedule update reviews and independent site safety inspections respectively as needed.

Construction Contract No. T-644A

J.D. Eckman, Inc. (JDE) was awarded this Construction contract at the Commission's April 2017 Meeting, and given Notice to Proceed effective May 22, 2017.

During this reporting period JDE reached Substantial Completion on November 14th, completing the remaining mainline striping on I-78, replacing the neoprene strip seals on the various bridges. A final project walk though was conducted on November 28th with JDE and members of the Design Consultant, Construction Management/Inspection team, the DRJTBC and AECOM. JDE continued working on punch-list items and providing final submittal documentation. JDE participated in two (2) Progress Meetings.

SALT STORAGE FACILITY CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT Task Order Assignment No. C-703A-3

Urban Engineers was issued Notice to Proceed effective October 16, 2017. A project kick-off meeting was held with Urban on October 16, 2017. Urban provided a part time Project Manager, full time Resident Engineer/Inspector and part time Scheduler throughout this task order assignment. Urban attended a kick-off meeting with the contractor (Bracy), conducted job progress meetings and performed construction management and inspection activities. Field activities resumed in mid-April and Urban performed CM related duties through project completion. Field work is now complete and the assignment is in the process of being closed out.

APPROACH ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS AT THE CENTRE BRIDGE – STOCKTON, NEW HOPE – LAMBERTVILLE, AND UHLERSTOWN – FRENCHTOWN TOLL-SUPPORTED BRIDGES

DESIGN

Task Order Assignment C-715A-1

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Pennoni, Inc. (Pennoni), is providing professional services for the design of approach roadway improvements at the Centre Bridge – Stockton, New Hope – Lambertville, and Uhlerstown – Frenchtown Toll-Supported Bridges. Improvements include select roadway repaving, re-striping, three (3) ADA ramps, replacement of six (6) inlets, curbing repair and patching/coating of a retaining wall. Notice to proceed was given on September 25, 2017. A kick off meeting was held on October 3, 2017. Field visits occurred September 28 through October 3. Progress Meeting No. 1 was held on Friday, November 3. A progress / 60% submission review meeting was held on November 29. On 1/30, Supplement No. 1 was approved to use \$4,265.75 of the \$8,000 Unforeseen Allowance for work related to the NH-L PA north roadway retaining wall that was not included in the original scope of work. Pennoni has submitted the pre-final PS&E documents and previously submitted a request for Supplement No. 2 related to additional traffic control plans due to the planned eastbound lane closing and subsequent detour to be planned. Both documents are under review by the Commission.

PRELIMINARY, FINAL & POST DESIGN SERVICES C-696B-1

Utilizing the Commission standing Consulting Engineer Task Order Agreement with French & Parrello Associates (FPA), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to support the Commission needs for Toll Counting facilities at I-78, Easton Philipsburg, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Facilities.

As a part of a fast track implementation plan, Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with FPA on October 20, 2016, at which time the Consultant provided pre-schematic design sketches to expedite Commission's input on the same. The Consultant collected Project related record documents after this meeting, conducted site visits on October 25th at all three locations. Schematic Design Submission was received on November 9th, 2016 and a submission review meeting was held on November 14th sharing the Commission's comments with the Consultant. Final Design Submission was received December 30, 2016 and a design submission review meeting was conducted on January 9, 2017 and revised documents were received January 19, 2017.

ESS MAINTENANCE CONTRACT Contract No. DB-724A

Schneider Electric Building Americas, Inc. continued to provide maintenance services in support of the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System under the direction of the Commission's Public Safety and Bridge Security, who operate the system from the Primary Control Center located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, New Jersey.

CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER/VIOLATION PROCESSING CENTER PROJECT DB-584

The new NJ Customer Service Center (CSC) is live. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA), as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Conduent to manage the implementation of outstanding system elements. Commission staff, Conduent, HNTB and representative from the other agencies that are included in the NJ CSC participated in follow-up workshops to develop the AET invoice templates that will be issued to Toll-by-Plate customers using the Scudder Falls Bridge. The Commission's in-lane toll system provider, TransCore, submitted sample transactions and images to Conduent to use in developing the AET processing system.

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

As the Commission expands its wide area network (WAN) to the toll supported bridges, the traffic counters will transition from the wireless modems to the WAN for the transmission of data.

(JJS), this Task Order Assignment is to obtain engineering preliminary, final, and post design services to implement the Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) identified in an ASHRAE Level 3 Energy Audit prepared under Task Oder Assignment No. C-657A-1 at all of the Commission's seven (7) Toll Bridge facilities.

A Kick-Off Meeting was conducted with JJS on November 21, 2016, record room site visits, and field surveys of the seven toll bridges has been completed. Progress meeting was conducted on February 1, 2017, reporting field observations and conditions in advance of a Schematic Design submission was received February 28, 2017 and a design review meeting was conducted with the consultant on March 21, and a Final Submission was received on April 24, 201 addressing Commission's comments. Public Bid Advertisements for an Electrical and a Mechanical Construction Contracts were posted on May 9th, bids were publically opened on June 8th & June 13th respectively. Bids received from the low bidder of each Contract was reviewed by JJS, Commission Staff and Counsels, and found to be responsive. Construction Contracts Awards were made for each of the two (2) Contracts and Consultant is currently providing Post Design Services answering Contractors' Requests for Information and reviewing submittals.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES Task Order Assignment No. C-696A-2

Utilizing the Commission's current Facilities Task Order Agreement with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson (JMT), this Task Order Assignment is to provide Construction Management (CM) Services in connection with the Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) implementation Project.

Schneider Electric Buildings Americas, Inc., was awarded this construction contract at the Commission's June 2017 Meeting. Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed letter was issued effective June 27, 2017. Pre-Construction Meeting was held on August 11th and a Notice to Proceed effective date of August 16th was issued.

