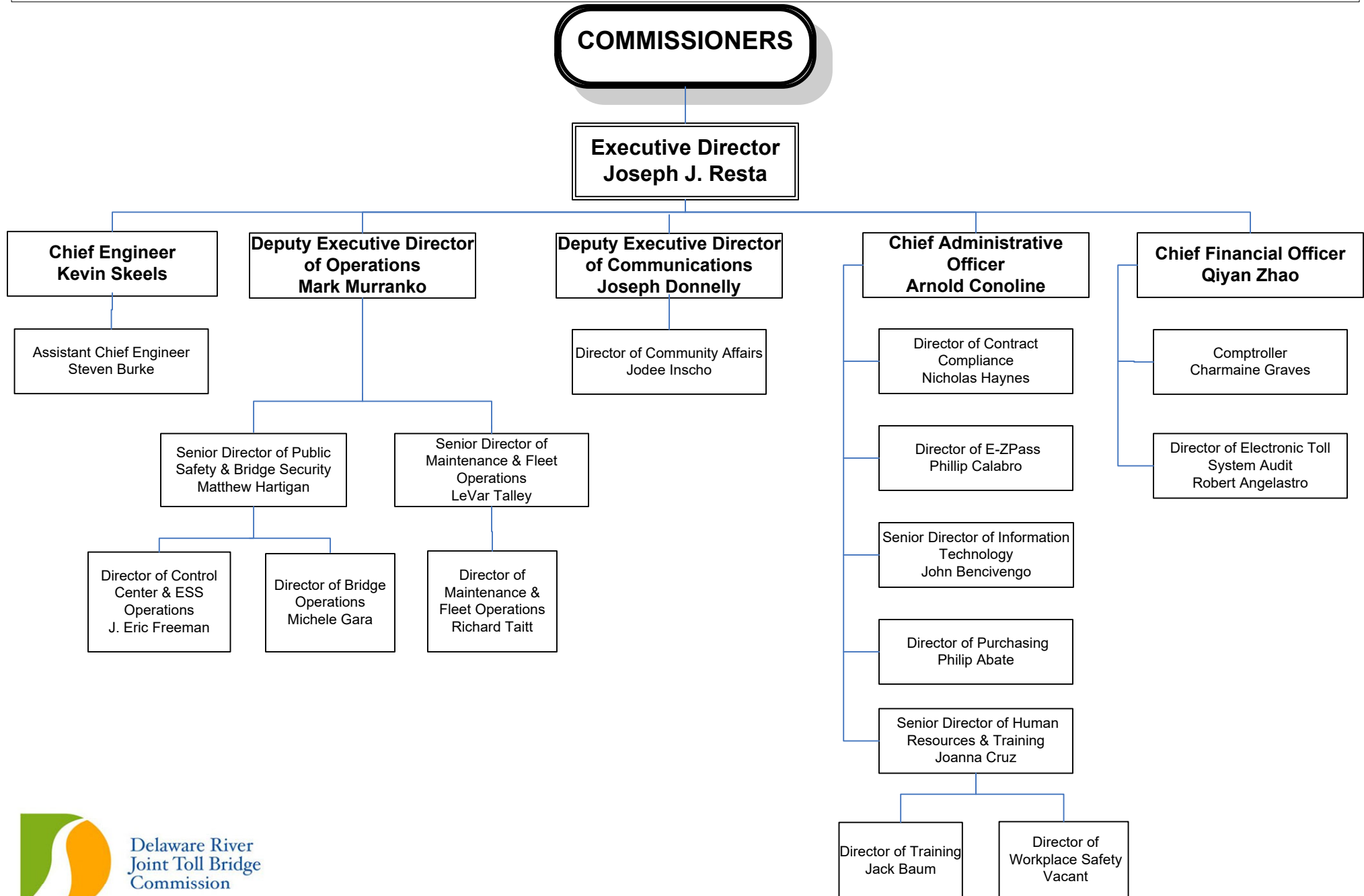

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Good morning, commissioners, last month in May, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission conducted its Annual Meeting and Election of Officers for the ensuing year. Also in May, based on the covenants of the Commission's Bond Indenture, the Commission conducted, and Commissioners adopted an annual independent audit of its financial statements. SBC, the Commission's independent auditor, performed the audit with cooperation and assistance from Commission staff, and for that, we thank all involved for their hard work and persistence. We are pleased to report that the Auditor issued an "unmodified" or "clean" opinion on the financial statements ending 12/31/2025 and that according to government accounting standards, there were no negative findings regarding: internal control over financial reporting, noncompliance with laws, regulations, contracts, or agreements. The 2025 Audit has already been placed on the Commission's website as have prior year's audits.

This Wednesday, July 1st, the Commission closes on its \$344 million Bridge System Revenue Bonds, Series 2026. In addition to the prior approval of this Board of Commissioners, I would like to take the opportunity to thank the team that has guided the recent transaction over the past months. Co-Bond Counsel: Dilworth Paxon and Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, our own Archer & Greiner and Florio Perrucci, Steinhardt, Capelli, & Tipton. Underwriter's Counsel: Ahmad Zaffarese and McManimon, Scotland & Baumann. Underwriters: RBC Capital Markets, Wells Fargo Securities, Drexel Hamilton, Ramirez & Company. Financial Advisor to the Commission, Acacia Financial Group. Thank you to Moody's, S&P, and Fitch for our "A1", "A+", and "A+" ratings, respectively. And last, but certainly never least, our Chief Engineer, Kevin Skeels, and Chief Financial Officer, Tracy Zhao. Wednesday's closing certainly culminates hard work by a great team and provides the Commission with a stable financial footing from which its capital plan and a capital program are built upon.

Today's agenda includes design services, capital program management services, Network VMS Integrator Services, and personnel resolutions for which we ask for your support. Thank you, Commissioners, this concludes the Executive Director's report.

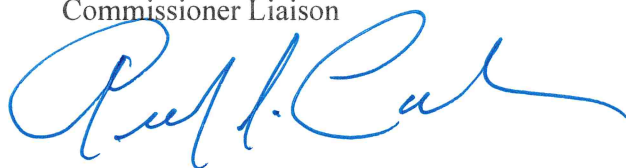

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION
Meeting of June 29, 2026
TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (May 2026)

Summary: The Commission recorded an increase in total toll revenue for May 2026 in comparison to the May 2025 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month. It should be noted that the Commission increased toll rates for all vehicle classifications effective January 1, 2026. In addition, it should be noted that cash toll collections were eliminated at TM, I78, EP, and DWG on January 12, 2025.

Analysis of May 2026 / May 2025 toll revenue data comparison:

- Total toll revenue increased by **\$7,105,497** or 41.07 percent at the Commission's eight toll bridges for the month of May.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue increased \$4,595,490, or 39.94 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue increased \$2,510,007 or 43.32 percent.

Analysis of May 2026 / May 2025 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by **38,521** vehicles, or 0.96 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 34,716 vehicles, or 5.75 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 73,237 vehicles, or 2.16 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's toll bridges for May 2026 was 130,116 total vehicles as compared to the 128,873 total vehicles recorded in May 2025, an increase on average of 1,243 vehicles a day.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 10 toll supported bridges for May 2026 increased by 63,360 vehicles, or 3.50 percent as compared to May 2025. Average daily westbound traffic on the toll supported bridges was 60,655 vehicles in May 2026 as compared to 58,611 vehicles in May 2025, an increase of 2,044 vehicles a day.

Traffic analysis for May 2026:

- Total toll traffic for the eight toll bridges is reflecting a 0.76 percent decrease for the first five months of 2026 as compared to the same five-month period of 2025.
- Westbound traffic on the ten toll supported bridges reflects an increase of 1.50 percent through the first five months of 2026 when compared to 2025.

REGION REVIEW:

Southern Region

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) reflected a 0.20 percent increase for May 2026 when compared to May 2025 as the result of the increase of 2,940 cars and the decrease of 1,422 trucks. The Scudder Falls Bridge recorded a 3.09 percent decrease in total toll traffic for May 2026 compared to May 2025 due to the decreases of 17,174 cars and 5,194 trucks. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), a decrease of 9,821 cars combined with a decrease of 1,744 trucks resulted in an overall decrease of 7.82 percent in total toll traffic for May 2026 as compared to May 2025.

Central Region

The I-78 Toll Bridge recorded a decrease of 4.89 percent in total toll traffic for the month of May 2026 when compared to May 2025 as the result of the decreases of 14,030 cars and 35,860 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, combined decreases of 13,396 passenger vehicles and 10,742 trucks generated a 4.87 percent decrease in total toll traffic for May 2026 as compared to May 2025.

Northern Region

Portland-Columbia (PC) recorded a 16.28 percent increase in total toll traffic during May 2026 compared to May 2025 as the result of the combined increases of 11,007 automobiles and 4,163 trucks. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, an increase of 108,833 passenger vehicles and an increase of 16,887 trucks generated a total increase of 18.55 percent in toll traffic for May 2026 when compared to May 2025. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 4,878 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 804 trucks produced a 4.33 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of May 2026 as compared to May 2025.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

The following items were recently initiated, accomplished or performed during the above noted month:

Activities for the In-Lane Toll System

1. Lane equipment cleaning is a constant activity during this time of year. Firmware upgrades are continuing on all UPS units as needed. In addition, UPS units are affected by the warmer temperatures and battery conditions are being checked. Also, all lane cameras are being checked for image clarity.
2. Commission Staff is worked with TransCore to identify locations within the Commission's facilities for TransCore to store spare parts that are used by their technicians when responding to various in-lane toll system issues. TransCore provided photos of the proposed cabinet locations, and they were approved by Commission Staff.
3. Commission Staff and TransCore meet monthly to review and discuss system operational and maintenance items. A weekly call also takes place to briefly review system maintenance items for the week.

Activities for the E-ZPass Customer Service Center/Violation Processing Center

1. Conduent continues to develop the real time digital payment function at the NJ E-ZPass CSC for toll by plate customers. Conduent revised the terms and conditions that will be displayed on the NJ E-ZPass website, and comments were provided from the NJTA. Conduent has released this functionality into the NJ CSC software, and they are proceeding with testing it through a small group of individuals.
2. Conduent continues to develop the real time digital payment function at the NJ E-ZPass CSC for toll by plate customers. Conduent revised the terms and conditions that will be displayed on the NJ E-ZPass website, and comments were provided from the NJTA. Conduent has released this functionality into the NJ CSC software, and they are proceeding with testing it through a small group of individuals.
3. The NJ E-ZPass CSC launched the Amnesty Program in June 2025. NJ MVC legislation was passed and NJTA is working with the MVC on the programs. There are two programs: the Amnesty Program and the Vehicle Registration Suspension Program. The Amnesty Program must run for 180 days, with no lookback timeframe, meaning the program can go back as far as the violator wants to pay. Violation transactions after the start of the program are NOT eligible. The program is open to all violators (from any state), with tolls and fees that are \$500 or more prior to June 2025.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION
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The program must offer a 25% reduction of the fees, the program will collect 100% of the toll revenue. When applying payment, 100% of the toll amount will be satisfied first, followed by AET fees and administrative fees. The amount owed must be paid in full of no payment plan. A violator may make arrangements for a payment plan, outside of the Amnesty Program. For the NJ MVC Vehicle Registration Suspension, the transactions criteria include all NJ E-ZPass agency violations, unpaid tolls, administration fees and AET fees totaling \$500 or more; or 60 or more violations with at least one having occurred after January 2024 (legislation date). The Amnesty Program was completed in November 2025 and the NJTA has identified the first group of vehicles to request registration suspension. These vehicles are currently under administrative review by the NJTA.

4. TransCore continues to coordinate with Conduent for the testing for the new toll host that is being deployed to support the Hard AET conversion at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge, along with the other toll plazas. Conduent completed a revision to the NJ E-ZPass Customer Service Center system that allows the new toll host to exchange files with that system. Additional test transactions were completed in the AET lanes at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and these test transactions were provided to Conduent to process in their test system.
5. Conduent participated in meetings with TransCore to discuss and plan for a data migration from the existing NJ E-ZPass Customer Service Center to the Next Generation Back Office System.
6. The NJTA, as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Conduent to manage the implementation of outstanding system elements for the New Jersey E-ZPass Customer Service Center.

AET Program

1. Rummel, Klepper & Kahl, LLP (RK&K) participated in project related meetings with PKF for the construction project as needed for the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET project. During the reporting period RK&K prepared responses to Requests for Information (RFI) from the construction team and issued change of plans as needed. Additionally, RK&K completed several reviews of construction submittals from the contractor.
2. For the AET system implementation, Commission Staff, TransCore and the RK&K team participated in bi-weekly project status meetings. TransCore submitted the updated project schedule. The revised schedule is under review by RK&K and comments will be shared with TransCore. TransCore submitted the Succession Plan,

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FCC Certification updates, and as-built drawings for the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET system that are being review by Commission Staff and RK&K.