Long lead delivery material was received and Contractor completed working at Milford Montague, Delaware Water Gap, Portland-Columbia and I-78, Easton Philipsburg sites and is currently working at the New Hope Toll Bridge Facility. Contractor is also finalizing the system integration and setting up the Sequence of Operation of the Commission wide Building Management System.

The Gordian Group provided the first version of the front end bid documents for the Commission's review. Representatives of the Gordian Group and the Commission met on November 15, 2018 to discuss further development of the JOC Program charter and review of the front end bid documents. The Gordian Group continues preparation of Construction Task Catalog and provided the Commission with a working copy of the same on November 21, 2018.

GENERAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANT 2015-2018 ANNUAL INSPECTIONS C-684A

As the Commission's General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Cherry, Weber & Associates (CWA) is providing Annual Inspection Services for the Toll-Supported Bridges in 2016. CWA was provided with Notice to Proceed on March 23, 2015. On November 21, 2016, the Commission, via Resolution 3090-11-16, extended CWA's contract to perform GEC services and inspections in 2017 & 2018. On November 19, 2018, the Commission, via Resolution 4045-10-18, extended CWA's contract to perform GEC services and inspections in 2019 & 2020, the second and final of two 2-year optional extensions in the original contract. A kick-off meeting was held on March 217, 2017 for the 2017 Toll Bridge Inspections at the –Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from District 1, District 2, District 3, Operations, Engineering, and CWA. A progress meeting was held on June 9.

Interim inspections have been completed at all of the required (load posted) Toll-Supported Bridges and Inspections of all seven (7) Toll Bridges have been completed. The Annual Inspection Report was accepted by the Commission on April 30.

A kick-off meeting was held on February 23, 2018, for the 2018 Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections at the Easton - Phillipsburg Toll Bridge Administration Building and attended by representatives from Central and South Regions Maintenance, the Deputy Director of Maintenance, Engineering, and CWA. Due to the number of snow storms this March and raining weather in April, Toll-Supported Bridge Inspections are slightly behind schedule. CWA will continue inspections as weather permits and all inspections except Scudder Falls should be completed by June or July. Scudder Falls is scheduled for August. Inspections have been completed at the Lower Trenton, Calhoun Street, Washington Crossing, New Hope – Lambertville, Centre Bridge – Stockton, Uhlerstown – Frenchtown, Upper Black Eddy – Milford, and Riegelsville Toll- Supported Bridges. The Taylorsville Road and Pennsylvania Canal Overpass on the approach of Scudder Falls have also been inspected. Inspections are underway at Riverton – Belvidere Toll-Supported Bridge.

December 17, 2018 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

Facilities inspections were completed on June 20 & 21 at the Southern Region and Central Region Toll-Supported Bridges. Attendees included CWA, Engineering Staff, and Maintenance personnel, with a brief visit by the Deputy Executive Director of Operations.

Inspections at all Toll-Supported Bridges have been completed for the year. The draft Annual Maintenance Report was submitted to the Commission on September 7 and has been distributed to staff for review and comment. Retro-reflectivity inspections were held on October 15 and 16 in the Southern and Central Regions for all the toll-supported bridges except Scudder Falls. Maintenance report review meetings were held with the Northern and Central Region operations staff on October 22 and the Southern Region operations staff on October 26. The Draft Annual Inspection Report was delivered to the Commission on September 28 and is under review.

TRAINING AND EMPLOYEE SAFETY DEPARTMENT MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2018

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Training and Employee Safety Department:

- The Training & Employee Safety (TES) department facilitated training for 158 employees at 15 classes in November. Commission staff spent 478 hours attending training classes.
- Two CPR/AED/FIRST AID classes were facilitated by TES staff. All 24 attendees were certified in First Aid, CPR, and AED.

A total of 135 Commission employees have been certified in CPR/AED in 2018.

- Two Respect in the Workplace for Supervisors training classes were conducted by TES staff. This class is specifically geared for supervisors and included the following topics.
 - 1) Harassment, Bullying, & Discrimination.
 - 2) Sensitivity
 - 3) Dealing with Trauma
 - 4) Suicide Awareness.

A total of 282 Commission employees have been trained in Respect in the Workplace in 2018.

- A class in Drug Impairment Training for Professionals is scheduled in December. At the completion of this class, all 24 supervisors attending the class will have been trained on how to make a determination if an employee is suspected of working while impaired. Upon completion of this class, all attendees will receive a certification.
- An order for 40 AED units will be placed to replace all of the current AED units located in the office, toll, and maintenance areas at all toll facilities. In addition, AED units will be installed in all 14 bridge shelters located at the toll supported bridges. The Zoll Plus Automatic AED is a state of the art AED that features a feedback tool that will assist users. All AED units will be mounted in new storage boxes and new signage will be installed. TES staff will provide training for all employees.
- TES staff presented the Snow Operations plan at two ESS training classes.
- TES staff facilitated a toll collector orientation class for new toll collectors. This class was conducted by toll managers.

- TES staff conducted a Toll Sergeant promotional training class.
- TES staff conducted a Deputy Regional Maintenance Supervisor promotional training class.
- TES staff facilitated a Microsoft Word class for 4 employees.
- A Workplace Safety Meeting was held on October 18 at the Delaware Water Gap facility. A facility safety audit was conducted by committee members.
- Tool Box safety talks were conducted at 7 maintenance facilities. The subjects presented at the classes were; Back Injury Protection, Electrical Hazards, and Electrical Safety.
- TES managers met and discussed department goals.
- TES staff met and discussed department activities and plans. Also discussed were training initiatives and employee safety programs.
- Submitted the TES department report for the December staff meeting.
- TES staff attended the November Staff and Operation meeting