3. TransCore completed the installation of the Primary Toll Host and worked with the Commission's IT Department and Conduent for the New Jersey Customer Service Center (NJ CSC) to establish connectivity and data exchanges.
4. TransCore facilitated follow-up meetings with Conduent to coordinate connectivity testing between the new in-lane toll system and the NJ Customer Service Center.
5. For the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge hard AET project TransCore completed retests for the scripts from the Factory Acceptance Testing that required revisions at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and this phase is now complete. TransCore began the Production Readiness On-Site First Installation Test (PROFIT) of the AET system at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and is currently reviewing the transactions for accuracy. Commission Maintenance Staff assisted with the PROFIT by generating over 1,000 test transactions by driving vehicles through the AET zone.
6. TransCore staff continue to meet with the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET Conversion construction team to discuss the construction progress and to coordinate the all-electronic-tolling equipment installation and testing schedules.
7. For the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge hard AET project, TransCore continues to respond to questions from Atkins Réalis related to the T-M Toll Bridge AET design. The Preliminary Design plans for this project were shared with TransCore for their review.
8. Commission Staff and Atkins Réalis USA Inc. held several project status meetings. Atkins Réalis prepared and submitted responses to comments from the PennDOT Cycle 2 Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP) review for the Route 1 / Pennsylvania Avenue interchange with the roundabout design. The design team met with PennDOT to clarify a few comments, assisting them to provide responses to these comments. The design team is advancing the interchange design and preparing for the Cycle 3 HOP submission to PennDOT. The interchange design will include a traffic signal for the adjacent railroad crossing that will be activated by approaching trains from a railroad circuit that will be implemented as part of the project. Atkins Réalis submitted the updated project schedule. Atkins Réalis is addressing review comments from the Preliminary Design (60% complete) plans, specifications and estimate submission. Atkins Réalis submitted the draft US 1 over NJ 29 Superstructure Replacement Traffic Control Analysis and the document is being reviewed by Commission staff. The design

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team also submitted the draft US 1 over NJ 29 NB Superstructure Replacement Alternative Analysis document and it is being reviewed by Commission staff and AECOM.

9. Under this Task Order Assignment, the RK&K team is preparing preliminary (30% complete) design plans for the conversion to hard all electronic tolling (AET) at the I-78, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. RK&K submitted project memorandums that summarize the preferred hard AET option at each of the remaining toll bridges. The documents were reviewed by Commission staff and comments were provided. The design team addressed the review comments and adjusted the preferred option concepts to address the comments.
10. For the Customer Service Center Services for the New Jersey E-ZPass Group program, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA) issued a new Request for Proposals for Category D Merchant Services. Proposals are due this summer and will then be evaluated.

General Electronic Toll Collection Program Activities

1. Mr. Stracciolini facilitated the IAG E-ZPass Executive Management Committee meetings. At the August 2025 IAG EMC Meeting, Mr. Stracciolini was elected by the members to serve as Chair to the EMC.
2. Mr. Stracciolini facilitated the IAG Service Corporation meetings. At the December 12, 2024, IAG Service Corp. Board of Directors Meeting, a resolution was approved electing and appointing Mr. Stracciolini as the Chair of the IAG Service Corporation, effective December 12, 2024.
3. Commission staff are preparing to host the IAG EMC June 2026 Annual Meeting at the Administration Building.
4. Mr. Stracciolini participated on the IAG Policy Committee meetings.
5. Mr. stracciolini participated on the IAG Procurement Committee meetings.
6. Mr. Stracciolini is participating in the Non-toll Business Opportunity Task Force.
7. Mr. Stracciolini is serving on the International Bridge, Tunnel & Turnpike Association's (IBTTA) 2026 Engineering and Construction Task Force and the Toll Revenue Assurance Committee.

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IBE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (Commission) established an IBE Program (MBE/WBE/SBE/DBE/DsBE/VBE) with a target of 25% for all Professional Services and Construction Contracts awarded by the Commission effective July 1, 2014. To date, the Commission has awarded **(114)** contracts with the IBE Program requirements. Currently, there are **(56) active** projects and **(58) completed** projects.

IBE Program Requirements

The Commission began using Elation Systems effective January 2017, as the online system for Payment Verification and Certified Payroll Reporting (CPR). All contracts awarded by the Commission to a Prime Consultant/Prime Contractor and their Subconsultants and Subcontractors use this service free of charge. Online training is available to vendors on how to use Elation Systems. The Contract Compliance Department and Elation Support Staff are available to assist all users.

The Contract Compliance Department (CCD) monitors and posts and reports data regarding all payments. The CCD also reviews all Certified Payrolls submitted into Elation Systems.

The following are all mandatory requirements:

Company On-Line Registration:

- i.* All Primes must register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems; *and*
- ii.* All Primes must also ensure that all Subconsultants and Subcontractors register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems.

Payment Verification:

- i.* Prime Contractors must post all payments to their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors in Elation Systems; *and*
- ii.* Prime Contractors and their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors must confirm all payments received in Elation Systems.

Certified Payroll Reporting:

- i.* All Prime Contractors are responsible for assigning someone from their staff with the responsibility to review, approve, and upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems; *and*
- ii.* All Prime Contractors must also ensure that their Subcontractors upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems.

Prime Consultants / Contractors IBE Target performance will be displayed / available on the Commission's public website.

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Contract Compliance Department
Compliance IBE Scores Overview

The Commission through its Contract Compliance Department has instituted a Compliance Score Ranking that will be included in the Monthly Contract Compliance Report for all Professional Services and Construction Projects.

The Compliance Score Ranking is an ongoing summary of data presented on Active and Completed contracts, which includes the tracking of payments from Prime Consultants and Contractors to IBE Subconsultants and Subcontractors, and the Prime Contractors Workforce Utilization. The Scores will illustrate the progress and participation to meet the Targets by Prime Consultants and Contractors as part of the IBE program.

The complete and timely reporting of payments and certified payrolls to the Elation Systems by the Prime Consultants and Prime Contractors, and their Subconsultants and Subcontractors, will assist the Prime Consultant and Prime Contractor in tracking the data to meet their targets.

Accordingly, each Prime will also be given a final grade at the completion of each project. Additionally, the data will be uploaded onto the Commission's public website monthly.

The Score(s) are factored using the following criteria:

IBE PAYMENTS

The payments by the Prime Consultant / Contractor to each of their IBE Subconsultants / Subcontractors will be calculated based on the criteria set by the Commission's 25% IBE Target.

WORKFORCE UTILIZATION

Workforce utilization contains two levels of scoring and documents the hourly employee utilization by workforce type, ethnicity and gender.

MINORITY, WOMEN AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission implemented a one-year Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) pilot program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) pilot program with a 3% goal. These goals applied to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program and were effective on September 1, 2008.

At its December 2008 Commission Meeting, the Commission revised the pilot program to specify a 25% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal to New Jersey assigned consultant contracts in lieu of the previously specified 7% MBE and 3% WBE goals.

At its December 2010 Commission Meeting, due to the success of the Commission's MWSBE Pilot Program, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission adopted a resolution for permanent status of the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) program with a 3% goal, and the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program with a 25% goal. These goals apply to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program.

The Contract Compliance Department continues to monitor, update and analyze the payments for the MWSBE diversity program.

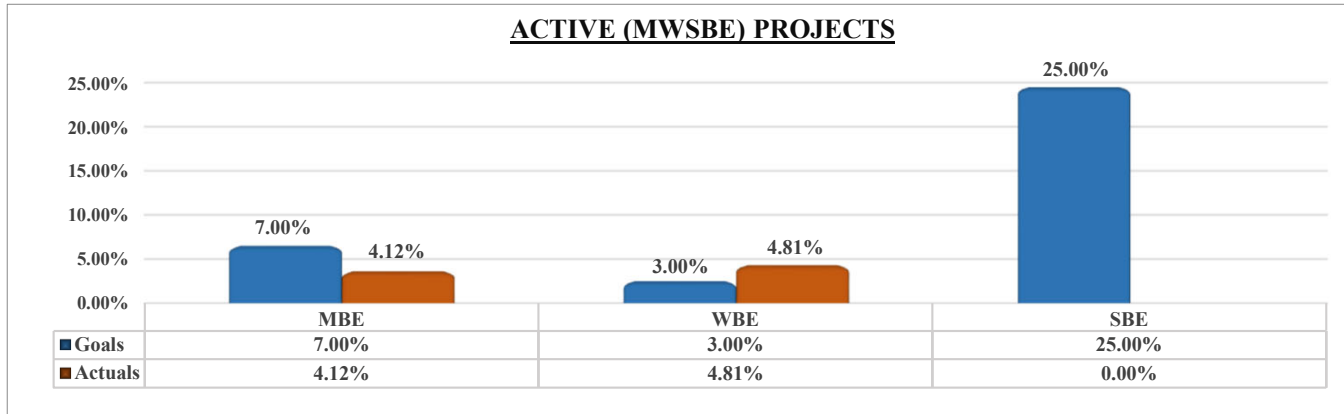

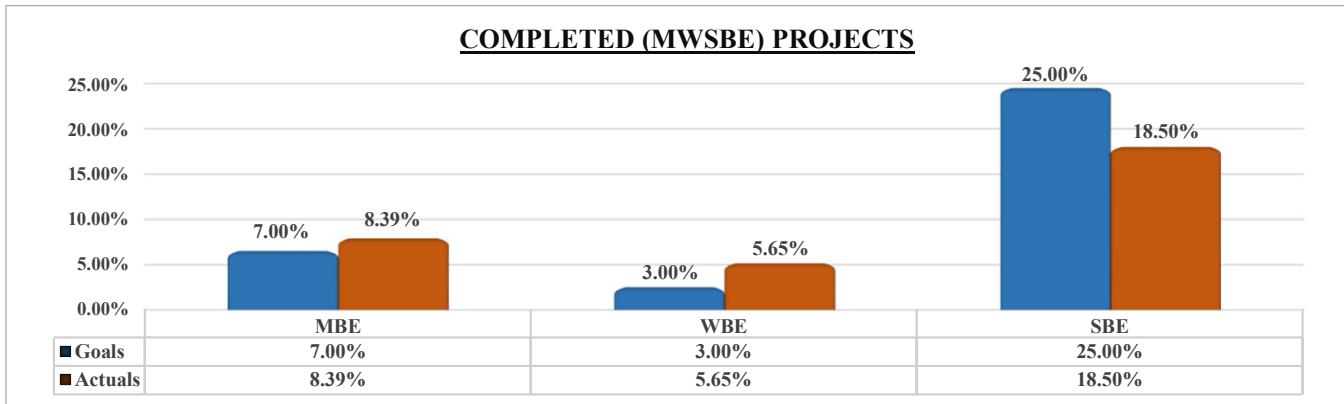

- **COMMISSION AWARENESS EFFORTS:**

Rollout of Lumberville-Raven Rock Toll-Supported Bridge Project – Worked with engineering department to craft a press release announcing the Commission’s upcoming project to outfit the Lumberville-Raven Rock Bridge with security cameras and color-programmable “node lighting” at catenary turnbuckle locations. The release also stated the Commission will assume responsibility for the display of an American flag at a yet-to-be-determined date later this year. The press release generated some online news coverage and was used in a Bucks County Herald article.

Scudder Falls Toll Bridge Bike-Ped Path Work Expands to Five-Day Schedule -- Drafted and issued a press release to advise the public that the Scudder Falls Toll Bridge’s walkway will be closed Mondays to Fridays until further notice. The walkway has been undergoing a resurfacing since mid-March. The revised work schedule could enable the resurfacing work to be completed before mid-June. The announcement – which also was posted on the Facebook page – generated hits and shares on a variety of social media platforms.

2025 Annual Report – Continued to draft articles for the upcoming annual report. Alex Styer of Bellevue Communications provided draft traffic counts and Statements of Net Position entries for the report. The process of identifying and acquiring various photographs also continued during the month.

Updating Photographs – Scheduled photograph sessions to update images on the Commission website and for a video related to the Washington Crossing Bridge. The website photographs will replace images of former cash-toll-collection facilities with the all-electronic tolling equipment arrays at the Commission’s two open-road tolling gantries at the Scudder Falls Toll Bridge (operational since 2019) and the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge (expected to begin operating in mid-to-late June).

Community Affairs Report May 2026

The following Community Affairs activities took place in May of 2026

Washington Crossing Bridge Alternatives Analysis

Participated in status meetings with team. Performing site visit with HDR Public Involvement team member to identify appropriate business stakeholders, and follow-up review of results.

Washington Crossing July 4 event

Continued to communicate with Friends of the Washing Crossing Park on the Commission's Use of Facilities requirements and to request meeting with all agencies involved. The Friends group is having difficulties with the insurance requirements, as was the issue with the 2025 Christmas event.

Penn DOT Usage of Scudder Falls Parking Facilities

PennDOT requested permission to stage trucks in the Scudder Falls Park and Ride during several events in June and July in the Philadelphia area, including FIFA games and MLB All-Star Week. Operations approved use of employee parking lot at Administration Building (most of the dates are outside of normal business hours) as well as access to the restrooms.

Uhlerstown-Frenchtown Toll-Supported Bridge

Received a couple of concerns regarding static electricity on the new walkway, similar to those received immediately after opening of the walkway at New Hope-Lambertville TSB. The contractor requested information from the panel manufacturer, which provided an explanation that this is common when the panels are first installed and should subside with use and weathering.

Lumberville-Raven Rock Pedestrian Bridge

Along with DED Joseph Donnelly, visited NJ Bulls Island Park and neighboring business to share information about the upcoming upgrades. Relayed information back to Engineering on some lighting work recently completed by the Black Bass Inn.

Portland-Columbia Toll Bridge

Maintenance produced and installed new signage directing trucks to the travel center via Rt. 94, instead of going through the village of Columbia.

Received call from neighboring property owner regarding property damage from a tree. Passed information along to PC maintenance and Insurance Manager. Fallen limbs were cleaned up; an additional tree needs to be removed. Claim filed.

New Hope-Lambertville Route 202 AET Conversion

Kept apprised of work schedule when not able to attend progress meetings. Residents upstream of the park in Pennsylvania are concerned about the level of noise and duration of the project.

Currently GF is providing Post-Design services for Contract T-519A by attending all project meetings, responding to requests for information, reviewing submittals, assisting in resolving conflicts in the field and clarifying the contract documents. During this reporting period, GF attended a third Commissioning meetings and witnessed further MEP equipment functional testing.

This contract is for Construction Management (CM) and Construction Inspection (CI) Services in connection with the demolition and new construction of the Southern Operations and Maintenance Facilities Improvements Project. JJS is currently overseeing the facility commissioning, punch list completion and processing closeouts documents as part of providing construction management services.

Notice of Award and Limited Notice to Proceed was issued to the Contractor on June 29, 2021; Notice to Proceed was made effective July 27, 2021, and a Pre-Construction Meeting was conducted on July 29, 2021.

At the **Trenton Morrisville** site, at the **new operations building**, Mechanical equipment start-up and Commissioning activities are near completion. Building systems installation and primary control center configuration are also near completion. Commission Staff moved into the Operation Building on October 27, 2025, with substantial completion. Training for the site emergency Generator has been completed, and the balance of the training sessions for building systems were completed December 4, 2025. Equipment Commissioning and Punch-List activities continue throughout the facility during the reporting period.

At the **new maintenance garage** location, door hardware, mechanical equipment installation and equipment start-up activities are in progress. Equipment Commissioning and Punch -List activities continue throughout the facility during the reporting period.

At the **Langhorne site**, punch-list activities continued along with Close-Out of final construction details throughout the reporting period.

This Task Order Assignment (TOA) with Traffic Planning and Design, Inc. (TPD) is for professional consultant design services, encompassing project management and coordination,

verification of facility condition assessment, preliminary and final design of plans, specifications, construction schedule, engineer's estimate, and post-design services for the Trenton-Morrisville Toll Bridge Miscellaneous Substructure Spall Repairs. The not-to-exceed amount for this TOA is \$129,794.95. The contract also includes an item for chloride testing of the Ramp I & Ramp Y bridge over Bridge Street due to the extensive delamination in the northerly pier cap, as well as the repair of spalls with exposed prestressed strands at the ends of beams and superstructure members.

The TPD contract was fully executed on April 24, 2025, and the Notice to Proceed was effective on April 28, 2025. A project Kick-off meeting was held on May 2, 2025. TPD began their field inspections and coring the caps on bridge IY for chloride testing on June 6, 2025. They continued their inspection on June 20, 2025 focusing on the west end of the prestressed beams.

During TPD's inspection efforts, beam deterioration was found on the bridge carrying Route 1 over Route 29 NB. This deterioration had been noted by the Commission's General Engineering Consultant Pickering, Corts & Summerson (PCS) in previous Annual Inspection Reports, with recommendation to monitor the situation. On July 2, 2025 a meeting was held between Commission staff, AECOM, TPD and PCS to review the field inspection investigation findings and discuss the overall condition of the bridge and the typical beam deterioration. TPD was directed, and has since completed, the load ratings for Beam 6 on the bridge carrying Route 1 over Route 29 NB and has determined that traffic restrictions are not required at this time. However, the recommendation included accelerating the bridge replacement due to advancing deterioration of the beams. This will be performed under a separate design and construction contract.

On February 26, 2026, Advanced Infrastructure Design, Inc. (AID) issued the Final Half-Cell Testing and Analysis report to TPD and subsequently to the Commission. TPD is currently coordinating with Vector who will prepare the design based on the half-cell testing information. Vector will function as the specialty contractor as a subcontractor to Mount Construction Company (MCC) under the JOC program.

On February 19, TPD attended a Joint Scope Meeting along with personnel from MCC, the Gordian Group and the Commission. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the scope of the project with the contractor and address any project concerns.

During this reporting period TPD and the Commission finalized the review and negotiation of Mount Construction Company's Price Proposal for this project. Price Proposal 2.0, in the amount of \$1,580,401.17, was approved, and the Commission is proceeding with the award of the Job Order Assignment. The Notice to Proceed is anticipated to be issued prior to June 12, 2026. The contract duration is 134 days from the Notice to Proceed date, with project completion expected in early October 2026.

Atkins Réalis prepared and submitted responses to comments from the PennDOT Cycle 2 Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP) review for the Route 1 / Pennsylvania Avenue interchange with the roundabout design. The design team met with PennDOT to clarify a few comments, assisting them to provide responses to these comments. The design team is advancing the interchange design and preparing for the Cycle 3 HOP submission to PennDOT. The interchange design will include a traffic signal for the adjacent railroad crossing that will be activated by approaching trains from a railroad circuit that will be implemented as part of the project.

Atkins Réalis submitted the updated project schedule. Atkins Réalis is addressing review comments from the Preliminary Design (60% complete) plans, specifications and estimate submission.

Atkins Réalis submitted the draft US 1 over NJ 29 Superstructure Replacement Traffic Control Analysis and the document is being reviewed by Commission staff. The design team also submitted the draft US 1 over NJ 29 NB Superstructure Replacement Alternative Analysis document, and it is being reviewed by Commission staff and AECOM.

Under Task Order Assignment No. C-771A-2 French & Parrello Associates provided conceptual design services for the development of a new pilot over height vehicle detection system for the New Jersey approach to the Lower Trenton TSB. The work of that assignment was completed with acceptance of the final Concept Report dated March 6, 2024.

On May 14, 2024, the Commission provided French & Parrello Associated with Notice-to-Proceed for final design services for the development of a new over height vehicle detection system for the New Jersey approach to the Lower Trenton TSB. The design is complete, and staff from the Commission, AECOM, Gordian (JOC Program Manager) and Mount Construction continue to work towards an agreed upon Job Order Contract price for the system installation.

This project includes the design of a Bridge Monitor Shelter on the New Jersey approach to the Lower Trenton Toll-Supported Bridge. Conceptual layouts of the proposed Shelter have been created in conjunction with the over height detection system layout. The concepts include the need to establish construction and property easements with the City of Trenton.

On September 4, 2024, Commission personnel met with City of Trenton personnel to discuss temporary construction and permanent property easements needed for this project. On January 3, 2025, DRJTBC attorneys completed an appraisal for the two City of Trenton properties that are needed for temporary construction and permanent easements for the project. On June 27, 2025, DRJTBC staff and attorneys met with City officials to discuss the project and steps needed to obtain construction and permanent property easements, with the goal of getting City Council resolutions on the agenda for their September 2025 meeting. On August 25, 2025, DRJTBC attorneys sent a draft easement agreement and draft amendment to the City's lease with the State for their review and consideration. Coordination with the City is ongoing. DRJTBC is trying to get comments or a follow-up meeting with the City of Trenton to finalize temporary construction and permanent property easements needed for this project.

On January 30, 2026, Mount Construction submitted a revised Price Proposal for the Truck Warning System Pilot Project, not including the Bridge Officer's Shelter. The design team provided proposal review comments on February 17, 2026, and attended a proposal review meeting that day. A revised Price Proposal was submitted on April 1, 2026, and is under review.

AECOM has provided DMC services throughout the construction of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Contract T-668A under Task Order Assignment C-502A-2I. The remaining unexpended funds in Task Order Assignment C-502A-2I have been transferred over to Task Order Assignment C-502A-1M and Task Order Assignment C-502A-2I has been closed out. Remaining DMC services on the Scudder Falls Project will be completed under the C-502A-1M Task order Assignment.

The remaining DMC Services include support to the Commission in the following and assistance with various project close-out activities:

Environmental Permitting – The remaining effort under this task was to coordinate a final inspection of the project site performed by the Bucks County Soil Conservation District (BCSCD) to obtain final acceptance of all BCSCD Permitting work. BCSCD self-visited the site on July 2, 2025 during the reporting period. Verbal acceptance was received from the BCSCD representative as to the adequacy of established vegetation. Commission staff, in conjunction with the final designer Michael Baker International, and the General Contractor Trumbull Corporation have submitted the project Notice of Termination (NOT). BCSCD has approved the NOT for the project, Permit Completion Forms need to be sent to the PADEP and the USACE. This will close-out all outstanding permitting work associated with the project other than the continued five-year monitoring period for the PA Wetlands Mitigation Site.

Environmental Monitoring Services – Continuous services were provided throughout construction to meet project permit requirements. Yearly reporting on the monitoring activities for the PA Wetlands Mitigation Site, by ACT Engineers will continue through 2027. This includes monthly monitoring well readings of the groundwater levels within the wetlands site along with vegetation growth and invasive plantings treatment. Wetlands Monitoring Report #5 was submitted to US Army Corps of Engineers for their review on December 23, 2025.

Right of Way Transfers – Working with Commission staff and attorneys to transfer certain property and easements to NJDOT, PennDOT and Lower Makefield Township. These properties and easements were acquired by DRJTBC to construct the project but are located within jurisdiction of these other agencies or municipalities.

The Commission has implemented a periodic deck sealing program at specific bridges to prolong the useful service life of the bridge decks and to mitigate the need for potential future maintenance. The Commission engaged Task Order Consultant, NAIK, under the standing professional services task order agreement, to provide design services for the bridge deck sealing of the bridges associated with the Trenton–Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility, the Scudder Fall Toll Bridge Facility and Shared Use Path PPC Overlay Improvements, and the Interstate 78 Toll Bridge Facility.

The final design bid documents, addressing all Commission comments to the pre-final design, was received on April 28, 2023. The project to seal decks at all 3 Toll Bridge facility bridge decks (T-764A) was advertised for bids on May 2, 2023. A virtual Bid Opening was held on Thursday June 1, 2023, at 2:00 PM. No bids were received.

NAIK repackaged the bid documents into three individual projects: 1. Trenton–Morrisville Toll Bridge Facility; 2. the Scudder Fall Toll Bridge Facility, and 3. the Interstate 78 Toll Bridge Facility for incorporation into other Capital construction contracts. The TMTB deck sealing was completed as part of Contract T-746A in 2024; the I-78 deck sealing was completed as part of Contract T-766A in 2025; the Scudder Falls project is being completed under a Job Order Contract with Mount Construction Company. The job order contract to perform the work at the Scudder Falls Facility structures was executed in September 2025 with work start on September 29, 2025. Naik will perform construction phase support services.

During this reporting period, Artheon (formerly NAIK) attended the Job Order Contract No. T/TS-785A-005 Progress Meetings No. 10 and 11, held on May 14, 2026 and May 28, 2026, respectively.

On May 11, 2026, Artheon provided recommendations for adjusting grades to an area approximately 50' in length in the vicinity of the PA expansion cover plate on the west end of the Main River Bridge to eliminate a potential ponding issue near the cover plate.

Traffic Planning and Design, Inc (TPD) was provided with Notice to Proceed on October 21, 2024, to design repairs and verify/update bridge load ratings. TPD performed field visits to the bridge site in November 2024. The project recommendations report was submitted, reviewed and accepted in July 2025. During this reporting period, TPD has continued work on the pre-final design submission.

M-M TB STORAGE BUILDING

Task Order Assignment No. C-789A-2
(BVP/SJB)

On June 6, 2025, the Commission provided Pennoni Associates with Notice-to-Proceed for design services in support of construction of a storage building at the Milford-Montague toll bridge facility. Commission Staff and the Pennoni team participated in a project kick-off meeting on June 11, 2025. Pennoni Associates submitted final design plans for a job order contract on March 5, 2026, but is revising the submission to include a new electrical supply path to the storage building from an electrical panel in the electrical room of the Administration building, instead of pulling the electric supply from the existing salt shed panel. A field meeting was held on May 21, 2026,

to determine the electrical panel source in the administration building's electrical room and the conduit path to provide ample power to the new storage building. Once the electrical plans, including site and building electrical layout plans are finalized, final documents will be issued for a job order contract.

Services under this Task Order Assignment from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2028. Under Task Order Assignment 502A-1N, AECOM continues to provide Capital Program Management Consultant (CPMC) Staff Augmentation Services for delivery of the Commission's Capital Program. AECOM is currently providing three (3) full-time Project Managers to oversee and administer various design and construction projects that are being advanced in the Capital Improvement Program.

CPMC staff will continue to provide support to the Commission in advancing the Capital Program in the following areas: procurement assistance, scheduling and cost control, programming/planning, Project Management, Program Area Management, technical support, design oversight and support, construction oversight and support, and oversight and support of the Job Order Contract (JOC) construction work, all including coordination with multiple Commission departments outside of Engineering.

UNDERWATER SUBSTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS DESIGN – ALL REGIONS

Design
Contract No. C-782A

IH Engineers, P.C. of Princeton, New Jersey was awarded this contract and given full notice to proceed with the delivery of the executed agreement on August 18, 2023. In 2021 the Commission performed the 5-year interval underwater inspections of each of its river crossing bridges, to meet National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS) requirements. The findings of these inspections identified the need for bridge substructure repair and/or rehabilitation of existing scour remediation measures at bridge substructures below the water level. IH's scope is to prepare a

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Substructure Foundation Report (SFR), identifying foundation types and assessing vulnerability to scour at each of the Commission's Delaware River crossings. followed by a **Condition Assessment Report (CAR)** recommending any repairs or maintenance required to mitigate potential effects of scour).

IH's subconsultants GPI and JMT have completed the in-depth field inspections for incorporation into the Condition Assessment Report (CAR). IH has reviewed potential remediation methods to affect the repairs with NJDEP. Based upon NJDEP comments, alternate repair methods are being developed by IH as the CAR continues to be progressed. IH is working on the preliminary design to support the effort to acquire the necessary permits.

IH and the Engineering Department have held 'workshop' meetings to finalize the CAR and its recommendations. A revised Corrective Action Report was resubmitted on September 4, 2025. Based on recommendations prescribed in the CAR, IH is progressing the preliminary design. Permit pre-application meetings were conducted with NJDEP and PADEP. The IH team submitted a Modification request on March 13, 2026 that was reviewed and comments were returned.

BRIDGE INSPECTION PLATFORM LAYOUT AND DESIGN

TOLL-SUPPORTED BRIDGES

Design

The purpose of this project is to develop detailed temporary rigging access platforms, cabling and attachment details for internal Commission use. Rigging access is needed to inspect and maintain the underside of the Commission's Toll-Supported Bridges. The rigging system shall be designed to be efficiently installed, operated, and maneuvered by Commission staff.

Traffic Planning and Design, Inc (TPD) was provided with Notice to Proceed on September 24, 2024. A kick-off meeting was held on October 6. After field site visits during the October month, a meeting was held with Maintenance, Engineering, TPD and TPD's subconsultant Malick Sherer (MS). The Rigging Layout Report dated October 20, 2025 was received, reviewed and accepted. TPD has submitted a modification to perform the final design of the rigging and access, intentionally not included in the preliminary design base Task Order Agreement. The Final Design Modification was executed on April 22, 2026. The TPD team continues to work on the final rigging design and plans.

BRIDGE MONITOR SHELTER ENHANCEMENTS PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Dynamic Security, LLC (dba Secuni) continued to provide maintenance services of headend type equipment in support of the Electronic Surveillance / Detection System (ESS) under the direction of the Commission's Public Safety and Bridge Security Department, who operates the system from the Control Centers located at the New Jersey State Police's Regional Operation and Information Center (ROIC) in West Trenton, New Jersey and the New Hope-Lambertville Toll Bridge facility in New Hope, Pennsylvania.

Throughout the reporting period, work efforts included the continued deployment of an Endpoint Detection and Response solution across the ESS.

ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION

CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER/VIOLATION PROCESSING CENTER PROJECT

Contract No. DB-584A

(CAS/KMS)

Conduent continues to develop the **real time digital payment function** at the NJ E-ZPass CSC for toll by plate customers. Conduent revised the terms and conditions that will be displayed on the NJ E-ZPass website, and comments were provided from the NJTA. Conduent has released this functionality into the NJ CSC software, and they are proceeding with testing it through a small group of individuals.

The NJ E-ZPass CSC launched the Amnesty Program in June 2025. NJ MVC legislation was passed and NJTA is working with the MVC on the programs. There are two programs: the Amnesty Program and the Vehicle Registration Suspension Program. The Amnesty Program must run for 180 days, with no lookback timeframe, meaning the program can go back as far as the violator wants to pay. Violation transactions after the start of the program are NOT eligible. The program is open to all violators (from any state), with tolls and fees that are \$500 or more prior to June 2025. The program must offer a 25% reduction of the fees; the program will collect 100% of the toll revenue. When applying payment, 100% of the toll amount will be satisfied first, followed by AET fees and administrative fees. The amount owed must be paid in full or no payment plan. A violator may make arrangements for a payment plan, outside of the Amnesty Program. For the NJ MVC Vehicle Registration Suspension, the transactions criteria include all NJ E-ZPass agency violations, unpaid tolls, administration fees and AET fees totaling \$500 or more; or 60 or more violations with at least one having occurred after January 2024 (legislation date). The Amnesty Program was completed in November 2025 and the NJTA has identified the first group of vehicles to request registration suspension. These vehicles are currently under administrative review by the NJTA.

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TransCore continues to coordinate with Conduent for the testing for the new toll host that is being deployed to support the Hard AET conversion at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge, along with the other toll plazas. Conduent completed a revision to the NJ E-ZPass Customer Service Center system that allows the new toll host to exchange files with that system. Additional test transactions were completed in the AET lanes at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and these test transactions were provided to Conduent to process in their test system.

Conduent participated in meetings with TransCore to discuss and plan for data migration from the existing NJ E-ZPass Customer Service Center to the Next Generation Back Office System.

The NJTA, as the lead agency, is facilitating all meetings with the other agencies and Conduent to manage the implementation of outstanding system elements for the New Jersey E-ZPass Customer Service Center.

Lane equipment cleaning is a constant activity during this time of year. Firmware upgrades are continuing on all UPS units as needed. In addition, UPS units are affected by the warmer temperatures and battery conditions are being checked. Also, all lane cameras are being checked for image clarity.

Commission Staff is worked with TransCore to identify locations within the Commission's facilities for TransCore to store spare parts that are used by their technicians when responding to various in-lane toll system issues. TransCore provided photos of the proposed cabinet locations, and they were approved by Commission Staff.

Commission Staff and TransCore meet monthly to review and discuss system operational and maintenance items. A weekly call also takes place to briefly review system maintenance items for the week.

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Remington & Vernick Engineers (RVE), is providing professional consulting services to review, analyze, provide alternatives, and prepare construction plans for revised toll plaza and approach restriping at the seven (7) traditional toll plazas.

Plans for Interstate 78 and Trenton – Morrisville were completed as part of the T-766A I-78 I-NJ Roadway Rehabilitation and Power & Communication Infrastructure Improvements project and the of T-746A Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge Roadway Paving and Deck Sealing Improvements project, respectively.

Due to timing of the upcoming accelerated AET conversion projects, the Commission will incorporate the new toll plaza striping with additional full facility restriping at the Easton – Phillipsburg, Portland – Columbia, and Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridges as they were last striped in 2015, 2015, and 2021, respectively.

TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM UPGRADE

Signal Service, Inc. of West Chester, PA (SS) is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program and installs traffic counter equipment purchased under that program.

Commission staff and Signal Service continue to monitor and reconfigure or recalibrate traffic count sensors at any bridges when needed. There are a few bridges that are problematic, including Uhlerstown – Frenchtown, Upper Black Eddy – Milford, and Riverton – Belvidere where narrow approach roadways coupled with steel guiderail has caused issues with radar counts.

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PROJECT STATUS REPORT

On January 16, Signal Service, Inc., of West Chester, PA (SS) was issued a new Purchase Order for 2026 Traffic Counter Maintenance Services. As a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program, SS will continue providing the Commission with Maintenance Services of the traffic counter radar system that was installed in 2023, including quarterly maintenance and reinstallation/recalibration after rehabilitation or other projects are completed that require relocation of the traffic counter equipment.

Quarterly maintenance was performed on February 4, 5, 6, and 10 at all facilities except NH-L Toll Bridge and Uhlerstown – Frenchtown TSB, which are offline due to construction. On March 3, the Uhlerstown – Frenchtown TSB traffic counter was relocated to the new pole installed under Contract No. TS-642A U-F TSB Rehabilitation by the ESS Department. Signal Service was on-site to set up the traffic counter, configure it, and perform Quarterly Maintenance. Calibration was unsatisfactory and Signal Service will be returning to re-calibrate.

SS was on-site on March 3 & 12 to recalibrate the counter at Uhlerstown – Frenchtown TSB. This counter will be monitored for a few months to make sure data collection is consistent and as accurate as possible. SS was also asked to review and comment on the proposed location of the Trenton – Morrisville TB Traffic Counter after reconfiguration for All Electronic Tolling.

SS provided comments to the T-M AET Design team on the location of the Traffic Counter on April 1. SS also provided the Commission with a quote to upgrade all the traffic counter's power supplies, battery back-ups, and user manuals to incorporate updates that have taken place since the traffic counters were originally installed. They originally communicated via cellular modem and are now hardwired to the Commission's network.

On May 5, A purchase order was issued to SS for upgrades to all the traffic counters' power supplies, battery back-ups, and user manuals. SS is currently awaiting parts to complete the purchase order. On May 19, the reporting system for the traffic counters was updated to take into account the moving of the U-F TSB sensor from the north side of the roadway to the south side of the roadway in March.

AET SYSTEM SUPPORT SERVICES

Under this Task Order Assignment, the RK&K team is providing AET support services. Services include working with Commission staff and its in-lane toll system provider (TransCore) to transition the Commission's existing toll operation to a Hard All Electronic Tolling (AET) system at each new toll gantry. This task also includes managing the coordination between TransCore and various civil design/construction teams, review of TransCore design and test documents, oversight of system testing, and post conversion transaction monitoring.

The RK&K team participated in meetings with the NH-L Toll Bridge AET construction team and TransCore to coordinate the testing of the in-lane All Electronic Tolling system at this location.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION

PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The RK&K team participated in the TransCore Factory Acceptance Testing retests as well as the Production Readiness On-Site First Installation Test (PROFIT) of the new AET system at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. The team has access to the AET system and is reviewing transactions from the PROFIT. Further, the RK&K team participated in a workshop with TransCore and Commission staff for training on accessing and using the AET system.

The RK&K team continues to review submittals from TransCore related to the AET system. These items include updated project schedule, Succession Plan, Infinity Reports and Report Development Requirement Research documents, FCC Certification updates, and as-built drawings for the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET system.

The RK&K team also is assisting with the coordination and exchange of information between the Trenton – Morrisville Toll Bridge AET design team and the Commission's in-lane toll system provider.

RK&K and Commission staff executed a Task Order Assignment Modification that extends the support services to allow continuous coverage as the Commission transitions to hard AET.

HARD AET PRELIMINARY DESIGN

Task Order Assignment No. C-770A-6
(CAS/ KMS)

Under this Task Order Assignment, the RK&K team is preparing preliminary (30% complete) design plans for the conversion to hard all electronic tolling (AET) at the I-78, Easton-Phillipsburg, Portland-Columbia, Delaware Water Gap and Milford-Montague Toll Bridges. RK&K submitted project memorandums that summarize the preferred hard AET option at each of the remaining toll bridges. The documents were reviewed by Commission staff and comments were provided. The design team addressed the review comments and adjusted the preferred option concepts to address the comments.

IN-LANE ALL ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM DESIGN, BUILD & MAINTAIN

Contract No. DB-792A Systemwide
(CAS/ KMS)

Commission Staff, TransCore and the RK&K team participated in bi-weekly project status meetings. TransCore submitted the updated project schedule. The revised schedule is under review by RK&K and comments will be shared with TransCore. TransCore submitted the Succession Plan, FCC Certification updates, and as-built drawings for the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET system that are under review by Commission Staff and RK&K.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION

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PROJECT STATUS REPORT

TransCore completed the installation of the Primary Toll Host and worked with the Commission's IT Department and Conduent for the New Jersey Customer Service Center (NJ CSC) to establish connectivity and data exchanges.

TransCore facilitated follow-up meetings with Conduent to coordinate connectivity testing between the new in-lane toll system and the NJ Customer Service Center

NEW-HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE

TransCore completed retests for the scripts from the Factory Acceptance Testing that required revisions at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and this phase is now complete. TransCore began the Production Readiness On-Site First Installation Test (PROFIT) of the AET system at the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge and is currently reviewing the transactions for accuracy. Commission Maintenance Staff assisted with the PROFIT by generating over 1,000 test transactions by driving vehicles through the AET zone.

TransCore staff continue to meet with the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge AET Conversion construction team to discuss the construction progress and to coordinate the all-electronic-tolling equipment installation and testing schedules.

TRENTON-MORRISVILLE TOLL BRIDGE

TransCore continues to respond to questions from Atkins Réalis related to the T-M Toll Bridge AET design. The Preliminary Design plans for this project were shared with TransCore for their review.

NEW JERSEY E-ZPASS SERVICES

Next Generation BACO Office System

Contract No. DB-791A

(CAS/ KMS)

For the Customer Service Center Services for the New Jersey E-ZPass Group (Category A), the New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA) awarded the agreements at their Board Meeting. The NJTA issued their findings from the procurement challenge, concluding that the NJTA properly determined TransCore to be the most qualified responsible proposer. Accordingly, the hearing officer recommended that the award to TransCore should be sustained and the protest of Conduent be dismissed. Contract documents were provided from the NJTA for Category A Customer Service Center Services for the New Jersey E-ZPass Group and for Category B for License Plate Review Services for the New Jersey E-ZPass Group. The documents were provided to Commission counsel for review prior to execution.

As TransCore submits various documents, they are being reviewed by the implementation team that includes North Highland and HNTB under contract with the New Jersey Turnpike Authority. Commission Staff are participating on their assigned implementation team meetings as

needed. Meetings are held to review the business rules, the AET accounts/toll bills and the system architecture. Additionally, TransCore facilitated an initial meeting with Conduent, the current NJ CSC vendor, to discuss data migration.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority issued a new Request for Proposals for Category D Merchant Services. Proposals are due this summer and will then be evaluated.

NON-DESTRUCTIVE BRIDGE PIN TESTING PROGRAM

Deterioration (corrosion) of a structural pin was found at the New Hope-Lambertville Toll-Supported bridge, during the bridge blast cleaning and painting stage of the 2024-2025 rehabilitation of the bridge. Replacement of the deteriorated pin took place, which prompted the non-destructive ultrasonic testing of the remaining 209 pins on the bridge. All results were positive.

As a result of the findings of a structural pin deterioration on the New Hope - Lambertville Toll-Supported bridge, the Commission decided to perform testing on all the structural pins in its bridge system.

SOUTHERN REGION BRIDGES

Design/Testing

At the Commissions November 24, 2025 the Commission awarded his contract to Pennoni Associates (PA) of King of Prussia, PA for the not-to-exceed amount of \$1,080,103.19. This contract will test the structural pins at the following locations:

- New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge (US 202) (approximately 16 hanger assembly pins)
- Calhoun Street Toll-Supported Bridge (Wrought Iron - approximately 252 truss pins)
- Lumberville-Raven Rock Pedestrian Bridge (approximately 8 anchorage pins)

A project kickoff meeting was held with PA on December 15, 2025. Project field work started in mid-February 2026 with the testing of pins along the north side of the New Hope – Lambertville Toll Bridge. Pin testing at Lumberville – Ravenrock was completed in the first week of March 2026.

- Northampton Street Toll-Supported Bridge (approximately 98 truss pins)
- Easton-Phillipsburg Toll Bridge (US 22) (approximately 74 truss pins)
- Riegelsville Toll-Supported Bridge (approx. 8 suspension cable pins, 162 suspension rod pins)

A kickoff meeting was held with M&M on January 15, 2026. The M&M team has initiated the review of existing bridge plans and has commenced coordination for the upcoming inspection and testing of bridge pins. Pin testing at the Northampton Street Toll-Supported Bridge and the Riegelsville Bridge has been completed. The majority of the pin testing at the Easton – Phillipsburg Toll Bridge has been completed except for two pin location where pin caps could not be removed. Plans are in progress to have a JOC Contractor remove the two pin caps in question so testing can be completed.
